The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 9th day of September, 1940 (N645/40), in the words following, viz.:—

"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions, or other allowances in the nature thereof, payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman, or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner, and subject to such restrictions, conditions, and provisions, as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas by Order in Council bearing date the 6th May, 1938, sanction was given, *inter alia*, to the transfer to the Royal Navy of certain trained ranks of the Royal Air Force:

"And whereas in order to meet the requirements of the Air Arm of Your Majesty's Fleet, it is now necessary to increase the number of ratings in the Air Artificer branch of the Royal Navy, and to transfer thereto such ratings of the Air Fitter branch (formerly in the Royal Air Force) who are found to be qualified:

"And whereas we are of opinion that such ratings should be granted conditions of transfer to the Air Artificer branch similar to those authorised by Your Order in Council of the 6th May, 1938.

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty, by Your Order in Council, may be graciously pleased to sanction, with effect from a date to be determined by us, the conditions of transfer and service set out in the accompanying schedule; men transferred who are in receipt of pay on the scale in force immediately prior to the 5th October, 1925, being eligible to continue to receive pay on that scale, subject otherwise to the usual regulations governing pay scales.

"The Lord Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in the above proposals.

"SCHEDULE.

WHEREAS by Section 5 of the Merchant Shipping (Mercantile Marine Fund) Act, 1898 (61 & 62 Vict. c. 44) (hereinafter referred to as "the said Section") it is amongst other things enacted as follows:—

"5.—(1) On and after the commencement of this Act the general lighthouse authorities shall levy light dues with respect to the voyages made by ships or by way of periodical payment and not with respect to the lights which a ship passes or from which it derives benefit and the dues so levied shall take the place of the dues now levied by those authorities.

(2) The scale and rules set out in the Second Schedule to this Act shall have effect for the purpose of the levying of light dues in pursuance of this Act but Her Majesty may by Order in Council alter either generally or with respect to particular classes of cases the scale or rules and the exemptions therefrom."

And whereas by the Merchant Shipping (Light Dues) Order, 1939, certain alterations were made in the Scale and Rules set out in the Second Schedule to the said recited Act:

And whereas it is expedient that such last recited Order should be revoked:

And whereas it has been made to appear to His Majesty that the said Scale and Rules should be further altered in manner hereinafter appearing:

Now, therefore, His Majesty in exercise of the powers vested in Him by the said Section and of all other powers enabling Him in that behalf and by and with the advice of His Privy Council, doth order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. (a) This Order may be cited as the Merchant Shipping (Light Dues) Order, 1940, and shall have effect from the date of its publication in the London Gazette.

(b) The Interpretation Act, 1889 (52 & 53 Vict. c. 63), shall apply to the interpretation of this Order as it applies to the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.

2. Each of the dues authorised to be levied in accordance with the Scale set out in the Second Schedule to the said recited Act shall be subject to an increase of 100 per cent., for the purpose of the levying of light dues in pursuance of the said recited Act.

3. The payments referred to in the proviso to Rule (1) and in the proviso to Rule (7) of the

Rules set out in the Second Schedule to the said recited Act shall also be subject to an increase of 100 per cent.

4. The Merchant Shipping (Light Dues) Order, 1939, is hereby revoked.

"Whereas by the Dockyard Ports Regulation Act, 1865, it is enacted that it shall be lawful for His Majesty in Council to define the limits of a Dockyard Port for the purposes of that Act and to make regulations in relation to any Dockyard Port for all or any of the purposes in the said Act particularly mentioned, and for such other purposes as from time to time seem necessary with a view to the proper protection of H.M. vessels, dockyards or property, or to the requirements of H.M. Naval Service:

"And whereas in pursuance of the said Act certain Regulations and Rules were made by Order in Council dated the 12th day of August, 1907, and by Order in Council dated the 9th day of February, 1914, with reference to the port of Berehaven:

"And whereas the schedule attached to the Eire (Confirmation of Agreements) Act, dated 25th April, 1938, provided for the transfer to the Government of Eire of the Admiralty property and rights at Berehaven, Cobh and Lough Swilly:

"And whereas it appears in consequence that the Rules and Regulations before mentioned are no longer required.

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty by Your Order in Council may be graciously pleased to revoke the Orders in Council relating to the port of Berehaven dated the 12th day of August, 1907, and the 9th day of February, 1914."

And whereas the provisions of section one of the Rules Publication Act, 1893, have been complied with:

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1936, duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a Scheme bearing date the 30th day of May, 1940, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1936, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for effecting the union of the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Ivington, Saint John, and the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Leominster, both of which Benefices are situate in the County of Hereford and in the Diocese of Hereford:

"Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend Lisle, Bishop of Hereford, pursuant to the provisions of the said Measures to inquire into and report upon the union of the said two Benefices of Ivington, Saint John, and Leominster duly made their Report to the said Bishop of Hereford and therein recommended the union of the said two Benefices and the terms for effecting the union, and the said Bishop of Hereford signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

"And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the union of the said two Benefices, which Scheme is based upon the terms recommended in the said Report but, with the assent of the said Bishop of Hereford, contains a modification thereof:

"And whereas both of the said Benefices are now full, the Reverend George Walter being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Ivington, Saint John, and the Reverend William Graham Moeran being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Leominster:

"And whereas the patronage of the said Benefice of Ivington, Saint John, belongs to the Vicar of Leominster in right of his vicarage and the patronage of the said Benefice of Leominster belongs to the said Bishop of Hereford in virtue of his See:

"Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said Lisle, Bishop of Hereford (testified by his signing this Scheme), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

"1. That the said Benefice of Ivington, Saint John, and the said Benefice of Leominster shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with cure of souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Leominster with Ivington' but the Parishes of the said Benefices shall continue in all respects distinct.

"2. That if upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London

Gazette both of the said two Benefices shall be vacant, the union of the same two Benefices shall take effect forthwith: and if the said Benefice of Ivington, Saint John, only shall be then vacant the said union shall also take effect forthwith if the Incumbent of the other of the said two Benefices shall with the approval of the Bishop consent to become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice, but if he shall not so consent or if the Bishop shall not approve, then the said union shall take effect upon the then next avoidance of the said Benefice of Leominster and the then Incumbent of Ivington, Saint John, shall be the first Incumbent of the United Benefice, and if the said Benefice of Leominster only shall be then vacant the said union shall take effect upon the next avoidance of the said Benefice of Ivington, Saint John, and if neither of the said two Benefices be then vacant, then the said union shall take effect on the next avoidance of the said Benefice of Ivington, Saint John, if the Incumbent at that time of the said Benefice of Leominster shall have been instituted to Leominster subsequently to the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme or if instituted before that date shall with the approval of the Bishop consent to become the Incumbent of the United Benefice, but if he shall have been instituted to the said Benefice of Leominster before that date and shall not so consent or if the Bishop shall not approve, then the said union shall take effect immediately upon the next vacancy of the said Benefice of Leominster following such avoidance of the said Benefice of Ivington, Saint John, and the then Incumbent of the said Benefice of Ivington, Saint John, shall become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice.

"3. That upon the said union taking effect the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Leominster shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice.

"4. That upon the said union taking effect provision shall be made by the Incumbent of the United Benefice for employing the services of a Curate and a part of the total endowments and property of the Benefices hereinbefore recommended and proposed to be constituted an United Benefice, that is to say, an annual sum of £92 (being part of a larger annual sum) now payable by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, to the Incumbent of the said Benefice of Leominster shall be severed or diverted from that Benefice and from the United Benefice and shall be appropriated by us as a fund towards the cost of providing for the employment of the services of the said Curate and the said annual sum of £92 shall be paid by us to the Diocesan Board of Finance of the Diocese upon trust to apply the same to the purpose aforesaid.

"5. That after the said union has taken effect the patronage of the United Benefice shall belong wholly to the Patron of the said Benefice of Leominster.

"Provided always that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from making any other recommendations and proposals relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Measures, or of any other Measure of the National

Assembly of the Church of England, or of any Act of Parliament."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have been duly published in accordance with the provisions of the said Measures, and Notices have been transmitted to the persons or bodies entitled under the said Measures to receive Notice requiring any objections to such draft Scheme to be stated or transmitted in writing to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules applicable to proceedings under the said Measures:

And whereas certain objections have been so stated or transmitted to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the same Rules:

And whereas the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners after giving full consideration to such objections have deemed right to make no alterations in such draft Scheme.

And whereas public notice of the certification to His Majesty in Council of the said Scheme and the consent thereto in writing of the Bishop of Hereford has been duly given in the manner and within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules aforesaid:

And whereas no appeal has been proceeded with to His Majesty in Council within the period of one month after the date of the said public notice in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure against the said Scheme or any part thereof by any person who has made objection as aforesaid to the said draft Scheme:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty by and with the advice of His said Council is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that the Benefices therein recommended to be united shall be united to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme and further to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the date when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measures.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Hereford.

Arthur Hendon Cole, Sergeant, Kent Special Constabulary.

An aircraft of the Royal Air Force taking off from the Biggin Hill aerodrome crashed and turned over in the garden of the house next to that occupied by Sergeant Cole. The pilot was trapped and hanging by his harness upside down. Cole ran to his assistance and, although expecting the aircraft to catch fire and blow up at any moment, he freed the pilot from his gear and dragged him away, saving his life. The aircraft caught fire and the petrol tank exploded a minute or two after the pilot had been released.

ROYAL AIR FORCE.

The KING has been graciously pleased to approve the undermentioned appointment and awards in recognition of gallantry displayed in flying operations against the enemy:—

Appointed a Companion of the Distinguished Service Order.

Acting Squadron Leader Charles John French KYDD, D.F.C. (37505).

This officer was pilot and captain of an aircraft detailed to attack, from a very low altitude, the ship lift on the Canal at Magdeburg one night in August, 1940. Despite intense fire from a battery of twelve anti-aircraft guns and the glare from searchlights, he displayed courage and determination when he made five runs over the target to ensure

accuracy before he dropped his bombs. A few nights previous, Squadron Leader Kydd took a leading part in the attack on the Leuna oil works when he displayed equal courage and determination. Since the outbreak of war he has done outstandingly good work, proving himself to be a fine leader and a skilled and resolute captain of aircraft.

Awarded a Bar to the Distinguished Flying Cross.

Pilot Officer Alexander WEBSTER, D.F.C. (40770).

This officer was captain and pilot of an aircraft detailed to carry out an attack, from a very low altitude, on the ship lift on the Canal at Magdeburg during a night in August, 1940. In spite of illumination by two searchlights and gunfire from twelve anti-aircraft guns, he carried out this attack successfully from a height of only fifty feet. Recently Pilot Officer Webster carried out a low attack on the oil refinery at Leuna and pressed home his attack with the same courage and determination in the face of enemy opposition. His skill, keenness and devotion to duty provide a fine example to his fellow pilots.

Awarded the Distinguished Flying Cross.

Flight Lieutenant Robert Findlay BOYD (90165), Auxiliary Air Force.

Flight Lieutenant Boyd has led his flight into action on all possible occasions and by his initiative and accurate shooting has personally destroyed nine enemy aircraft. He has displayed cool judgment and a keen desire to engage the enemy irrespective of the odds against him.

Acting Flight Lieutenant Jack Sylvester ADAMS (37728).

In August, 1940, whilst engaged on a night patrol, Flight Lieutenant Adams sighted an enemy aircraft about a mile ahead. He chased it for fifty minutes and, although out of radio telephony communication with his base for most of the time, he eventually contacted the enemy off the South Coast. He attacked the enemy aircraft over the sea and, it is believed, destroyed it. He returned to his base and landed with both petrol gauges reading nil. Flight Lieutenant Adams has been continuously employed on night flying duties since the commencement of hostilities and has displayed conspicuous devotion to duty throughout.

Acting Flight Lieutenant Allen Roy MULLIGAN (40058).

One night in August, 1940, this officer carried out a successful low-flying attack from 150 feet on the Dortmund-Ems Canal. He displayed the utmost skill, determination, courage and devotion to duty in pressing home his attack, in spite of intense opposition from the ground and a knowledge of the reception that would be awaiting him over this area. Flight Lieutenant Mulligan has carried out a total of twenty-three operational flights and has at all times set an excellent example to other pilots by his enthusiasm, keenness and courage. His work as an operational pilot has been outstanding.

Acting Flight Lieutenant Stanley Charles NORRIS (40561).

In August, 1940, this officer was leading his flight on an offensive patrol when twenty

Junkers 88's were sighted. Flight Lieutenant Norris ordered his flight to attack them, but were themselves attacked in turn by twenty Messerschmitt 109's. It became necessary to abandon the attack on the enemy bombers, and to engage the enemy fighters. During the combat Flight Lieutenant Norris destroyed one Messerschmitt 109. This officer has personally destroyed six enemy aircraft and damaged a further two. He has displayed outstanding determination and skill as a leader.

Acting Flight Lieutenant Charles Gordon Chaloner OLIVE (39469).

Flight Lieutenant Olive has led his flight and, on occasions, his squadron both on operations in France and later throughout the intensive fighting in the defence of his country. He has personally destroyed at least five enemy aircraft. His fearlessness and cool courage in action have been a splendid example to other pilots he has led and have contributed largely to their successes against greatly superior numbers of the enemy.

Flying Officer Harold Arthur Cooper BIRD-WILSON (40335).

Flying Officer Bird-Wilson has shot down six enemy aircraft and shared in the destruction of several others. He has shown fine fighting qualities and determination in his attacks.

Flying Officer Brian John George CARBURY (40288).

During operations on the North East coast Flying Officer Carbury led his section in an attack on two enemy aircraft. Both were destroyed. From 28th August, 1940, to 2nd September, 1940, he has, with his squadron, been almost continuously engaged against large enemy raids over Kent, and has destroyed eight enemy aircraft. Five of these were shot down during three successive engagements in one day.

Flying Officer Edwin Charles Sandars FEWTRELL (37673).

This officer has completed more than twenty night flying operations over enemy territory at extreme ranges, and in the face of severe enemy opposition and difficult weather conditions. He is a captain of aircraft of invariable resolution and great skill, who has set a splendid example to the others on his station.

Pilot Officer Dudley Hamilton DAVIS (43146).

This officer was pilot and captain of an aircraft detailed to carry out a low-level attack on warships in Wilhelmshaven Harbour one night in July, 1940. He delivered his attack in the face of terrific anti-aircraft fire from all the defences of the town. He has completed fourteen successful raids over enemy territory during which he has shown conspicuous gallantry and has pressed home his attacks with the same indomitable courage.

Pilot Officer Peter Morrice DE MESTRE (41678).

This officer was captain of an aircraft detailed to attack the oil tanks at Bordeaux one night in August, 1940. On his first run over the target at 2,000 feet his aircraft and one engine were severely damaged by anti-aircraft fire, and the glare from searchlights prevented his bombs being dropped with accuracy. In

spite of the serious condition of his aircraft, and the continuous gunfire, he made a second attack and dropped his bombs with success. On the return flight, with his wireless apparatus smashed, the damaged engine failed whilst still over France, but with splendid determination he managed to cross the sea and made a forced landing on the English coast without causing injury to his crew. Pilot Officer De Mestre has many times pressed home his attacks on the enemy with equal courage and determination.

Pilot Officer Michael James HERRICK (33566).

During an interception patrol on the night of 4th September, 1940, Pilot Officer Herrick sighted two enemy aircraft and destroyed them both. In his attack against the second aircraft he succeeded in closing to within thirty yards and it fell in pieces under his fire.

Pilot Officer Kenneth JONES (40714).

This officer was pilot and captain of an aircraft detailed to make a low-level attack on warships at Wilhelmshaven Harbour one night in July, 1940. He delivered his attack in the face of a tremendous barrage of fire from all the defences. Pilot Officer Jones has shown conspicuous courage and devotion to duty on many previous occasions and has always pressed home his attacks with the same determination.

Pilot Officer James Joseph O'MEARA (40844).

Pilot Officer O'Meara has displayed a very high degree of skill and devotion to duty in all operations against the enemy and has destroyed at least six enemy aircraft. His example and keenness have been outstanding.

Pilot Officer Donald Stuart SCOTT (40569).

Pilot Officer Scott has destroyed five enemy aircraft and severely damaged three others. He has flown with his squadron continuously over a considerable period and has displayed great gallantry at all times.

Awarded the Distinguished Flying Cross.

Pilot Officer Nigel BICKNELL (73041), Royal Air Force Volunteer Reserve.

Awarded the Distinguished Flying Medal.

581329 Sergeant William Broughton GINGELL.

In August, 1940, Pilot Officer Bicknell was the pilot and Sergeant Gingell the observer, of an aircraft detailed to carry out a night attack on Antwerp Aerodrome. As the aircraft reached the Dutch coast the port engine failed, and Pilot Officer Bicknell therefore decided to abandon his original target and bomb Haamsted aerodrome; this was located by Sergeant Gingell and successfully attacked from 5,000 feet. On the return journey, just before reaching the coast, the aircraft commenced to lose height, and in spite of the efforts of the crew it became necessary to make a forced landing in a rough sea close to a trawler. The pilot and observer forced their way out of the aircraft and made repeated but unsuccessful attempts to extricate the unconscious air gunner before the aircraft sank. Some thirty minutes later, the pilot, who was suffering from head injuries, and the unconscious observer were picked up by the trawler. Pilot Officer Bicknell displayed great determination in pressing home an

alternative attack, after one of his engines had failed, and both he and Sergeant Gingell showed great courage in endeavouring to free the unconscious air gunner.

Awarded the Distinguished Flying Cross.

Pilot Officer Alexander Herbert GOULD (40692).

Awarded the Distinguished Flying Medal.

743018 Sergeant John Fleming COWAN, Royal Air Force Volunteer Reserve.

635808 Sergeant Richard BONSON.

Pilot Officer Gould was the pilot, Sergeant Cowan the navigator and bomb aimer, and Sergeant Bonson the wireless operator air gunner, of an aircraft detailed to carry out a very low altitude attack on warships in Wilhelmshaven Harbour one night in July, 1940. The attack was carried out in the face of a terrific barrage of anti-aircraft fire. On many previous occasions Pilot Officer Gould has shown conspicuous gallantry and devotion to duty and has always pressed home his attacks in the same fearless manner, while Sergeants Cowan and Bonson have contributed largely to the success of the attacks and have displayed great courage and skill in the face of enemy opposition often in severe weather conditions.

Awarded the Distinguished Flying Medal.

561329 Flight Sergeant John Frederick CLAYTON.

563523 Sergeant John Christopher CHESTER.

One night in August, 1940, Flight Sergeant Clayton was captain and Sergeant Chester navigator and bomb aimer of an aircraft detailed to attack an objective in Berlin. Difficult conditions and dense cloud were encountered on the entire journey. The adverse weather conditions, combined with searchlights and anti-aircraft fire, made recognition of the original objective temporarily impossible, and the available fuel did not permit of their waiting for the clouds to clear. With great skill and determination Flight Sergeant Clayton and his navigator located an alternative target—an aircraft factory—and despite intense opposition, direct hits were obtained from a low altitude on the largest buildings. These were seen to disintegrate and catch fire. By their courageous and determined action Flight Sergeant Clayton and Sergeant Chester have set a fine example of devotion to duty.

700102 Sergeant Oswald Arthur DUPEE, Royal Air Force Volunteer Reserve.

517215 Sergeant Thomas Henry BANISTER.

Sergeant Dupee and Sergeant Banister were the pilot and air gunner respectively, in an aircraft which attacked a Heinkel IIIK. Shortly after commencing the attack the return fire from the enemy aircraft ceased, but as Sergeant Dupee was about to continue his attack at short range the Heinkel's dorsal gun again opened fire severely wounding him in the arm and causing damage to his aircraft. Sergeant Banister thereupon crawled forward, assisted Sergeant Dupee from his seat and took control of the aircraft. Despite failing strength, through loss of blood, Sergeant Dupee gave directions to Sergeant Banister who, although untrained as a pilot, was enabled to fly the aircraft until compelled to force land. This was carried out on a

strange aerodrome with the undercarriage retracted and only slight damage was caused to the aircraft.

550006 Acting Sergeant John BLAIR.

In September, 1940, during operations over Derna when the pilot of the aircraft was killed instantaneously by enemy action Sergeant Blair, the observer, succeeded in getting the aircraft under control and taking evasive action while the air gunner fought off the enemy aircraft. Assisted by the air gunner, he then removed the dead pilot from his seat and, without previous flying experience, achieved a safe landing after a flight of 350 miles. By his courage, devotion to duty and determination he saved the lives of both himself and the air gunner as well as saving the aircraft.
