At the Court at Buckingham Palace, the 4th day of October, 1940.

PRESENT.

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 23rd day of September, 1940 (C.W. 27083/40), in the words following,

"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, inter alia, that all pay, pensions or other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force, to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in

' And whereas by Section 3 of the Officers of Royal Naval Reserve Act, 1863, it is enacted, inter alia, that Officers of reserve shall be entitled to receive such pay and allowances as we, with the consent of Your Majesty in

Council, may from time to time appoint:

"And whereas by the Naval Forces Act, 1903, it is enacted that the Admiralty shall have power to raise and maintain a Force to be called the Royal Naval Volunteer Reserve and that any Volunteer enrolling under this Act, when serving for training afloat or called out for actual service shall be deemed to be serving in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force within the meaning of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865:

And whereas by Order in Council dated 16th day of December, 1925 (No. 139/C.W.), provision is made for a category of Electrical Officers in Your Majesty's Navy:

"And whereas we consider it desirable that provision should now be made for a corresponding category of Officers in the Royal Naval Volunteer Reserve:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased by Your Order in Council to approve the institution of a category of Electrical Officers of the Royal Naval Volunteer Reserve and that these Officers should be eligible for full pay on the. scale laid down for qualified officers of the Engineer category of the same rank and seniority.

Lords Commissioners of Majesty's Treasury have signified Their concurrence in this proposal.'

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Com-

missioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

His Majesty the KING has been graciously pleased to award the Edward Medal to Thomas Jameson and Carl Mallinson Schofield, in recognition of their gallantry in the following circumstances:—

About 8.45 p.m. on the 14th February, 1940, a serious fall of roof occurred in the main loading level of the Bold Colliery, Lancashire, completely burying five men. Rescue operations were immediately begun and in 11 hours one of the men was liberated and was able to walk out of the pit with assistance. He was able to tell the agent, Thomas Jameson, who had arrived and taken charge, the approximate position of the other four men. Jameson, assisted by a night shift foreman, Carl Schofield, whose father was one of the men buried, working only with their hands (there was no room for a shovel) removed stones and dirt and sawed through a conveyor chain and a rail, and after prolonged efforts one of the men was rescued by 2 a.m. next morning. Operations were continued, other men taking turns, until about 3 a.m. a third man was released. The other two men could be seen but appeared to be dead.

The rescue had to be carried out in a very confined space and in conditions of extreme

difficulty and danger owing to the imminent risk of further falls as the debris which covered the buried men was removed. If this had not been prevented by the skilful directions of Jameson the number of deaths would almost certainly have been greater. Immediately after the third man had been released there was another big fall which completely blocked the hole which the rescuers had been using as a means of access.

The rescues were undoubtedly due to the coolness, courage and skilful leadership of Jameson, and to the assistance he received from Schofield, who displayed the greatest energy and courage throughout, knowing all the time that his father was lying under the fall.

ROYAL AIR FORCE.

The KING has been graciously pleased to approve the following awards in recognition of gallantry displayed in flying operations against the enemy:

Awarded a Bar to the Distinguished Flying Cross.

Archibald Flight Lieutenant Ashmore McKellar, D.F.C. (90168), Auxiliary Air Force.

During a period of eight days in the defence of London, Flight Lieutenant McKellar has destroyed eight hostile aircraft, bringing his total to twelve. He displays an excellent fighting spirit, is a particularly brilliant tactician and has led his squadron with skill and resource.

Flying Officer Alistair Lennox Taylor, D.F.C.

In September, 1940, this officer carried out a successful photographic reconnaissance of the Dortmund-Ems aqueduct. Flying Officer Taylor took off from his base in dense fog but, flying through this, he reached his objective and secured valuable photographs from. a height of 6,000 feet. He has, during the last two months, carried out a number of exceptionally successful reconnaissances, including one over Kiel which was considered the most valuable reconnaissance completed for the Navy during the war. Other work by this pilot includes photographs of Cap Gris. Nez and Flushing taken from a height of 400 feet. He has completed sixty photographic missions and in this class of operation he is outstanding.

Pilot Officer William Lidstone McKnight, D.F.C. (41937).

This officer has destroyed six enemy aircraft during the last thirteen weeks. He has proved himself to be a most efficient section leader, and has consistently given proof that he is a courageous and tenacious fighter.

Awarded the Distinguished Flying Cross.

Acting Squadron Leader John Fulton (37095). This officer has taken part in twenty major operations over enemy territory since early in June, 1940. On the night of 15th September an attack on the marshalling yards at Brussels was frustrated by the failure of the starboard engine and he turned for home. Later, however, the engine functioned normally and Squadron Leader Fulton decided to resume his mission. He made two successful attacks from 11,000 feet straddling the railway junction with both sticks of bombs. By his persistent determination, outstanding skill and devotion to duty in the face of heavy opposition and many set-backs, Squadron Leader Fulton was able to complete his task.

Flight Lieutenant William Johnson Leather (90355), Auxiliary Air Force.

This officer has conducted many convoy patrols under very adverse weather conditions. Many times when the weather has been unfit for a section he has flown alone in an effort to engage the enemy. On one occasion he shot down a Junkers 88 a hundred miles out to sea. Over Dunkirk he destroyed a Messerschmitt 109 and in September, 1940, he shot down two Dornier 215's. Flight Lieutenant Leather has led his flight, and frequently his squadron, with skill and courage.

Acting Flight Lieutenant Christopher Frederick CURRANT (43367).

This officer has led his flight with great skill and courage in air combats in the defence of London. He has destroyed seven enemy aircraft and damaged a number of others. His splendid example and fine fighting spirit have inspired the other pilots in his flight.

Acting Flight Lieutenant John Ignatius KILMARTIN (39793).

Flying Officer Kilmartin has destroyed twelve enemy aircraft. His dash and determination, with clear thinking, combine to make him a magnificent leader.

Acting Flight Lieutenant Peter Coplestone Lemon (39320).

Since the beginning of the war this officer has conducted 28 operations over Norway, Holland, France, Belgium and Germany. In September, 1940, Flight Lieutenant Lemon with great courage in the face of intense anti-aircraft fire, dived to 500 feet over Antwerp Harbour and released a stick of bombs which caused a large brick building to blow up and burn furiously. His aircraft was considerably damaged by an anti-aircraft shell which caused a fire, but by skilful piloting a successful landing was made. By his courage, per-

sistent determination and outstanding skill this officer has at all times set an example of the highest order.

Acting Flight Lieutenant Percival Stanley Turner (41631).

On September 15th, 1940, Pilot Officer Turner succeeded in shooting down one enemy aircraft, when his own aircraft was hit by a cannon shell which put it temporarily out of control. On recovery, he saw and attacked a further enemy aircraft which he destroyed, afterwards bringing his own damaged aircraft safely back to its base. This officer has personally destroyed a total of ten hostile aircraft during engagements over Dunkirk and England. He has proved himself a most courageous and capable leader, displaying coolness and initiative in the face of the enemy.

Acting Flight Lieutenant John Wolferstan VILLA (39768).

Since 31st August, 1940, this officer has destroyed at least six enemy aircraft. One day in September, 1940, he was successful in destroying three enemy aircraft unaided and assisted in the destruction of a fourth. Flight Lieutenant Villa has consistently led his flight, and frequently the squadron, with great dash and eagerness, and has proved a keen fighter and a good leader.

Flying Officer Thomas Arthur Francis Elsdon

(33308).

Since 31st August, 1940, this officer has destroyed six enemy aircraft, bringing his total to eight. On 4th September, 1940, when leading his squadron, his method of attack was successful in destroying nine enemy aircraft and probably three more. A few days later, he brought down the leading aircraft of a bomber formation. His record is outstanding and he has led his section and flight with distinction, showing complete disregard of danger and personal injury.

Flying Officer Leonard Archibald Haines (40297).

Flying Officer Haines has destroyed seven enemy aircraft, and assisted in the destruction of another. Twice he has pursued hostile aircraft to France and shot them down. He has shown the utmost courage, tenacity and devotion to duty.

Pilot Officer Geoffrey Allard, D.F.M. (44551).

Between 30th August and 1st September, 1940, this officer destroyed seven enemy aircraft; previously he had destroyed ten and shared in the destruction of others. He has displayed outstanding skill and courage in combat against the enemy.

Pilot Officer Clare Arthur Hovendon Connor (40892).

Pilot Officer Connor was captain of an aircraft detailed to attack enemy barge concentrations at Antwerp one night in September, 1940. His first run over the target was inaccurate and no bombs were dropped. In the second approach, at 2,000 feet, the aircraft was subjected to intense fire from the ground, but the attack was pressed home successfully. During this attack the bomb compartment in the aircraft was shattered and a fire started which quickly spread to the wireless operator's and rear gunner's cockpit. The port mid-wing and the tail boom were

Shell fire pierced the port rear petrol tank causing grave risk of the fire spreading, and the starboard tank was also pierced. The navigator and rear gunner abandoned the aircraft, but the wireless operator air gunner remained and succeeded in controlling, and eventually extinguishing the flames. In spite of the condition of his the flames. aircraft and knowing that he had neither a navigator, rear gunner nor normal wireless facilities, Pilot Officer Connor succeeded in flying back to his base and landing without further damage. He displayed the most outstanding coolness, courage and devotion to duty.

Pilot Officer Wallace Cunningham (80545), Royal Air Force Volunteer Reserve.

This officer has shot down five hostile aircraft. He has shown great personal gallantry and splendid skill in action.

Pilot Officer Wilfred John Lewis (41188).

One night in September, 1940, this officer successfully pressed home, in the face of intense and accurate anti-aircraft fire and searchlight glare, a dive-bombing attack on a concentration of barges in Antwerp Docks. During the dive his aircraft was severely damaged by gun-fire from the ground defences and was rendered temporarily out of control. Since March, 1940, Pilot Officer Lewis has taken part in thirty-eight operational flights over enemy territory, and as a captain of aircraft has displayed outstanding coolness, determination and devotion to duty.

Pilot Officer James Reginald Bryan MEAKER

(42514), now missing.
Pilot Officer Meaker has shot down at least five enemy aircraft and damaged others. Resolute in attack, with a calm, determined temperament, his leadership has been an example to his squadron.

Pilot Officer Thomas Francis Neil (79168), Royal Air Force Volunteer Reserve.

This officer has destroyed six enemy aircraft. He shows great keenness and has displayed dash and courage of a high order.

Pilot Officer Noel Karl STANSFELD (42272).

This officer has destroyed seven enemy aircraft during engagements over Dunkirk and England. He has exhibited excellent fighting qualities, initiative and marked powers of leadership.

Awarded the Distinguished Flying Medal.

802602 Sergeant Andrew McDowall, Auxiliary Air Force.

This airman has led his section on many occasions and has destroyed at least six enemy aircraft, one of which he destroyed in a brilliant head-on attack at night. His capable leadership has contributed largely to the many successes of his section.
