WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of His late Majesty King William the Fourth, Chapter 77, and of the Act of the 5th and 6th years of Her late Majesty, Queen Victoria, Chapter 26, duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a Scheme bearing date the 30th day of May, 1940, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

“ We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of His late Majesty King William the Fourth, Chapter 77, and of the Act of the 5th and 6th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 26, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for authorising certain improvements at the Episcopal Residence belonging to the See of Rochester which is known as *Bishopscourt*, Rochester:

“ Whereas the Right Reverend Christopher, now Bishop of Rochester, is desirous that certain improvements should be made at the said Episcopal Residence and has submitted to us the particulars of such improvements and we have specified our general approval of the same:

“ And whereas the said Bishop is also desirous and it appears to us to be expedient that towards the cost of effecting the aforesaid improvements a sum of £800 (being a sum which together with the outstanding balance of the sum already borrowed under the authority

of the statutes hereinbefore mentioned for effecting improvements at the said Episcopal Residence does not exceed two years income of the See) should be provided by way of advance from us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, to be repaid out of the emoluments of the Bishopric of Rochester:

“ Now, therefore, with the consent of the said Christopher, Bishop of Rochester (testified by his having affixed his signature and Episcopal Seal to this Scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that the said Bishop be authorised to borrow and that we be authorised to advance and pay to him a sum of £800, and that the whole or any part or parts of the said sum of £800 so to be advanced shall be applied by us at such time or times and in such manner as shall appear to us to be expedient towards effecting the said proposed improvements at the Episcopal Residence aforesaid, and that such sum of £800 shall be repaid with interest thereon as hereinafter mentioned, in the manner following, that is to say, during the period of fifteen years from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme, the said Bishop or his successors shall at the end of each year pay to us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners one fifteenth part of the said principal sum of £800 and shall also at the end of each year pay interest at the rate of 4 per centum per annum on the said principal sum or on so much thereof as shall from time to time remain unpaid, or alternatively it shall be permissible for us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, to provide for the repayment of the said sum of £800 and interest thereon or on outstanding balances as aforesaid by way of a yearly deduction during the said period of

fifteen years from the annual sum payable by us to the said Bishop of Rochester and his successors:

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in conformity with the provisions of the herein named Acts or of either of them or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Rochester.

"And whereas the Benefices of the said Cures are now full, the Reverend James Thompson being the present Incumbent of the Benefice of Saint Andrew the Less, Cambridge, the Reverend John Oldcastle Cobham being the present Incumbent of the Benefice of Saint Benedict, Cambridge, and the Reverend Max Alexander Cunningham Warren being the present Incumbent of the Benefice of the Holy Trinity, Cambridge and such Incumbents have signified their consents to the proposals hereinafter mentioned by signing this Scheme:

"And whereas the Diocesan Committee of the said Diocese of Ely appointed pursuant to the first section of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, have by a Resolution passed at a meeting of the said Committee held on the 23rd day of December, 1939, signified their

consent to the alterations of boundaries herein proposed:

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from making any other recommendations and proposals relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Measures, or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England, or of any Act of Parliament."

“ And whereas the Benefices of five of the said Cures are now full, the Reverend John Oldcastle Cobham being the present Incumbent of the Benefice of Saint Benedict, Cambridge, the Reverend Paul Meyer Osborn being the present Incumbent of the Benefice of Saint Giles with Saint Peter, Cambridge, the Reverend Geoffrey Philip Henry Pawson being the present Incumbent of the Benefice of Saint Mary the Less, Cambridge, the Reverend Francis Headley Robbs being the present Incumbent of the Benefice of Saint Mark, Cambridge, and the Reverend Gerald William Joseph Gregson being the present Incumbent of the Benefice of Saint Paul, Cambridge, and such Incumbents have signified their consents to the proposals hereinafter mentioned by signing this Scheme:

“ And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from making any other recommendations and proposals relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Measures, or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England, or of any Act of Parliament.

“ THE SCHEDULES to which the foregoing Scheme has reference.

“ *The First Schedule.*

“ The territory to be annexed to the Parish of Saint Benedict, Cambridge, in the County of Cambridge and in the Diocese of Ely, comprising:—

“ 1. All that portion of the Parish of Saint Botolph, Cambridge, in the said County and Diocese, which is bounded upon the north by the said Parish of Saint Benedict, Cambridge, upon the east by the Parish of Saint Edward, Cambridge, in the said County and Diocese, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the south and upon the west, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said Parish of Saint Edward, Cambridge, from the said Parish of Saint Botolph, Cambridge, at the junction of Free School Lane with Botolph Lane, and extending thence westward along the middle of Botolph Lane for a distance of  $2\frac{1}{2}$  chains or thereabouts to a point opposite to the southern end of the wall or fence forming the eastern boundary of Saint Botolph's Churchyard, and extending thence northward to and along the said wall or fence for a distance of  $1\frac{1}{2}$  chains or thereabouts to the point where it meets the wall or fence forming the northern boundary of the said Churchyard, and extending thence westward along the last mentioned wall or fence for a distance of  $2\frac{1}{2}$  chains or thereabouts to the point where it reaches the eastern side of Trumpington Street, and extending thence first westward to and then northward along the middle of Trumpington Street for a distance of  $3\frac{1}{2}$  chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said Parish of Saint Botolph, Cambridge, from the said Parish of Saint Benedict, Cambridge.

" 2. And also all that other portion of the said Parish of Saint Botolph, Cambridge, which is bounded upon all sides as follows, that is to say, upon part of the west by the Parish of Saint Mary the Less, Cambridge, in the said County and Diocese, upon the south by a detached portion of the said Parish of Saint Benedict, Cambridge, upon the east and upon part of the north by the Parish of Saint Andrew the Great, Cambridge, in the said County and Diocese, upon the remaining part of the north by another detached portion of the said Parish of Saint Benedict, Cambridge, and upon the remaining part of the west by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the last mentioned detached portion of the Parish of Saint Benedict, Cambridge, from the said Parish of Saint Botolph, Cambridge, at the junction of Downing Street and Tennis Court Road, and extending thence southward along the middle of Tennis Court Road for a distance of 3 chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said Parish of Saint Botolph, Cambridge, from the said Parish of Saint Mary the Less, Cambridge.

" 3. And also all that portion of the New Parish of Saint Paul, Cambridge, in the said County and Diocese which is bounded upon the west by the said Parish of Saint Mary the Less, Cambridge, upon the north by a detached portion of the said Parish of Saint Benedict, Cambridge, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the east and upon the south by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said detached portion of the Parish of Saint Benedict, Cambridge, from the said New Parish of Saint Paul, Cambridge, at a point in Lensfield Road opposite to the middle of Panton Street, and extending thence southward along the middle of Panton Street for a distance of 2 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Saxon Street, and extending thence westward along the middle of Saxon Street for a distance of 6 chains or thereabouts to its junction with the road called Brookside, and continuing thence westward in precisely the same direction and in a straight line for a distance of 1 chain or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Paul, Cambridge, from the said Parish of Saint Mary the Less, Cambridge.

" The territory to be annexed to the said Parish of Saint Botolph, Cambridge, comprising:—

" 1. All those contiguous portions of the New Parish of Saint Mark, Cambridge, and of the Parish of Saint Giles with Saint Peter, Cambridge, which taken together are bounded upon the east partly by the said Parish of Saint Botolph, Cambridge, and partly by the said Parish of Saint Mary the Less, Cambridge, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the south, upon the west, and upon the north by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said Parish of Saint Mary the Less, Cambridge, from the said New Parish of Saint Mark, Cambridge, at the junction of Church Rate Walk with the road called Summerfield, and extending thence westward along the middle of Summerfield for a distance of 10 chains or thereabouts to a point at its western

end where it reaches the wall or fence forming the eastern boundary of the premises attached to Newnham College, and extending thence first southward and then in various directions along the walls or fences forming the eastern and southern boundaries of the said premises for a distance of 22 chains or thereabouts to the point where the last mentioned wall or fence reaches the eastern side of Grange Road, and extending thence first westward to and then northward along the middle of Grange Road for a distance of  $7\frac{1}{2}$  chains or thereabouts to its junction with Sidgwick Avenue, and extending thence eastward along the middle of Sidgwick Avenue (thereby following the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Mark, Cambridge, from the said Parish of Saint Giles with Saint Peter, Cambridge), for a distance of  $10\frac{1}{2}$  chains or thereabouts to a point opposite to the southern end of the Corpus Christi College Sports Ground, and extending thence northward to and along the said wall or fence for a distance of 6 chains or thereabouts to the point where it meets the wall or fence forming the northern boundary of the said Sports Ground, and extending thence eastward along the last mentioned wall or fence, along the wall or fence forming the northern boundary of Corpus Christi College Garden, and along the wall or fence forming the northern boundary of the house and premises known as The Yews, for a distance in all of 15 chains or thereabouts to the point where the last mentioned wall or fence reaches the western side of Queen's Road, and extending thence in a straight line due east (thereby crossing Queen's Road) for a distance of 2 chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said Parish of Saint Giles with Saint Peter, Cambridge, from the said Parish of Saint Botolph, Cambridge.

" 1. All that detached portion of the said Parish of Saint Benedict, Cambridge, which lies to the south of the middle of Mill Lane and to the west of the middle of Trumpington Street.

" 2. And also all that portion of the said New Parish of Saint Paul, Cambridge, which is bounded upon the west by the said Parish of Saint Mary the Less, Cambridge, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the south, upon the east, and upon the north by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said Parish of Saint Mary the Less, Cambridge, from the said New Parish of Saint Paul, Cambridge, at a point in the middle of the eastern end of the bridge which carries Bateman Street across Hobson's Brook, and extending thence eastward along the middle of Bateman Street for a distance of 9

chains or thereabouts to its junction with Panton Street, and extending thence northward along the middle of Panton Street for a distance of 15 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Saxon Street, and extending thence westward along the middle of Saxon Street for a distance of 6 chains or thereabouts to its junction with the road called Brookside, and continuing thence westward in precisely the same direction and in a straight line for a distance of 1 chain or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Paul, Cambridge, from the said Parish of Saint Mary the Less, Cambridge."

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1936, and of the Act of the 33rd and 34th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 39, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say, the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 113, the Act of the 4th and 5th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 39, and the Act of the 31st and 32nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 114, duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a Scheme bearing date the 14th day of March, 1940, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1936, and of the Act of the 33rd and 34th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 39, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say,

the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 113, the Act of the 4th and 5th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 39, and the Act of the 31st and 32nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 114, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for effecting the union of the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Bungay, Saint Mary, and the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Bungay, Holy Trinity, both of which Benefices are situate in the County of Suffolk and in the Diocese of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich:

"Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend Walter Godfrey, Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich, pursuant to the provisions of the said Measures to inquire into and report upon the union of the said two Benefices of Bungay, Saint Mary, and Bungay, Holy Trinity, duly made their Report to the said Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich and therein recommended the union of the said two Benefices and the terms for effecting the union, and the said Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

"And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the union of the said two Benefices based upon the terms recommended in the said Report:

"And whereas both of the said Benefices are now full, the Reverend Walter Edward Harper being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Bungay, Saint Mary, and the Reverend Adolphus Ethelbert Gledhill being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Bungay, Holy Trinity:

"And whereas the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Bungay, Saint Mary, is now vested in the persons commonly known as the Church Patronage Trustees that is to say, John Francis William Deacon of Mabledon Park, Quarry Hill, Tonbridge, in the County of Kent, the Venerable Ernest Newton Sharpe, Archdeacon of London, of No. 9 Amen Court in the City of London, the Reverend Canon John Ralph Strickland Taylor, Principal of Wycliffe Hall, Oxford, the Reverend William Leonard Bertram Caley of Number 2 Elm Grove, Wimbledon, in the County of Surrey, and Mervyn Gurney Talbot-Rice, of Cunard House, Number 86, Leadenhall Street in the said City of London:

"And whereas the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Bungay, Holy Trinity, is now vested in the said Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich in right of his See:

"And whereas the said Church Patronage Trustees and the said Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich are willing that, upon the union of the said Benefices of Bungay, Saint Mary, and Bungay, Holy Trinity, taking effect as hereinafter recommended and proposed all their right claim or title to any interest in the patronage or presentation in respect of the United Benefice should be transferred to the Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich Diocesan Board of Patronage (hereinafter referred to as the Diocesan Board of Patronage) as hereinafter recommended and proposed:



" And whereas the said Diocesan Board of Patronage is willing to accept such transfer and in token of its willingness has executed this Scheme as hereinafter mentioned :

" And whereas the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Cosmo Gordon, Archbishop of Canterbury, is consenting to the transfer of Patronage hereinbefore mentioned and hereinafter recommended and proposed, and in token of such consent, which by the hereinbefore mentioned Acts or by some or one of them is in this case made necessary, he, the said Cosmo Gordon, Archbishop of Canterbury, has executed this Scheme as hereinafter mentioned :

" And whereas the transfer of Patronage which is hereinbefore mentioned and hereinafter recommended and proposed will, in our opinion, tend to make better provision for the cure of souls in the Parishes or Districts in or in respect of which the right of Patronage so recommended and proposed to be transferred as aforesaid arises or exists, that is to say, in the Parish of Bungay, Saint Mary, and the Parish of Bungay, Holy Trinity :

" And whereas the said Walter Godfrey, Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich, has executed this Scheme as hereinafter mentioned in token of the consent required by the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, and also in token that the said transfer of Patronage has that consent of the Bishop of the Diocese which by the hereinbefore mentioned Acts or by some or one of them is made necessary :

" Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say :—

" 1. That the said Benefice of Bungay, Saint Mary, and the said Benefice of Bungay, Holy Trinity, shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with Cure of Souls under the style of ' The United Benefice of Bungay, Holy Trinity and Saint Mary ' but the Parishes of the said Benefices shall continue in all respects distinct.

" 2. That if upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette both of the said two Benefices shall be vacant the union of the same two Benefices shall take effect forthwith: and if one only of the said two Benefices shall be then vacant the said union shall take effect upon the next avoidance of the other of the said two Benefices: and if neither of the said two Benefices be then vacant the said union shall take effect upon the next avoidance of that one of the said two Benefices which shall last be avoided after the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme.

" 3. That upon the said union taking effect the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Bungay, Saint Mary, shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice and so soon as conveniently may be the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Bungay, Holy Trinity, and the site and appurtenances thereof and the grounds heretofore usually occupied and enjoyed therewith shall be sold and disposed of by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners at such time or times and in such manner in all respects as to

us shall seem expedient and that the net proceeds of such sale shall be appropriated, as to so much as may be necessary, in or towards effecting such works of improvement to the said house of residence as in our opinion and that of the Bishop of the Diocese may appear desirable and any balance of such net proceeds shall be held and invested as a Curate Fund for the United Benefice and the income in respect thereof shall be paid by us to the Diocesan Board of Finance of the Diocese as trustees to apply the same towards the stipend of a Curate to assist the Incumbent of the United Benefice.

" 4. That, with the consent of the said Walter Godfrey, Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich (in testimony whereof also he has signed this Scheme and sealed the same with his Episcopal Seal), with the consent of the said Cosmo Gordon, Archbishop of Canterbury (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme and sealed the same with his Archiepiscopal Seal), with the consent of the said Church Patronage Trustees, that is to say, the said John Francis William Deacon, Ernest Newton Sharpe, John Ralph Strickland Taylor, William Leonard Bertram Caley and Mervyn Gurney Talbot-Rice (in testimony whereof they have signed and sealed this Scheme) and with the consent of the said Diocesan Board of Patronage (in testimony whereof the said Board has sealed this Scheme with its Common Seal), upon the said union taking effect and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme and duly published in the London Gazette as aforesaid all right claim or title of the said Church Patronage Trustees and of the said Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich to any share or interest in the patronage of the United Benefice shall be transferred to and be absolutely vested in the said Diocesan Board of Patronage to the intent that the patronage of the United Benefice shall and may from time to time be exercised solely by the said Diocesan Board of Patronage.

" Provided always that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from making any other recommendations and proposals relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Measures and of the said Acts or of any of them or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England, or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas public notice of the certification to His Majesty in Council of the said Scheme and the consent thereto in writing of the Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich has been duly given in the manner and within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules aforesaid:

And whereas no appeal has been proceeded with to His Majesty in Council within the period of one month after the date of the said public notice in accordance with the provisions of the said Measures against the said Scheme or any part thereof by any person who has made objection as aforesaid to the said draft Scheme:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty by and with the advice of His said Council is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that the Benefices therein recommended to be united shall be united to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme and further to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the date when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measures.
