The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 8th and 9th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 70, of the Act of the 14th and 15th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 97, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 55, duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a Representation, bearing date the 6th day of June, 1940, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

“ We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 8th and 9th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 70, of the Act of the 14th and 15th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 97, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 55, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Representation as to the assignment of a Consolidated Chapelry to the consecrated Church known as Christ Church, Orpington, situate within the Parish of Chelsfield in the County of Kent and in the Diocese of Rochester:

“ Whereas at certain extremities of the said Parish of Chelsfield and of the Parish of Orpington in the said County and Diocese which said extremities lie contiguous one to another, and are described in the Schedule hereunder written, there is collected together a population which is situate at a distance from the several churches of such Parishes:

“ And whereas it appears to us to be expedient that certain contiguous portions (being the portions containing the population aforesaid) of the said Parishes should be formed into a Consolidated Chapelry for all ecclesiastical purposes, and that the same should be assigned to the said Church known as Christ Church, Orpington, situate as aforesaid:

“ Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Christopher, Bishop of Rochester, as such Bishop (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Representation), with the consent of the Warden and College of the Souls of All Faithful People Deceased of Oxford, as the Patrons of the Rectory of the said Parish of Chelsfield (in testimony whereof they have affixed their Common or Corporate Seal to this Representation), and with the consent of the Dean and Chapter of the Cathedral Church of Christ and the Blessed Virgin Mary, Rochester, as the Patrons of the Vicarage of the said Parish of Orpington (in testimony whereof they have affixed their Common or Capitular Seal to this Representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly represent, that it would, in our opinion, be expedient that all those contiguous portions of the said Parishes which are described in the Schedule hereunder written, all which portions, together with the boundaries thereof, are delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, should be united and formed into one Consolidated Chapelry for the said Church known as Christ Church, Orpington, situate as aforesaid, and that the same should be named ‘The Consolidated Chapelry of Christ Church, Orpington.’

“ THE SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Representation has reference.

“ The Consolidated Chapelry of Christ Church, Orpington, comprising:—

“ All those contiguous portions of the Parish of Chelsfield and of the Parish of Orpington, both in the County of Kent and in the Diocese of Rochester, which taken together are bounded upon the south-west by the New Parish of Saint Mary, Greenstreet Green, in the said County and Diocese, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the south, upon the south-east, upon the east, upon the north and upon the west by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Mary, Greenstreet Green, from the said Parish of Chelsfield at the centre of the bridge which carries Warren Road across the Main Line of the Eastern Section of the Southern Railway, and extending thence eastward along the middle of Warren Road for a distance of 17 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Highways Road, and extending thence north-eastward along the middle of Highways Road for a distance of 30½ chains or thereabouts to its junction with Orpington By-Pass Road and extending thence north-eastward in a straight line for a distance of 35 chains or thereabouts to the point where the boundary which divides the said Parish of Chelsfield from the said Parish of Orpington crosses the middle of Chelsfield Lane, and extending thence north-westward along the middle of Chelsfield Lane for a distance of 7½ chains or thereabouts to its junction with the road called Craven Estate, and extending thence first westward and then northward along the middle of Craven Estate (thereby twice crossing the boundary which divides the said Parish of Orpington from the said Parish of Chelsfield) for a distance of 34 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Avalon Road, and extending thence westward along the middle of Avalon Road (thereby again twice crossing the last mentioned boundary) for a distance of 34 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Orpington By-Pass Road, and extending thence southward along the middle of Orpington By-Pass Road for a distance of 2 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Spur Road, and extending thence westward along the middle of Spur Road for a distance of 43 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Sevenoaks Road, and extending thence southward along the middle of Sevenoaks Road for a distance of 40 chains or thereabouts to the centre of the bridge which carries the said Main Line of the Eastern Section of the Southern Railway across Sevenoaks Road where the boundaries of the said Parish of Orpington, of the said New Parish of Saint Mary, Greenstreet Green, and of the Parish of Farnborough, in the said County and Diocese, all meet.”

And whereas the said Representation has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Rochester.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1936, duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a Scheme bearing date the 25th day of July, 1940, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

“ We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1936, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for effecting the unions (1) of the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Spennymoor, Saint Paul, with a part of the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Whitworth and (2) of the Benefice (being a Rectory) of Byers Green with the remaining part of the said Benefice of Whitworth, all of which Benefices are situate in the County of Durham and in the Diocese of Durham:

“ Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend Alwyn Terrell Petre, Bishop of Durham, pursuant to the provisions of the said Measures to inquire into and report upon the unions (1) of the said Benefice of Spennymoor, Saint Paul, with a part of the said Benefice of Whitworth and (2) of the said Benefice of Byers Green with the remaining part of the said Benefice of Whitworth duly made their Report to the said Bishop of Durham and therein recommended such unions and the terms for effecting the same and the said Bishop of Durham signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

“ And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, have prepared this Scheme for the said unions based upon the terms recommended in the said Report:

“ And whereas the said Benefice of Spennymoor, Saint Paul, is now full, the Reverend Kenneth Moir Carey being the present Incumbent thereof and the said Benefices of Whitworth and Byers Green are at present vacant:

“ And whereas the endowments of the said Benefice of Whitworth are held partly by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, and partly by Queen Anne's Bounty, and in part arise from glebe:

“ And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, have agreed to continue towards the stipend of a second Assistant Curate in the United Benefice, hereinafter firstly recommended a grant of £120 per annum at present made towards the stipend of a first Assistant Curate in Saint Paul, Spennymoor:

“ Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consents of the said Alwyn Terrell Petre, Bishop of Durham, and of the said Kenneth Moir Carey

(testified by their respectively signing this Scheme), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

" 1. That the said Benefice of Spennymoor, Saint Paul, and a part of the said Benefice of Whitworth, namely, all that part of the last-named Benefice which lies to the north of the Bishop Auckland and Ferryhill Branch Line and of the Toddhill Branch Line of the London and North Eastern Railway shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with cure of souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Whitworth with Spennymoor' but that the parishes of the said Benefices shall continue distinct in all respects.

" 2. That the said Benefice of Byers Green and the remaining part of the said Benefice of Whitworth shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with cure of souls and one parish for ecclesiastical purposes under the style of 'The Benefice of Byers Green' (hereinafter referred to as the United Benefice of Byers Green).

" 3. That the Church of the Parish of Byers Green shall be the Parish Church of the United Parish of Byers Green and that the Table of Fees for the said Parish of Byers Green shall (until revised or altered by proper authority) be the Table of Fees for the United Parish.

" 4. That upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette the unions shall forthwith take effect and the said Kenneth Moir Carey if he is then Incumbent of the said Benefice of Spennymoor, Saint Paul, shall be the first Incumbent of the United Benefice of Whitworth with Spennymoor.

" 5. That upon the said unions taking effect the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Spennymoor, Saint Paul, shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice of Whitworth with Spennymoor and so soon as conveniently may be the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Whitworth and the site and appurtenances thereof and the grounds heretofore usually occupied and enjoyed therewith shall be sold and disposed of by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners at such time or times and in such manner in all respects as to us shall seem expedient and that the net proceeds of such sale shall constitute and form part of the Expenses Fund established pursuant to the 32nd Section of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, to the intent that grants shall thereafter be made out of such Fund of such amounts as shall with the approval of us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, be recommended by the Bishop of Durham, towards the cost of (a) providing a Parish Hall for the benefit of the area known as Page Bank in the Parish of Whitworth and (b) repairing the Church of Saint Barnabas, Binchester, in the Parish of the said United Benefice of Byers Green.

" 6. That upon the said unions taking effect the glebe at present belonging to the said Benefice of Whitworth shall be annexed to the said United Benefice of Whitworth with Spennymoor as part of the endowment thereof and all other the secured endowments of the said Benefice of Whitworth now held by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, and by Queen Anne's Bounty shall be assigned for

the endowment of two assistant curacies as follows, viz.:—

" (a) a sum of £1,754 9s. 6d. Local Loans £3 per cent. Stock and a sum of £2,710 1s. 10d. £3 per cent. Redemption Stock now held by Queen Anne's Bounty on behalf of the said Benefice of Whitworth shall be annexed to that part of the Benefice of Whitworth united to the Benefice of Byers Green and shall be held by Queen Anne's Bounty for endowment of an assistant curacy in the said United Benefice of Byers Green; and

" (b) all other the secured endowments of Whitworth now held by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, and by Queen Anne's Bounty, shall be annexed to that part of the Benefice of Whitworth united to the Benefice of Spennymoor, Saint Paul, and shall be held for endowment of an Assistant Curacy in the said United Benefice of Whitworth with Spennymoor;

and the income therefrom shall be paid by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners or by Queen Anne's Bounty as the case may be as it accrues due to the Diocesan Board of Finance of the Diocese of Durham upon trust to apply the same as to £133 18s. 8d. per annum in or towards the stipend of an assistant Curate working in the said parish and United Benefice of Byers Green and as to the balance in or towards the stipend of an Assistant Curate working in the said parishes and United Benefice of Whitworth with Spennymoor.

" Provided that as from the same date the annual sum of £120 at present payable by us towards the stipend of an Assistant Curate working in the said parish and Benefice of Byers Green shall also be paid by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners to the said Diocesan Board of Finance upon trust to apply the said sum in or towards the stipend of the Assistant Curate in Byers Green hereinbefore referred to.

" Provided further that as from the same date the annual sum of £120 at present payable by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for an Assistant Curate in the parish of Spennymoor shall be payable by us only if two curates are employed in the United Benefice of Spennymoor with Whitworth.

" 7. That with the consent of the Dean and Chapter of Durham as the Patrons of the Benefice of Merrington in the said County and Diocese and also as the Patrons of the said Benefice of Spennymoor, Saint Paul (in testimony whereof they have caused their Common or Capitular Seal to be affixed to this Scheme), and with the consent of the Reverend Matthew Richardson, being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Merrington (testified by his signing this Scheme), upon the unions taking effect there shall be transferred for all ecclesiastical purposes to the Parish of Spennymoor, Saint Paul, all that portion of the Parish of Merrington which lies to the north-west of the Binchester Colliery Railway.

" 8. That after the said unions have taken effect (a) the Patronage of the said United Benefice of Whitworth with Spennymoor shall belong wholly to the patrons of the said Benefice of Spennymoor, Saint Paul, and (b) the patronage of the said United Benefice of Byers

Green shall belong wholly to the Patron of the said Benefice of Byers Green.

" Provided that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from making any other recommendations and proposals relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Measures, or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England, or of any Act of Parliament."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have been duly published in accordance with the provisions of the said Measures, and Notices have been transmitted to the persons or bodies entitled under the said Measures to receive Notice requiring any objections to such draft Scheme to be stated or transmitted in writing to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules applicable to proceedings under the said Measures:

And whereas the prescribed time has elapsed and no such objections have been so stated or transmitted to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners:

And whereas public notice of the certification to His Majesty in Council of the said Scheme and the consent thereto in writing of the Bishop of Durham has been duly given in the manner and within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules aforesaid:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that the Benefices therein recommended to be united shall be united to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme and further to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the date when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measures.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Durham.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of His late Majesty King William the Fourth, Chapter 77, and of the Act of the 5th and 6th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 26, duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a Scheme bearing date the 25th day of July, 1940, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

" We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of His late Majesty King William the Fourth, Chapter 77, and of the Act of the 5th and 6th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 26, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for authorising certain

improvements at the Episcopal House of Residence belonging to the See of Peterborough:

" Whereas the Right Reverend Claude Martin, now Bishop of Peterborough, is desirous that certain works should be executed at the said Episcopal House of Residence and has submitted to us the particulars and we have specified our general approval thereof:

" And whereas the said Bishop is also desirous and it appears to us to be expedient that towards the cost of effecting the aforesaid works a sum of £130 should be provided by way of advance from us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, to be repaid out of the emoluments of the Bishopric of Peterborough:—

" Now, therefore, with the consent of the said Claude Martin, Bishop of Peterborough (testified by his having affixed his signature and Episcopal Seal to this Scheme), we the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that the said Bishop be authorised to borrow and that we be authorised to advance and pay to him a sum of £130, and that the whole or any part or parts of the said sum of £130 so to be advanced shall be applied by us at such time or times and in such manner as shall appear to us to be expedient towards effecting the said works, and that such sum of £130 shall be repaid with interest thereon as hereinafter mentioned, in the manner following, that is to say, during the period of ten years from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme, the said Bishop or his successors shall at the end of each year pay to us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, one-tenth part of the said principal sum of £130 and shall also at the end of each year pay interest at the rate of 4 per centum per annum on the said principal sum or on so much thereof as shall from time to time remain unpaid or alternatively it shall be permissible for us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, to provide for the repayment of the said sum of £130 and interest thereon or on outstanding balances, as aforesaid, by way of a yearly deduction during the said period of ten years from the annual sum payable by us to the said Bishop of Peterborough and his successors.

" Provided that if the Bishop shall at any time pay to us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, the whole or any part of the sum borrowed with interest to the date of such repayment, the liability for repayment resting upon the Bishop and his successors shall be thereupon cancelled or reduced.

" And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in conformity with the provisions of the herein named Acts or of either of them or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the Diocese of Peterborough:
