FACTORIES ACT, 1937.

The Secretary of State for the Home Department hereby gives notice that on 25th April, 1940, he made Regulations under the Factories Act, 1937, fixing (with certain exceptions) 48 as the maximum weekly working hours for young persons under 16 employed in factories in which the sole or principal industry carried on is one or a combination of the following, namely:—

- The spinning or doubling of cotton, woollen or worsted yarn;
- The spinning or doubling or throwing of silk or rayon yarn;
- The weaving of cotton or woollen or worsted cloth;
- The weaving of carpets;

The weaving or printing of silk or rayon fabrics (not including smallwares, ribbons, labels, badges or similar goods);

The bleaching or dyeing of cotton, rayon or woollen yarn;

The bleaching, dyeing, printing or finishing of cotton, rayon or woollen piece goods (except hosiery);

The Regulations also apply to the operations known as legging and stripping in the finishing of hosiery. They are substantially in accordance with the draft issued on the 25th August, 1939, and will come into force on 1st June, 1940.

TRADE BOARDS ACTS, 1909 AND 1918, HOLIDAYS WITH PAY ACT, 1938, AND TRADE BOARDS AND ROAD HAULAGE WAGES (EMERGENCY PROVISIONS) ACT, 1940.

LAUNDRY TRADE BOARD (GREAT BRITAIN).

Proposal to vary minimum rates of wages (including holiday remuneration).

PETROLEUM (PRODUCTION) ACT, 1934.

In pursuance of Section 2 (3) of the Petroleum (Production) Act, 1934, the Board of Trade hereby give notice that in accordance with the provisions of that Act and of the Petroleum (Production) Regulations, 1935, they have granted to the D'Arcy Exploration Co., Ltd., of Britannic House, Finsbury Circus, London, E.C.2, three Prospecting Licences in respect of the areas referred to in the Schedule hereto, the boundaries of which are described by reference to the one-inch Ordnance Survey Map, supplemented where necessary by reference to the six-inch Ordnance Survey Map.

SCHEDULE.

An area of approximately 179 square miles, situated in the counties of Chester, Flint and Lancaster.

Northern Boundary.

Commencing at Hilbre Point, thence along the coastline at High Water Mark in a north-easterly direction past the Old Leasowe Lighthouse to a point about 2,000 feet north-east of the Lighthouse where a track leads to the coast.

Thence along this track in a south-south-easterly direction and along the road past Moreton Railway Station, passing through Moreton by way of Station Road and Upton Road, continuing along the said road through Upton by way of the Village and Hake Lane and skirting Arrowe Park on the east side to the road junction at Woodchurch Green. Thence along the road running in a north-easterly direction for about $\frac{1}{4}$ mile to a road junction and along Woodchurch Road under the Wrexham and Bidston Branch of the London and North Eastern Railway, past the Wirral Water Works, to the road junction about $\frac{3}{4}$ mile north-east of Prenton Hall. Thence in a south-easterly direction along Storeton Road and Mount Road to the road junction about half a mile south-west of Higher Bebbington. Thence in an east-north-easterly direction along Bracken Lane past Highclere and along Heath Road to the road junction at Lower Bebbington continuing along The Village, Bebbington Road, Tollbar Corner and New Ferry Road to New Ferry Pier. Thence following High Water Mark in a south-easterly direction for about 300 feet to the Parish boundary, thence in a north-easterly direction to its junction with the county boundary. Thence following the county boundary in a south-easterly direction to its turning point south of Garston continuing in a north-north-easterly direction to the road junction about $\frac{1}{4}$ mile north-west of Mount Pleasant. Thence along Speke Road in a west-north-westerly direction for about 1,000 feet, continuing in a northerly direction to the rail-

way junction. Thence following the Garston Curve of the London Midland and Scottish Railway, along the railway in a north-westerly direction to the point where the road crosses the railway at Mossley Hill Railway Station. Thence following the road to the junction of Calderstones Road and Cromptons Lane continuing along Cromptons Lane, Park Road and Queens Drive to the point where the road crosses the London Midland and Scottish Railway about 1,700 feet west of Broad Green Railway Station. Thence following the railway in an easterly direction to the point where it crosses the Cheshire Lines Railway.

Eastern Boundary.

Thence following the Cheshire Lines Railway in a south-easterly direction past Childwall and Gateacre Railway Stations, Halewood North and West Junction and continuing past Hough Green and Great Sankey Stations to the point in Warrington where the railway crosses the Winwick-Warrington Road. Thence following the said road in a southerly direction past the Railway Station to the point where it crosses the River Mersey. Thence following the River and River Diversion in a south-south-westerly direction for about $\frac{1}{4}$ mile to the point where the Chester Road leaves the River Diversion and along this road to the point where it crosses the Manchester Ship Canal. Thence following the Ship Canal in a south-westerly direction to the point where it is crossed by the London Midland and Scottish and Great Western Joint Railway continuing along the said railway past Moore Station to the point where the road crosses the railway by Preston on the Hill Station. Thence following the road in a generally south-westerly direction past Sutton to the point where the road crosses the railway at Halton Station. Thence following the railway in a south-westerly direction past Frodsham, Helsby, Dunham on the Hill and Mickle Trafford Stations to Chester General Station.

Southern Boundary.

Thence following the said railway in a north-westerly direction to East Junction, north-west of Chester General Station and following the London and North Eastern Railway in a west-north-westerly direction to the junction about $1\frac{1}{2}$ miles south-west of Shotwick continuing along the northern curve to Birkenhead junction.

Western Boundary.

Thence following the London and North Eastern Railway in a north-north-westerly direction to the point where the road crosses the railway at Burtoft Point Station. Thence following the road in a north-westerly direction to Denhall Quay continuing along the bank of the River Dee in a north-westerly direction, skirting the eastern side of West Kirby Marine Lake to Hilbre Point, the point of departure.

An Area of approximately 156 sq. miles situated in the counties of Flint, Denbigh and Chester.

Northern Boundary.

Commencing at a point where the road crosses the London Midland & Scottish Railway at a point about $\frac{1}{2}$ mile west-north-west of Talacre Station, thence following the said

Railway in an east-south-easterly direction for about $1\frac{1}{2}$ miles to a point about 300 feet west-south-west of the Sluice House. Thence in a straight line to Sluice House Gutter and along the Gutter in a north-easterly direction to the Breakwater. Thence along the coast at High Water Mark in a general northerly direction to a point about 150 feet east of the Old Light-house. Thence in a straight line in an east-north-easterly direction to the point where the county boundary crosses Low Water Mark continuing along boundary to the point where it turns north-north-west about $\frac{1}{4}$ mile west of Hilbre Island. Thence in a straight line to Red Stones, Hilbre Point.

Eastern Boundary.

Thence following the coast at High Water Mark in a south-easterly direction skirting the eastern edge of West Kirby Marine Lake to Denhall Quay. Thence following the track and road running in a south-easterly direction to Denhall House and to the point where the road crosses the London & North Eastern Railway at Burton Point Station, continuing along the said Railway in a south-south-easterly direction to the junction about $1\frac{1}{2}$ miles south-west of Shotwick. Thence in a south-easterly direction to East Junction north-west of Chester General Station, following the London Midland & Scottish Railway (Chester and Holyhead Branch) across the River Dee to Mold Junction. Thence along the branch railway to the point where the railway crosses the road at Kinnerton Station continuing along the road in a south-westerly direction past Higher Kinnerton and Hope in a southerly direction through Caergwle to the point where the railway crosses the road at Cefn-y-bedd.

Southern Boundary.

Thence continuing along the main road in a south-westerly direction to the road junction by the reservoir about $\frac{1}{4}$ mile west-north-west of Coedpoeth Station. Thence following the road in a north-westerly direction to Rhydtalog, continuing in the same direction to the cross-roads at Graianryd and to Erryrys along the road running in a general north-westerly direction.

Western Boundary.

From Erryrys along the road running in a northerly direction to the county boundary, thence in a north-easterly direction to the road junction about $\frac{1}{4}$ mile north-north-west of Nerquis. Thence along the road running in a north-westerly direction through Gwernymynydd to Waen. Thence following the road in a westerly direction to the cross-roads about 3,000 feet west of Waen, thence along the road in a general north-north-easterly direction to Rhydymwyn, passing Llyn-y-pandy and Twmpath. Thence following the road running in a north-westerly direction to the cross-roads at Dolfechlas-isaf and along the road running in a north-easterly direction towards The Nant. Thence in a general north-north-westerly direction along the road to Holywell, passing Halkyn and Brynford. Thence along the main road running in a north-westerly direction past Holloway to the road junction 600 feet south-east of Golch Farm, continuing to Whitford by way of the road leading past Pwll Highbrook and Mertyn Abbot, through Whitford to Tre Mostyn. Thence following the road in a

westerly direction past Trelogan to the cross-roads named Four Crosses, continuing in a general northerly direction along the road through Llanasa, past Kelston Farm to the point where it meets the road from Gronant to Glan-yr-afon. Thence through the Dingle, passing west of Talacre to the main road as far as Triangle Wood branching off along the road which bisects the London Midland & Scottish Railway at the point of departure.

An area of approximately 197 square miles situated in the counties of Nottingham, Leicester and Rutland.

Northern Boundary.

Commencing at a point South of Kegworth Station in the County of Nottingham where the Kegworth—West Leake road crosses the London Midland and Scottish Railway, thence along the road in an easterly direction to the road junction by Pit House. Thence along the road in a northerly direction to West Leake and in an east-north-easterly direction through the village. Thence following the main road in a southerly and easterly direction through East Leake to the cross-roads by the Inn at Costock. Thence in a general northerly direction along the main road to Nottingham past Bunny, to the road junction at the north-west corner of Bunny Park. Thence along the road in an east-north-easterly direction south of Rancliffe Wood through the village of Keyworth to the road junction approximately $\frac{3}{4}$ mile east of Keyworth. Thence along the road in a north-north-easterly direction for about a $\frac{1}{2}$ mile to point 292. Thence along the road in a south-easterly direction for about $\frac{1}{2}$ mile to the road junction south-west of Stanton on the Wolds. Thence along the road in north-easterly and easterly directions past Stanton on the Wolds to the road junction at point 316. Thence along the main road in a south-easterly direction to the road junction approximately $\frac{1}{2}$ mile north-east of Widmerpool Railway Station. Thence along the road in a north-easterly direction past Wolds Farm and through the village of Kinoulton to the road junction about $\frac{1}{2}$ mile north-east of Kinoulton. Thence along the road in a general south-south-easterly direction to the point where the road crosses the Grantham Canal about $\frac{1}{2}$ mile north of the village of Hickling. Thence along the canal in a general easterly direction to a point where the road crosses the canal about $\frac{1}{2}$ mile north-west of the village of Hose. Thence along the said road in an east-south-easterly direction for about $\frac{1}{2}$ mile and skirting the north of Hose. Thence along the road in a north-north-easterly direction to the road junction about 600 yards south of Harby Church.

Eastern Boundary.

Thence along the main road in a south-easterly direction to the cross-roads at Eastwell Lodge. Thence along the road running in a south-westerly direction which crosses the Holwell Branch of the London Midland and Scottish Railway by the Lion Brick Works as far as the fork-road to Scalford. Thence in a south-easterly direction along the road to Scalford and through Scalford, passing the church and water works and crossing under the London and North Eastern Railway (Waltham Branch) by the allotment gardens, thence in a

southerly direction past Melton Spinney to the town of Melton Mowbray passing through Melton Mowbray by way of Thorpe Road, Thorpe End, Sherrard Street and Burton Street. Thence in a south-easterly direction along Burton Road past Burton Lazars and Leesthorpe Hill to the town of Langham in Rutland, passing through that town by way of Melton Road and through Barleythorpe to the point in the town of Oakham where the road touches the Syston and Peterborough branch of the London Midland and Scottish Railway about 400 feet south of Oakham Railway Station. Thence along the said railway in a general south-south-easterly direction to a point where the Oakham—Manton Road crosses the said railway at a point approximately $\frac{1}{2}$ mile north-west of Manton. Thence along the road in a south-south-easterly direction to the cross-roads west of Manton. Thence along the main Oakham—Uppingham Road, skirting Preston on the east side to the cross-roads approximately $\frac{1}{2}$ mile east of Ayston.

Southern Boundary.

Thence along the road in a westerly direction for about $\frac{3}{4}$ mile to its junction with the main road from Uppingham to Leicester. Thence along this road in a westerly direction past Allextion and over Finchley bridge to the point where the road crosses the joint London and North Eastern and London Midland and Scottish Railway south of East Norton Station.

Western Boundary.

Thence along the said railway in a general north-westerly direction past Tilton Railway Station to the triangular railway junction about $\frac{1}{4}$ mile south-west of Marefield. Thence following the railway along the southern curve of the triangle past John O'Gaunt Fox Covert to a point where the road crosses the railway about $\frac{1}{2}$ mile north-east of Lowesby Railway Station. Thence along the said road in a general north-westerly direction past Lowesby Hall, Barsby and Queniborough to the road junction about $\frac{1}{2}$ mile north of The Beeches. Thence along the road in a south-westerly direction to the road junction in Syston. Thence along the road running in a west-north-westerly direction to the point where it meets the Fosse Way. Thence in a south-south-westerly direction along the Fosse Way for a distance of about 400 feet to a point where it is crossed by the London Midland and Scottish Railway. Thence in a general north-westerly direction along the railway past Sibleby, Barrow-upon-Soar, Loughborough and Sutton Bonnington to the point where it is crossed by the Kegworth—West Leake road, the point of departure.

PETROLEUM (PRODUCTION) ACT, 1934.

The Board of Trade hereby give notice that they have renewed for a further term of twelve months from 25th February, 1940, two Prospecting Licences granted under the Petroleum (Production) Act, 1934, and the Petroleum (Production) Regulations, 1935, to the D'Arcy Exploration Company Limited of Britannic House, Finsbury Circus, London, E.C.2. The licensed areas consist of about 189 square miles in the Counties of Derby and Stafford, and 164 square miles in the Counties of Chester, Derby and Stafford.

The KING has been graciously pleased to
approve of the undermentioned awards in
recognition of gallantry displayed in flying
operations against the enemy:—

*Awarded a Bar to the Distinguished Service
Order.*

Wing Commander Basil Edward EMBRY,
D.S.O., A.F.C. (09252).

In April, 1940, Wing Commander Embry
led a squadron of twelve aircraft in an attack
on Stavanger aerodrome and seaplane base.
He successfully completed his task and re-
turned to his base, with the whole squadron,
despite the failure of one of his engines before
he reached his objective. Again, two days
later, he led his squadron in another attack
on Stavanger, which was also a success, and
very valuable photographs were taken.
During this flight he suffered from frost-bite.
The satisfactory results achieved were due,
primarily, to the courage, determination and
fine leadership of this officer.

Awarded the Distinguished Flying Cross.

Flight Lieutenant Peter Wooldridge TOWNSEND (33178).

In April, 1940, whilst on patrol over the North Sea, Flight Lieutenant Townsend intercepted and attacked an enemy aircraft at dusk and after a running fight shot it down. This is the third success obtained by this pilot and in each instance he has displayed qualities of leadership, skill and determination of the highest order, with little regard for his own safety.

Flying Officer William Henry EDWARDS (40045).

In April, 1940, this officer was pilot of one of six aircraft which left to attack Stavanger aerodrome and seaplane base. The weather was so bad that five aircraft were compelled to abandon the task but Flying Officer Edwards succeeded in getting through, attacked the objectives and obtained valuable information. On the previous day he was pilot of one of twelve aircraft ordered to attack the same objectives. Despite a heavy snow storm, which forced him to fly very low, he reached the target and attacked it in the face of heavy anti-aircraft fire. When returning he attacked a Dornier seaplane with his guns and scored hits. On both days this officer displayed great skill and determination, and courage of a high order.
