At the Court at Buckingham Palace, the 4th day of October, 1940.

PRESENT.

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 23rd day of September, 1940 (C.W. 27083/40), in the words following,

"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, inter alia, that all pay, pensions or other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force, to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in

' And whereas by Section 3 of the Officers of Royal Naval Reserve Act, 1863, it is enacted, inter alia, that Officers of reserve shall be entitled to receive such pay and allowances as we, with the consent of Your Majesty in Council, may from time to time appoint:

"And whereas by the Naval Forces Act,

1903, it is enacted that the Admiralty shall have power to raise and maintain a Force to be called the Royal Naval Volunteer Reserve and that any Volunteer enrolling under this Act, when serving for training afloat or called out for actual service shall be deemed to be serving in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force within the meaning of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865:

And whereas by Order in Council dated 16th day of December, 1925 (No. 139/C.W.), provision is made for a category of Electrical Officers in Your Majesty's Navy:

"And whereas we consider it desirable that provision should now be made for a corresponding category of Officers in the Royal Naval Volunteer Reserve:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased by Your Order in Council to approve the institution of a category of Electrical Officers of the Royal Naval Volunteer Reserve and that these Officers should be eligible for full pay on the. scale laid down for qualified officers of the Engineer category of the same rank and seniority.

Lords Commissioners of Majesty's Treasury have signified Their concurrence in this proposal.'

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve

of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.
