WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 3rd day of April, 1940 (N4430/1940), in the words following, viz.:—

“Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions or other allowances in the nature thereof, payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

“And whereas by Order in Council dated 5th October, 1939, sanction was given to the continuance during the period of hostilities of Marriage Allowance, together with an amount equal to the appropriate qualifying allotment, for thirteen weeks following the notification of the death of the man concerned:

“And whereas by Order in Council dated 17th November, 1939, similar provision was made for continuance of the qualifying rate of allotment payable with Dependants Allowance:

“And whereas we are of the opinion that, with effect from 7th March, 1940, the allotment for the first four weeks of the thirteen-week

period should be paid at the actual rate in force at the time of death:

“And whereas we are also of opinion that, with effect from the commencement of the present war, allotments held by persons who receive no Dependants Allowance but who are within the degrees of relationship recognised for such allowance should continue for thirteen weeks following notification of the death of the man, at the actual or qualifying rate whichever is the less, and that, with effect from 7th March, 1940, the actual rate, if greater than the qualifying rate, should continue to be paid for the first four weeks of the thirteen-week period:

“And whereas we also consider that allotments held by dependants of a relationship not recognised for Dependants Allowance purposes should, with effect from the commencement of the present war, continue at the actual or qualifying rate, whichever is the less, for four weeks following notification of the death of the man.

“We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased by Your Order in Council to sanction payment being made accordingly for the period of the present war.

“The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in this proposal.”

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1936, duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a Scheme bearing date the 29th day of February, 1939, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1936, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for effecting the union of the Benefice of Askham and the Benefice of East Drayton with Stokeham, both of which Benefices are situate in the County of Nottingham and in the Diocese of Southwell:

"Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend Henry, Bishop of Southwell, pursuant to the provisions of the said Measures to inquire into and report upon the union of the said two Benefices of Askham and East Drayton with Stokeham duly made their Report to the said Bishop of Southwell and therein recommended the union of the said two Benefices and the terms for effecting the union, and the said Bishop of Southwell signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

"And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared

this Scheme for the union of the said two Benefices based upon the terms recommended in the said Report:

"And whereas both of the said Benefices are now full, being held in plurality by the Reverend Frederick Homer under the authority of a Dispensation:

"And whereas the patronage of both of the said Benefices now belongs to one and the same Patron:

"Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said Henry, Bishop of Southwell, and with the consent of the said Frederick Homer (testified by their signing this Scheme) do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

"1. That the said Benefice if Askham and the said Benefice of East Drayton with Stokeham shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with Cure of Souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of East Drayton and Stokeham with Askham' but the Parishes of the said Benefices shall continue in all respects distinct.

"2. That upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette, the union shall forthwith take effect and the said Frederick Homer if he is then the Incumbent of both of the said Benefices of Askham and East Drayton with Stokeham shall become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice and his admission thereto shall be without any form or fee of or for presentation or nomination and he shall not be required to pay any fees in respect of his collation, institution, licence, or induction to the United Benefice beyond such fees as he would have been liable to pay if his admission to the United Benefice had been an admission solely to that one of the said two Benefices for the holding of which in plurality with the other a Dispensation was heretofore granted to him.

"3. That the Incumbent of the United Benefice shall reside at East Drayton but pending the provision of a new Parsonage House at East Drayton the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Askham shall upon the said union taking effect become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice and so soon as conveniently may be the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of East Drayton with Stokeham and the site and appurtenances thereof and the grounds heretofore usually occupied and enjoyed therewith shall be sold and disposed of by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, at such time or times and in such manner in all respects as to us shall seem expedient and that the net proceeds of such sale shall be applied towards the cost of providing a new Parsonage House at East Drayton as aforesaid.

"Provided always that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from making any other recommendations and proposals relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Measures, or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England, or of any Act of Parliament."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have been duly published in accordance with the provisions of the said Measures, and Notices

have been transmitted to the persons or bodies entitled under the said Measures to receive Notice requiring any objections to such draft Scheme to be stated or transmitted in writing to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules applicable to proceedings under the said Measures:

And whereas an objection has been so stated or transmitted to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the same Rules:

And whereas the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, after giving full consideration to such objection, have deemed right to make no alterations in such draft Scheme:

And whereas public notice of the certification to His Majesty in Council of the said Scheme and the consent thereto in writing of the Bishop of Southwell has been duly given in the manner and within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules aforesaid:

And whereas no appeal has been made to His Majesty in Council within the period of one month after the date of the said public notice in accordance with the provisions of the said Measures against the said Scheme or any part thereof by any person who has made objection as aforesaid to the said draft Scheme:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that the Benefices therein recommended to be united shall be united to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme and further to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the date when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measures.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Southwell.

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 33rd and 34th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 39, and of the Acts therein

mentioned, that is to say, the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 113, the Act of the 4th and 5th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 39, and the Act of the 31st and 32nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 114, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for effecting a transfer of the ownership of the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the Church and Cure (hereinafter called 'the said Benefice') of Willingham by Stow in the County of Lincoln and in the Diocese of Lincoln:

"Whereas the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Willingham by Stow is vested for an estate in fee simple without incumbrances in the Martyrs Memorial and Church of England Trust Company Limited whose registered office is situate at the Rectory, Tooting, in the County of London (hereinafter called the said Company):

"And whereas the said Company are desirous that the whole Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Willingham by Stow now vested in them as aforesaid, should be transferred to and be vested in the Bishop of Lincoln for the time being:

"And whereas the Right Reverend Nugent, now Bishop of Lincoln, is willing to accept such transfer, and in token of such his willingness and also in token that the same transfer has that consent of the Bishop of the Diocese which by the hereinbefore mentioned Acts or by some or one of them is made necessary he, the said Nugent, Bishop of Lincoln, has executed this Scheme as hereinafter mentioned:

"And whereas the transfer of the Patronage of the said Benefice of Willingham by Stow which is hereinbefore mentioned and hereinafter recommended and proposed will in our opinion tend to make better provision for the Cure of Souls in the Parish or District in or in respect of which the right of Patronage or Advowson so recommended and proposed to be transferred as aforesaid arises or exists, that is to say, in the Parish of Willingham by Stow:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the said Company (in testimony whereof they have affixed hereto their Corporate Seal) and with the consent of the said Nugent, Bishop of Lincoln (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme and sealed the same with his Episcopal Seal), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the whole Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Willingham by Stow now vested in them, the said Company, as aforesaid, shall be transferred to the said Nugent, Bishop of Lincoln, and his successors in the same Bishopric, and shall thereupon and thenceforth become and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the said Nugent, Bishop of Lincoln, and by his successors in the said Bishopric for ever.

" And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any further or other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or of any of them or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Lincoln.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 37, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 104, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme bearing date the 11th day of April, 1940, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

" We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 37, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 104, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for constituting a separate District for spiritual purposes to be taken partly out of the Parish of Brodsworth, partly out of the Parish of Sprotborough and partly out of the New Parish (sometime District Chapelry) of Saint Peter, Bentley, all in the County of York and in the Diocese of Sheffield:

" Whereas we are satisfied that the said Parish of Brodsworth, the said Parish of Sprotborough and the said New Parish of Saint Peter, Bentley, are Cures wherein or in parts whereof the provision for public worship and for pastoral superintendence is insufficient for the spiritual wants of the inhabitants thereof and it has been made to appear to us that it would promote the interests of religion that the particular portions of the said Parish of Brodsworth, of the said Parish of Sprotborough and of the said New Parish of Saint Peter, Bentley, which are hereinafter mentioned and described, should be constituted a separate District in the manner which is hereinafter set forth:

" And whereas there is not at present within the limits of the said proposed separate District any consecrated Church or Chapel in use for the purposes of Divine worship:

" And whereas by an Order of Your Majesty in Council bearing date the 8th day of June, 1937, and published in the London Gazette on the 11th day of the same month the Cathedral Benefice of Sheffield (Saint Peter and Saint Paul), the Benefice of Sheffield, Saint Paul, the Benefice of Sheffield, Saint James and the Benefice of Moorfields, Saint Jude, all in the said County and Diocese were united into one Benefice and it was by the same Order provided amongst other things that the whole of the endowments of the said Benefice of Moorfields, Saint Jude, and also the Parsonage House Fund held by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, for the same Benefice should be appropriated for the endowment of a new Ecclesiastical District to be selected by the Bishop of Sheffield and that the patronage of such new Ecclesiastical District should belong to the Patron of the said Benefice of Moorfields, Saint Jude:

" And whereas the said endowments will amount to about £390 per annum and the whole will be payable by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, to the Minister of the said proposed separate District so soon as a Minister shall have been duly licensed in accordance with the provisions of the firstly herein mentioned Act and to his successors:

" And whereas the District hereinafter proposed to be constituted has been selected by the Bishop of Sheffield as the District for which an endowment shall be secured as provided by the above mentioned Order in Council:

" And whereas at the date of the said Order in Council the patronage of the said Benefice of Moorfields, Saint Jude, was vested in Your Majesty, Your Heirs and Successors:

" Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Leslie, Bishop of Sheffield, in testimony whereof he has set his hand and Episcopal seal to this Scheme, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that all those portions of the said Parish of Brodsworth, of the said Parish of Sprotborough, and of the said New Parish of Saint Peter, Bentley, which are described in the schedule hereunder written all which portions, together with the boundaries thereof, are delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed shall upon and from the day upon which any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette become and be constituted a separate District for spiritual purposes by the name of 'The District of Saint Leonard and Saint Jude, Doncaster'.

" And we further recommend and propose that the whole right of Patronage of the said proposed District and when such District shall have become a New Parish then of such New Parish and the nomination of the Minister or Incumbent thereof shall as provided by the said Order in Council of the 8th day of June, 1937, be vested in and exercised by Your Majesty, Your Heirs and Successors for ever.

" And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or of any of them or of any other Act of Parliament.

" THE SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme has reference.

" The District of Saint Leonard and Saint Jude, Doncaster, being:—

" All those contiguous portions of the Parish of Brodsworth, of the Parish of Sprotborough and of the New Parish (sometime District Chapelry) of Saint Peter, Bentley, all in the County of York and in the Diocese of Sheffield, which taken together are bounded upon the north by the New Parish of All Saints, Woodlands, in the said County and Diocese, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the west, upon the south-west, and upon the east by an imaginary line commencing at the point where the boundaries of the said New Parish of All Saints, Woodlands, of the said Parish of Brodsworth, and of the said New Parish of Saint Peter, Bentley, all meet at the junction of Green Lane with the road called Roman Ridge, and extending thence south-eastward along the south-western side of Roman Ridge (thereby following the boundary which divides the said Parish of Brodsworth from the said New Parish of Saint Peter, Bentley) for a distance of $7\frac{1}{2}$ chains or thereabouts to the eastern end of the fence forming the northern boundary of the close numbered 44 upon the Ordnance Survey Map of the Civil Parish of Brodsworth published in the year 1930 on the scale of 25 inches to a mile and also upon the map or plan annexed to this Scheme, and extending thence first westward and then in various directions along the said fence and the fences forming the western and southern boundaries of the said close, the western boundary of the close numbered 12 and the northern and western boundaries of the close numbered 6 upon the same maps for a distance in all of 52 chains or thereabouts to the point where the fence forming the western boundary of the said close numbered 6 reaches the northern side of the main road from Barnsley to Doncaster, and extending thence southward in a straight line across such road and across the close numbered 31 upon the same maps for a distance of 11 chains or thereabouts to the point where the fence forming the southern boundary of the last mentioned close meets the fence forming the western boundary of the close numbered 4 upon the said maps, and extending thence southward along the last mentioned fence for a distance of 20 chains or thereabouts to the point where it reaches the northern side of Long Plantation, and extending thence westward along the northern side of Long Plantation (thereby following the boundary which divides the said Parish of Brodsworth from the said Parish of Sprotborough) for a distance of 24 chains or thereabouts to a point opposite to the northern end of the fence forming the western boundary of the portion of Cusworth Park known as 'The Reins' and extending thence generally southward to and along the said fence for a distance of $18\frac{1}{2}$ chains or thereabouts to the point where it reaches the northern side of Back Lane, and extending thence first southward to and then westward along the middle of Back Lane for a distance of 4 chains or thereabouts to a point opposite to the northern end of the fence forming the boundary of Cusworth Park, and extending thence first southward to and then first southward and then in various directions

along such fence for a distance of 1 mile and 45 chains or thereabouts to the point where it meets the fence which divides the close numbered 96 upon the Ordnance Survey Map of the Civil Parish of Sprotborough published in the year 1930 on the scale of 25 inches to a mile and also upon the said map or plan annexed to this Scheme from the close numbered 69 upon the said maps and extending thence north-eastward along such fence for a distance of 12 chains or thereabouts to the point where it meets the fence forming the western boundary of the Gowdall and Braithwell Line of the London and North Eastern Railway, and extending thence first eastward to and then northward along the middle of the said line of railway (thereby crossing the boundary which divides the said Parish of Sprotborough from the said New Parish of Saint Peter, Bentley), for a distance of 1 mile and 50 chains or thereabouts to the centre of the bridge which carries it across Bruslingholme Lane and extending thence north-westward along the middle of Bruslingholme Lane for a distance of 5 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Langthwaite Lane, and extending thence north-westward along the middle of Langthwaite Lane for a distance of $6\frac{1}{2}$ chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Peter, Bentley, from the said New Parish of All Saints, Woodlands."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have, in accordance with the provisions of the firstly hereinbefore mentioned Act, been transmitted to the Patrons and to the Incumbents of the Cures out of which it is intended that the District recommended in such Scheme to be constituted shall be taken, and such Patrons and Incumbents have, with the exception herein-after mentioned, signified their assent to such Scheme:

And whereas no reply has been received from the Incumbent of the Benefice of Sprotborough, although a period of more than one calendar month has elapsed since the said drafts were so transmitted:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Sheffield.

a Scheme bearing date the 11th day of April, 1940, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1936, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for altering the boundaries of the Parish of Saint Giles, Durham, of the New Parish (sometime District) of Belmont and of the Parish of Shincliffe, all in the County of Durham and in the Diocese of Durham:

"Whereas it has been represented to us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, and it appears to us to be desirable that the boundaries of the said Parishes should be altered in the manner which is hereinafter mentioned:

"And whereas the Benefices of Saint Giles, Durham, of Belmont and of Shincliffe are now full, the Reverend George Henry Aird being the present Incumbent of the Benefice of Saint Giles, Durham, the Reverend George Suthrien being the present Incumbent of the Benefice of Belmont and the Reverend Thomas Henry Lilburn being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Shincliffe, and the said George Henry Aird, George Suthrien and Thomas Henry Lilburn have signified their consent to the proposals hereinafter mentioned by signing this Scheme:

"And whereas the Diocesan Committee of the Diocese of Durham appointed pursuant to the first section of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, have by a Resolution passed at a meeting of the said Diocesan Committee held on the 5th day of December, 1938, signified their consent to the alteration of boundaries herein proposed:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Alwyn Terrell Petre, Bishop of Durham (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that from and after the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme and without any assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the boundaries of the said Parish of Saint Giles, Durham, of the said New Parish of Belmont and of the said Parish of Shincliffe shall be altered so that first all that portion of the said Parish of Shincliffe, which is described in the First Schedule hereunder written and is delineated and set forth upon the map or plan hereunto annexed and is thereon coloured pink shall be annexed to and shall in future form part of the said Parish of Saint Giles, Durham, and secondly all that other portion of the said Parish of Shincliffe which is described in the Second Schedule hereunder written and is delineated and set forth upon the said map or plan and is thereon coloured green shall be annexed to and shall in future form part of the said New Parish of Belmont.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from making any other recommendations and proposals relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure, or of any other

Provisional Regulations, dated April 16, 1940, made by the Minister of Health under the Poor Law Act, 1930.

102750.

Whereas by the Public Assistance Order, 1930 (S.R. & O. 1930 No. 185), made by the Minister of Health under the Poor Law Act, 1930 (20 & 21 Geo. 5. c. 17), as amended by the Public Assistance (Casual Poor) Order, 1931 (S.R. & O. 1931 No. 136), and the Public Assistance (Amendment) Order, 1939 (S.R. & O. 1939 No. 484), provision is made in relation to the discharge of the poor law functions of councils of counties and county boroughs;

And whereas it is expedient that the Public Assistance Order, 1930, as amended as aforesaid should be further amended as hereinafter appearing:

Now therefore the Minister of Health hereby certifies under section 2 of the Rules Publication Act, 1893 (52 & 53 Vict. c. 63), that on account of urgency the following regulations should come into immediate operation and in exercise of his powers under the Poor Law Act, 1930, and of all other powers enabling him in that behalf, hereby makes the following regulations to come into operation forthwith as provisional rules:

1. These regulations may be cited as the Public Assistance (Amendment) Order, 1940.

2. These regulations shall continue in operation until such date as His Majesty may by Order in Council declare to be the date on which the emergency that was the occasion of the passing of the Courts (Emergency Powers) Act, 1939 (2 & 3 Geo. 6. c. 67), came to an end.

3. Subject to the provisions of subsection (1) of section 137 of the Poor Law Act, 1930, the Public Assistance Order, 1930, as amended as aforesaid, shall have effect as if—

(i) the following provision were added to Article 5 thereof namely—

“ ‘ evacuation plan ’ means such a plan as is mentioned in subsection (1) of section 56 of the Civil Defence Act, 1939 ”;

(ii) the words “ or to and from any place for the purpose of visiting a child for the time being at such place under an evacuation plan ” were added to Article 17 thereof;

(iii) the following proviso were added to Article 22 thereof, namely—

“ Provided that this Article shall not be applicable in relation to any relief given in food, temporary lodging or clothing under arrangements made for the relief of

(a) persons for the time being rendered homeless by the destruction of their houses by enemy action;

POOR LAW, ENGLAND.

RELIEF.

Provisional Regulations, dated April 16, 1940, made by the Minister of Health under the Poor Law Act, 1930.

102751.

Whereas by the Relief Regulation Order, 1930 (S.R. & O. 1930, No 186), made by the Minister of Health under the Poor Law Act, 1930 (20 & 21 Geo. 5. c. 17), as amended by the Relief Regulation (Amendment) Order, 1932 (S.R. & O. 1932, No. 631), provision is made in relation to the discharge of the poor law functions of councils of counties and county boroughs;

And whereas it is expedient that the Relief Regulation Order, 1930, as amended as aforesaid should be further amended as hereinafter appearing:

Now therefore the Minister of Health hereby certifies under section 2 of the Rules Publication Act, 1893 (52 & 53 Vict. c. 63), that on account of urgency the following regulations should come into immediate operation and in exercise of his powers under the Poor Law Act, 1930, and of all other powers enabling him in that behalf, hereby makes the following regulations to come into operation forthwith as provisional rules.

1. These regulations may be cited as the Relief Regulation (Amendment) Order, 1940.

2. These regulations shall continue in operation until such date as His Majesty may by Order in Council declare to be the date on which the emergency that was the occasion of the passing of the Courts (Emergency Powers) Act, 1939 (2 & 3 Geo. 6. c. 67), came to an end.

3. Subject to the provisions of subsection (1) of section 137 of the Poor Law Act, 1930, the Relief Regulation Order, 1930, as amended as aforesaid shall have effect as if—

(i) Article 5 were omitted therefrom;

(ii) the following provision were added after Article 9 thereof, namely—

“9A. Notwithstanding anything contained in Articles 6, 7 or 8 the Council may afford without conditions relief given in food, temporary lodging or clothing under arrangements made for the relief of

(a) persons for the time being rendered homeless by the destruction of their houses by enemy action;

(b) persons, other than those transferred under an evacuation plan, forced to leave their homes by enemy attack or the imminence of such attack; and

(c) survivors of disasters at sea landed in England and Wales.”

(iii) the words “a fortnight” were substituted for the words “a week” in paragraph (1) and the word “twenty-seven” were substituted for the word “fourteen” in sub-paragraph (c) of paragraph (2) of Article 11 thereof.
