TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS.

1. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office, at the Bank of England, on Friday, the 6th September, 1940, at 1 p.m., for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, the National Debt Act, 1889, and the National Loans Acts, 1939 and 1940, to the amount of £65,000,000.

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000, £10,000, £50,000 or £100,000. They will be dated at the option of the Tenderer on any business day from Monday, the 9th September, 1940, to Saturday, the 14th September, 1940, inclusive, and will be payable at three months after date.

3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000, and must specify the date on

which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.

6. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same not later than the following day, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of Cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not later than 1.30 p.m. (Saturday 12 noon) on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated.

7. Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills.

8. Tenders must be made on the printed forms which may be obtained from the Chief Cashier's Office, Bank of England.

The KING has been pleased, upon the recommendation of the Minister of Shipping, to award Bronze Medals for Gallantry in Saving Life at sea to Neville Charles Eric Little, Third Officer, Valla Pema, Lascar, and Jairam Narron, Lascar, in the s.s. "Barpeta" in recognition of their services in rescuing, on the 14th September, 1939, four members of the crew of an aircraft of the Royal Air Force in India, which had made a forced landing.

A boat had put off from the "Barpeta" to rescue the aircraft crew from the shore. The surf was very heavy and the boat was unable to pass through more than the first line of breakers, about three-quarters of a mile off the shore. It was necessary for Mr. Little, Valla Pema and Jairam Narron to swim to the shore and assist the rescued men through the water to the boat. There was a strong and dangerous tide and a risk of being incapacitated by the men who were rescued, three of whom were unable to swim.

ROYAL AIR FORCE.

The KING has been graciously pleased to approve the undermentioned appointment and awards, in recognition of gallantry displayed in flying operations against the enemy:—

Appointed a Companion of the Distinguished Service Order.

Acting Squadron Leader Michael Nicholson CROSSLEY, D.F.C. (37554).

This officer has led his section, flight and squadron with skill and courage and has flown almost continuously since the commencement of hostilities. Since May, he has participated in engagements against the enemy over Holland, Belgium and France, including patrols over Dunkirk and St. Valery during the evacuation operations. In August he destroyed two Junkers 88 over Portsmouth and assisted in the destruction of another over Croydon. During the latter engagement he encountered another Junkers 88 and, having expended all his ammunition, acted as above guard until two of his section finally destroyed it. The next day he destroyed three enemy aircraft. Squadron Leader Crossley has now destroyed a total of eighteen enemy aircraft and possibly another five. He has displayed rare qualities as a leader; his example of courage and tenacity of purpose have proved an inspiration to other members of his squadron.

Awarded the Distinguished Flying Cross.

Acting Squadron Leader John David Drought COLLIER (39037).

One night in August, 1940, this officer led a successful attack on an enemy oil refinery and storage tanks. After identifying the target, he carried out a low level attack from 100 feet obtaining direct hits which set the target ablaze. Intense fire from local defences was experienced, but these were eventually silenced by the explosion of the tanks and the gun positions became enveloped in flames. The target was completely destroyed. Previously, in August, 1940, Acting Squadron Leader Collier was the leader of the diversionary aircraft which carried out a low attack on a target and the defences in the vicinity. In spite of his aircraft having been hit in many places, this officer continued his attacks, until the main attack was completed. He has invariably displayed outstanding qualities of leadership, skill, courage and devotion to duty.

Acting Flight Lieutenant Patrick Windsor LYNCH-BLOSSE (70690), Reserve of Air Force Officers.

One night in August, 1940, this officer carried out a determined bombing attack against an aircraft factory at Bernberg. The first attack was made by a dive to 3,000 feet. Owing to poor light the dive was not over

the centre of the factory and, in spite of intense opposition, he decided not to bomb but to make a fresh attack. This was made from 2,000 feet and direct hits by all bombs were made on the main buildings which immediately commenced to burn furiously. Following aircraft were thereby enabled to locate and bomb the target. This officer displayed gallantry of a high order.

Acting Flight Lieutenant Edward Brian Bretherton SMITH (90340), Auxiliary Air Force.

This officer has led his flight with great success; twenty-five enemy aircraft have been destroyed since June, 1940. One day in August he led the flight almost to the French coast to attack two enemy aircraft flying over the Channel. Despite strong opposition an enemy seaplane was damaged and, whilst on the return journey, another aircraft was attacked and damaged. Flight Lieutenant Smith was the only member of his section to return from these engagements. The next day, he was involved in an attack by twelve or more Messerschmitt 109's. His aircraft was hit by two shells, damage being inflicted near the cockpit and petrol tanks. His aircraft eventually caught fire and, although he himself was enveloped in flames, he successfully abandoned his aircraft and was rescued about eight miles out to sea. Flight Lieutenant Smith has now destroyed six enemy aircraft. He has displayed great courage and leadership.

Acting Flight Lieutenant John Terrance WEBSTER (37436).

Flight Lieutenant Webster has led his flight in innumerable offensive patrols during the latter part of the Dunkirk operations and during the intensive air fighting over the English Channel and Dover area in protection of shipping. With great skill and gallantry he has personally destroyed seven enemy aircraft and assisted in the destruction of two others. One day in August, 1940, he and another pilot of his section engaged considerably superior numbers of enemy fighters. Three were destroyed by this officer. Not content with this, he also attacked an enemy motor torpedo boat with considerable success. His faculty for seeking out and engaging the enemy has been outstanding.

Flying Officer Carl Raymond DAVIS (90131), Auxiliary Air Force.

Flying officer Davis has been engaged on operational flying since 3rd September, 1939. He has taken part in nearly all patrols and interceptions carried out by his squadron. He has been a section leader for the last two months, and on several occasions has led his flight. Flying Officer Davis has personally destroyed six enemy aircraft, and severely damaged several others. He has shown great keenness and courage.

Flying Officer Anthony EYRE (90406), Auxiliary Air Force.

This officer has shot down seven enemy aircraft, and inflicted damage on several others. Whilst on service in France, he showed eagerness to fly on all occasions and during the winter his flying times exceeded fifty hours monthly. During the evacuation from France, Flying Officer Eyre was en-

trusted with an important message from England to France and successfully completed this mission, which required great coolness and presence of mind. He has at all times shown great devotion to duty.

Flying Officer John Bernard William HUMPHERSON (39317).

This officer has led his section, and on occasions his flight, with great skill. During operations in France he destroyed two enemy aircraft and possibly another three. Since returning to England he has destroyed a further four enemy aircraft. He has displayed courage and initiative and has proved an excellent leader.

Flying Officer Richard Maxwell MILNE (40129).

Flying Officer Milne has personally destroyed seven enemy aircraft, and seriously damaged a number of others. He has led his section throughout with skill and courage, and has set an example to other members of the squadron.

Flying Officer Rupert Frederick SMYTHE (40436).

In July, 1940, this officer, whilst leading his section, broke up a formation of six Messerschmitt 109's near Folkestone, and succeeded in destroying one. Flying Officer Smythe has destroyed six enemy aircraft. He has displayed great courage and set an excellent example to all.

Pilot Officer Peter Melvill GARDNER (40527).

During a short time in France this officer succeeded in destroying four enemy aircraft. Since returning to this country he has destroyed a further five enemy aircraft and possibly several others. He has displayed great keenness and courage.

Pilot Officer John Albert Axel GIBSON (40969).

In August, whilst on an offensive patrol over Dover this officer engaged and destroyed a Junkers 87 and was afterwards shot down himself. Although his aircraft was in flames he steered it away from the town of Folkestone and did not abandon the aircraft until it had descended to 1,000 feet. Pilot Officer Gibson has destroyed eight enemy aircraft, and has displayed great courage and presence of mind.

Pilot Officer James Eric STORRAR (41881).

This officer took part in the intensive fighting over Dunkirk last May, and has since been engaged in numerous successful actions. His squadron was responsible for the destruction of twenty-one enemy aircraft in one day; he personally destroyed two of these. Pilot Officer Storrar has displayed an unflinching desire to engage the enemy at all times and has shot down eight enemy aircraft.

Pilot Officer Archibald Nigel Charles WEIR (73593), Royal Air Force Volunteer Reserve.

This officer took part in the intensive fighting over Dunkirk last May, and has since played a highly successful part in numerous engagements over the Channel. Pilot Officer Weir has shown an intense desire to engage the enemy and has destroyed at least five enemy aircraft, three of these in the course of a single day.

Awarded the Distinguished Flying Cross.
Pilot Officer Charles Raymond HATTERSLEY
(40699).

Awarded the Distinguished Flying Medal.
580928 Sergeant Donald WINDLE.

One night in August, 1940, Pilot Officer Hattersley was the pilot and Sergeant Windle the navigator and bomb-aimer of an aircraft detailed to carry out a bombing attack on an aircraft factory at Dessan. Two reconnaissance runs were made over the target during which Pilot Officer Hattersley carefully selected the most vital parts to attack. On the third run he descended to a low altitude, regardless of enemy fire, and enabled Sergeant Windle, by skilful bomb-aiming, to obtain three direct hits which destroyed the main power house and severely damaged the assembly shops and the metal shop. The success of this operation, which lasted eight hours, was in no small measure due to the accurate navigation of Sergeant Windle and the determination, courage and skill displayed by Pilot Officer Hattersley in carrying out the attack.

Awarded the Distinguished Flying Medal.
524661 Sergeant Eric KNOWLES.

On two consecutive days in August, 1940, while captain of an aircraft on patrol over the North Sea, Sergeant Knowles encountered enemy naval forces. On each occasion, he showed great skill, coolness and devotion to duty in reporting and shadowing these forces, and in carrying out determined bombing and machine gun attacks in the face of heavy anti-aircraft fire. He only broke off the engagements when compelled to return to his base owing to lack of fuel. The accuracy and clarity of his reports enabled striking forces to be despatched to the attack. Since the outbreak of war he has carried out over five hundred hours operational flying and has been engaged with the enemy on numerous occasions.

565977 Sergeant George SMYTHE.

This airman pilot has personally destroyed five enemy aircraft and assisted in heavily damaging several others. On one occasion Sergeant Smythe engaged a Messerschmitt 109 over the Channel, and, after a considerable chase, he eventually shot it down whilst well inside enemy territory. His continued resourcefulness and courage have been outstanding.

565662 Sergeant Clifford WHITEHEAD.

Sergeant Whitehead has taken part in most of the patrols with his squadron since the outbreak of the hostilities. He has personally destroyed four enemy aircraft, and probably three more. He has carried out his many tasks with enthusiasm, and has set an example by his courage and leadership.
