WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 20th day of June, 1940 (N. 10237/40), in the words following, viz.:—

“Whereas by section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions or other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman or Marine therein shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

“And whereas by Order in Council of the 21st February, 1935, Your Majesty was graciously pleased to sanction the payment of Training Allowance to certain men of the Royal Navy and of the Royal Marines who have responsibility and charge of new entries out of instructional hours at the three naval depots:

“And whereas we are of opinion that the duties and responsibilities devolving upon the Instructors at any Training Establishment for ‘Hostility only’ ratings render them deserving of similar remuneration:

“We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased by Your Order in Council to sanction payment of Training Allowance to these Instructors at the rates, and subject to the conditions laid down for Instructors of new entries at the three naval depots.

“The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in these proposals.”

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

“And whereas we have found it expedient to employ certain specially trained naval ratings on cable work and we consider that the qualifications and duties required of these ratings justify the grant of non-substantive pay:

" We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased by Your Order in Council to sanction the establishment of a new non-substantive rate of Harbour Defence Layer, to be sub-divided into three classes with pay at rs., 8d. and 3d. a day respectively, with effect from the date on which the personnel concerned qualify at the approved course of instruction.

" The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in this proposal."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

" Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted inter alia that all pay, pensions or other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman or Marine therein shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

" And whereas by Orders in Council dated 29th July, 1937 and 30th April, 1940, special conditions of service and consolidated rates of pay were established for naval ratings entered for certain duties connected with controlled minefields and kindred work:

" And whereas by Order in Council dated 21st September, 1939, the non-substantive rate of Harbour Defence Operator in three grades, with pay at rs., 8d. and 4d. a day respectively, was instituted for trained ratings of Your Majesty's Naval Volunteer Reserve who are required to augment the personnel of such fixed anti-submarine defences in an emergency:

" And whereas we have found it expedient to train and employ on such duties ratings of Your Majesty's Naval Forces other than members of the Royal Naval Volunteer Reserve and those entered under the conditions of Orders in Council of 29th July, 1937 and 30th April, 1940, and we are of the opinion that they should be eligible for the award of the paid non-substantive rate of Harbour Defence Operator equally with qualified ratings of Your Majesty's Naval Volunteer Reserve:

" We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to sanction payment accordingly to those naval ratings and members of Your Majesty's Naval Reserve Forces generally, other than men who are in receipt

of consolidated rates of pay, who are qualified and have been or may be so employed.

" The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in this proposal."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

" We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 33rd and 34th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 39, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say, the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 113, the Act of the 4th and 5th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 39, and the Act of the 31st and 32nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 114, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for effecting a transfer of the ownership of the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the Church and Cure (hereinafter called 'the said Benefice') of *Lufton* in the County of *Somerset* and in the Diocese of *Bath and Wells*:

" Whereas the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of *Lufton* is vested for an estate in fee simple without incumbrances in *Bridget Evelyn Phelps Batten of Stone Bridge, Blackboys*, in the County of *Sussex*, Spinster:

" And whereas the said *Bridget Evelyn Phelps Batten* is desirous that the whole Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of *Lufton* now vested in her as aforesaid, should be transferred to and be vested in the Bishop of *Bath and Wells* for the time being:

" And whereas the Right Reverend Francis now Bishop of *Bath and Wells* is willing to accept such transfer, and in token of such his willingness and also in token that the same transfer has that consent of the Bishop of the Diocese which by the hereinbefore mentioned Acts or by some or one of them is made necessary he, the said Francis, Bishop of *Bath and Wells* has executed this Scheme as herein-after mentioned:

“ And whereas the transfer of the Patronage of the said Benefice of Lufton which is hereinbefore mentioned and hereinafter recommended and proposed will in our opinion tend to make better provision for the cure of souls in the Parish or District in or in respect of which the right of Patronage or Advowson so recommended and proposed to be transferred as aforesaid arises or exists, that is to say, in the Parish of Lufton:

“ Now, therefore, with the consent of the said Bridget Evelyn Phelps Batten (in testimony whereof she has signed and sealed this Scheme) and with the consent of the said Francis, Bishop of Bath and Wells (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme and sealed the same with his Episcopal Seal), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the whole Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Lufton now vested in her, the said Bridget Evelyn Phelps Batten as aforesaid, shall be transferred to the said Francis Bishop of Bath and Wells and his successors in the same Bishopric, and shall thereupon and thenceforth become and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the said Francis Bishop of Bath and Wells and by his successors in the same Bishopric for ever.

“ And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any further or other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or of any of them or of any other Act of Parliament.”

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

“ And whereas Mary Frances Lucas of Morestead Grange aforesaid, Widow, and the Public Trustee are the Executors of the said Will in whom but for the hereinbefore recited devise the said Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice would now be vested, and they are desirous with a view to the confirmation of the said devise that the said Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Ashtead should be transferred to and be vested in the Bishop of Guildford for the time being:

“ And whereas the Right Reverend John, now Bishop of Guildford, is willing to accept such transfer, and in token of such his willingness and also in token that the same transfer has that consent of the Bishop of the Diocese which by the hereinbefore mentioned Acts or by some or one of them is made necessary, he, the said John, Bishop of Guildford, has executed this Scheme as hereinafter mentioned:

“ And whereas the transfer of the Patronage of the said Benefice of Ashtead which is hereinbefore mentioned and hereinafter recommended and proposed will in our opinion tend to make better provision for the cure of souls in the Parish or District in or in respect of which the right of Patronage or Advowson so recommended and proposed to be transferred as aforesaid arises or exists, that is to say, in the Parish of Ashtead:

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1936, duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a Scheme bearing date the 14th day of March, 1940, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1936, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for effecting the union of the Benefice (being a Rectory) of Carlton Curlieu and the Benefice (being a Rectory) of Shangton both of which Benefices are situate in the County of Leicester and in the Diocese of Leicester:

"Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend Cyril, Bishop of Leicester, pursuant to the provisions of the said Measures to inquire into and report upon the union of the said two Benefices of Carlton Curlieu and Shangton duly made their Report to the said Bishop of Leicester and therein recommended the union of the said two Benefices and the terms for effecting the union, and the said Bishop of Leicester signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

"And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this

Scheme for the union of the said two Benefices based upon the terms recommended in the said Report:

"And whereas the said Benefice of Carlton Curlieu is now full the Reverend Horace Bertram Freeman being the present Incumbent thereof and the said Benefice of Shangton is at present vacant:

"Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said Cyril, Bishop of Leicester, and of the said Horace Bertram Freeman (testified by their signing this Scheme) do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

"1. That the said Benefice of Carlton Curlieu and the said Benefice of Shangton shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with cure of souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Carlton Curlieu with Shangton' but the Parishes of the said Benefices shall continue distinct in all respects.

"2. That upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette the union shall forthwith take effect and the said Horace Bertram Freeman if he is then Incumbent of the said Benefice of Carlton Curlieu shall be the first Incumbent of the United Benefice.

"3. That upon the said union taking effect the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Carlton Curlieu shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice and so soon as conveniently may be the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Shangton and the site and appurtenances thereof and the grounds heretofore usually occupied and enjoyed therewith shall be sold and disposed of by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners at such time or times and in such manner in all respects as to us shall seem expedient and that such part of the net proceeds of such sale as to us and to the Bishop of the Diocese shall appear expedient shall be applied towards the restoration of the Parish Church of Shangton and the balance of such net proceeds shall be held and invested by us for the benefit of the United Benefice.

"4. That after the said union has taken effect the course and succession in which the respective Patrons shall present or nominate to the United Benefice from time to time as the same shall become vacant shall be as follows, that is to say, the right of presentation shall be exercised by the Patrons of the said two Benefices alternately, the Patron of the said Benefice of Shangton having the right upon the first presentation to the United Benefice to be made after the union and every alternate right of presentation and the Patron of the said Benefice of Carlton Curlieu having the right of presentation upon the second presentation to the United Benefice to be made after the union and every alternate turn thereafter.

"Provided always that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from making any other recommendations and proposals relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Measures, or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England, or of any Act of Parliament."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have been duly published in accordance with the provisions of the said Measures, and Notices have been transmitted to the persons or bodies entitled under the said Measures to receive Notice requiring any objections to such draft Scheme to be stated or transmitted in writing to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules applicable to proceedings under the said Measures:

And whereas an objection has been so stated or transmitted to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the same Rules:

And whereas the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners after giving full consideration to such objection have deemed right to make no alteration in such draft Scheme:

And whereas public notice of the certification to His Majesty in Council of the said Scheme and the consent thereto in writing of the Bishop of Leicester has been duly given in the manner and within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules aforesaid:

And whereas no appeal has been proceeded with to His Majesty in Council within the period of one month after the date of the said public notice in accordance with the provisions of the said Measures against the said Scheme or any part thereof by any person who has made objection as aforesaid to the said draft Scheme:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that the Benefices therein recommended to be united shall be united to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme and further to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the date when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measures.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Leicester.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of His late Majesty King William the Fourth, Chapter 77, and of the Act of the 5th and 6th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 26, duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a Scheme bearing date the 6th day of June, 1940, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

“ We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of His late Majesty King William the Fourth, Chapter 77, and of the Act of the 5th and 6th years of Her late Majesty Queen

Victoria, Chapter 26, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for providing the Bishop of Sheffield with a more convenient house of residence:

“ Whereas the house and premises known as Bishopsholme, with the appurtenances thereto belonging, situate in the City of Sheffield, form part of the endowment fund of the Bishopric of Sheffield, and are held as and for an episcopal residence for the Bishop of such Bishopric:

“ And whereas it has been represented to us by the Right Reverend Leslie, now Bishop of Sheffield, and it has been made to appear to us that the said house and appurtenances are no longer desirable for use as such episcopal residence and should be sold:

“ And whereas in the circumstances hereinbefore set forth it appears to us to be expedient and likely to conduce to the permanent benefit of the See of Sheffield that a sale of the said house and premises should be effected in manner hereinafter recommended and proposed:

“ Now, therefore, with the consent of the said Leslie, Bishop of Sheffield (in testimony of which consent he has signed this Scheme and sealed the same with his Episcopal Seal) we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that the said house and premises known as Bishopsholme with its appurtenances may be sold for such price or prices and at such time or times and in such manner as shall be approved by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, under our Common Seal, and that all moneys received by or on account of the sale of the said house and appurtenances or of any part thereof shall be paid over to us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, and shall be applied by us (first) in defraying any costs, charges and expenses of and incidental to the sale of the said house and appurtenances known as Bishopsholme and (secondly) in payment to the Sheffield Bishopric Endowment Fund held by us under the Bishoprics Act, 1878, and the Bishoprics of Sheffield, Chelmsford and for the County of Suffolk Act, 1913, for the purpose of defraying the cost of providing in such manner and at such times as shall be approved by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, another episcopal residence, with the appurtenances thereto, for the Bishop of Sheffield:

“ And we further recommend and propose that as soon as the above mentioned new episcopal residence shall have been provided the said Leslie, Bishop of Sheffield, or his successors, shall, at his or their personal charge and expense, insure and keep insured from loss or damage by fire such residence, with the appurtenances thereto belonging, such insurance being effected in such one of the public offices of Assurance in London or Westminster as we may approve for such a sum as may be determined by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, and that in case of any loss or damage by fire to the said residence any and every sum of money receivable under such insurance shall become and be payable and be paid to and deposited with us in trust to be applied (and we recommend and propose that the same, together with any interest and accumulations thereof, shall be applied) by us

towards the rebuilding or repairing and reinstating of the said residence or any part thereof which may have so suffered loss and damage in such manner as shall be determined by us, with the concurrence of the said Bishop of Sheffield for the time being:

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in conformity with the provisions of the said Acts, or of either of them, or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Sheffield.

These two airmen displayed great courage in effecting the rescue of an unconscious pilot from a burning aircraft which resulted from a collision in which two Blenheim aircraft were involved while taking off. Aircraftmen Campion and Frost were among the first to arrive on the scene. Not knowing that the pilot was the sole occupant, Aircraftman Frost promptly entered the rear cockpit, which was full of smoke and fumes, in search of the wireless operator. Satisfying himself that no one was there, he climbed out and, nearly exhausted, ran to the front cockpit where Leading Aircraftman Campion was trying to rescue the pilot. Working heroically both men, with great

risk to themselves, due to the imminent danger of the petrol tanks exploding, extricated the pilot from the burning wreckage. Shortly afterwards the tanks exploded and the whole aircraft was rapidly burned out. Unfortunately the pilot died later.
