PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS it is provided by the Prize Act, 1939 (2 & 3 Geo. 6. c. 65), that the law relating to Prize shall apply in relation to aircraft and goods carried therein in the same manner as it applies to ships and goods carried therein:

And whereas by Orders in Council dated the 27th day of November, 1939, and the 11th day of June, 1940, His Majesty was pleased, for the reasons specified in the said Orders, to direct certain measures to be taken against the commerce of Germany and Italy respectively:

And whereas it is provided by the said Orders that the law and practice in Prize shall, so far as applicable, be followed in all cases arising thereunder:

And whereas it is expedient to make clear the position of aircraft and goods carried therein in relation to the said Orders:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

The Orders in Council dated the 27th day of November, 1939, and the 11th day of June, 1940, shall be deemed to have applied and shall apply as if the terms "merchant vessel" and "vessel", wherever occurring therein, included civil aircraft; as if the term "port" included place; and as if the term "sailed from" included the departure of an aircraft.

CENTRAL CHANCERY OF THE ORDERS OF KNIGHTHOOD.

The KING has been graciously pleased to approve the following Award:—

The Medal of the Civil Division of the Most Excellent Order of the British Empire, for Meritorious Service:—

Warden Donald Louis Jones, Air Raid Precautions Service, Kent.

During a recent raid on a Kentish town a number of people were buried under the debris of a house which had been damaged. At considerable risk Warden Jones crawled under some tons of wreckage and found two persons pinned down by heavy joists which had fallen with the floor above. For four hours, during which heavy building material was likely to collapse, he protected with his body the heads and faces of the trapped people from debris which was dislodged during the rescue operations, and encouraged them while giving directions to the rescue party. It was mainly owing to his courage and endurance that the victims were eventually released.

ELECTION OF REPRESENTATIVES OF WORKERS IN THE INDUSTRY.

ROYAL AIR FORCE.

The KING has been graciously pleased to approve the undermentioned awards in recognition of gallantry displayed in flying operations against the enemy:

Awarded the Distinguished Flying Cross.

Acting Flight Lieutenant John Hunter COGHLAN (37719).

This officer has been a flight commander in his squadron on most of the recent patrols and has led the squadron on some occasions. At all times he has shown the greatest initiative and courage and has personally destroyed at least six enemy aircraft.

Flying Officer Anthony Douglas Forster (90290), Auxiliary Air Force.

This officer has displayed great courage and devotion to duty in participating in all patrols recently undertaken by his squadron, during which he has destroyed at least two enemy aircraft. Previously he has been engaged in intensive flying operations in France, where he destroyed four enemy aircraft.

Flying Officer William Henry Rhodes-MOORHOUSE (90140), Auxiliary Air Force.

This officer has been engaged on operational flying since November, 1939. During this period he has destroyed five enemy aircraft and has displayed great courage and devotion to duty.

Pilot Officer Jack Royston Hamar (70898) since deceased.

This officer has participated in all operational and most of the patrol flights undertaken by his squadron. He has shown coolness and courage of a high order, and has personally destroyed six enemy aircraft.

Pilot Officer David Albert Alton Romans (42265).

Pilot Officer Romans was navigator and bomb aimer in an aircraft engaged in a recent bombing attack on Eschwege aerodrome. During the attack, the aircraft was hit by a shell from the ground defences, and the pilot was rendered unconscious. Officer Romans, realising that the aircraft was flying in an erratic manner, and receiving no communication from the pilot, proceeded to the pilot's cockpit, and sitting on the unconscious pilot's knees, gained control of the aircraft. He continued to fly it under these conditions until the injured pilot was removed some twenty-minutes later by the remainder of the crew. This officer performed a fine feat of airmanship and showed great presence of mind in gaining control of the aircraft under such difficult conditions, especially as it was flying at a dangerously low altitude and subjected to intense and accurate anti-aircraft fire. He further succeeded in flying the aircraft safely back to its base, which necessitated accurate navigation, without assistance.

Awarded; the Distinguished Flying Medal. 563147 Flight Sergeant Frederick William HIGGINSON.

This airman pilot has led a section during all operations undertaken by his squadron, and has personally destroyed at least five enemy aircraft. He has shown the greatest determination in the face of the enemy and his cool and courageous leadership has been an example to his squadron.
