OLD AGE AND WIDOWS' PENSIONS ACT, . 1940.

Notice is hereby given under the Rules Publication Act, 1893, that it is proposed by the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury after the expiration of at least forty days from this date in pursuance of the powers conferred upon Them by Section 9 of the Superannuation Act, 1935, and Section 18 of the Old Age and Widows' Pensions Act, 1940, and of every other power enabling Them in that behalf to issue Rules to be entitled the Assistance Board (Superannuation) Rules, 1940:

And that on account of urgency Their Lordships under Section 2 of the Rules Publication Act, 1893, made rules entitled the Assistance Board (Superannuation) Rules, 1940, to come into operation immediately as provisional rules, to continue in force until rules have been made in accordance with the provisions of Section I of that Act.
