PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 15th day of *July*, 1940 (N8165/40), in the words following, viz.:—

"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions, or other allowances in the nature thereof, payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman, or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner, and subject to such restrictions, conditions, and provisions, as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas, with increased numbers of naval ratings required for continuous employment on coding and kindred duties, we are of opinion that, for their proper administration, such ratings should be organised into a separate branch of Your Majesty's Navy to be called the Coding Branch:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty by Your Order in Council may be graciously pleased to sanction the institution, for the period of the present emergency, of the Coding Branch in the Royal Navy, with titles and rates of pay as set out in the accompanying schedule, with effect from a date to be determined by us.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in the above proposals.

*The Medal of the Civil Division of the Most Excellent Order of the British Empire, for Gallantry:—*

John Henry Farr, Foundryman.

When an explosion occurred recently at a factory in the South of England, he displayed exceptional bravery and devotion to duty. In spite of the grave danger due to molten metal and the risk of electrocution from the loose high tension cables, he removed a colleague from the danger zone. He then returned into the foundry with his brother Douglas. Between them they cleared two large furnaces each containing 1,000 lbs. of molten aluminium. Farr and his brother volunteered for that duty in spite of falling debris, the dangerous condition of the structure and roof, and in complete darkness. As a result of their voluntary efforts, the plant was restored to production days sooner than would otherwise have been the case.

William Douglas Farr, Foundryman.

After an explosion at a factory in the South of England, he accompanied his brother, John Farr, into the foundry and, in spite of the condition of the structure and the danger of electrocution, helped to clear two large furnaces of molten aluminium. He displayed great courage and initiative in efforts to locate missing men in the debris.

## TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS.

1. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office, at the Bank of England, on Friday, the 2nd August, 1940, at 1 p.m., for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, the National Debt Act, 1889, and the National Loans Acts, 1939 and 1940, to the amount of £65,000,000.

3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000, and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.

6. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same not later than the following day, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of Cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not later than 1.30 p.m. (Saturday 12 noon) on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated.

7. Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills.

8. Tenders must be made on the printed forms which may be obtained from the Chief Cashier's Office, Bank of England.

9. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury reserve the right of rejecting any Tenders.

## DANGEROUS DRUGS ACTS, 1920 TO 1932.

## CANCELLATION OF SUSPENSION OF WITHDRAWAL OF AUTHORITIES.

(ALEXANDER GORDON BONNYMAN.)

Whereas in pursuance of the powers conferred upon the Secretary of State by Regulation 6 of the Raw Opium Regulations, 1921, as extended by the Coca Leaves and Indian Hemp Regulations, 1928, and by Regulation 7 of the Dangerous Drugs (Consolidation) Regulations, 1928, the authorities granted by the aforesaid Regulations to duly qualified medical practitioners to be in possession of and to supply raw opium, coca leaves and Indian hemp, and the drugs and preparations to which Part III of the Dangerous Drugs Act, 1920, applies, were, by Notice published in the London Gazette and Edinburgh Gazette on the 28th August, 1934, withdrawn from Alexander Gordon Bonnyman, M.B., Ch.B., then residing at Llys Meddyg, Blaenau Festiniog, who had been convicted of an offence against the Dangerous Drugs Acts:

And whereas by the said Notice it was directed that it should not be lawful for the

said Alexander Gordon Bonnyman to give prescriptions for the purposes of the Dangerous Drugs (Consolidation) Regulations, 1928:

And whereas the operation of the said Notice was by Notice published in the London Gazette and Edinburgh Gazette on the 12th March, 1937, suspended until further Order:

And whereas I am of opinion that the said Alexander Gordon Bonnyman cannot properly be allowed for the purposes of the Raw Opium, etc., Regulations, 1937, and the Dangerous Drugs Regulations, 1937, to remain an authorised person or to give prescriptions:

Now, therefore, I hereby cancel, as from to-day's date, the Notice of suspension published in the London Gazette and Edinburgh Gazette on the 12th March, 1937.

BACTON, WALCOT, HAPPISBURGH—PROPOSED PROHIBITION OF REMOVAL, ETC., OF MATERIALS FROM THE SEASHORE.

#### ROYAL AIR FORCE.

The KING has been graciously pleased to approve the undermentioned awards, in recognition of gallantry displayed in flying operations against the enemy:—

##### *Awarded the Distinguished Flying Cross.*

Pilot Officer John Fraser DRUMMOND (40810).

During operations in Norway, this officer shot down two enemy aircraft and seriously damaged a further three. On one occasion, as pilot of one of two Hurricanes which attacked four Heinkel III's, he damaged one of the enemy aircraft and then engaged two of the others. Despite heavy return fire, Pilot Officer Drummond pressed home his attack, silenced the rear guns of both aircraft and compelled the Heinkels to break off the engagement.

Pilot Officer Charles Peter Dovey PRICE (41736).

During a night in July, 1940, this officer was pilot of an aircraft engaged in a bombing raid on an aircraft factory at Bremen. In spite of extremely difficult conditions, he successfully located his target and carried out a determined attack, at an altitude of 500 feet, in the face of anti-aircraft fire. On

the return journey Pilot Officer Price engaged three Messerschmitt 110's which he had observed flying above the aerodrome at Borkum. By skilful manoeuvring he enabled his rear gunner to fire bursts at one of the enemy aircraft, which appeared to be hit, and then engaged a second fighter which was shot down into the sea with its port engine on fire. Pilot Officer Price displayed great courage, initiative and determination throughout the operation.
