WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 28th day of August, 1940 (C.W. 13925/40), in the words following, viz.:—

"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions or other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by order in Council:

"And whereas by Schedule V, Section VI, of Order in Council bearing date the 22nd day of January, 1920, sanction was given to the payment of an allowance of 5s. a day to a Paymaster Captain or Paymaster Commander in charge of the accounts of a Division at the Royal Naval Barracks at Portsmouth, Devonport or Chatham:

"And whereas by Order in Council bearing date the 5th day of July, 1929, a similar allowance was sanctioned to the Accountant Officer in charge of the accounts of H.M.S. "Egmont II" (now H.M.S. "St. Angelo") when the total number of pay accounts appearing on the ledger during a quarter does not fall below 4,000:

"And whereas we consider that in certain other Establishments, Bases and Depot Ships, when the number of accounts exceeds this

figure, a similar allowance should be payable to the Accountant Officers:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased by Your Order in Council to authorize the payment, for the period of the war, of an allowance of 5s. a day to the Accountant Officer in any Training or other Naval Establishment, Base or Depot Ship where the number of accounts for which he is responsible during a quarter is not less than 4,000, with effect from 1st April, 1940, payment not to be made whilst closing accounts.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in this proposal."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 3rd

and 4th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 113, and of the Act of the 17th and 18 years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 84, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for apportioning the income of the Benefice of Nuneaton, in the County of Warwick and in the Diocese of Coventry, between that Benefice and four other Benefices, namely, the Benefices of Saint Luke, New Kentish Town, in the County of Middlesex and in the Diocese of London; Saint Philip, Camberwell, and Saint Olave, Mitcham, both in the County of Surrey and in the Diocese of Southwark; and Saint Peter, Sacriston, in the County of Durham and in the Diocese of Durham (hereinafter called 'the said four Benefices'):

"Whereas the advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Nuneaton and each of the said four Benefices is vested in Your Majesty Your heirs and successors:

"And whereas we are of opinion that additional provision should be made for the cure of souls within each of the Parishes of the said four Benefices by means of that apportionment of the income of the said Benefice of Nuneaton which is hereinafter recommended and proposed, and that the said Benefice of Nuneaton will thereafter still be sufficiently endowed:

"And whereas the said Benefice of Nuneaton is now vacant:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Mervyn George, Bishop of Coventry, as Bishop of the Diocese within which the said Benefice of Nuneaton is situate and with the consents of the Bishops of the Dioceses within which the said four Benefices are respectively situate (in testimony whereof they have signed this Scheme) and with the consent of the Right Honourable Winston Leonard Spencer Churchill, now First Lord of Your Majesty's Treasury, acting on behalf of Your Majesty as the Patron of the said Benefice of Nuneaton and of each of the said four Benefices as aforesaid (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme) we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that, without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than this Scheme and any duly gazetted Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying the same, as from the day of the date upon which any such Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette a sum of £3,333 6s. 8d. Redemption £3 per cent. Stock (1986-1996) and a sum of £2,857 3s. 0d. Conversion £3 10s. per cent. Stock, each such sum of Stock being a part of a larger sum of the same Stock held by us for the said Benefice of Nuneaton, shall cease to form part of the endowments of the said Benefice of Nuneaton and shall be transferred to the Benefices mentioned in Column I of the Schedule to this Scheme appended the amount of Stock to be appropriated to each Benefice being stated in Column II of the said Schedule:

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other Measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions

of the said Acts or of either of them or of any other Act of Parliament.

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 33rd and 34th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 39, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say, the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 113, the Act of the 4th and 5th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 39, and the Act of the 31st and 32nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 114, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for effecting a transfer of the ownership of the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the Church and Cure (hereinafter called 'the said Benefice') of Standon in the County of Stafford and in the Diocese of Lichfield:

"Whereas the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Standon is vested for an estate in fee simple without incumbrances in Anna Caroline Salt of The Priory Dorchester-on-Thame in the County of Oxford Widow:

"And whereas the said Anna Caroline Salt is desirous that the whole Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Standon should be transferred to and vested in her the said Anna Caroline Salt and in the Right Reverend Edward Sydney now Bishop of Lichfield and his successors in the same Bishopric to hold as joint tenants during the lifetime of the said Anna Caroline Salt and should after her decease be vested in the Bishop for the time being of the said Diocese of Lichfield:

"And whereas the Right Reverend Edward Sydney, now Bishop of Lichfield, is willing to accept such transfer on behalf of himself and of his successors in the same Bishopric and in token of such his willingness and also in token that the same transfer has that consent of the Bishop of the Diocese which by the hereinbefore mentioned Acts or by some or one of them is made necessary he, the said Edward Sydney, Bishop of Lichfield, has executed this Scheme as hereinafter mentioned:

"And whereas the transfer of the Patronage of the said Benefice of Standon which is hereinbefore mentioned and hereinafter recommended and proposed will in our opinion tend to make better provision for the cure of souls in the Parish or District in or in respect of which the right of Patronage or Advowson so recommended and proposed to be transferred as aforesaid arises or exists, that is to say, in the Parish of Standon:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the said Anna Caroline Salt (in testimony whereof she has signed and sealed this Scheme) and with the consent of the said Edward Sydney, Bishop of Lichfield (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme and sealed the same with his Episcopal Seal), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the whole Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Standon now vested in her the said Anna Caroline Salt as aforesaid, shall be transferred to the said Anna Caroline Salt and Edward Sydney, Bishop of Lichfield, and his successors in the same Bishopric, as joint tenants to hold unto her the said Anna Caroline Salt and the Bishop of Lichfield for the time being jointly during the lifetime of the said Anna Caroline Salt and after her decease unto the Bishop for the time being of the said Diocese of Lichfield and his successors in the same Bishopric for ever.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any further or other Measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or of any of them or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Lichfield.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1936, duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a Scheme bearing date the 29th day of August, 1940, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1936, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for effecting firstly the union of the Benefice (being a Rectory) of Chillenden and the Benefice (being a Rectory) of Knowlton, secondly the union of the United Benefice so formed and the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Goodnestone (next Wingham) and thirdly certain alterations in the boundaries of the Parishes of the said Benefices of Goodnestone (next Wingham) and Knowlton and of the Parishes of the Benefices of Wingham, Staple and Northbourne all of which Benefices are situate in the County of Kent and in the Diocese of Canterbury:

"Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Cosmo, Archbishop of Canterbury, pursuant to the provisions of the said Measures to inquire into and report upon the union of the said Benefices of Goodnestone (next Wingham), Chillenden and Knowlton duly made their Report to the said Archbishop of Canterbury and therein recommended the union of the said Benefices and the terms for effecting the union and also certain alterations in the boundaries of the Parishes of the said Benefices and the said Archbishop of Canterbury signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

"And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the said unions of Benefices and for the said alterations of boundaries which Scheme is based upon the terms recommended in the said Report, but with the assent of the said Archbishop of Canterbury, embodies certain modifications thereof:

"And whereas all of the said Benefices of Goodnestone (next Wingham) Chillenden and Knowlton are now full, the Reverend Harold Frederic Edward Wigram being the present

Incumbent of the said Benefice of Goodnestone (next Wingham) and the said Benefices of Chillenden and Knowlton being held in plurality by the Reverend Richard Frederick Martin Clifford under the authority of a Dispensation:

"Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said Cosmo, Archbishop of Canterbury, and of the said Richard Frederick Martin Clifford (testified by their signing this Scheme) do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

"1. That upon the day when an Order of Your Majesty in Council affirming this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette the said Benefice of Chillenden and the said Benefice of Knowlton shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with Cure of Souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Chillenden with Knowlton' and the said Richard Frederick Martin Clifford if he is then Incumbent of the said Benefices of Chillenden and Knowlton shall be the first Incumbent of the United Benefice and the Parishes of the said Benefices of Chillenden and Knowlton shall also be united into one Parish for ecclesiastical purposes and for such other purposes as in the said Measures provided.

"2. That the Church of the Parish of Chillenden shall be the Parish Church of the United Parish of Chillenden with Knowlton and that the Table of Fees for the said Parish of Chillenden shall (until revised or altered by proper authority) be the Table of Fees for the United Parish.

"3. That upon the union of the said Benefices of Chillenden and Knowlton taking effect the marriage registers in duplicate current at the Church of Knowlton shall be sent by the Incumbent of the United Benefice of Chillenden with Knowlton to the Registrar General to be closed officially.

"4. That upon the union of the said Benefices of Chillenden and Knowlton taking effect the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Chillenden shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice.

"5. That pending the taking effect of the union of the said United Benefice of Chillenden with Knowlton and the said Benefice of Goodnestone (next Wingham) as hereinafter recommended and proposed the course and succession in which the respective Patrons shall present or nominate to the said United Benefice of Chillenden with Knowlton shall be as follows, that is to say, the right of presentation or nomination shall be exercised by the Patrons of the said two Benefices of Chillenden and Knowlton alternately and the first turn after the union of such two Benefices shall be exercised by the Patron of the said Benefice of Chillenden.

"6. That the said United Benefice of Chillenden with Knowlton and the said Benefice of Goodnestone (next Wingham) shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with Cure of Souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Goodnestone with Chillenden and Knowlton' but the Parish of the said Benefice of Goodnestone (next Wingham) shall continue distinct in all respects.

"7. That if upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council affirming this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette both the said United Benefice of Chillenden with Knowlton and the said Benefice of Goodnestone (next Wingham) shall be vacant the union referred to in Clause 6 of this Scheme shall take effect forthwith: and if the said United Benefice of Chillenden with Knowlton only or the said Benefice of Goodnestone (next Wingham) only shall be then vacant the said union shall take effect upon the next avoidance of the other of such two Benefices: and if neither of such two Benefices be then vacant the said union shall take effect upon the next avoidance of that one of such two Benefices which shall last be avoided after the day aforesaid.

"8. That upon the taking effect of the union referred to in Clause 6 of this Scheme an annual payment of £75 being part of a larger annual payment at present made by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, to the Incumbent of the said Benefice of Goodnestone (next Wingham) shall cease to be payable to such Incumbent and shall be paid by us to the Diocesan Board of Finance of the Diocese as trustees to apply the same for the purpose of providing clerical or lay assistance for the Incumbent of the United Benefice.

"9. That with the consent (testified by his signing this Scheme) of the Reverend Walter Sellers being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Northbourne and with the consent (testified as aforesaid) of the said Cosmo, Archbishop of Canterbury, being the Patron of such Benefice upon the union referred to in Clause 1 of this Scheme taking effect all that detached portion of the said Parish of Northbourne which immediately adjoins the northern boundary of the said Parish of Knowlton and is delineated upon the map or plan annexed to this Scheme and is thereon coloured pink shall be transferred and annexed for all ecclesiastical purposes to the said United Parish of Chillenden with Knowlton.

"10. That with the consents (testified by their signing this Scheme) of the Incumbents and Patrons of the said Benefices of Wingham and Staple, namely the Reverend Frederick Batten Beaven as Incumbent of the said Benefice of Wingham, Francis Fitzherbert Plumtre, of Church Stretton in the County of Salop, Esquire, as the Patron of the said Benefice of Wingham (acting by Lionel Sherbrooke Osmaston, of Old House, Barham, in the said county of Kent, Esquire, pursuant to an authority dated the 6th day of February, 1940, granted by the Master under the Act 53 Vict. c. 5 and amending Acts), the Reverend Cyril Paul Johnson as Incumbent of the said Benefice of Staple, and the said Cosmo, Archbishop of Canterbury, as Patron of the said Benefice of Staple, upon the union referred to in Clause 6 of this Scheme taking effect there shall be transferred and annexed for all ecclesiastical purposes to the said Parish of Staple (a) all that detached portion of the said Parish of Goodnestone (next Wingham) which lies between and immediately adjoins the said Parishes of Wingham and Staple and (b) all that detached portion of the said Parish of Wingham which lies to the north of the said Parish of Goodnestone (next Wingham) and

immediately adjoins the said Parish of Staple which said detached portions are delineated upon the map or plan annexed to this Scheme and are thereon coloured green and purple respectively.

" 11. That after the union referred to in Clause 6 of this Scheme has taken effect the course and succession in which the respective Patrons shall present or nominate to the United Benefice from time to time as the same shall become vacant shall be as follows, that is to say, that in every series of four successive turns of presentation or nomination the Patron of the said Benefice of Goodnestone (next Wingham) shall have two turns and the Patrons of the said Benefices of Chillenden and Knowlton shall have one turn each and (a) if in accordance with the provisions of Clause 7 of this Scheme an Incumbent of the said Benefice of Goodnestone (next Wingham) shall become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice of Goodnestone with Chillenden and Knowlton then the first and third turns in each such series shall be exercised by the Patrons of the said two Benefices of Chillenden and Knowlton the first turn being exercised by that patron whose last presentation or nomination to either of those Benefices or to the said United Benefice of Chillenden with Knowlton was more remote in point of time and the third turn being exercised by the other of such two Patrons and the second and fourth turns shall be exercised by the Patron of the said Benefice of Goodnestone (next Wingham) and (b) if in accordance with the provisions of Clause 7 of this Scheme an Incumbent of the said United Benefice of Chillenden with Knowlton shall become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice of Goodnestone with Chillenden and Knowlton then the first and third turns in each such series shall be exercised by the Patron of the said Benefice of Goodnestone (next Wingham) and the second and fourth turns shall be exercised by the Patrons of the said two Benefices of Chillenden and Knowlton the second turn being exercised by that one of the two Patrons other than the Patron whose nominee shall so become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice of Goodnestone with Chillenden and Knowlton and the fourth turn being exercised by the other of such two Patrons.

" Provided always that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from making any other recommendations and proposals relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Measures, or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England, or of any Act of Parliament."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have been duly published in accordance with the provisions of the said Measures, and Notices have been transmitted to the persons or bodies entitled under the said Measures to receive Notice requiring any objections to such draft Scheme to be stated or transmitted in writing to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules applicable to proceedings under the said Measures:

And whereas the prescribed time has elapsed and no such objections have been so stated or transmitted to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners:

And whereas public notice of the certification to His Majesty in Council of the said Scheme and the consent thereto in writing of the Archbishop of Canterbury has been duly given in the manner and within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules aforesaid:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that the Benefices therein recommended to be united shall be united to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme and further to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the date when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measures.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Canterbury.

" We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 113, of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 37, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 104, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for constituting a separate District for spiritual purposes to be taken partly out of the Parish of Great Stanmore and partly out of the New Parish (sometime Chapelry District) of Harrow Weald, both in the County of Middlesex and in the Diocese of London:

" Whereas we are satisfied that the said Parish of Great Stanmore and the said New Parish of Harrow Weald, are Cures wherein or in parts whereof the provision for public worship and for pastoral superintendence is insufficient for the spiritual wants of the inhabitants thereof and it appears to us that it would promote the interests of religion that the particular portions of the said Parish of Great Stanmore and of the said New Parish of Harrow Weald which are mentioned and described in the Schedule to this Scheme and are delineated on the map or plan annexed to this Scheme should be constituted a separate District for ecclesiastical purposes in the manner which is hereinafter set forth:

" And whereas there is not at present within the limits of the said proposed District any consecrated Church or Chapel in use for the purposes of Divine Worship:

" And whereas by an Order of Your Majesty in Council bearing date the 24th day of February, 1938, and published in the London Gazette on the following day the Benefice of Saint George, Hanover Square, and a part of the Benefice of Hanover Chapel, Regent Street, otherwise known and in the said Order referred to as the Benefice of Saint Anselm, Davies Street, both in the said County and Diocese, were united into one Benefice, and the Benefice of Saint Mark, North Audley Street, in the said County and Diocese, and the remaining part of the said Benefice of Saint Anselm, Davies Street, were likewise united into one Benefice; And it was by the same Order provided (inter alia) (1) that out of the proceeds of the sale or sales of the site and materials of the Church of Saint Anselm, Davies Street, a Church shall be built for an ecclesiastical district to be constituted within the said Diocese of London, (2) that the patronage of such Church shall be vested in the Patron of the said Benefice of Saint George, Hanover Square (that is to say, the Bishop of London for the time being), and (3) that a part of the endowments (all being stock held by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners) of the said Benefice of Saint Anselm, Davies Street, and at present amounting to £354 4s. 8d. per annum shall be appropriated by us towards the endowment of the said proposed new ecclesiastical district subject to the payment of £300 per annum thereof to the Reverend Robert Henry Sinclair, the former Incumbent of the said Benefice of Saint Anselm, Davies Street, so long as he shall be entitled to receive the same under Clause 6 of the said Order:

" And whereas the District hereinafter proposed to be constituted has been selected as the District for which a Church shall be built and endowed as provided by the above mentioned Order in Council:

" And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, have agreed to make and pay out of the Common Fund created by the firstly herein mentioned Act a temporary grant of £200 per annum to the Minister of the said proposed separate District so soon as a Minister shall have been duly licensed in accordance with the provisions of the secondly herein mentioned Act and to his successors, such temporary grant to continue payable until the date upon which the above mentioned sum of £300 per annum becomes available towards the endowment of the said proposed separate District:

" And whereas the said temporary grant of £200 per annum will, after the publication in the London Gazette of an Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme, be made and secured by an Instrument to be executed by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, under our Common Seal, in accordance with the provisions of the Act of the 29th and 30th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter III:

" Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Honourable and Right Reverend Geoffrey Francis, Bishop of London (in testimony whereof he has set his hand and Episcopal Seal to this Scheme), we, the said

Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that all those portions of the said Parish of Great Stanmore and of the said New Parish of Harrow Weald, which are described in the Schedule hereunder written, all which portions together with the boundaries thereof are delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, shall, upon and from the day upon which any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme, be published in the London Gazette, become and be constituted a separate District for spiritual purposes by the name of ' The District of Saint Anselm, Belmont '.

" And we further recommend and propose that the whole right of patronage of the said proposed District and, when such District shall have become a New Parish, then of such New Parish and the nomination of the Minister or Incumbent thereof shall, as provided by the said Order in Council bearing date the 24th day of February, 1938, be vested in and exercised by the said Geoffrey Francis, Bishop of London, and his successors in the same Bishopric for ever.

" And we further recommend that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending or proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or to any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or of any of them, or of any other Act of Parliament.

ROYAL AIR FORCE.

The KING has been graciously pleased to approve the undermentioned awards, in recognition of gallantry displayed in flying operations against the enemy:—

Awarded the Distinguished Flying Cross.

Flight Lieutenant Archibald Ashmore McKELLAR (90168), Auxiliary Air Force.

This officer has at all times displayed the keenest desire to engage the enemy. In his first large-scale encounter against enemy aircraft he displayed a great sense of leadership and tactics in launching his flight against ninety Heinkel 111's. As a result, at least four enemy aircraft were destroyed, of which Flight Lieutenant McKellar destroyed three. He has displayed outstanding leadership and courage.

Acting Flight Lieutenant Peter Malan BROTHERS (37668).

During an offensive patrol in August, 1940, this officer's flight encountered about one hundred enemy aircraft. He led the flight in attack against them, but before this could be pressed home, he was himself attacked by a number of Messerschmitt 110's. Turning to meet them, he found himself in a stalled position; he spun out of it and immediately sighted and engaged a Dornier 215 which he shot down. Later in the day he destroyed a Messerschmitt 109. Altogether Flight Lieutenant Brothers has destroyed seven enemy aircraft. He has at all times displayed great courage and initiative.

Acting Flight Lieutenant Sidney Robert GIBBS (37776).

In August, 1940, Flight Lieutenant Gibbs, as captain of a Sunderland aircraft, was detailed to carry out a reconnaissance of Tromsø. After a long night flight, under bad conditions, he located eight Heinkel 115 float planes, which he promptly attacked. As a result, three of these aircraft were destroyed and the remainder seriously damaged. Flight Lieutenant Gibbs brought his aircraft safely to his home base after being in the air for fifteen and a half hours. Valuable information concerning shipping in

the Tromso area was obtained. This officer has carried out over six hundred operational hours flying since the commencement of hostilities. His excellent reconnaissance work includes the locating of survivors of the Andania and guiding a destroyer to the rescue. His perseverance and unflinching devotion to duty have proved invaluable.

Flying Officer Gordon Neil Spencer CLEAVER (90135), Auxiliary Air Force.

This officer has been engaged on operational flying since December, 1939. He participated in numerous offensive patrols during operations in France and the Dunkirk evacuation. Flying Officer Cleaver has now destroyed seven enemy aircraft and possibly another two. In August, 1940, whilst his base was being subjected to intense bombing, he led his section with great determination and courage and after destroying one of the attacking aircraft he was severely wounded in both eyes. Despite this, he refused to abandon his aircraft and effected a successful landing. He has displayed great determination and devotion to duty.

Awarded the Distinguished Flying Medal.

580244 Sergeant Ronald Fairfax HAMLYN.

In August, 1940, whilst on an offensive patrol, Sergeant Hamlyn attacked and destroyed one Junkers 88, and one Messerschmitt 109. A few hours later he engaged a Messerschmitt 109, chased it across the English Channel and finally shot it down over Calais where it crashed in flames. Shortly afterwards he attacked and destroyed two further enemy aircraft, thus making a total of five in one day. Altogether this airman pilot has personally destroyed at least seven enemy aircraft. He has displayed great courage and good marksmanship.
