bruffells, warcls 23. We have here Letters from Father Nithard the Inquifitor, writen foom Bierbefca about 4r lengues from Madrid, informing us of his refolution of paling into Germany, and from shance to Rome.

Here is lately arrived the Heer Maetsfelt Agent from Madam the Princefs Dowager of Orange, "who hasin the Name of that Princefs his Miftrifs complemented the Confable of cuffille upon bis entry into the Government of thele Countries.

The Colledge of the Nine Na ions refufed to confent to the Demands of the Conftable, till he had promifed them to Cupprels the Impofts as they were etlabliftr at Willebracck. They pref earneftly the reftoring of the Copper Plates which were by Order of charles the Fifth fixed upon their Gates; having on them engraved the fums which were to be charged upon all forts of Merch. naizes coming in or going out of this City: the faid Plates having beea privately taken down shout 2 of 2 years lince. The Magiftrates have pobilickly offered the fum of an hundred Rixdollers to ang perfor who thall give them true information who it was that took them away.

Hague, March 25. The 23th initant arrived the Heer de Villuecs a Major in the Garrifon at Maefricht, informing the Srates of the death of the Commander ItterSum of his wounds, of which he died the 20 h inflant; whereupon the States imme istely conferred the $($ harge of High Baily of Daclben, Hertogenrade, and Overmaze, which was vacant by his deceafe, upen the Heer Van Af. seren.

The States. are giving out new Commiflicns 10 Several Officts, whb are orde red to repair with their Companies to the feveral Garrifons upon the Fronties of Brabant and Flanders. The States Commiffioners and Deputies have had a late Conference with Marefhal/Wurts about the ex ercifing of the Militia.

The Deputies from the States of Zealand have been received with much ivility by the States, and ate fallifg upon the bufinefs of their Nrgotiation.

The Stares General having paken notice of feveral fcand $A$ lous Pamphlets and defamator. Libels which bave lacely crept but of the Prefs, have iflued our an Arreft or Decree intofnfirmation of fome former ones upon the fame fubject, againft fuch pe fons as fhall prefumé to $p$ int, fell, or diltribute any Libel or Pampi,jer, to the defamatimp or dithonour of any ftrangers of what quality or condition focver they are; or any other Book containing any thing of fcandal or what is repugnant and contraty to good manners; under fain of forfeiting One th $u$ and Livres for she frift default, befites confication of all fuch Copies as Thall be found upon them, and Corporal punifiment for the fecond.

Yefterday arrived here from Amfterdam the Heer Charifus Envoye from the Crown of Denmark, baving agreed upon the thi thod of meafuring fuch thips as fhall trade in o Normay and the sound.
Paris, Marcis 27. From the New Conqueffs in the Netherlavds we find that the Farmers who rent Land's or Tenements from fuch perfonsas live within the Spanifh Juriddiction, are eafily induced to comply with the lare Prohibition from paying their Rents, under pain of paying twice; befides other pus. nimment g to which they hould be liable : and from Dun. kirke, that they havemade a confiderable progrefs in the enlargementof ehar place $;$ for which they have pulled down
iwo Baftions;', and are now raifing a new Cittadelie : and Uyat they are enlarsing the Graft at , Mardike.na and intend to make it a Port capable of containing a large Fleet of Ships.

The 2sch inftant arrived here Mr. Moatague Ambaff ${ }^{-}$ dour from His Majefty of Great Eritain, but continues yet incognito.

From Earcellone they write, that they have not of late had any news of 10 of the Spanihh Gallies $n$ hich thave been for fome time cruifing upon thole fears, and were fome dayes - fince expe Cted in that Port.

From $S w i f f e$ we are advifed, that the Cantons have deferred their General Diet, and that His Majefties Refdent has informed themt that he had roo thooland Crowns in his hands, wish Órders to pay ix çhem, on condition they would oblige themielves nor to enteg into any new Atliance contrary to what they formorly contracted with His Moft Chriftisn Majefty.

On Sunday laft His Majefty ordered a Declargrion to be sealed for the Continuance of the Pailette or Droit Annual for three years; from which he has fhought fit to exempt the Trealurers of France, the Chamber of Accompts of Nontpellier, the Court of Moneys, the Officers belonging to bis Revenue of Salt, and the Parliament of Metz.

Plymouth, March 16. The Fleet of Merchant fhips which was for fome time detained here by contrary winds, failed yeflerday from chis Port with a fair gale. I wo faips are larely arrived here from France laden with Corn.

Ionden, March 20. This day His Majeßy and Royal Highneis, having divertifed themielves for fome dayes about New-sarket and other parts of the Ccuntrey, tecurned again to $W$ bitehall.

London, March 21 . Yefterday inthe Evening abput 8. of the Clock, $\ddagger$ perfons with their ho fes which had becen hard ridden, endeavoured to have paffed the Hortc-Ferry at the Mill-bank in Wefiminster; but the Ferry-man fufpecting them iot High. way-men, and refufing to unlock his Boat, they immediarely put up their Hories in two leveral Subles, andipaffed aver themelves to Lambeth, where ups on diligent fearch they werefecifed, and upon Examination committed by Mr. Juftice Morton to efr.tggate ; they pala under féveral Names, vǐ.
