At the Court at *Buckingham Palace*, the 7th day of *August*, 1940.

PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 5th day of August, 1940 (C.W. 16329/40), in the words following, viz.:—

"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions or other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas Your Majesty was graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council dated 16th April, 1923, to sanction regulations governing the compulsory retirement of Officers of the Royal Marines after periods of non-service:

"And whereas a revised establishment of General Officers, Royal Marines, was sanctioned by Your Order in Council dated 3rd March, 1936:

"And whereas, under existing regulations, Officers of the Royal Marines for whom no further employment is intended may be promoted to General Officer and qualify for the scale of retired pay attaching to the higher rank:

"And whereas we consider it desirable to amend the existing regulations concerning the conditions of service and retirement of such Officers:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to sanction the introduction of the regulations in the annexed schedule.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in these proposals."

" SCHEDULE.

" 1. Not more than two of the officers who have been appointed as Colonels Commandant to be promoted to the rank of Major General at Admiralty discretion during the tenure of their appointments, without alteration to the total number of such appointments.

" 2. Officers so promoted to receive the full pay of a Major General together with Entertaining Allowance of 10s. a day and Duty Allowance of 5s. a day. The Good Service Pension payable under present regulations to such officers to be in abeyance.

" 3. An officer so promoted, when he relinquishes his command, if it is decided that he will not be further employed, to be placed on the Retired List in the rank of Major General with retired pay of £950 per annum. If, however, further employment, either as Adjutant General or otherwise, be probable, such an officer to be retained on the Active List as a Major General additional to establishment and to receive full pay while awaiting further employment.

" 4. The officer selected to be Adjutant General to be promoted to the rank of Lieutenant General on appointment. The regulations as to his promotion to General to remain as at present.

" 5. The foregoing regulations to apply to all officers promoted to the rank of Colonel Second Commandant on or after the 1st May,

1940. Officers promoted to that rank before that date to remain under existing regulations as regards retirement and non-effective pay, though with option to come under the new conditions. Such option to be exercised before completion of period as Commandant and, once exercised, to be irrevocable."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

ROYAL AIR FORCE.

The KING has been graciously pleased to approve the undermentioned awards in recognition of gallantry displayed in flying operations against the enemy:—

Awarded a Bar to the Distinguished Flying Cross.

Flight Lieutenant Adolph Gysbert MALAN, D.F.C. (37604).

Since the end of May, 1940, this officer has continued to lead his flight and, on many occasions the squadron, in numerous successful engagements against the enemy. During the Dunkirk operations he shot down three enemy aircraft and assisted in destroying a further three. In June, 1940, during a night attack by enemy aircraft, he shot down two Heinkel III's. His magnificent leadership, skill and courage have been largely responsible for the many successes obtained by his squadron.

Awarded the Distinguished Flying Cross.

Squadron Leader John Ralph Alexander PEEL (33011).

This officer's outstanding quality as a leader has raised the flying standard and morale of his squadron to the highest pitch. During a period of thirteen days in July, he destroyed at least two enemy aircraft. On one occasion, although his aircraft had been badly damaged in action, he followed and shot down a Dornier 17 twenty-five miles from the coast and eventually had to abandon his own aircraft over the sea. He was picked up by a lifeboat when on the verge of losing

consciousness, but was again leading his squadron the next morning.

Acting Flight Lieutenant John ELLIS (37850).

This officer was employed on offensive patrols over Dunkirk during the evacuation of the British Expeditionary Force and led his flight with great courage. On two occasions, whilst deputising for his Commanding Officer, he led a patrol of four squadrons, displaying great initiative and leadership. During these patrols Flight Lieutenant Ellis destroyed two enemy aircraft. Later, whilst engaged on home defence duties, he shot down one enemy bomber. In July, 1940, whilst leading the squadron, he destroyed two enemy aircraft and on the following day he shot down a further three of eight enemy aircraft destroyed by his squadron. Flight Lieutenant Ellis has displayed courage and leadership of a high order.

Flying Officer Alister John Oswald JEFFREY (39740)—now reported missing.

This officer has displayed gallantry and skill in engagements against the enemy. He has destroyed three enemy aircraft in air combat, and on two occasions has carried out attacks on enemy bases, destroying at least four aircraft on the ground.

Pilot Officer John Connell FREEBORN (70854).

This officer has taken part in nearly all offensive patrols carried out by his squadron since the commencement of the war, including operations over the Low Countries and Dunkirk, and, more recently, engagements over the Channel and S.E. of England. During this period of intensive air warfare he has destroyed four enemy aircraft. His high courage and exceptional abilities as a leader have materially contributed to the notable successes and high standard of efficiency maintained by his squadron.

Pilot Officer Dorian George GRIBBLE (40695).

Since the outbreak of war, this young officer has taken part in most of the offensive patrols carried out by his squadron, including operations over the Low Countries and Dunkirk, and intensive air fighting over the Channel. Pilot Officer Gribble has led his section, and recently his flight, in a courageous and determined manner. On one offensive patrol, having expended his ammunition, he did not hesitate to lead two other pilots of his section, under severe cross-fire, in an attack against a formation of six Dornier 17's. As a result the effective bombing of an important convoy was prevented. This officer has personally destroyed three Messerschmitt 109's, and damaged many others.

Awarded a Bar to the Distinguished Flying Medal.

562984 Flight Sergeant William Henry FRANKLIN, D.F.M.

Since the 22nd May, 1940, this airman has shot down ten enemy aircraft and assisted in destroying a further two. On two occasions, during these engagements, he shot down two Messerschmitt 109's in one sortie. On another occasion, after chasing a Messerschmitt across the Channel to Calais, he encountered seven enemy fighters, five of which he engaged, destroying one of them.
