STANLEY ELECTRICITY SPECIAL ORDER, 1939.

Application for Alteration and Amendment of Draft Special Order.

NOTICE is hereby given that the Urban District Council of Stanley (hereinafter called "the Council") whose address is at the Council Offices, Stanley, in the County of Durham, have applied to the Electricity Commissioners for the amendment and alteration of the above named draft Special Order for which application was made to the Electricity Commissioners in the month of June, 1939, under the Electricity (Supply) Acts, 1882 to 1936. The alterations and amendments proposed are as follows:—

1. Instead of extending the area of supply of the Council for the purposes of the Stanley Electricity Special Order, 1925 (hereinafter called "the Stanley Order") as proposed by the draft Special Order to include so much of the Urban District of Stanley as prior to the commencement of the County of Durham Review Order, 1937, formed part of (a) the Parish

of Craghead in the Lanchester Rural District (hereinafter called "the Craghead Area") and (b) the Parish of Iveston in the Leadgate Urban District and constituting the undertakings authorised by the Annfield Plain Electric Lighting Order, 1901 (confirmed by the Electric Lighting Orders Confirmation (No. 9) Act, 1901) (hereinafter called "the Annfield Plain Order") the Stanley Order and the Tanfield Electricity Special Order, 1925 one undertaking it is proposed to authorise the Council to supply electricity throughout:—

(1) The whole of the Urban District of Stanley (hereinafter called "the district") as now constituted except the parts thereof which prior to the coming into operation of the County of Durham Review Order, 1937, formed (a) part of the Urban District of Blaydon (b) part of the Urban District of Whickham but not including in this exception the road at Sheep Hill known as Busty Bank Road from the boundary of the former urban district of Tanfield to Leap Mill Burn and (c) parts of the parishes of Lamesley and Urpeth in the Chester-le-Street rural district;

(2) The parts of the Urban District of Consett and the part of the parish of Lamesley in the Chester-le-Street rural district which prior to the coming into operation of the said Review Order formed parts of the urban districts of Annfield Plain and Tanfield;

but the Order is not to come into force in the Craghead area until such date as the Minister of Transport may appoint after the day declared by His Majesty by Order in Council to be the end of the present emergency.

2. To revoke the Annfield Plain Order and to provide that all works established and agreements entered into under the said Order and also under the Stanley Order and the Tanfield Electricity Special Order, 1925 (if such Orders are revoked by the Minister of Transport under the provisions of section 66 of the Electric Lighting (Clauses) Act, 1899) shall be deemed

to have been established and entered into under the provisions of the proposed Amending Order.

3. To authorise the Council to break up and open streets and parts of streets throughout the proposed area of supply which are not repairable by the local authority and railways.

4. To prescribe the maximum prices for the supply of electricity to be charged by the Council throughout the proposed area of supply and to enable the Council to charge minimum prices for supply in any quarter of a year.

Copies of the Amended Order and of the map showing the proposed area of supply and the street in the Craghead Area within which it is proposed that electric lines shall be laid down within a specified time have been deposited for public inspection at the office of the Clerk of the County Council of the County of Durham at Durham, at the Council Offices, Stanley, at the Council Offices, Consett, and at the Union Offices, Chester-le-Street, all in the County of Durham.
