TREASURY NOTICE UNDER REGULA-TION 5 (4) OF THE DEFENCE FINANCE REGULATIONS, 1939.

The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that as from the 4th September, 1940, the following foreign currencies are designated by the Treasury under. Regulation 5 (4) of the Defence (Finance) Regulations, 1939, as foreign currencies to which the said Regulation applies:
