

At the Court at *Buckingham Palace*, the 11th day of *June*, 1940.

PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

Whereas the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1936, duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a Scheme bearing date the 6th day of June, 1940, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1936, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for altering the boundaries of the Parish of Saint Benedict, Cambridge, of the Parish of Saint Botolph, Cambridge, of the Parish of Saint Giles with Saint Peter, Cambridge, of the Parish of Saint Mary the Less, Cambridge, of the New Parish of Saint Mark, Cambridge, and of the New Parish of Saint Paul, Cambridge, all in the Diocese of Ely:

"Whereas it has been represented to us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, and it appears to us to be desirable that the boundaries of the said Parishes and New Parishes should be altered in the manner which is hereinafter mentioned:

"And whereas the Benefices of five of the said Cures are now full, the Reverend John Oldcastle Cobham being the present Incumbent of the Benefice of Saint Benedict, Cambridge, the Reverend Paul Meyer Osborn being the present Incumbent of the Benefice of Saint Giles with Saint Peter, Cambridge, the Reverend Geoffrey Philip Henry Pawson being the present Incumbent of the Benefice of Saint Mary the Less, Cambridge, the Reverend Francis Headley Robbs being the present Incumbent of the Benefice of Saint Mark, Cambridge, and the Reverend Gerald William Joseph Gregson being the present Incumbent of the Benefice of Saint Paul, Cambridge, and such Incumbents have signified their consents to the proposals hereinafter mentioned by signing this Scheme:

"And whereas the Benefice of Saint Botolph, Cambridge, is at present vacant:

"And whereas the Diocesan Committee of the said Diocese of Ely appointed pursuant to the first section of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, have by a Resolution passed at a meeting of the said Committee held on the 23rd day of December, 1939, signified their consent to the alterations of boundaries herein proposed:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Bernard Oliver Francis, Bishop of Ely (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that from and after the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme and without any assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the boundaries of the said Cures shall be altered so that first all those portions of the said Parish of Saint Botolph, Cambridge, and of the New Parish of Saint Paul, Cambridge, which are described in the First Schedule hereunder

written and are delineated and set forth upon the map or plan hereunto annexed and are thereon coloured pink shall be annexed to, and shall in future form part of the said Parish of Saint Benedict, Cambridge, (secondly) all those portions of the said New Parish of Saint Mark, Cambridge, of the said Parish of Saint Giles with Saint Peter, Cambridge, of the said Parish of Saint Mary the Less, Cambridge, and of the said Parish of Saint Benedict, Cambridge, which are described in the Second Schedule hereunder written and are delineated and set forth upon the said map or plan and are thereon coloured green shall be annexed to and shall in future form part of the said Parish of Saint Botolph, Cambridge, and (lastly) all those portions of the said Parish of Saint Benedict, Cambridge, and of the said New Parish of Saint Paul, Cambridge, which are described in the Third Schedule hereunder written and are delineated and set forth upon the said map or plan and are thereon coloured blue shall be annexed to and shall in future form part of the said Parish of Saint Mary the Less, Cambridge.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from making any other recommendations and proposals relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Measures, or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England, or of any Act of Parliament.

"THE SCHEDULES to which the foregoing Scheme has reference.

"The First Schedule.

"The territory to be annexed to the Parish of Saint Benedict, Cambridge, in the County of Cambridge and in the Diocese of Ely, comprising:—

"1. All that portion of the Parish of Saint Botolph, Cambridge, in the said County and Diocese, which is bounded upon the north by the said Parish of Saint Benedict, Cambridge, upon the east by the Parish of Saint Edward, Cambridge, in the said County and Diocese, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the south and upon the west, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said Parish of Saint Edward, Cambridge, from the said Parish of Saint Botolph, Cambridge, at the junction of Free School Lane with Botolph Lane, and extending thence westward along the middle of Botolph Lane for a distance of $2\frac{1}{2}$ chains or thereabouts to a point opposite to the southern end of the wall or fence forming the eastern boundary of Saint Botolph's Churchyard, and extending thence northward to and along the said wall or fence for a distance of $1\frac{1}{2}$ chains or thereabouts to the point where it meets the wall or fence forming the northern boundary of the said Churchyard, and extending thence westward along the last mentioned wall or fence for a distance of $2\frac{1}{2}$ chains or thereabouts to the point where it reaches the eastern side of Trumpington Street, and extending thence first westward to and then northward along the middle of Trumpington Street for a distance of $3\frac{1}{2}$ chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said Parish of Saint Botolph, Cambridge, from the said Parish of Saint Benedict, Cambridge.
