The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS His Majesty in virtue of the powers vested in Him by Section 84 of the Merchant Shipping Act, 1894 (57 & 58 Vict. c. 60), has been pleased to make the Egyptian Tonnage Order, 1939 (S.R. & O. 1939, No. 709) (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Order") whereby it is ordered that ships of the Kingdom of Egypt the certificates of registry or other national papers of which are dated on or after the 31st December, 1935, shall be deemed to be of the tonnage denoted in such certificates of registry or other national papers in the same manner, to the same extent and for the same purposes, as the tonnage denoted in the certificate of registry of a British ship is deemed to be the tonnage of that ship:

And whereas the principal Order applies only to ships of the Kingdom of Egypt when in the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland, Newfoundland, Burma, British Colonies or Protectorates or mandated territories in respect of which the mandate is exercised by the Government of the United Kingdom:

And whereas by sub-section (1) of section 738 of the said Act, it is enacted inter alia that His Majesty may by Order in Council revoke, alter or add to any Order made by Him under the said Act:

And whereas it appears to His Majesty that the principal Order should apply to ships of the Kingdom of Egypt when in India:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, in exercise of the power conferred upon Him as aforesaid and of all other powers enabling Him in that behalf, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1.—(a) This Order may be cited as the Egyptian Tonnage (Amendment) Order, 1940.

(b) The Interpretation Act, 1889 (52 & 53 Vict. c. 63), shall apply to the interpretation of this Order as it applies to the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.

2. The principal Order shall have the effect as if India were included amongst the countries and territories specified in Article 3 thereof.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 7th and 8th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 94; of the Act of the 13th and 14th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94; and of the Act of the 32nd and 33rd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94, duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a Scheme or Representation, bearing date the 4th day of July, 1940, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting under the provisions of the Act of the 7th and 8th years of Her late Majesty

Queen Victoria, Chapter 94, the Act of the 13th and 14th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94, and the Act of the 32nd and 33rd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme or Representation for altering the boundaries of the New Parish of Seaham Harbour, of the New Parish of Christ Church, New Seaham, and of the New Parish of Saint Hild and Saint Helen, Dawdon, all in the County and Diocese of Durham:

"Whereas District Chapelries were assigned to the Churches of Saint John, Seaham Harbour; Christ Church, New Seaham; and Saint Hild and Saint Helen, Dawdon, by the Orders in Council specified in the following Table:—

"And whereas the said District Chapelries have under the provisions of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 104, become New Parishes of the character contemplated by that Act, by the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 37, and by the above-mentioned Act of the 32nd and 33rd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94:

"And whereas it has been represented to us, and it appears to us to be expedient that the boundaries of the said New Parish of Seaham Harbour, of the said New Parish of Christ Church, New Seaham, and of the said New Parish of Saint Hild and Saint Helen, Dawdon, should be altered in the manner which is hereinafter mentioned:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Alwyn Terrell Petre, Bishop of Durham (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme or Representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly represent recommend and propose that from and after the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of an Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme or Representation and without any assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the boundaries of the said New Parishes shall be altered so that, first, all that portion of the said New Parish of Christ Church, New Seaham, which is described in the First Schedule hereunder written and is delineated and set forth upon the map or plan hereunto annexed and is thereon coloured green shall be dissevered from such New Parish and shall be annexed to and shall in future form part of the said New Parish of Seaham Harbour; secondly, all those portions of the said New Parish of Seaham Harbour and of the Parish of Seaham, in the said County and Diocese, which are described in the Second Schedule hereunder written and are delineated and set forth upon the said map or plan and are thereon coloured pink shall be dissevered from such New Parish and Parish

respectively and shall be annexed to and shall in future form part of the said New Parish of Christ Church, New Seaham, and thirdly, all that portion of the said New Parish of Seaham Harbour, which is described in the Third Schedule hereunder written and is delineated and set forth upon the said map or plan and is thereon coloured purple shall be dissevered from such New Parish and shall be annexed to and shall in future form part of the said New Parish of Saint Hild and Saint Helen, Dawdon:

"And we further represent, recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from representing, recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the hereinbefore mentioned Acts or any of them or of any other Act of Parliament:

"The First Schedule.

"The territory to be dissevered from the New Parish of Christ Church, New Seaham, in the County of Durham and in the Diocese of Durham and to be annexed to the New Parish of Seaham Harbour in the said County and Diocese being:—

"All that portion of the said New Parish of Christ Church, New Seaham, which is bounded upon the south by the Parish of Dalton le Dale in the said County and Diocese, upon the east by the said New Parish of Seaham Harbour and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the north upon the north-west and upon the west by an imaginary line commencing at the point where the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Seaham Harbour from the said New Parish of Christ Church, New Seaham, crosses the middle of the Seaham Colliery line of railway and extending thence westward along the middle of the said line of railway for a distance of 27 chains or thereabouts to the centre of the footbridge which carries the footpath leading south-westward from School Street and Bank Head Street over the said line of railway and extending thence south-westward along the said footbridge and along the footpath in continuation thereof for a distance of 1½ chains or thereabouts to the north-eastern end of the wall or fence forming the south-eastern boundary of the close numbered 163 upon the map or plan annexed to this Scheme or Representation and extending thence south-westward along the said wall or fence and along the walls or fences forming the south-eastern boundaries of the closes numbered 161, 159, 158, and 158a upon such map or plan to the junction of the said wall or fence with the wall or fence which divides the houses and premises situate on the north-western side of the northern arm of Ryton Crescent from the houses and premises situate on the western side of Steward Street and extending thence first south-westward and then southward along the last mentioned wall or fence and along the wall or fence forming the north-western and western boundaries of the houses and premises situate on the north-western and western sides of Ryton Crescent for a distance in all of 37 chains or thereabouts to the junction of the said wall or fence with the wall or fence forming the north-western boundary of the houses and premises situate on the northern side of the road known as The Avenue and

extending thence south-westward along the last mentioned wall or fence for a distance of 1 chain or thereabouts to the footpath leading to the Sunderland and South Shields Water Company's reservoir and extending thence south-westward to and south-eastward along the middle of the said footpath (thereby crossing The Avenue) to its south-eastern end and in a straight line in continuation thereof for a distance in all of 8 chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Christ Church, Seaham, from the said Parish of Dalton le Dale.

" The Second Schedule.

" The territory to be annexed to the said New Parish of Christ Church, New Seaham, comprising:—

" I. All that portion of the said New Parish of Seaham Harbour which is bounded upon a part of the north-east and a part of the north-west by the Parish of Seaham in the said County and Diocese upon the remaining part of the north-west by the said New Parish of Christ Church, New Seaham, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the south and upon the remaining part of the south-east by an imaginary line commencing at the point where the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Christ Church, New Seaham, from the said New Parish of Seaham Harbour crosses the middle of the Seaham Colliery line of railway and extending thence eastward along the middle of the said line of railway for a distance of $9\frac{1}{2}$ chains or thereabouts to the centre of the bridge which carries the Leeds Northern line of the London and North Eastern Railway over such railway and extending thence north-westward along the middle of the Leeds Northern line of railway for a distance of $2\frac{1}{2}$ chains or thereabouts to the centre of the bridge which carries the last mentioned line of railway over Londonderry Road and extending thence north-eastward for a distance of 10 yards or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Seaham Harbour from the said Parish of Seaham.

" II. All that portion of the said Parish of Seaham which lies to the west of the Leeds Northern line of the London and North Eastern Railway.

" The Third Schedule.

" The territory to be dissevered from the New Parish of Seaham Harbour and to be annexed to the New Parish of Saint Hild and Saint Helen, Dawdon, in the said County and Diocese being:—

" All that portion of the said New Parish of Seaham Harbour which is bounded upon the west by the said Parish of Dalton le Dale upon the south-east by the said New Parish of Saint Hild and Saint Helen, Dawdon, and upon the remaining sides that is to say upon the north-east upon the north and upon the north-west by an imaginary line commencing at the point where the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Hild and Saint Helen, Dawdon, from the said New Parish of Seaham Harbour crosses the middle of the Leeds Northern line of the London and North Eastern Railway and extending thence north-westward along the middle of the said line of railway for a distance of $4\frac{1}{2}$ chains or

thereabouts to a point opposite the north-eastern end of Park Street and extending thence south-westward to and along the middle of Park Street for a distance in all of 15 chains or thereabouts to the junction of Park Street, with Princess Road and extending thence north-westward along the middle of Princess Road for a distance of 16 yards or thereabouts to its junction with Parkside Crescent and extending thence south-westward along the middle of Parkside Crescent for a distance of $13\frac{1}{2}$ chains or thereabouts to a point opposite the eastern end of the wall or fence forming the northern boundary of the houses and premises situate on the Parkside Housing Estate and extending thence westward to and along such wall or fence and in a straight line in continuation thereof for a distance in all of $14\frac{1}{2}$ chains or thereabouts to a point in the middle of the beck running through Dawdon Dene and extending thence generally south-westward along the middle of the said beck for a distance of 24 chains or thereabouts to a point opposite the northern end of the Ewe Hill Gutter and extending thence due southward in a straight line for a distance of 13 yards or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Seaham Harbour from the said Parish of Dalton le Dale."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme or Representation have been transmitted to the Patrons and to the Incumbents of the Cures affected by the arrangements which are contemplated by such Scheme or Representation and such Patrons and Incumbents have respectively signified their assent thereto:

And whereas the said Scheme or Representation has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme or Representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Durham.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 37, duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a Scheme bearing date the 11th day of July, 1940, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

" We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 37, have prepared and now

humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for authorising the sale and disposal of certain property situate in the County of Lincoln now vested in us:

"Whereas the property, particulars whereof are set forth in the Schedule hereunder written, is now vested in us not subject to any outstanding beneficial lease or grant but in possession and we are desirous of selling the

same or some portion thereof for the improvement of our Common Fund:

"Now, therefore, we humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty that we may be authorised and empowered to sell or dispose of and duly to transfer or convey from time to time all or part of the said property described in the said Schedule for such consideration as shall appear to us to be just and reasonable.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1936, duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a Scheme bearing date the 30th day of May, 1940, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1936, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for effecting the union of the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Highworth with Sevenhampton and the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Inglesham, both of which Benefices are situate in the County of Wilts and in the Diocese of Bristol, and for annexing to the Parish of the United Benefice a detached portion of the Parish of the Benefice

of Coleshill in the Counties of Berks and Wilts and in the Diocese of Oxford:

"Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend Clifford Salisbury, Bishop of Bristol, pursuant to the provisions of the said Measures to inquire into and report upon the union of the said two Benefices of Highworth with Sevenhampton and Inglesham duly made their Report to the said Bishop of Bristol and therein recommended the union of the said two Benefices and the terms for effecting the union and also recommended the transfer to the Parish of the said Benefice of Inglesham of a portion of the Parish of the said Benefice of Coleshill, and the said Bishop of Bristol signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

"And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the said union and alteration of boundaries which Scheme is based upon the terms recommended in the said Report but with the assent of the said Bishop of Bristol embodies a modification thereof:

" And whereas the said Benefice of Highworth with Sevenhampton is now full, the Reverend Frederick Reginald Webb being the present Incumbent thereof, and the said Benefice of Inglesham is at present vacant:

" And whereas the patronage of both of the said Benefices of Highworth with Sevenhampton and Inglesham now belongs to one and the same Patron:

" Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said Clifford Salisbury, Bishop of Bristol, and of the said Frederick Reginald Webb (testified by their signing this Scheme), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

" 1. That the said Benefice of Highworth with Sevenhampton and the said Benefice of Inglesham shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with cure of souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Highworth with Sevenhampton and Inglesham' and that the Parishes of the said Benefices shall also be united into one Parish for ecclesiastical purposes and for such other purposes as in the said Measures provided.

" 2. That the Church of the Parish of Highworth with Sevenhampton shall be the Parish Church of the United Parish and that the Table of Fees for the said Parish of Highworth with Sevenhampton shall (until revised or altered by proper authority) be the Table of Fees for the United Parish.

" 3. That upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette the union shall forthwith take effect and the said Frederick Reginald Webb, if he is then Incumbent of the said Benefice of Highworth with Sevenhampton, shall be the first Incumbent of the United Benefice.

" 4. That upon the union taking effect the marriage registers in duplicate current at the Church of Inglesham shall be sent by the Incumbent of the United Benefice to the Registrar General to be closed officially.

" 5. That upon the said union taking effect the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Highworth with Sevenhampton shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice and so soon as conveniently may be the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Inglesham and the site and appurtenances thereof and the grounds heretofore usually occupied and enjoyed therewith shall be sold and disposed of by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, at such time or times and in such manner in all respects as to us shall seem expedient and that one moiety of the net proceeds of such sale shall be appropriated and held by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners or transferred to the Diocesan Board of Finance of the said Diocese of Bristol, as a Repair Fund for the Church at Inglesham and the other moiety of the net proceeds shall constitute and form part of the Expenses Fund established pursuant to the 32nd Section of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923.

" 6. That upon the union taking effect provision shall be made by the Incumbent of the United Benefice for obtaining (a) the services

of an Assistant Curate and (b) such additional clerical or lay assistance as the Bishop of Bristol may from time to time direct and parts of the total endowments and property of the Benefices hereinbefore recommended and proposed to be constituted an United Benefice, that is to say, (a) a part, namely, a sum sufficient to produce £100 per annum of the sum of money appropriated or to be appropriated by Queen Anne's Bounty to the said Benefice of Inglesham pursuant to the provisions of Part II paragraph 2 of the Third Schedule to the Tithe Act, 1936, and paragraph 1 of the Eighth Schedule to the same Act and (b) a further part, namely, a sum sufficient to produce £25 per annum of the said sum of money shall be appropriated by Queen Anne's Bounty as funds towards meeting the cost of obtaining the services of such Assistant Curate and such additional clerical or lay assistance as aforesaid respectively; and the said sums of £100 per annum and £25 per annum shall be paid by Queen Anne's Bounty to the Diocesan Board of Finance of the Diocese as trustees to apply the same respectively to the purposes aforesaid.

" 7. That, with the consent of the said Clifford Salisbury, Bishop of Bristol, as Patron of the said Benefices of Highworth with Sevenhampton and Inglesham (testified as aforesaid) upon the union taking effect parts of the total endowments and property of the Benefices hereinbefore recommended and proposed to be constituted an United Benefice, that is to say, (a) an annual payment of £93 now made by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, to the said Benefice of Highworth with Sevenhampton and (b) an annual payment of £20 now made by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, to the said Benefice of Inglesham and (c) the sum of £400 Local Loans £3 per cent. Stock now held by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, on behalf of the said Benefice of Inglesham, shall be severed or diverted from the said Benefices and from the United Benefice and shall be appropriated by us as to the annual sum of £65 (being part of the said annual payment of £93) for the augmentation of the Benefice of Wanborough and as to the remainder for the augmentation of the Benefice of South Marston, both of which Benefices are in the said Diocese of Bristol.

" 8. That, with the consent of the Right Reverend Kenneth Escott, Bishop of Oxford, as the Bishop of the Diocese in which the said Benefice of Coleshill is situate and with the consents also of the Right Honourable William, Earl of Radnor, as the Patron of that Benefice and of the Reverend William Stevens Porter as the present Incumbent thereof (testified by their respectively signing this Scheme) upon the union taking effect all that detached portion of the Parish of the said Benefice of Coleshill which is contiguous to the United Parish upon the east and which lies to the west of the River Cole shall be severed from the Parish of Coleshill and shall be annexed for all ecclesiastical purposes to the United Parish.

" Provided always that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from making any other recommendations and proposals relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Measures, or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England, or of any Act of Parliament."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have been duly published in accordance with the provisions of the said Measures, and Notices have been transmitted to the persons or bodies entitled under the said Measures to receive notice requiring any objections to such draft Scheme to be stated or transmitted in writing to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules applicable to proceedings under the said Measures:

And whereas certain objections have been so stated or transmitted to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the same Rules:

And whereas the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners after giving full consideration to such objections have deemed right to make no alterations in such draft Scheme:

And whereas public notice of the certification to His Majesty in Council of the said Scheme and the consent thereto in writing of the Bishop of Bristol has been duly given in the manner and within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules aforesaid:

And whereas no appeal has been made to His Majesty in Council within the period of one month after the date of the said public notice in accordance with the provisions of the said Measures against the said Scheme or any part thereof by any person who has made objection as aforesaid to the said draft Scheme:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that the Benefices therein recommended to be united shall be united to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme and further to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the date when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measures.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Bristol.

This day, the Lords being met, a message was sent to the Honourable House of Commons, by the Gentleman Usher of the Black Rod, acquainting them that *The Lords, authorised by virtue of a Commission under the Great Seal, signed by His Majesty, for declaring His Royal Assent to the Acts agreed upon by both Houses, do desire the immediate attendance of the Honourable House in the House of Peers to hear the Commission read;* and the Commons being come thither, the said Commission, empowering the Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, and several other Lords therein named, do declare and notify the Royal Assent to the said Acts, was read accordingly, and the Royal Assent given to:—

Consolidated Fund (No. 2) Act, 1940.
Colonial Development and Welfare Act, 1940.
Confirmation of Executors (War Service) (Scotland) Act, 1940.

The Medal of the Military Division of the Most Excellent Order of the British Empire, for Gallantry:—

880538 Corporal (now Assistant Section Officer) Joan Daphne Mary Pearson, Women's Auxiliary Air Force.

On the 31st May, 1940, at 0100 hours an aircraft crashed near the Women's Auxiliary Air Force quarters, the pilot being seriously injured, another officer killed outright and two airmen slightly injured. Upon hearing the crash Corporal Pearson rushed out to it and, although the aircraft was burning and she knew that there were bombs aboard, she stood on the wreckage, roused the pilot, who was stunned, and assisted him in getting clear, releasing his parachute harness in doing so. When he was on the ground about 30 yards away, a 120 lb. bomb went off. Corporal Pearson at once threw herself on top of the pilot to protect him from blast and splinters. Her prompt and courageous action undoubtedly helped to save the pilot's life.

874574 Corporal John McIntosh McClymont, Auxiliary Air Force.

On the 18th January, 1940, an aircraft, with two occupants, crashed during a snow-storm and immediately caught fire.

Several individuals ran to the scene and Corporal McClymont, who was one of the party, helped in extricating one of the airmen from the cabin. As the flames were increasing in intensity and ammunition and Very lights were continually exploding, all ranks were ordered to stand away from the aircraft. Corporal McClymont heard the order but considered it did not prevent a single-handed attempt being made to rescue the second occupant and remained behind for this purpose. An officer returned shortly to help him and, together, they succeeded in extricating the airman just before the petrol tank exploded. During the second operation, whilst Corporal McClymont was holding back part of the cabin, he received injuries to his hands. He displayed great courage in the face of extreme danger and had the second airman been alive would undoubtedly have saved him from being burnt to death. Both occupants had, however, been killed instantaneously when the aircraft crashed.

Pilot Officer Thompson was the pilot and Sergeant Davis the observer of an aircraft which, early in July, 1940, was detailed to make a reconnaissance over Kiel Harbour. Adverse weather conditions prevailed at the time making it necessary to fly above the clouds, but the excellent flying of Pilot Officer Thompson and the accurate navigation of Sergeant Davis, enabled them on emerging, to locate their position and proceed direct to the target. This pilot and observer maintained this high standard of flying and navigation on the homeward flight, arriving at their base only two minutes late of schedule. They displayed great courage and determination and set a magnificent example of accuracy.

Awarded the Distinguished Flying Cross.

Pilot Officer Alexander WEBSTER (40770).

Awarded the Distinguished Flying Medal.

751016 Sergeant William Slater BISSETT, Royal Air Force Volunteer Reserve.

During a night early in July, 1940, Pilot Officer Webster was captain and pilot of an aircraft detailed to carry out an attack on the German battleship "Scharnhorst" whilst she was lying in the floating dock in Kiel Harbour. On arrival over Kiel the aircraft was picked out by the searchlights and subjected to a continuous hail of gunfire from the entire harbour defences. With great courage and determination this officer dived to 250 feet to attack and Sergeant Bissett, the navigator and bomb aimer, directed him with great skill and coolness on to the target. This is one of many occasions when this officer and airman have displayed conspicuous gallantry and devotion to duty.

Awarded the Distinguished Flying Cross.

Flight Lieutenant George BURGESS (33225).

Although normally a flying-boat pilot, and only transferred to fighter duties since the commencement of war with Italy, Flight Lieutenant Burgess has shot down three enemy aircraft and so damaged three more that they probably failed to reach their base. He has shown great tenacity and determination in seeking combat, usually in the face of superior numbers.

Awarded the Distinguished Flying Medal.

612422 Aircraftman 1st Class Albert Alfred MEADOWS.

This airman was a gunner in an aircraft engaged on a raid on Bardia, Libya, where a troop concentration was bombed. When

the pilot of his aircraft was wounded and the observer killed, he applied a tourniquet to the pilot's arm. Then, though untrained as a pilot, he took control of the aircraft under the officer's instructions and brought it back to the base.
