At the Court at Buckingham Palace, the 31st day of July, 1940.

PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 22nd day of July, 1940 (N 5062/40), in the words following, viz.:—

"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, inter alia, that all pay, pensions or other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman or Marine therein shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas in order to meet the requirements of the Air Arm of Your Majesty's Fleet, it has been found necessary to transfer thereto certain trained personnel of Your Majesty's Air Force and Order in Council dated 6th May, 1938, provides, inter alia, that former Royal Air Force service rendered by such transferees shall be allowed to reckon towards the award of the Long Service and Good Conduct Medal and Gratuity to the same extent as it would have done under Royal Air Force Regulations, but that all awards shall be made under conditions applicable to ratings of the Royal Navy:

"And whereas the Long Service and Good Conduct Medal may be awarded under Royal Air Force Regulations after 18 years' approved service and the amount of the associated Gratuity is only £5, while, under Royal Naval Regulations, only 15 years' qualifying service is required and the award of the Medal carries with it an initial Gratuity of £20 and additional Gratuity at the rate of £1 for each year of approved service subsequent to the award:

"And whereas certain Royal Air Force personnel transferred to the Royal Navy in the circumstances described herein had already been awarded the Long Service and Good Conduct Medal and associated Gratuity of £5 prior to transfer and we desire that such men, while being allowed to retain the Medal so awarded, shall be paid a further Gratuity of £15, representing the difference between the amount of the Gratuity payable under Royal Air Force Regulations and that initially payable under Royal Naval Regulations, and shall be eligible for the additional allowance at the rate of £1 for each year of service subsequent to the date of transfer to the Royal Navy, subject to fulfilment of the authorised conditions for its payment to Naval ratings.

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to sanction payment accordingly.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in this proposal."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by Orders in Council dated the 27th day of November, 1939, and the 11th day of June, 1940, His Majesty was pleased to direct certain measures to be taken against the commerce of the enemy:

And whereas the illegal acts on the part of the German Government referred to in the said Orders have continued in an aggravated form and have, in equal violation of the laws of war, the rights of neutrals and the obligations of humanity, been accompanied by air attacks on merchant and other non-combatant shipping, resulting in grave loss of civilian life:

And whereas neutral countries have been subjected to unprovoked attack and to invasion and occupation by Germany, in gross violation of their neutrality and for the sole purpose of prosecuting the War against His Majesty and

His Majesty's Allies:

And whereas Italy, by entering the war as Germany's ally, has associated herself with Germany's actions, sharing in any advantages derived therefrom and employing her commerce in the common cause of the enemies of His Majesty

And whereas these proceedings on the part of the enemy give to His Majesty an unquestionable right to adopt such measures as may be deemed expedient for restricting further the enemy's commerce and for maintaining the

efficiency of those previously taken:

And whereas, for the convenience of traders and for the avoidance of the risks and delays inseparable from the diversion of ships into port in the exercise of belligerent rights against commerce at sea, a system has been instituted whereby passes can be obtained for approved cargoes and for ships which carry none but approved cargoes:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:-

r. For the purposes of this Order:—(i) the term "enemy territory" includes territory under enemy occupation or control, and the term "enemy port" includes a port in the occupation of the enemy or situated in

territory under enemy occupation or control:
(ii) the term "goods of enemy origin" includes goods having their origin in territory under enemy occupation or control, and the term "goods of enemy.....ownership" goods of enemy.....ownership includes goods belonging to a person in such

territory;

(iii) the term "Cargo Navicert" means a pass issuable by the appropriate British or Allied authority in the neutral country of shipment in respect of goods consigned to any port or place from which they might reach the enemy, to the effect that, so far as is known at the date of issue, there is no

objection to the consignment;
(iv) the term "Certificate of origin and Interest" means a pass issuable by the appropriate British or Allied authority in territory (and, where necessary, endorsed at the port of shipment), certifying that a declaration of the non-enemy origin and ownership of the goods concerned has been made, supported by satisfactory documentary evidence;

- (v) the term "Ship Navicert" means a pass issuable to a vessel in respect of a given voyage by the appropriate British or Allied authority at all principal British, Allied or neutral ports, if that authority is satisfied that the vessel is duly qualified to receive it.
- 2. Any vessel on her way to or from a port through which goods might reach or come from enemy territory or the enemy armed forces, not being provided with a Ship Navicert valid for the voyage on which she is engaged, shall, until the contrary is established, be deemed to be carrying contraband or goods of enemy origin or ownership, and shall be liable to seizure as Prize; provided that a vessel, other than a vessel which sailed from or has called at an enemy port, shall not be liable to seizure under the provisions of this Article unless she sailed from or could have called at a port at which she would, if duly qualified, have obtained a Ship Navicert.

3.—(1) Goods consigned to any port or place from which they might reach enemy territory or the enemy armed forces, and not covered by a valid Cargo Navicert or, in the case of goods shipped from a British or Allied port, by a valid Export or Transhipment Licence, where such Licence is required, shall, until the contrary is established, be deemed to have an

enemy destination.

(2) Goods shipped from any port from which goods of enemy origin or ownership might have been shipped, and not covered by a valid Certificate of Origin and Interest, shall, until the contrary is established, be deemed to be of enemy origin or ownership.

4. Goods of enemy origin or ownership shall

be liable to condemnation.

5. Any vessel seized under Article 2 hereof and carrying contraband or goods of enemy origin or ownership shall be liable to condemnation in respect of such carriage.

6.—(1) A Ship or Cargo Navicert, Export or Transhipment Licence ceases to be valid if any condition or direction to which it is subject

is not observed.

(2) A Ship Navicert ceases to be valid if, after obtaining it, the vessel calls at an enemy port or (unless otherwise indicated in the Navicert) at any port other than a declared port of destination.

The provisions of this Order shall not apply to any vessel which left her last port of departure before the 1st day of August, 1940, on her way to or from a port through which goods might reach or come from enemy termtory or the enemy armed forces, or to any goods carried in such a vessel,

8. Nothing in this Order shall be deemed to confer any immunity from detention, seizure or condemnation on any vessel or goods by reason of being provided with or covered by

any form of pass or permit.

9. Nothing in this Order shall affect the liability of any vessel or goods to detention, seizure or condemnation independently of this Order.

10. The law and practice in Prize shall, so far as applicable, be followed in all cases arising under this Order.

II. Proceedings under this Order may be taken in any Prize Court having jurisdiction to which the Prize Court Rules, 1939, apply.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1936, duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a Scheme bearing date the 23rd day of November, 1939, in the words and figures following, that is to say:-

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1936, have pre-pared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for effecting the union of the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Oakham and the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Burley, both of which Benefices are situate in the County of Rutland and in the Diocese of Peterborough:

"Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend Claude, Bishop of Peterborough, pursuant to the provisions of the said Measures to inquire into and report upon the union of the said two Benefices of Oakham and Burley duly made their Report to the said Bishop of Peterborough and therein recommended the union of the said two Benefices and the terms for effecting the union, and the said Bishop of Peterborough signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

"And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the union of the said two Benefices which Scheme is based upon the terms recommended in the said Report, but with the assent of the said Bishop Peterborough, embodies certain modifications thereof:

'And whereas the said Benefice of Oakham is now full, the Reverend Charles Octavius Richard Wormald being the present Incumbent thereof, and the said Benefice of Burley is at present vacant:

"And whereas the patronage of the said Benefices of Oakham and Burley now belongs to one and the same Patron:

"And whereas there is a pension-charge of £35 per annum payable out of the revenues of the said Benefice of Burley to a former Incumbent thereof:

" Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consents of the said Claude, Bishop of Peterborough, and of the said Charles Octavius Richard Wormald (testified by their respectively signing this Scheme) do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to

say:—
"I. That the said Benefice of Oakham and the said Benefice of Burley shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with Cure of Souls under the style of ' United Benefice of Oakham with Burley ' but the Parishes of the said Benefices shall continue in all respects distinct.

"2. That upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette the union shall forthwith take effect and the said Charles Octavius Richard Wormald, if he is then Incumbent of the said Benefice of Oakham, shall be the first Incumbent of the United Benefice.

3. That upon the said union taking effect the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Oakham shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice and so soon as conveniently may be the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Burley and the site and appurtenances thereof and the grounds heretofore usually occupied and enjoyed therewith shall be sold and disposed of by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners at such time or times and in such manner in all respects as to us shall seem expedient and that the net proceeds of such sale shall be appropriated and applied by us, in three equal portions, for the augmentation of the Benefices of Braunston with Brooke, Langham with Barleythorpe and Hambleton with Egleton respectively, all in the said Diocese of Peterborough.

"4. That upon the said union taking effect provision shall be made by the Incumbent of the United Benefice for employing the services of a Curate to assist him in the performance of his duties and a part of the endowments of the United Benefice, that is to say, during the incumbency of the said Charles Octavius Richard Wormald (if under Clause 2 of this Scheme he becomes the first Incumbent of the United Benefice) £122 per annum and during any other incumbency thereof £175 per annum of the sum of money appropriated or to be appropriated by the Governors of Queen Anne's Bounty to the said Benefice of Oakham pursuant to the provisions of Part II, paragraph 2, of the Third Schedule to the Tithe Act, 1936, and paragraph 1 of the Eighth Schedule to the same Act shall be appropriated by the said Governors as a fund towards meeting the cost of providing the services of a Curate as aforesaid and the income in respect of such appropriation shall be paid by the said Governors to the Diocesan Board of Finance of the Diocese as trustees to apply the same to the purpose aforesaid: Provided that during the incumbency of the said Charles Octavius Richard Wormald as aforesaid and so long as the said pension-charge of £35 per annum continues to be payable the amount to be paid by the said Governors to the said Diocesan Board shall be reduced to £87 per annum and such reduced amount shall be available for obtaining a Curate or clerical assistance.

"And provided further that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from making any other recommendations and proposals relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Measures, or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England, or of any Act of Parliament."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have been duly published in accordance with the provisions of the said Measures, and Notices have been transmitted to the persons or bodies entitled under the said Measures to receive Notice requiring any objections to such draft Scheme to be stated or transmitted in writing to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules applicable to proceedings under the said Measures:

And whereas certain objections have been so stated or transmitted to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the same Rules:

And whereas the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners after giving full consideration to such objections have deemed right to make no alterations in such draft Scheme:

And whereas public notice of the certification to His Majesty in Council of the said Scheme and the consent thereto in writing of the Bishop of Peterborough has been duly given in the manner and within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules aforesaid:

And whereas an appeal against the said Scheme has been made to His Majesty in Council by the Reverend G. A. Hassell and W. H. M. Finch (since deceased), and such appeal was referred to the Judicial Committee of the Privy Council by Order in Council of the 16th day of January, 1940:

whereas the Lords of the said Committee having taken the said appeal into consideration and the Appellant the Reverend G. A. Hassell having intimated the withdrawal of the said appeal, Their Lordships reported to His Majesty in Council their opinion that the appeal ought to be dismissed and the said Scheme be affirmed:

And whereas His Majesty was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, by Order of the 17th day of July, 1940, to approve the said Report:

And whereas the said Scheme has been

approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty by and with the advice of His said Council is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that the Benefices therein recommended to be united shall be united to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme and further to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the date when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measures.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Peterborough.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 33rd and 34th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 39, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say, the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 113, the Act of the 4th and 5th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 39, and the Act of the 31st and 32nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 114, duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a Scheme bearing date the 25th day of July, 1940, in the words and figures following, that is to say:

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for

England, in pursuance of the Act of the 33rd and 34th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 39, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say, the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 113, the Act of the 4th and 5th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 39, and the Act of the 31st and 32nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 114, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for effecting a transfer of the ownership of the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the Church and Cure (hereinafter called 'the said Benefice ') of Saint Michael, North Rode, in the County of Chester and in the Diocese of

Chester:
"Whereas the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Saint Michael, North Rode, is vested in Charles Russell Hall of Congleton in the County of Chester, Estate Agent, and William Francis Challinor formerly of Pickwood Leek in the County of Stafford but now of Little Hampden, Great Missenden, in the County of Buckingham, Esquire, as the Special Personal Representatives of the late George Percival Daintry and the said Charles Russell Hall and William Francis Challinor are therefore the Patrons or persons entitled to present or nominate to the said Benefice in case the same were now vacant:

"And whereas the said Charles Russell Hall and William Francis Challinor are desirous that the whole Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Saint Michael, North Rode, should be transferred to and be vested in the Bishop of Chester for the time being:

And whereas the Right Reverend Douglas now Bishop of Chester is willing to accept such transfer, and in token of such his willingness and also in token that the same transfer has that consent of the Bishop of the Diocese which by the hereinbefore mentioned Acts or by some or one of them is made necessary he the said Douglas, Bishop of Chester, has executed this Scheme as hereinafter mentioned:

"And whereas the transfer of the Patronage of the said Benefice of Saint Michael, North Rode, which is hereinbefore mentioned and hereinafter recommended and proposed will in our opinion tend to make better provision for the Cure of Souls in the parish or district in or in respect of which the right of Patronage or Advowson so recommended and proposed to be transferred as aforesaid arises or exists, that is to say, in the New Parish of Saint Michael, North Rode:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the said Charles Russell Hall and William Francis Challinor being the persons whose consent as Patrons is required by the provisions of the hereinbefore mentioned Acts and of the Act of the 1st and 2nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 106 (in testimony of which consent they have signed and sealed this Scheme), and with the consent of the said Douglas, Bishop of Chester (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme and sealed the same with his Episcopal Seal), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the whole Advowson

or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Saint Michael, North Rode, shall be transferred to the said Douglas, Bishop of Chester, and his successors in the same Bishopric and shall thereupon and thenceforth become and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the said Douglas, Bishop of Chester, and by his successors in the same Bishopric for ever.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any further or other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or of any of them or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Chester.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1936, duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a Scheme bearing date the 25th day of July, 1940, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1936, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for altering the boundaries of the Parish of Newark upon Trent (being one of the Parishes of the United Benefice of Newark with Coddington), of the New Parish of Christ Church, Newark upon Trent, of the Parish of Averham, of the Parish of Kelham, of the Parish of Balderton, of the Parish of East Stoke, of the Parish of Farndon, and of the Parish of Hawton, all in the County of Nottingham and in the Diocese of Southwell:

"Whereas it has been represented to us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, and it appears to us to be desirable that the boundaries of the said Parishes and New Parish should be altered in the manner which is hereinafter mentioned:

"And whereas the Benefices of the said Cures are now full, the Reverend Canon Alfred Parkinson being the present Incumbent of the United Benefice of Newark with Coddington, the Reverend James Edward Godsmark being the present Incumbent of the Benefice of Christ Church, Newark upon Trent, the Reverend Joseph Cyril Walker being the present Incumbent of the Benefice of Averham with Kelham, the Reverend William Henry Crewe being the present Incumbent of the Benefice of Balderton, the Reverend Edwin Ernest Fitz-Hugh being the present Incumbent of the Benefice of East Stoke, the Reverend Harold Frederick Hawkins being the present Incumbent of the Benefice of Farndon, and the Reverend Frederick Herbert Burnside being the present Incumbent of the Benefice of Hawton and such Incumbents have signified their consents to the proposals hereinafter mentioned by signing this Scheme:

"And whereas the Diocesan Committee of the said Diocese of Southwell, appointed pursuant to the first section of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, have by a Resolution passed at a meeting of the said Committee held on the 4th day of July, 1938, signified their consent to the alterations of boundaries herein

proposed:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Henry, Bishop of Southwell (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that from and after the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme and without any assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the boundaries of the said Cures shall be altered so that, first, all those portions of the said Parish of Kelham, of the said Parish of Averham, of the said Parish of East Stoke and of the said Parish of Farndon which are described in the First Schedule hereunder written and are delineated and set forth upon the map or plan hereunto annexed and are thereon coloured pink shall be annexed to and shall in future form part of the said Parish of Newark upon Trent and, secondly, all those portions of the said Parish of Newark upon Trent, of the said Parish of Hawton and of the said Parish of Balderton, which are described in the Second Schedule hereunder written and are delineated and set forth upon the said map or plan and are thereon coloured green shall be annexed to and shall in future form part of the said New Parish of Christ Church, Newark upon Trent.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from making any other recommendations and proposals relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Measures, or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England, or of any Act of Parliament.

'THE SCHEDULES to which the foregoing Scheme has reference.

"The First Schedule.

"The territory to be annexed to the Parish of Newark upon Trent, in the County of Nottingham, and in the Diocese of Southwell, comprising:—

"I. All those contiguous portions of the Parish of Kelham and the Parish of Averham, both in the said County and Diocese, which, taken together, are bounded upon the north by the Parish of South Muskham upon the

east partly by the New Parish of Saint Leonard, Newark upon Trent, both in the said County and Diocese, and partly by the said Parish of Newark upon Trent, upon the south, partly by a detached portion of the Parish of East Stoke, in the said County and Diocese, partly by a detached portion of the said Parish of Newark upon Trent, and partly by another detached portion of the said Parish of East Stoke and upon the remaining side, that is to say, upon the west, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the last mentioned detached portion of the said Parish of East Stoke from the said Parish of Averham at a point in the middle of Old Trent Dyke, opposite to the southern end of the fence which divides the close numbered 236 upon the Ordnance Survey maps of the Civil Parish of Averham published in the year 1919 upon the scale of 25 inches to a mile and also upon the map or plan annexed to this Scheme from the close numbered 238 upon the same maps and extending northward to and along the said fence for a distance of $9\frac{1}{2}$ chains or thereabouts to the point where it meets the southern side of the road leading from Southwell to Newark upon Trent, and extending thence north-westward diagonally across such road (thereby crossing the boundary which divides the said Parish of Averham from the said Parish of Kelham) for a distance of 13 yards or thereabouts to a point opposite the middle of the stream flowing between the closes numbered 262 and 263 on the Ordnance Survey map of the Civil Parish of Kelham published in the year 1919 upon the scale of 25 inches to a mile and also upon the map or plan annexed to this Scheme or Representation, and extending thus first northward and then north-eastward along the middle of the said stream for a distance of 34 chains or thereabouts to a point opposite the fence forming the boundary between the close numbered 238 and the close numbered 239 upon the last mentioned maps, and extending thence northward along such fence for a distance of II chains or thereabouts to the point where it reaches the southern side of the roadway forming the close numbered 231 upon the same maps, and extending thence north-westward to and along the middle of such roadway to a point opposite to the middle of the stream flowing towards Crankley Lane, and extending thence first northward and then north-eastward along the middle of such stream for a distance of 38 chains or thereabouts to the point where it meets the southern side of Crankley Lane upon the boundary which divides the said Parish of Kelham from the said Parish of South Muskham.

'II. "We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1936, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for effecting the union of the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Kilton with the Chapelry of Lilstock annexed and the Benefice (being a Rectory) of Kilve with the Vicarage of

Stringston annexed, both of which Benefices are situate in the County of Somerset and in the Diocese of Bath and Wells:
"Whereas Commissioners appointed at our

"Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend Francis, Bishop of Bath and Wells, pursuant to the provisions of the said Measures to inquire into and report upon the union of the said two Benefices of Kilton with Lilstock and Kilve with Stringston duly made their Report to the said Bishop of Bath and Wells and therein recommended the union of the said two Benefices and the terms for effecting the union, and the said Bishop of Bath and Wells signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the union of the said two Benefices which Scheme is based upon the terms recommended in the said Report but with the assent of the said Bishop of Bath and Wells embodies certain modifications thereof:

"And whereas both of the said Benefices are now full, the Reverend Samuel Hunter Shedden being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Kilton with Lilstock and the Reverend Digby James Hawker being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Kilve with Stringston:

That if upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette both of the said two Benefices shall be vacant, the union of the same two Benefices shall take effect forthwith; and if the said Benefice of Kilton with Lilstock only shall be then vacant the said union shall also take effect forthwith if the Incumbent of the other of the said two Benefices shall with the approval of the Bishop consent to become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice, but if he shall not so consent or if the Bishop shall not approve, then the said union shall take effect upon the then next avoidance of the said Benefice of Kilve with Stringston and the then Incumbent of Kilton with Lilstock shall be the first Incumbent of the United Benefice, and if the said Benefice of Kilve with Stringston only shall be then vacant the said union shall take effect upon the next avoidance of the said Benefice of Kilton with Lilstock and if neither of the said two Benefices be then vacant, then the said union shall take effect on the next. avoidance of the said Benefice of Kilton with: Lilstock if the Incumbent at that time of the said Benefice of Kilve with Stringston shall. have been instituted to that Benefice subsequently to the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme or if instituted before that date shall with the approval of the Bishop consent to become the Incumbent of the United Benefice, but if he shall have been instituted to the said Benefice of Kilve with Stringston before that date and shall not so consent or if the Bishop shall not approve, then the said union shall take effect immediately upon the next vacancy of the said Benefice of Kilve with Stringston following such avoidance of the said Benefice of Kilton with Lilstock and the then Incumbent of the said Benefice of Kilton with Lilstock shall become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice.

"3. That upon the said union taking effect the Parsonage House of the United Benefice shall be that one of the Parsonage Houses belonging to the said Benefices of Kilton with Lilstock and Kilve with Stringston which the Bishop of the Diocese shall in writing addressed to us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, assign or appropriate as the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice.

"4. That upon the union taking effect, provision shall be made by the Incumbent of the United Benefice for obtaining such clerical or lay assistance as shall from time to time be required by the Bishop and a portion of the endowments of the United Benefice, namely, a capital sum of £3,333 6s. 8d. being part of a sum of money appropriated or to be appropriated by Queen Anne's Bounty to the said Benefices of Kilton with Lilstock and Kilve with Stringston, pursuant to Sections 7 and 38 of the Tithe Act, 1936, and the provisions of Part II of the Third Schedule to the said Act and Paragraph I of the Eighth Schedule to the same Act shall be severed or diverted from the said Benefices and from the United Benefice and the sum of £3,333 6s. 8d. 3 per cent. Redemption Stock 1986/96 issued or to be issued to Queen Anne's Bounty pursuant to the provisions of Part II of the said Third Schedule and representing the said capital sum of £3,333 6s. 8d. shall be severed and diverted from the General Corporate Account of Queen Anne's Bounty and shall be held by Queen Anne's Bounty as a special fund with the same powers of sale and re-investment as if the said sum of stock were still held by Queen Anne's Bounty on their General Corporate Account and the income on the said fund, or on any securities or investments representing the same, or any part of such income as the Bishop shall from time to time direct shall be applied by the Incumbent towards the cost of such assistance and subject to such direction, may be enjoyed by him as part of the income of the United Benefice.

"5. That after the said union has taken effect the course and succession in which the respective Patrons shall present or nominate to the United Benefice from time to time as the same shall become vacant shall be as follows, that is to say, the right of presentation shall be exercised by the Patrons of the said two Benefices alternately, the Patron of that one of the said Benefices the Incumbent of which shall not become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice under any of the provisions of Clause 2 of this Scheme having the right upon the first presentation to the United Benefice to be made after the union and every alternate right of presentation and the Patron of the other of the said Benefices having the

right of presentation upon the second presentation to the United Benefice to be made after the union and every alternate turn thereafter.

The Medal of the Military Division of the Most Excellent Order of the British Empire, for Gallantry:—

Flying Officer Anthony Henry Hamilton TOLLEMACHE (90100), Auxiliary Air Force.

On the night of 11th March, 1940, this officer was pilot of an aircraft which carried a passenger and an air gunner and was engaged in a searchlight co-operation exercise. When approaching the flare-path to land, at 2320 hours, after completing the exercise, the aircraft struck a tree and crashed into a field, where it immediately burst into flames. Flying Officer Tollemache was thrown clear

of the wreckage, and his air gunner was able to escape. Realising, however, that his passenger was still in the aircraft Flying to escape. Officer Tollemache, with complete disregard of the intense conflagration or the explosion of small arms ammunition, endeavoured to break through the forward hatch and effect a rescue. He persisted in this gallant attempt until driven off with his clothes blazing. His efforts, though in vain, resulted in injuries which nearly cost him his life. Had he not attempted the rescue it is considered he would have escaped almost unscathed.

Pilot Officer Edward Donald Parker (76465), Royal Air Force Volunteer Reserve.

On the night of June 8th, 1940, this officer was first pilot of an aircraft detailed for bombing operations. Just after taking off in complete darkness the port engine failed. Displaying great coolness Pilot Officer Parker immediately raised the undercarriage and tried to fly straight on, but found that he could gain neither height or speed with his heavily loaded aircraft on only one engine. Reducing speed to 80 m.p.h. he switched off his engine and "felt" the aircraft into the nearest field in complete darkness. The aircraft crashed however and immediately burst into flames. Pilot Officer Parker jumped out and got clear to find that his navigator and air gunner were safe but the wireless operator was lying stunned near the burning aircraft. With complete disregard for his own personal safety and knowing there were four 500 lb. bombs in the wreckage, which might explode any moment, he returned and carried his wireless operator to a place of safety. During this action one of the bombs exploded and Pilot Officer Parker saved the airman further injury by throwing him to the ground. This officer displayed exceptional coolness, resourcefulness and courage throughout and, in face of extreme danger, undoubtedly saved the life of his wireless operator.

During the combat Squadron Leader Lott's aircraft was badly hit but, displaying great skill, despite an injury which eventually necessitated the removal of an eye, he brought his aircraft to within 3 miles of the base before he was compelled to abandon it. He has personally destroyed two enemy aircraft and possibly another. This officer has

displayed outstanding leadership and an intense desire to engage the enemy. He has set a magnificent example to all pilots in his squadron.

Awarded the Distinguished Flying Cross:

Squadron Leader John Worrall (26251).

This officer's splendid leadership has been reflected in the work of his squadron which has now destroyed forty-three enemy aircraft and possibly a further twenty-two. In July, 1940, he led his squadron in a successful attack against a superior number of enemy aircraft, and assisted in destroying three of the enemy force. Squadron Leader Worrall has displayed great skill, courage and leader-

Flying Officer Neville WILLIAMS, Royal New Zealand Air Force.

One night in July, 1940, this officer was captain of an aircraft engaged in bombing operations in the Ruhr area. During the return flight his aircraft was attacked by three enemy aircraft, and after a determined fight, one, and possibly two, were shot down: the third was driven off. In spite of his aircraft being riddled with bullets Flying Officer Williams successfully brought it back to its base. Since the beginning of the year he has taken part in twenty-one attacks on Norway, Germany, Holland, Belgium and France, and has shown outstanding determination and an extremely keen sense of duty. He has displayed coolness, courage and real leadership in all the numerous operations he has under-

Awarded the Distinguished Flying Cross. Pilot Officer Angus Robson (41471).

Awarded the Distinguished Flying Medal.

551385 Sergeant Wallace STOCKPORT.

One night in July, 1940, Pilot Officer Robson carried out a bombing attack on warships in the harbour at Wilhelmshaven. Undeterred by a terrific barrage of enemy gunfire, he swept down to the very low level of twenty feet above the buildings, and with conspicuous courage crossed the harbour and pressed home his attack on an enemy warship. Sergeant Stockport as wireless operator air gunner fired continuously at the enemy defences and searchlights with his machine guns. Pilot Officer Robson has consistently shown great daring and devotion to duty, and Sergeant Stockport by his courage and skill, has on many previous occasions contributed to the success of attacks on the enemy, often under the most trying weather conditions.

Awarded the Distinguished Flying Cross.

Pilot Officer James Frederick Swift (41080).

Since January, 1940, this officer has taken part in twenty-eight raids against the enemy. One night in July, 1940, he carried out an attack on the railway marshalling yard at Osnabruck. Despite the presence of a balloon barrage and a heavy concentration of anti-aircraft guns, he successfully attacked his target from an altitude of 700 feet. A few nights later Pilot Officer Swift was detailed to attack an aerodrome at Rotenburg. After waiting for forty-five minutes over the target, he carried out his attack at a low altitude and several of his bombs hit a hangar. The target was also machine gunned from a height of 300 feet and, in addition, two trains just south of the target were subjected to this form of attack. This officer has, at all times, displayed the utmost determination and courage with a complete disregard for his own personal safety.

Pilot Officer William Frank TUDHOPE (41224).

Awarded the Distinguished Flying Medal. 581261 Sergeant Lewis Smith Belton.

One night in July, 1940, Pilot Officer Tudhope was captain of an aircraft which delivered an attack on enemy warships in Wilhelmshaven harbour from an altitude of only 50 feet. The aircraft was subjected to terrific anti-aircraft fire and was badly hit by a high explosive shell. In spite of this, a second attack was attempted, but owing to the extreme density of the gunfire, one engine was badly damaged and the navigator's cabin was riddled with holes. In spite of this ordeal, Sergeant Belton, the navigator and bomb aimer, with great coolness and courage continued his duties, and enabled Pilot Officer Tudhope to bring the damaged aircraft safely home. This officer and non-commissioned officer have shown conspicuous gallantry and devotion to duty on many previous occasions.

Awarded the Distinguished Flying Medal. 565152 Sergeant Sidney Ben Fuller.

551854 Sergeant Albert Gorsuch Goulder.

Sergeant Fuller was captain of an aircraft which made an attack on warships in the harbour at Wilhelmshaven one night in July, 1940. Despite searchlight glare, and an intense enemy barrage the operation was successful. Sergeant Fuller delivered his attack from a few feet above the docks, and though the aircraft was hit by enemy gunfire Sergeant Goulder, the wireless operator air gunner, directed a heavy fire at the enemy from his machine guns. These airmen have invariably shown conspicuous courage and devotion to duty.

626213 Sergeant Lewis Alan White.

One night in July, 1940, Sergeant White was rear gunner in an aircraft which was attacked by three enemy aircraft when over the aerodrome of Wessel at a height of 14,000 feet. Two enemy aircraft were sent down out of control, and the third flew away and was not seen again. The airframe and turret surrounding Sergeant White's position were riddled with bullets, but he exhibited a high degree of skill, combined with clear thinking and quick judgment in dealing successfully with this combined attack. He has been continuously employed as wireless operator air gunner on operational work, and has carried out a total of fourteen attacks on targets in Norway, Denmark, Germany, Holland, Belgium and France.
