

duly licensed in accordance with the provisions of the firstly herein mentioned Act and to his successors:

" And whereas at the date of the said Order in Council the patronage of the said Benefice of Clifton Wood, Saint Peter, was vested in certain trustees known as Simeon's Trustees:

" Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Clifford Salisbury, Bishop of Bristol (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that all those portions of the said New Parish of Saint Christopher, Brislington, and of the said Parish of Brislington, which are described in the Schedule hereunder written, all which portions, together with the boundaries thereof, are delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed shall upon and from the day upon which any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme be published in the London Gazette and shall become and be constituted a separate District or New Parish for spiritual purposes and that the same shall be named ' The New Parish of Christ Church, Hengrove.'

" And we further recommend and propose that the said Church known as Christ Church, Hengrove, shall as from the day last mentioned be, and for that purpose we hereby specify the same Church as, the Parish Church for the said New Parish of Christ Church, Hengrove.

" And we further recommend and propose that the patronage of the said proposed New Parish and the nomination of the Minister or Incumbent thereof shall as provided by the said Order in Council of the 24th day of February, 1938, be exercised alternately by Simeon's Trustees aforementioned, namely, the Reverend Francis Edward Murphy of Bladud, Entry Hill, Bath, in the said County of Somerset, Clerk in Holy Orders and a Prebendary of the Cathedral Church of Wells, the Reverend Charles Edward Wilson of The Vicarage, Gipsy Hill in the County of Surrey, Clerk in Holy Orders and an Honorary Canon of the Cathedral Church of Southwark, the Very Reverend William Edward Reginald Morrow, Clerk in Holy Orders and Provost of the Cathedral Church of Chelmsford, the Very Reverend Edward Worsfold Mowll, Clerk in Holy Orders and Provost of the Cathedral Church of Bradford, and the Venerable William Marshall Selwyn of Park Lane, Bath, aforesaid, Clerk in Holy Orders and Archdeacon of Bath, and their successors, and by the said Clifford Salisbury, Bishop of Bristol, and his successors, and that the first turn of presentation shall be exercised by the said Bishop.

" And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or of any of them or of any other Act of Parliament.

" THE SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme has reference.

" The New Parish of Christ Church, Hengrove, comprising:—

" I. All that portion of the New Parish (sometime Consolidated Chapelry) of Saint

Christopher, Brislington, in the County of Somerset and in the Diocese of Bristol which is bounded upon the east by the Parish of Brislington, in the said County and Diocese, upon the south and upon the south-west by the Parish of Whitchurch in the said County of Somerset and in the Diocese of Bath and Wells, upon the north-west by the New Parish of Saint Barnabas, Knowle, upon a part of the north by the New Parish of Saint Martin, Knowle, both in the said County of Somerset and in the said Diocese of Bristol and upon the remaining side, that is to say, upon the remaining part of the north by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Martin, Knowle, from the said New Parish of Saint Christopher, Brislington, at a point in the middle of Wells Road and extending thence southward along the middle of Wells Road for a distance of 9½ chains or thereabouts to its junction with Hengrove Lane and West Town Lane and extending thence eastward along the middle of West Town Lane for a distance of 19 chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Christopher, Brislington, from the said Parish of Brislington.

" II. And also all that contiguous portion of the said Parish of Brislington which is bounded upon a part of the east and upon the south by the said Parish of Whitchurch, upon the west by the said New Parish of Saint Christopher, Brislington, and upon the remaining sides that is to say upon the north-west and upon the remaining part of the east by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Christopher, Brislington, from the said Parish of Brislington in the centre of the bridge which carries West Town Lane across the Bristol and North Somerset Line of the Great Western Railway and extending thence first eastward and then north-eastward along the middle of West Town Lane for a distance of 17 chains or thereabouts to the centre of the bridge or culvert which carries the said Lane across the stream flowing in a northerly direction past West Town and extending thence generally southward along the middle of the said stream for a distance of 52½ chains or thereabouts to a point opposite the western end of the wall or fence dividing the close numbered 1 upon the map or plan annexed to this Scheme from the close numbered 2 upon the same map and extending thence eastward along the said wall or fence for a distance of 15 yards or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said Parish of Brislington from the said Parish of Whitchurch."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have, in accordance with the provisions of the firstly hereinbefore mentioned Act, been transmitted to the Patron and to the Incumbents of the Cures out of which it is intended that the District or New Parish recommended in such Scheme to be constituted shall be taken, and such Patron and Incumbents have respectively signified their assent to such Scheme:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:
