#### ROYAL AIR FORCE.

The KING has been graciously pleased to confer the Victoria Cross on the undermentioned officer and non-commissioned officer, in recognition of most conspicuous bravery:—

Flying Officer Donald Edward GARLAND (40105).

563627 Sergeant Thomas GRAY.

Flying Officer Garland was the pilot and Sergeant Gray the observer of the leading aircraft of a formation of five aircraft that attacked a bridge over the Albert Canal which had not been destroyed and was allowing the enemy to advance into Belgium. All the air crews of the squadron concerned volunteered for the operation and, after five crews had been selected by drawing lots, the attack was delivered at low altitude against this vital target. Orders were issued that this bridge was to be destroyed at all costs. As had been anticipated, exceptionally intense machine gun and anti-aircraft fire was encountered, and the bridge area was heavily protected by enemy fighters. In spite of this the formation successfully delivered a dive bombing attack from the lowest practicable altitude and fighters in the vicinity reported that the target was obscured by the bombs bursting on it and in its vicinity. Only one aircraft returned from this mission out of the five concerned. The pilot of this aircraft reports that in addition to the extremely heavy antiaircraft fire, through which our aircraft dived to attack the objective, they were also attacked by a large number of enemy fighters after they had released their bombs on the target. Much of the success of this vital operation must be attributed to the formation leader; Flying Officer Garland,

and to the coolness and resource of Sergeant Gray, who navigated Flying Officer Garland's aircraft under most difficult conditions in such a manner that the whole formation was able successfully to attack the target in spite of subsequent heavy losses. Flying Officer Garland and Sergeant Gray unfortunately failed to return from the mission.

#### ROYAL AIR FORCE.

The KING has been graciously pleased to approve the undermentioned appointment and awards, in recognition of gallantry displayed in flying operations against the enemy:—

Appointed a Companion of the Distinguished
Service Order.

Acting Flight Lieutenant James Anthony LEATHART (39625).

During May, 1940, this officer led his squadron on a large number of offensive patrols over Northern France. On one occasion an attack was made on a formation of no less than 60 enemy aircraft. In company with his squadron he has shot down fifteen Messerschmitts, and possibly one Heinkel III and one Junkers 88, during the period mentioned. He also flew a trainer aircraft to Calais Marck aerodrome to rescue a squadron commander who had been shot down there but was uninjured. Whilst taking off, after the rescue, an attack was made by twelve Messerschmitt 109's but with great coolness and skilful evasive tactics Flight Lieutenant Leathart succeeded in shaking off the enemy and landing again without damage. Subsequently, he took off and flew back to England unescorted. This officer has displayed great courage, determination and splendid leadership.

Awarded the Distinguished, Flying Cross.

Squadron Leader George Campbell Tomlinson (05214).

This officer has commanded a Squadron since November, 1939. He has led numerous interception and convoy patrols, and also two raids over Holland and one over Brussels. In these raids his squadron destroyed thirteen enemy aircraft and damaged a further nine. He himself, shot down one enemy aircraft and damaged another. On two occasions he was forced to land in the front lines, but by courageous endeavour he returned to his unit in both instances.

Flight Lieutenant Adolph Gysbert Malan' (37604).

During May, 1940, this officer has led his flight, and on certain occasions his squadron, on ten offensive patrols in Northern France. He has personally shot down two enemy aircraft and possibly three others. Flight Lieutenant Malan has displayed great skill, courage and relentless determination in his attacks on the enemy.

Flight Lieutenant William Arthur TOYNE (39140).

As a flight commander this officer has carried out offensive patrols in German occupied territory in Holland and Belgium. He has personally shot down two enemy aircraft and has severely damaged another. He has displayed outstanding courage and his leadership has largely contributed to the success achieved by his squadron.

Acting Flight Lieutenant Robert Roland Stanford Tuck (47306).

During May, 1940, this officer led his flight in company with his squadron on two offensive patrols over Northern France. As a result of one of these patrols in which the squadron engaged a formation of some 60 enemy aircraft, the Squadron Commander was later reported missing, and the flight commander wounded and in hospital. Flight Lieutenant Tuck assumed command, and on the following day led the squadron, consisting of only eight aircraft, on a further patrol engaging an enemy formation of fifty aircraft. During these engagements the squadron has shot down ten enemy aircraft and possibly another twenty-four. Throughout the combats this officer has displayed great dash and gallantry.

Awarded the Distinguished Flying Cross.

Flying Officer Oliver Russell Donaldson (37414).

One night in May, 1940, this officer was captain of an aircraft detailed to attack focal points behind the enemy's positions. In the neighbourhood of Hirson he came under heavy anti-aircraft fire which he regarded as indicating that he was near a profitable objective. In spite of the enemy fire Flying Officer Donaldson made five attacks on a road through a nearby wood. As a result a large fire and thirteen violent explosions occurred in what must have been an important enemy dump. He has consistently shown the highest degree of courage and determination.

Flying Officer David Douglas PRYDE (39564). In May, 1940, this officer was detailed for collaboration operation involving an attack on the communication centre of Despite difficult conditions, he Hannapes. succeeded in identifying the target from a very low altitude. Although his aircraft was hit heavily, Flying Officer Pryde climbed to 3,000 feet and executed a successful bombing attack. His aircraft subsequently caught fire but he continued flying and, when height could no longer be maintained, the entire crew landed by parachute. Flying Officer Pryde has completed sixteen operational flights during six months of war flying and has displayed courage and determination of a high order.

Pilot Officer John Laurence Allen (70008).

In May, 1940, this officer was detailed to intercept an enemy raider approaching this country. He proceeded as far as Dunkerque and between that place and Calais on his return journey, he observed thirty Junkers 88's engaged in bombing Calais. Although alone, he climbed to attack and badly

damaged one enemy aircraft, whereupon the remainder of the formation disappeared in the clouds. Two days later, in company with a second aircraft, he escorted a trainer aircraft to Calais Marck aerodrome, for the purpose of rescuing a squadron commander who had been shot down there. The trainer aircraft was attacked by twelve Messerschmitt 109's whilst taking off after the rescue, but Pilot Officer Allen in company with the other escorting aircraft immediately engaged these forces. Three of the enemy aircraft were shot down and a further three badly damaged.

Awarded the Distinguished Flying Medal.
561185 Sergeant James William Bristol
PHILLIPS.

This airman has accompanied his squadron on numerous offensive patrols over Northern France. On one day in May, 1940, he took part in two engagements with enemy aircraft and shot down four Messerschmitt 109's, and possibly another. Sergeant Phillips has shown great courage in his attack on the enemy. In one combat alone he destroyed three enemy aircraft from close range without damage to his own aircraft.

537006 Leading Aircraftman Brian GRAY.

In May, 1940, this airman was air gunner in an aircraft carrying out bombing operations against enemy troop concentrations at St. Omer. As a result of heavy anti-aircraft fire on the outward flight, Leading Aircraftman Gray was wounded in the left hand, one finger being practically severed and another out. He did not mention his wound until he had ascertained that the target had been attacked and the bombs released and, with great courage and devotion to duty, he continued to operate his wireless apparatus throughout the return flight.
