## TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS.

1. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office, at the Bank of England, on Friday, the 30th August,

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000, £10,000, £50,000 or £100,000. They will be dated at the option of the Tenderer on any business day from Monday, the 2nd September, 1940 to Saturday, the 7th September, 1940, inclusive, and will be payable at three months after date.

3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000, and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.

The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same not later than the following day, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of Cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not later than 1.30 p.m. (Saturday 12 noon) on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated.

7. Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills.

**THE FOREST OF DEAN DISTRICT (COAL MINES)  
SCHEME, 1930.**

**SCHEDULE.**

The Forest of Dean District (Coal Mines) Scheme, 1930, shall be amended in the following manner:—

1. After Clause 76, there shall be added the following clause:

76A.—(1) The Executive Board shall have power out of the District Fund to pay such sums as it thinks fit to any person upon his or her retirement from the service of or on ceasing to be employed by the Executive Board or upon his or her death or upon the happening of any other event which may be specified by the Executive Board and in connection therewith shall also have power to establish a Pensions Fund and to take out policies of insurance or indemnity and to make any payments due from the

Executive Board to such Pensions Fund and under such policies of insurance or indemnity out of the District Fund.

(2) The Scheme for such Staff Pensions Fund may provide that the Board may enter into agreements with the trustees of any Staff Pensions Fund in operation at the coal mine of the owner or with any owner who desires to establish a Staff Pensions Fund with regard to the payments to be made into or out of the Staff Pensions Fund established by the Board in respect of any officers and servants who shall be taken over or employed by the Board or who shall leave the employment of the Board and for the benefits to be received out of such Fund by any such person.

2. Clause 3 of the Schedule shall be re-numbered 3 (i), and to Clause 3 there shall be added the following sub-clause:

(ii) If the Board shall at any time after the said date establish a Staff Pensions Fund the Board shall be entitled to terminate any payment made by them under the foregoing sub-clause and to enrol the sales employee in the Staff Pensions Fund of the Board.

#### ROYAL AIR FORCE.

The KING has been graciously pleased to approve the undermentioned awards, in recognition of gallantry displayed in flying operations against the enemy:—

*Awarded the Distinguished Flying Cross.*

Acting Flight Lieutenant Lionel Manley GAUNCE (37632).

This flight commander has displayed excellent coolness and leadership since the return of the squadron to England. In July, 1940, his flight took part in resisting an enemy air attack on Dover, when three of our aircraft were attacked by forty Junkers 87's. At least two of the enemy aircraft were shot down. Flight Lieutenant Gaunce has shot down three enemy aircraft since returning to England.

Flying Officer Peter COLLARD (90402), Auxiliary Air Force, since reported missing.

During operations in France, and in particular during a period in May, 1940, this officer took part in almost every patrol undertaken by the squadron and destroyed two enemy aircraft. Since his return to England, Flying Officer Collard has continued his excellent work and has destroyed a further four enemy aircraft.

Pilot Officer Petrus Hendrik HUGO (41848).

Pilot Officer Hugo has displayed great keenness to engage the enemy on every possible occasion. During June and July, 1940, he destroyed five enemy aircraft.

740042 Sergeant James Harry LACEY, Royal Air Force Volunteer Reserve.

Sergeant Lacey has taken part in numerous patrols against the enemy. He has displayed great determination and coolness in combat, and has destroyed six enemy aircraft.

745789 Sergeant Leslie Stuart MILLEN, Royal Air Force Volunteer Reserve,

580536 Sergeant Richard Hayes CARR.

In August, 1940, Sergeant Millen was the pilot of an aircraft detailed to attack a target at Brest. During the attack he was severely wounded by anti-aircraft fire and throughout the remainder of the flight was unable to use his left arm. Sergeant Carr, the observer, then took the pilot's seat in order that he could apply an improvised tourniquet. During this operation he also controlled the aircraft and under these great difficulties undoubtedly saved the pilot's life. Again changing places, Sergeant Millen returned to the controls and, although he collapsed several times on the way back, he succeeded in bringing his aircraft safely to a home station. Both airmen displayed great courage, determination and devotion to duty of a high order.
