Miss Peggy Prince, Air Raid Precautions ambulance driver, Dymchurch, set out from there in her small canoe, accompanied by a soldier, to try and pick up the remaining members of the crew. After searching for some time the boat returned. Miss Prince was not satisfied and elected to go out again by herself in the canoe. On this journey she picked up a Sergeant Wireless Operator, who was clinging to a buoy. Somehow the exhausted airman was got into the small canoe, and his rescuer paddled back to her home. He undoubtedly owes his life to Miss Prince's courage and determination.

ROYAL AIR FORCE.

The KING has been graciously pleased to
 confer the Victoria Cross on the undermen-
 tioned officer, in recognition of most conspicuous
 bravery:—

Acting Flight Lieutenant Roderick Alastair
 Brook LEAROYD (37860).

This officer, as first pilot of a Hampden
 aircraft, has repeatedly shown the highest
 conception of his duty and complete in-
 difference to personal danger in making
 attacks at the lowest altitudes regardless of
 opposition. On the night of 12th August,
 1940, he was detailed to attack a special
 objective on the Dortmund-Ems Canal. He
 had attacked this objective on a previous
 occasion and was well aware of the risks
 entailed. To achieve success it was necessary
 to approach from a direction well known to
 the enemy, through a lane of especially dis-
 posed anti-aircraft defences, and in the face
 of the most intense point blank fire from
 guns of all calibres. The reception of the
 preceding aircraft might well have deterred
 the stoutest heart, all being hit and two lost.
 Flight Lieutenant Learoyd nevertheless made
 his attack at 150 feet, his aircraft being
 repeatedly hit and large pieces of the main
 planes torn away. He was almost blinded
 by the glare of many searchlights at close
 range but pressed home this attack with the
 greatest resolution and skill. He subsequently
 brought his wrecked aircraft home and, as
 the landing flaps were inoperative and the
 undercarriage indicators out of action, waited
 for dawn in the vicinity of his aerodrome
 before landing, which he accomplished
 without causing injury to his crew or further
 damage to the aircraft. The high courage,
 skill and determination, which this officer
 has invariably displayed on many occasions
 in the face of the enemy, sets an example
 which is unsurpassed.

Awarded a Second Bar to the Distinguished Service Order.

Wing Commander Basil Edward EMBRY, D.S.O., A.F.C. (09252).

During the operations over the Low Countries and France, Wing Commander Embry continued to display an extremely high standard of leadership and resolution in carrying out all the tasks allotted to his squadron, raising its morale to a high level and setting an example to the other squadrons in his group. He has shown a high sense of duty and determination.

Awarded a Bar to the Distinguished Flying Cross.

Acting Flight Lieutenant Adrian Hope BOYD D.F.C. (39101).

This flight commander has been actively engaged in flying operations against the enemy since the commencement of hostilities. By fine leadership and dauntless spirit he has enabled his flight to destroy a large number of enemy aircraft of which he has himself, shot down, or severely damaged, at least twelve.

Acting Flight Lieutenant Roy Gilbert DUTTON D.F.C. (39072).

This officer has led patrols with conspicuous success and has personally destroyed at least twelve enemy aircraft. He has displayed splendid qualities of leadership and courage, with a complete disregard for his own safety.

Awarded the Distinguished Flying Cross.

Squadron Leader Gerald Barnard KEILY, A.F.C. (27256).

On 28th July, 1940, Squadron Leader Keily was the pilot of an aircraft detailed to carry out a special reconnaissance over Libya. The reconnaissance had to be carried out at a low altitude owing to clouds. He was attacked by five enemy aircraft but, displaying great skill, he destroyed one of them. During the engagement the air observer was hit by a bullet. Notwithstanding the handicap of having the air observer's body leaning against him, Squadron Leader Keily continued with the reconnaissance, returning with information of great value. He has invariably displayed exceptional leadership, courage, and devotion to duty.

Awarded the Distinguished Flying Medal.

563426 Flight Sergeant Frederick George BERRY.

On 17th June, 1940, whilst leading a section on patrol over Saint Nazaire, to cover the embarkation of the British Expeditionary Force, Sergeant Berry attacked and shot down an enemy bomber about to make an attack on one of the troopships. Sergeant Berry has on many occasions led his section, and often his flight, in combat against the enemy with success. He has displayed exceptional qualities as a leader.

563046 Sergeant Arthur Victor CLOWES.

Sergeant Clowes has displayed courage and determination in many combats against the enemy. He has destroyed at least six enemy aircraft. On 14th June, 1940, he led his section in combat against five Messerschmitt 109's and destroyed one. He then observed, above him, three further enemy aircraft and, before they could attack his flight, he engaged them. He succeeded in damaging one and in causing the other two to disperse in the clouds. He has displayed great skill and power of leadership.
