DANGEROUS DRUGS ACTS, 1920 TO 1932. SUSPENSION OF WITHDRAWAL OF AUTHORITIES.

(Duncan Hugh Fraser.)

Edin., F.R.C.S., Edin. 1929, then residing at 1, St. Andrew Street, Castle Douglas, Kirkcudbrightshire, who had been convicted of an offence against the Dangerous Drugs Acts:
