“ We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1936, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for effecting the union of the Benefice (being a Rectory) of Whepstead and the Benefice (being a Rectory) of Brockley (being part of the United Benefice of Brockley with Somerton) both of which Benefices are situate in the County of Suffolk and in the Diocese of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich:

“ Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend Walter Godfrey, Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich, pursuant to the provisions of the said Measures to inquire into and report upon the union of the said two Benefices of Whepstead and Brockley duly made their Report to the said Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich and therein recommended the union of the said two Benefices and the terms for effecting the union, and the said Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

“ And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the union of the said two Benefices which Scheme is based upon the terms recommended in the said Report but with the assent of the said Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich embodies a certain modification thereof:

“ And whereas the said Benefice of Whepstead is now full, the Reverend Joseph David Sayer being the present Incumbent thereof, and the said United Benefice of Brockley with Somerton is at present vacant:

“ And whereas the patronage of the said Benefice of Whepstead and of the said United Benefice of Brockley with Somerton now belongs to one and the same Patron:

“ Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said Walter Godfrey, Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich, and with the consent of the said Joseph David Sayer (testified by their signing this Scheme) do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

“ 1. That the said Benefice of Whepstead and the said Benefice of Brockley (being part of the said United Benefice of Brockley with Somerton) shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with Cure of Souls under the style of ‘ The United Benefice of Whepstead with Brockley ’ but the Parishes of the said Benefices shall continue distinct in all respects.

“ 2. That upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette the union shall forthwith take effect and the said

Joseph David Sayer if he is then Incumbent of the said Benefice of Whepstead shall be the first Incumbent of the United Benefice.

" 3. That upon the said union taking effect the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Whepstead shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice and so soon as conveniently may be the Parsonage House at Brockley at present belonging to the said United Benefice of Brockley with Somerton and the site and appurtenances thereof and the grounds heretofore usually occupied and enjoyed therewith shall be sold and disposed of by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners at such time or times and in such manner in all respects as to us shall seem expedient and that the net proceeds of such sale shall constitute and form part of the Expenses Fund established pursuant to the 32nd Section of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923.

" 4. That upon the said union taking effect the endowments of the said United Benefice of Brockley with Somerton shall be divided as follows, that is to say, there shall be transferred to the United Benefice of Whepstead with Brockley subject as hereinafter mentioned (a) the whole of the glebe land at present forming part of such endowments (b) the sum of £67 *lis.* 5*d.* Local Loans £3 per cent. Stock held by Queen Anne's Bounty and also at present forming part of such endowments and (c) the part of the income in lieu of tithe payable by Queen Anne's Bounty to the Incumbent of the said United Benefice of Brockley with Somerton which arises in respect of Tithe Rent-charge formerly belonging to the said Benefice of Brockley and all other endowments at present belonging to the said United Benefice of Brockley with Somerton shall be transferred and belong to the Benefice of Somerton (being part of the said United Benefice of Brockley with Somerton).

" Provided that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from making any other recommendations and proposals relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Measures, or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England, or of any Act of Parliament."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have been duly published in accordance with the provisions of the said Measures, and Notices have been transmitted to the persons or bodies entitled under the said Measures to receive Notice requiring any objections to such draft Scheme to be stated or transmitted in writing to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules applicable to proceedings under the said Measures:

And whereas the prescribed time has elapsed and no such objections have been so stated or transmitted to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners:

And whereas public notice of the certification to His Majesty in Council of the said Scheme and the consent thereto in writing of the Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich has been duly given in the manner and within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules aforesaid:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that the Benefices therein recommended to be united shall be united to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme and further to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the date when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measures.

" Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend Lisle, Bishop of Hereford, pursuant to the provisions of the said Measures to inquire into and report upon the union of the said two Benefices of Eyton and Lucton duly made their Report to the said Bishop of Hereford and therein recommended the union of the said two Benefices and the terms for effecting the union and also an alteration of the boundaries of the Parish of the said Benefice of Eyton, and the said Bishop of Hereford signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

" And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the union of the said two Benefices and for the said alteration of boundaries based upon the terms recommended in the said Report:

" And whereas both of the said Benefices are now full, the Reverend William Graham Moeran being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Eyton and the Reverend George Henzell Jobling being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Lucton:

" And whereas the patronage of the said two Benefices now belongs to one and the same Patron:

" Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said Lisle, Bishop of Hereford (testified by

his signing this Scheme), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

" 1. That the said Benefice of Eyton and the said Benefice of Lucton shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with Cure of Souls under the style of ' The United Benefice of Lucton with Eyton ' but the Parishes of the said Benefices shall continue in all respects distinct.

in number of the said Governors have signed this Scheme) and with the consents also of the Reverend Reginald Arthur Leathley, being the present Incumbent of the Benefice of Eye in the said Diocese of Hereford (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme) and of the Right Honourable Thomas Walker Hobart, Viscount Caldecote, and of the Right Honourable John, Viscount Simon, now Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, acting on behalf of Your Majesty as Patron of the said Benefice of Eye (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme) upon the said union taking effect (a) there shall be severed from the Parish of the said Benefice of Kingsland and annexed for all ecclesiastical purposes to the Parish of Eyton all that portion of the Parish of the said Benefice of Kingsland including a part of Gilbert's Farm which portion is shown upon the map or plan annexed to this Scheme and is thereon coloured green, and (b) there shall be severed from the Parish of the said Benefice of Eye and annexed for all ecclesiastical purposes to the said Parish of Eyton all that portion of the Parish of the said Benefice of Eye including the areas known as The Piddle, Lyddiatts and Scatterbrain, which portion is shown upon the said map or plan and is thereon coloured pink.

" Provided also that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from making any other recommendations and proposals relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Measures, or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England, or of any Act of Parliament."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have been duly published in accordance with the provisions of the said Measures, and Notices have been transmitted to the persons or bodies entitled under the said Measures to receive Notice requiring any objections to such draft Scheme to be stated or transmitted in writing to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules applicable to proceedings under the said Measures:

“ Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend Henry Herbert, Bishop of Carlisle, pursuant to the provisions of the said Measures to inquire into and report upon the union of the said two Benefices of Ambleside, Saint Mary, and Rydal, Saint Mary, duly made their Report to the said Bishop of Carlisle and therein recommended the union of those Benefices and also an alteration of boundaries affecting the Parish of the said Benefice of Rydal, Saint Mary, and the Parish of the said Benefice of Grasmere and the terms for affecting the same and the said Bishop of Carlisle signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

“ And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the union of the said two Benefices of Ambleside, Saint Mary, and Rydal, Saint Mary, and for the said alteration of boundaries, which Scheme is based upon the terms recommended in the said Report, but with the assent of the said Bishop embodies a modification thereof:

“ And whereas both of the said Benefices of Ambleside, Saint Mary, and Rydal, Saint Mary, are now full, the Reverend Henry Adamson Thompson being the present Incumbent of the former Benefice and the Reverend John Arthur Legh being the present Incumbent of the latter Benefice:

“ And whereas the patronage of the said two Benefices of Ambleside, Saint Mary, and Rydal, Saint Mary, now belongs to one and the same Patron:

“ Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said Henry Herbert, Bishop of Carlisle (testified by his signing this Scheme) do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

“ 1. That the said Benefice of Ambleside, Saint Mary, and the said Benefice of Rydal, Saint Mary, shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with Cure of Souls under the style of ‘ The United Benefice of Ambleside with Rydal ’, but the Parishes of

the said Benefices shall continue in all respects distinct.

That if upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette both of the said two Benefices shall be vacant, the union of the same two Benefices shall take effect forthwith: and if the said Benefice of Rydal, Saint Mary, only shall be then vacant the said union shall also take effect forthwith if the Incumbent of the other of the said two Benefices shall, with the approval of the Bishop, consent to become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice, but if he shall not so consent, or if the Bishop shall not approve, that the said union shall take effect upon the then next avoidance of the said Benefice of Ambleside, Saint Mary, and the then Incumbent of Rydal, Saint Mary, shall be the first Incumbent of the United Benefice, and if the said Benefice of Ambleside, Saint Mary, only shall be then vacant the said union shall take effect upon the next avoidance of the said Benefice of Rydal, Saint Mary, and if neither of the said two Benefices be then vacant, then the said union shall take effect on the next avoidance of the said Benefice of Rydal, Saint Mary, if the Incumbent at that time of the said Benefice of Ambleside, Saint Mary, shall have been instituted to Ambleside, Saint Mary, subsequently to the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme or if instituted before that date shall with the approval of the Bishop consent to become the Incumbent of the United Benefice, but if he shall have been instituted to the said Benefice of Ambleside, Saint Mary, before that date and shall not so consent or if the Bishop shall not approve then the said union shall take effect immediately upon the next vacancy of the said Benefice of Ambleside, Saint Mary, following such avoidance of the said Benefice of Rydal, Saint Mary, and the then Incumbent of the said Benefice of Rydal, Saint Mary, shall become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice.

“ 3. That upon the said union taking effect the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Ambleside, Saint Mary, shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice.

“ 4. That upon the union taking effect provision shall be made by the Incumbent of the United Benefice for obtaining the services of a Curate and a portion of the endowments of the United Benefice, namely, (a) the sum of £653 7s. 11d. Parliamentary Grant £3 per cent. money, the sum of £220 18s. 4d. Bounty Lands etc. sold £3 per cent. money, and the sum of £800 Royal Bounty £3 per cent. money now held in trust for the said Benefice of Ambleside, Saint Mary, by Queen Anne's Bounty and (b) the sum of £1,200 Royal Bounty £4 per cent. money, the sum of £2,266 19s. 8d. Royal Bounty £3 per cent. money and the sum of £925 11s. 1d. Parliamentary Grants £3 per cent. money (being part of a larger sum of such money) now held in trust for the said Benefice of Rydal, Saint Mary, by Queen Anne's Bounty, shall be appropriated by Queen Anne's Bounty as a fund to meet the expenses of providing for the

services of a Curate and the income arising in respect of such fund shall be paid by Queen Anne's Bounty to the Diocesan Board of Finance of the Diocese as trustees to apply the same for the purpose of paying the stipend of a Curate as aforesaid.

That with the consents (testified by their signing this Scheme) of the Reverend Denys Penkivil King and of Michael George Hughes le Fleming of Rydal Hall, Ambleside, in the said County of Westmorland, Esquire, being respectively the present Incumbent and the present Patron of the Benefice of Grasmere in the said Diocese of Carlisle, upon the said union taking effect there shall be severed from the Parish of the said Benefice of Rydal, Saint Mary, and annexed for all ecclesiastical purposes to the Parish of the said Benefice of Grasmere all those portions of the Parish of the said Benefice of Rydal, Saint Mary, which lie to the west of the line shown in blue on the map or plan annexed to this Scheme and are thereon coloured blue.

" Provided always that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from making any other recommendations and proposals relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Measures, or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England, or of any Act of Parliament."

" We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 33rd and 34th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 39, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say, the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 113, the Act of the 4th and 5th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 39, and the Act of the 31st and 32nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 114, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for effecting a transfer of the ownership of a part or share of the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the Churches and Cure (hereinafter called 'the said United Benefice') of Chickerell with Fleet in the County of Dorset and in the Diocese of Salisbury:

" Whereas under the terms of an Order of His late Majesty King George the Fifth in Council dated the 7th day of February, 1927, and published in the London Gazette on the 8th day of the same month for effecting the union of the Benefice of West Chickerell and the Benefice of Fleet a part or share of and in the Advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said United Benefice of Chickerell with Fleet (that is to say the first and second turns in every series of three successive turns of presentation or nomination to be made to the said United Benefice after the union) was assigned to the Patron of the said Benefice of West Chickerell:

" And whereas the union of the said Benefices of West Chickerell and Fleet took effect on the 5th day of November, 1934:

" And whereas the said part or share of the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said United Benefice of Chickerell with Fleet is now vested for an estate in fee simple without incumbrances in the Public Trustee as the surviving trustee of a certain Indenture of Settlement dated the 2nd day of August, 1877:

" And whereas the said Public Trustee is desirous that the said part or share of the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said United Benefice of Chickerell with Fleet now vested in him as aforesaid, should be transferred to and be vested in the Bishop of Salisbury for the time being:

" And whereas the Right Reverend Ernest Neville, now Bishop of Salisbury, is willing to accept such transfer, and in token of such his willingness and also in token that the same

transfer has that consent of the Bishop of the Diocese which by the hereinbefore mentioned Acts or by some or one of them is made necessary, he, the said Ernest Neville, Bishop of Salisbury, has executed this Scheme as herein-after mentioned:

"And whereas the transfer of Patronage which is hereinbefore mentioned and hereinafter recommended and proposed will in our opinion tend to make better provision for the Cure of Souls in the Parishes or Districts in or in respect of which the right of Patronage or Advowson so recommended and proposed to be transferred as aforesaid arises or exists, that is to say, in the Parishes of West Chickerell and Fleet:

Now, therefore, with the consent of the said Public Trustee (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme) and with the consent of the said Ernest Neville Bishop of Salisbury (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme and sealed the same with his Episcopal Seal), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the said part or share of the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said United Benefice of Chickerell with Fleet now vested in him, the said Public Trustee as aforesaid, shall be transferred to the said Ernest Neville, Bishop of Salisbury, and his successors in the same Bishopric, and shall thereupon and thenceforth become and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the said Ernest Neville, Bishop of Salisbury, and by his successors in the same Bishopric for ever.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any further or other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or of any of them or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Salisbury.

and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 104, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme bearing date the 30th day of May, 1940, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 37, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 104, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for constituting a separate District or New Parish for spiritual purposes to be taken partly out of the New Parish (sometime Consolidated Chapelry) of Saint Christopher, Brislington, and partly out of the Parish of Brislington both in the County of Somerset and in the Diocese of Bristol:

"Whereas we are satisfied that the said New Parish of Saint Christopher, Brislington, and the said Parish of Brislington, are Cures wherein or in parts whereof the provision for public worship and for pastoral superintendence is insufficient for the spiritual wants of the inhabitants thereof and it has been made to appear to us that it would promote the interests of religion that the particular portions of the said New Parish of Saint Christopher, Brislington, and of the said Parish of Brislington, which are hereinafter mentioned and described, should be constituted a separate District or New Parish in the manner which is hereinafter set forth:

"And whereas there is within the limits of the said proposed separate District or New Parish a consecrated Church in use for the purposes of Divine worship and such Church is named Christ Church, Hengrove:

"And whereas by an Order of Your Majesty in Council bearing date the 24th day of February, 1938, and published in the London Gazette on the 1st day of the following month the Benefice of Clifton, Dowry Square, Saint Andrew the Less, the Benefice of Clifton, Holy Trinity, and the Benefice of Clifton Wood, Saint Peter, all in the County of Gloucester and in the said Diocese of Bristol, were united into one Benefice and it was by the same Order provided amongst other things that part of the endowments held by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for the said Benefice of Clifton, Holy Trinity, namely, a capital sum of £4,620 (in respect of which a payment at the rate of £160 per annum is made) together with an annual sum of £60, should be appropriated for the endowment of a new Ecclesiastical District to be formed partly or wholly out of the said New Parish of Saint Christopher, Brislington, and that the patronage of such new Ecclesiastical District should be exercised by the Patrons of the said Benefice of Clifton Wood, Saint Peter, and by the Bishop of Bristol alternately:

"And whereas the District or New Parish hereinafter proposed to be constituted has been selected as the District referred to in the above mentioned Order in Council:

"And whereas the aforesaid endowment amounting to £220 per annum will be payable by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, to the Minister or Incumbent of the said proposed separate District or New Parish so soon as a Minister or Incumbent shall have been

duly licensed in accordance with the provisions of the firstly herein mentioned Act and to his successors:

" And whereas at the date of the said Order in Council the patronage of the said Benefice of Clifton Wood, Saint Peter, was vested in certain trustees known as Simeon's Trustees:

" Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Clifford Salisbury, Bishop of Bristol (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that all those portions of the said New Parish of Saint Christopher, Brislington, and of the said Parish of Brislington, which are described in the Schedule hereunder written, all which portions, together with the boundaries thereof, are delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed shall upon and from the day upon which any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme be published in the London Gazette and shall become and be constituted a separate District or New Parish for spiritual purposes and that the same shall be named ' The New Parish of Christ Church, Hengrove.'

" And we further recommend and propose that the said Church known as Christ Church, Hengrove, shall as from the day last mentioned be, and for that purpose we hereby specify the same Church as, the Parish Church for the said New Parish of Christ Church, Hengrove.

" And we further recommend and propose that the patronage of the said proposed New Parish and the nomination of the Minister or Incumbent thereof shall as provided by the said Order in Council of the 24th day of February, 1938, be exercised alternately by Simeon's Trustees aforementioned, namely, the Reverend Francis Edward Murphy of Bladud, Entry Hill, Bath, in the said County of Somerset, Clerk in Holy Orders and a Prebendary of the Cathedral Church of Wells, the Reverend Charles Edward Wilson of The Vicarage, Gipsy Hill in the County of Surrey, Clerk in Holy Orders and an Honorary Canon of the Cathedral Church of Southwark, the Very Reverend William Edward Reginald Morrow, Clerk in Holy Orders and Provost of the Cathedral Church of Chelmsford, the Very Reverend Edward Worsfold Mowll, Clerk in Holy Orders and Provost of the Cathedral Church of Bradford, and the Venerable William Marshall Selwyn of Park Lane, Bath, aforesaid, Clerk in Holy Orders and Archdeacon of Bath, and their successors, and by the said Clifford Salisbury, Bishop of Bristol, and his successors, and that the first turn of presentation shall be exercised by the said Bishop.

" And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or of any of them or of any other Act of Parliament.

" THE SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme has reference.

" The New Parish of Christ Church, Hengrove, comprising:—

" I. All that portion of the New Parish (sometime Consolidated Chapelry) of Saint

Christopher, Brislington, in the County of Somerset and in the Diocese of Bristol which is bounded upon the east by the Parish of Brislington, in the said County and Diocese, upon the south and upon the south-west by the Parish of Whitchurch in the said County of Somerset and in the Diocese of Bath and Wells, upon the north-west by the New Parish of Saint Barnabas, Knowle, upon a part of the north by the New Parish of Saint Martin, Knowle, both in the said County of Somerset and in the said Diocese of Bristol and upon the remaining side, that is to say, upon the remaining part of the north by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Martin, Knowle, from the said New Parish of Saint Christopher, Brislington, at a point in the middle of Wells Road and extending thence southward along the middle of Wells Road for a distance of 9½ chains or thereabouts to its junction with Hengrove Lane and West Town Lane and extending thence eastward along the middle of West Town Lane for a distance of 19 chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Christopher, Brislington, from the said Parish of Brislington.

" II. ROYAL AIR FORCE.

The KING has been graciously pleased to approve the undermentioned awards in recognition of gallantry displayed in flying operations against the enemy:—

Appointed a Companion of the Distinguished Service Order.

Squadron Leader Philip Algernon HUNTER (32031).

In May, 1940, under the leadership of Squadron Leader Hunter, his squadron shot down thirty-eight enemy aircraft during the course of two patrols. He personally destroyed three of that number. His brilliant leadership as well as his example and courage are of the highest standard.

Awarded the Distinguished Flying Cross.

Flight Lieutenant Henry Bernard COLLINS (22215).

In May, 1940, this officer undertook a mission involving an exceedingly hazardous flight. Flying a very large and a comparatively slow aircraft, which was unarmed and unprotected, he delivered much needed anti-tank ammunition to the army in France. Showing great coolness, determination and tenacity he succeeded in his mission although faced with hostile action on both the outward and return flights.

Flight Lieutenant Nicholas Gresham COOKE (37652).

In May, 1940, this officer, acting as a flight leader, was responsible for shooting down eight enemy aircraft during the course of two patrols.

Flight Lieutenant Charles Edward Ramsay TAIT (37262).

In May, 1940, Flight Lieutenant Tait successfully delivered an attack on an enemy mechanised column, in the face of intense anti-aircraft and machine gun fire. This officer has completed many missions by day and night, displaying the highest courage, leadership and determination.

Acting Flight Lieutenant William Hugh BIDDELL (37376).

In May, 1940, whilst leading a flight of three aircraft on a patrol over the ships engaged in evacuating the British Expeditionary Force, this officer sighted a squadron of Skuas being attacked by eleven Messerschmitt 109's. The Skuas were hard pressed and two were shot down. Without hesitation and despite the fact that the Hudson is not a fighter aircraft, Flight Lieutenant Biddell led his flight against the enemy, damaging one Messerschmitt and causing the remainder to break off the engagement. Since the invasion of the Low Countries, and particularly since the commencement of the evacuation of the British Expeditionary Force, this officer has displayed qualities of leadership and endurance of a high order.

Flying Officer Leslie Redford CLISBY (40043) (now reported missing).

One day in April, 1940, this officer was the pilot of one of three Hurricanes which attacked nine Messerschmitt 109's, one of which he shot down. The following day he destroyed another Messerschmitt 109. In May, 1940, this officer was engaged in six combats against the enemy in which he shot down eight enemy aircraft. Flying Officer Clisby has displayed great courage on all occasions.

Flying Officer Thomas Bernard FITZGERALD (40783).

In May, 1940, Flying Officer Fitzgerald carried out a successful and daring low flying attack against the enemy at Sedan. During a second raid a few days later, he was wounded but succeeded in effecting a forced landing and saving the lives of his crew.

Flying Officer Hilton Aubrey HAARHOFF (43156).

In June, 1940, this officer was the rear gunner in one of a flight of three aircraft engaged in protecting shipping evacuating the British Expeditionary Force. The flight encountered a formation of some forty Junkers 87's, which were immediately attacked. Taking full advantage of the opportunities afforded by his pilot, Flying Officer Haarhoff destroyed one enemy aircraft and severely damaged another two.

Flying Officer David Leslie Russell HALLIDAY (39206).

In May, 1940, Flying Officer Halliday as pilot of an aircraft successfully carried out a bombing attack in the face of intense anti-aircraft fire. Whilst returning to his base, his aircraft was attacked by nine Messerschmitt 109's. In spite of the enemy's superior number Flying Officer Halliday displayed great skill in taking evasive action and it was entirely due to his determination, skill and courage that he managed to bring his aircraft safely back to his base. This officer has consistently shown magnificent courage and devotion to duty.

Flying Officer Ian Bedford Nesbitt RUSSELL (37869).

By shooting down two enemy aircraft one day in May, 1940, this officer has a total of ten enemy aircraft to his credit and possibly

a further six have also been destroyed by him. After this combat he was instrumental in saving the life of another British pilot by guiding a trawler to an aircraft which had alighted on the sea.

Flying Officer Ronald Nicholas SELLEY (39689).

In June, 1940, this officer was captain of one of a flight of three aircraft engaged in protecting shipping evacuating the British Expeditionary Force. A formation of some forty Junkers 87's was encountered, and were immediately attacked. Flight Lieutenant Selley shot down two of the enemy aircraft with his front guns. By skilful manoeuvring he also enabled his rear gunner to shoot down a third and damage a further two enemy aircraft.

Pilot Officer Alan Christopher DEERE (40370).

During May, 1940, this officer has, in company with his squadron, taken part in numerous offensive patrols over Northern France, and has been engaged in seven combats often against superior numbers of the enemy. In the course of these engagements he has personally shot down five enemy aircraft and assisted in the destruction of others. On one occasion, in company with a second aircraft, he escorted a trainer aircraft to Calais Marck aerodrome, for the purpose of rescuing a squadron commander who had been shot down there. The trainer aircraft was attacked by twelve Messerschmitt 109's whilst taking off at Calais, but Pilot Officer Deere, with the other pilot, immediately attacked, with the result that three enemy aircraft were shot down, and a further three severely damaged. Throughout these engagements this officer has displayed courage and determination in his attacks on the enemy.

Pilot Officer Richard John JOUAULT (40920).

In June, 1940, this officer was captain of one of a flight of three aircraft protecting shipping engaged on the evacuation of the British Expeditionary Force from Dunkerque. On encountering a force of some forty Junkers 87's the flight broke up and attacked. Pilot Officer Jouault, handling his aircraft with the utmost skill and determination, shot down two of the enemy with his front guns.

Pilot Officer Desmond Hayward Sidley KAY (42006).

This officer has shown bravery and skill in the face of extreme difficulties and dangers. On one occasion, after an engagement, he force landed at Zoute with holes in one petrol tank, then re-fuelled and returned to his base. Later in May, 1940, his aircraft was so badly damaged in an engagement that his air gunner landed by parachute but Pilot Officer Kay succeeded in bringing his aircraft home. He has shared, with other pilots of his squadron, in the destruction of four enemy aircraft and on one occasion attacked twelve Junkers 87's single-handed and probably shot down two.

Pilot Officer William Lidstone MCKNIGHT (41937).

One day in May, 1940, this officer destroyed a Messerschmitt 109 and on the following day, whilst on patrol with his squadron, he shot down three more enemy

aircraft. The destruction of the last one of the three aircraft occasioned a long chase over enemy territory. On his return flight he used his remaining ammunition, and caused many casualties, in a low flying attack on a railway along which the enemy was bringing up heavy guns. Pilot Officer McKnight has shown exceptional skill and courage as a fighter pilot.

Pilot Officer Phillip Walford PETERS (42259).

In June, 1940, near Dunkerque, this officer was pilot of an aircraft which, in company with two others, was attacked by nine Messerschmitt 109's. Pilot Officer Peters immediately turned to the attack and so skilfully manoeuvred his aircraft, that he and both the air gunner and navigator were enabled to concentrate their fire on the enemy. Two Messerschmitts were seen to crash, and two more appeared to be seriously damaged. After the engagement this officer continued to carry out the patrol alone, having lost touch with the other two aircraft which had returned to the base.

Awarded the Distinguished Flying Medal.

563441 Sergeant Samuel Leslie BUTTERFIELD.

One day in May, 1940, this airman was on patrol in company with his squadron, when some fifty or more enemy aircraft were sighted. During the engagement which ensued, he shot down two Messerschmitt 109's in quick succession. He then successfully attacked a Junkers 88, which fell into the sea. He was immediately attacked himself, by a Messerschmitt 110, and his aircraft was hit by a cannon shell, but by skilful manoeuvring and accurate shooting, he destroyed the enemy fighter. With his ammunition now expended, he set course for home but was again attacked and hit by three more cannon shells, which set his aircraft on fire. Sergeant Butterfield escaped by parachute and was picked up by a passing vessel. Throughout the engagement, though greatly outnumbered, this airman displayed great courage, outstanding initiative and determination.

561615 Sergeant Charles David PERRY.

In May, 1940, during a low flying attack against the enemy, Sergeant Perry was seriously wounded in the thigh and stomach by two bullets. He showed great courage and stamina in piloting his aircraft to the vicinity of his base and then, finding himself about to faint, he made a forced landing.

740155 Sergeant Deryk Cobham SPENCER.

812071 Acting Corporal Lewis George SMITH.

In June, 1940, these airmen were respectively navigator and air gunner of an aircraft which, in company with two others, were attacked by nine Messerschmitt 109's. Although the pilot was taking violent avoiding action, these airmen, showing skill and coolness, each destroyed a Messerschmitt 109 and severely damaged another.

562610 Sergeant Edward Rowland THORN.

747751 Leading Aircraftman Frederick James BARKER.

Sergeant Thorn and Leading Aircraftman Barker, as pilot and air gunner respectively, have shown considerable determination and

skill when engaging the enemy in a Defiant aircraft. On one occasion, when three similar aircraft in their squadron had been shot down, these airmen engaged three Messerschmitt 109's which were operating on the rear of the squadron, and succeeded in shooting them down. The remaining enemy aircraft were forced to break off the engagement. Sergeant Thorn and Leading Aircraftman Barker have so far destroyed six enemy aircraft.

348030 Acting Corporal Albert LIPPETT.

This airman was air gunner in the aircraft piloted by Flight Lieutenant N. G. Cooke on the occasion when he destroyed eight enemy aircraft in the course of two patrols during one day. By his coolness and good shooting he shares the credit of this achievement.

552214 Leading Aircraftman Walter Denis CAULFIELD.

In May, 1940, this airman was the air gunner in the aircraft of his flight commander which, in a formation of three, was attacked by eleven Messerschmitt 109's. Leading Aircraftman Caulfield maintained a steady and accurate fire, and severely damaged at least one enemy aircraft. He has gained the complete confidence of his pilot. During the past few weeks he has taken part in night bombing operations, reconnaissance and offensive patrols, and has displayed qualities of alertness and steadiness, with complete disregard for his own safety.

812142 Leading Aircraftman Frederick Stephen CUNNINGHAM.

In May, 1940, whilst wireless operator in one of three aircraft engaged in a patrol off Dunkerque, an attack was made by nine Messerschmitt 109's and this airman was shot in the foot. In spite of the great pain, he continued to carry out his duties by passing messages reporting a sinking destroyer. He refused morphia, so that he might retain the full use of his faculties until his services were no longer required.

523495 Leading Aircraftman Leslie Stewart DILLNUTT.

In May, 1940, this airman was the air gunner in one of a flight of three aircraft, which were attacked by nine Messerschmitt 109's, near Zeebrugge. Although the pilot was taken violent evasive action, Leading Aircraftman Dillnutt retained his coolness and used his gun with such skill that he shot down one Messerschmitt 109 and possibly damaged two others.

523270 Leading Aircraftman Kenneth Stirling FREEMAN.

In May, 1940, this airman was the wireless operator in one of a flight of three aircraft. When engaged in combat with eleven Messerschmitt 109's he immediately left his wireless set and manned one of the side Lewis guns. A cannon shell struck the aircraft, and Leading Aircraftman Freeman was wounded in the leg in two places. Despite this he carried on firing his gun, and the accurate fire of the whole flight forced the enemy to withdraw. This airman has shown steadiness and complete disregard for danger.

523466 Leading Aircraftman Frederick Harry KING.

This airman has acted as air gunner to Squadron Leader P. A. Hunter. He has been largely responsible for the training of air gunners in the squadron and by his excellent example and fine shooting has largely contributed to the successes achieved. He has taken part in all sorties of the squadron and has been responsible for the destruction of nine enemy aircraft.

626540 Aircraftman, 1st Class, Jack GUEST.

In May, 1940, Aircraftman Guest was air gunner of an aircraft which carried out bombing operations against enemy columns east of Dixmude. After completing this operation the aircraft was attacked from astern by a Messerschmitt 109. This airman, by his coolness and accurate instructions, enabled his pilot to take evasive action until an accurate burst of fire from Aircraftman Guest's gun resulted in the enemy being shot down. This airman carried out his first operational flight earlier in May, 1940, and on that occasion he also shot down a Messerschmitt 109. Since that date he has carried out several operational flights during which he has displayed exceptional skill and courage.

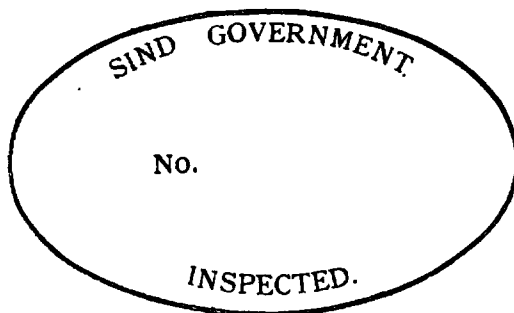
