Venice, March 22. The Doge is now recovering of his late Indisposition. The Vice-Doge and the Senate went yesterday in Ceremony to the Church of St. Mark, where *Te Deum* was sung for the Conclusion of the Peace with the Turks. The Senate have sent Orders for the demolishing of the Fortress of *Preveza*, and the Castle of *Romelia*, pursuant to the Treaty with the Port. Signior *Grimani*, whom they have appointed to be their Commissioner for settling the Limits in *Dalmatia*, is on his departure thither. The Soldiers that are come hither from *Terra-firma*, to recruit our Forces in *Dalmatia*, will be shipp'd this week on board the Convoy that lies here ready to sail with Provisions and Ammunition for the *Levant*.

Brussels, April 2. N. S. The King of Spain has made the Baron de *Grisper* President of the Council of *Mechlen*, Chancellor of *Brabant*, and has given the Presidentship of *Mechlen* to Counsellor *Brouckhoven*. The Council of this City are assembled, to consider of the Means to raise their Quota of the 12000 Florins, which the States of *Brabant* have granted as a Subsidy to the King of Spain.

Falmouth, March 27. On the 25th Instant came in here the *Adventure* of St. Malo, *Michael Bork* Master, with Wine for *Galway*. Yesterday arrived the Spanish Expedition *Pacquet-boat* with one Mail in three days from the *Groyne*, and the Spanish Alliance *Pacquet-boat* failed this day for the *Groyne*.

Plymouth, March 28. The *Pearl* of this Place, *Abram Manley* Master, laden with Salt, failed yesterday for *Riga*. This day failed from hence, the *Caolina* Merchant of London, *Tho. Foster* Master, for *Carolina*; the *Mary Fortuna* of London, *Tho. Barnes* Master, for the *Barbadoes*; the *Vine* of London, *Tho. Vaughan* Master, for *Bourdeaux*; the *Owners* *Good-will* of London, *Peter Stephenson* Master, for the *Isle of May*; and about eight Sail of Merchant Ships of *Topham* bound for *Newfoundland*.

Deal, March 31. His Majesty's Ship the *Lime* failed from hence last Tuesday for the *Streights*; Divers outward bound Merchant Ships did also fail the same day, but the Wind coming contrary, they were forced to return hither.
