the force I have here to abandon this place. The Cossacks are fu 'y resolved to maintain Peace and a good Correspondency with the Tartars, without whom they declare they are not able to live; but fet a small value upon the Polan-

ders, as being able to subsist without them. . Brussells, warch 23. We have here Letters from Father Nithard the Inquifitor, written from Bierbefes about 40 lengues from Madrid, informing us of his relolution of passing into Germany, and from thence to Rome.

Here is lately arrived the Heer Maetsfelt Agent from Madam the Princels Dowager of Orange, who has in the Name of that Princels his Mistrils complemented the Constable of Castille upon his entry into the Government of thele Countries.

The Colledge of the Nine Na ions refused to consent to the Demands of the Constable, till he had promised them to suppreis the Imposts as they were establisht at Willebracck. They press earnestly the restoring of the Copper Plates which were by Order of Charles the Fifth fixed upon their Gates; having on them engraved the sums which were to be charged upon all forts of Merch naizes coming in or going out of this City: the faid Plates having been privately taken down shout 2 or 3 years lince. The Magistrates have publickly offered the fum of an hundred Rixdollers to any perfor who shall give them true information who it was that took them away.

Hague, March 25. The 23th instant arrived the Heer de Villuecs a Major in the Garrison at Maestricht, informing the States of the death of the Commander Itterfum of his wounds, of which he died the 20 h inftant; whereupon the States imme 'intely conferred the Charge of High Brily of Pachen, Hertogenrade, and Overmare, which was vacant by his deceale, upon the Heer Van Af-

The States, are giving out new Commissions to several Officets, who are ordered to repair with their Companies to the leveral Garrisons upon the Frontiers of Brabant and Flanders. The States Commissioners and Deputies have had a late Conference with Mareshal Wurts about the ex erciling of the Militia.

The Deputies from the States of Zealand have been received with much ivility by the States, and are falling upon the business of their Negotiation.

Libels which have lately crept out of the Press, have issued out an Arrest of Decree in confirmation of some somer ones upon the same subject, against such pe sons as shall presume to p int, sell, or diffribute any Libel or Pamplilet, to the defamation or dishonour of any strangers of what quality or condition socver they are; or any other Book containing any thing of scandal, or what is repugnant and contrary to good man-ners; under pain of forfeiting One th u and Livres for the first default, besi les confication of all such Copies as shall be found upon them, and Corporal punishment for the se-

Yesterday arrived here from Amfterdam the Heer Charifius Envoye from the Crown of Denmark, baving agreed upon the method of measuring such thips as shall trade in o Norway and the Sound.

Paris, March 27. On Sunday last was solemnly bapti-Ted Monsieur the Duke of Anjou, in the Chappel of the Pallace in the Thuillgries, where officiated Cardinal Anthonie, affilted by the Condjutor of Rheims and one other Bishop; the Duke of Orleans standing as Godsather in the Room and Name of the Emperour, and Little Madam for the Queen of spain; who gave him the Name of Philip.

From the New Conquests in the Netherlands we find that the Farmers who rent Lands or Tenements from such persons as live within the Spanish Jurisdiction, are easily induced to comply with the late Prohibition from paying Their Rents, under pain of paying twice; besides other pu. nishment, to which they should be liable: and from Dunkirke, that they have made a confiderable progress in the enlargement of that place; for which they have pulled down two Bastions, and are now raising a new Cittadelle: and that they are enlarging the Graft at Mardike..., and in-tend to make it a Port capable of containing a large Fleet of

From Barcellona they write, that they have not of late had any news of 10 of the Spanish Gallies which have been for some time cruifing upon those seas, and were some dayes fince expected in that Port.

From Swiffe we are advised, that the Cantons have deferred their General Diet, and that His Majesties Resident has informed them that he had 100 thouland Crowns in his hands, with Orders to pay it them, on condition they would oblige themselves not to enter into any new Alliance contrary to what they formerly contracted with His Most Christian Majesty.

On Sunday last His Majesty ordered a Declaration to be fealed for the Continuance of the Paylette or Droit Annual for three years; from which he has thought fit to exempt the Treasurers of France, the Chamber of Accompts of Monte pellier, the Court of Moneys, the Officers belonging to

his Revenue of Salt, and the Parliament of Metz.

Plymouth, March 16. The Fleet of Merchant ships which was for some time detained here by contrary winds, failed yesterday from this Port with a fair gale. Two ships are lately arrived here from France laden with Corn.

London, March 20. This day His Majefly and Royal Highness, having divertised themselves for some dayes about New-Market and other parts of the Countrey, returned again to Whitehall.

London, March 21.
