CENTRAL CHANCERY OF THE ORDERS OF KNIGHTHOOD.

St. James's Palace, S.W.1, 22nd October, 1940.

The KING has been graciously pleased to approve of the following awards and for the publication in the London Gazette of the names of individuals shown below as having received an expression of Commendation for their good services.

Awarded the George Medal.

John German, M.M., Part-time Air Raid Warden, Bolton Air Raid Precautions Services.

During an enemy air attack eleven high explosive bombs were dropped. As a result, ten persons, including Warden German, were injured, five seriously.

Warden German, accompanied by a

Warden German, accompanied by a civilian named Kay, was patrolling his area when an aircraft was heard approaching. German then warned Kay to take cover. Before either of them could do so, however, the noise of a bomb falling was heard. German pushed Kay towards a shop and threw himself on top of him. They then heard a bomb explode about 100 yards away. A moment later another high explosive bomb exploded in front of the row of cottages and no more than 16 yards from where German and Kay were lying on the ground. After the initial effect, they extricated themselves from the wreckage. Lights were then visible in one or two of the damaged houses. German went in one and extinguished the light and assured the stricken occupants that he would bring assistance.

German told Kay to take cover whilst he himself travelled on foot to a Police pillar telephone 600 yards away from the incident, for the purpose of sending his air raid damage message. On the way, however, he found himself weakening as a result of the injuries he had received; realizing this he went to the Warden's post close by where he collapsed, but was still able to report where the damage was, and with assistance went to the Police pillar and sent his message through to the Report Centre, as a result of which, the necessary services were despatched.

His Majesty The KING has been graciously pleased to confer the Decoration of the Albert Medal, for Gallantry In Saving Life At Sea, on Sydney Owen of Brighton-le-Sands, Botany Bay, New South Wales, in recognition of his

gallantry in the following circumstances:—
"On the morning of the 23rd January, 1940, Maxwell Arthur Farrin, a boy of 13 years of age was bathing at Brighton-le-Sands, Botany Bay, New South Wales, about fifty yards from the shore, when he was attacked by a shark which severed his left leg and inflicted serious abdominal injuries. His plight was observed from the shore and Sydney Owen, although warned of the presence of the shark, which was still close to Farrin, unhesitatingly swam out to the boy and brought him back to the shore. Farrin, however, succumbed to the injuries he had sustained."

Appointed a Companion of the Distinguished Service Order.

Squadron Leader Horace Stanley Darley (32191).

This officer has led his squadron in a brilliant manner during its recent successful operations against superior numbers of enemy formations. He has displayed determination and coolness and, by his skill in action, he has contributed largely to the great successes obtained by his squadron.

Awarded a Bar to the Distinguished Flying Cross.

Pilot Officer Albert Gerald Lewis, D.F.C.

(41303).

One day in September, 1940, this officer destroyed six enemy aircraft; this makes a total of eighteen destroyed by him. courage and keenness are outstanding.

Pilot Officer Eric Stanley Lock, D.F.C. Reserve.

In September, 1940, whilst engaged on a patrol over the Dover area, Pilot Officer Lock engaged three Heinkel 113's one of which he shot down into the sea. Immediately after-wards he engaged a Henschel 126 and destroyed it. He has displayed great courage in the face of heavy odds, and his skill and coolness in combat have enabled him to destroy fifteen enemy aircraft within a period of nineteen days.

Awarded the Distinguished Flying Cross.

Wing Commander Robert Arthur Terence

STOWELL (26019).

Since the outbreak of war with Italy, Wing Commander Stowell has led his squadron against the enemy on 38 occasions often attacking his objectives after having forced his way past superior numbers of enemy His leadership has inspired his fighters. squadron with high morale, and he has shown exceptional valour, courage and devotion to duty.

Squadron Leader Ernest Archibald McNab, Royal Canadian Air Force.

Squadron Leader McNab has led his squadron with great success. At least twentythree enemy aircraft have been destroyed by the squadron. This officer has destroyed four of these.

cting Squadron Leader George Lovell Denholm (90190), Auxiliary Air Force. Since the commencement of hostilities, Lovell Acting

Squadron Leader Denholm has led his squadron, flight or section in innumerable operational patrols against the enemy. His magnificent leadership has contributed largely to the success of the squadron, which has destroyed fifty-four enemy aircraft in about six weeks; four of these aircraft were destroyed by Squadron Leader Denholm himself.

Flight Lieutenant Derek Peirre Aumale Boitel-GILL (28142).

In August, 1940, this officer, as leader of his squadron, intercepted an enemy formation consisting of thirty bombers which were escorted by some ninety fighters. As a result of his skilful leadership five of the enemy aircraft were destroyed, of which Flight Lieutenant Boitel-Gill number destroyed three. A further three enemy aircraft were damaged in the conflict. previous occasion Flight Lieutenant Boitel-Gill destroyed a Junker's 88.

Flight Lieutenant Athol Stanhope Forbes

This officer is a splendid leader and has contributed materially to the many successes obtained by his squadron. He has displayed great keenness in pressing home his attacks against the enemy and has destroyed seven of their aircraft.

Flight Lieutenant James Henry Gordon

McArthur (37925).

This officer has led his flight and squadron with skill and determination. His brilliant leadership has been reflected in the high standard of morale in his flight. destroyed at least seven enemy aircraft.

Lieutenant Alexander Flight

Rabagliati (37209).

This officer has led his flight and squadron in many engagements against the enemy during which he has destroyed five enemy aircraft and damaged others. He has shown magnificent leadership and courage.

Flight Lieutenant John Eric James Sing

(37428).

Flight Lieutenant Sing has taken part in numerous operational patrols and, during these flights has destroyed seven enemy aircraft and damaged several others. He has displayed courage, ability and leadership of a high order.

Acting Flight Lieutenant Robert Alexander

BARTON (37664).

This officer has displayed outstanding leadership and has contributed materially to the many successes obtained by his squadron. His skill was particularly displayed on the 28th September when his squadron was responsible for destroying twenty enemy aircraft. Flight Lieutenant Barton has personally destroyed four enemy aircraft and shared in the destruction of others.

Acting Flight Lieutenant Paterson Clarence

Hughes (39461) (since killed).

This officer has led his flight with skill and determination. He has displayed gallantry in his attacks on the enemy and has destroyed seven of their aircraft.

Flight Lieutenant James Murray

STRICKLAND (39581).

This officer has participated in numerous operational patrols against the enemy and, during these engagements has destroyed nine of their aircraft. He has set an excellent example and has proved an inspiration to other members of his unit.

Flying Officer John Charles Dundas (90334),

Auxiliary Air Force.

This officer has displayed great courage and determination and has destroyed six enemy

aircraft, of which five have been shot down within the last two weeks. He has shown outstanding leadership throughout.

Pilot Officer John Alan BARKE (43637).
This officer has taken part in 25 raids during the past two months on each of which he has shown marked courage and determination. When carrying out a reconnaissance, he was intercepted by enemy fighters and had the petrol and oil tanks of his aircraft pierced and his rear gun put out of action. By most skilful flying and the display of great courage and determination he out-manoeuvred the . enemy and landed at his base with only one engine running, thus undoubtedly saving the lives of his crew. His conspicuous gallantry has at all times set a fine example to the other flying personnel.

Pilot Officer Walter BEAUMONT (76308), (now missing), Royal Air Force Volunteer Reserve.

This officer has displayed great skill and determination in air combat against the enemy and has destroyed six of their aircraft.

Pilot Officer Robert Francis Thomas Doe

(41908)

Pilot Officer Doe has displayed great courage in the many patrols undertaken by his squadron and has destroyed nine enemy aircraft. He has shown outstanding dash and an eagerness to engage the enemy at close quarters.

Pilot Officer Dudley Trevor JAY (42063).

This officer has participated in numerous engagements against the enemy in France, and later in England, and has destroyed eight of their aircraft besides damaging several more. He has displayed great courage and a keen desire to engage the enemy on all occasions.

Pilot Officer Kenneth Norman Thomson LEE (72998), Royal Air Force Volunteer Reserve. This officer has led his section and flight with marked success. He has displayed great dash and determination and has destroyed at least six enemy aircraft.

Pilot Officer Keith Temple Lofts (90483), Auxiliary Air Force.

This officer has participated in numerous engagements against the enemy in Belgium, France and England. He has displayed great determination and coolness and has destroyed eight enemy aircraft.

Pilot Officer Constantine Oliver Joseph Pegge

(41317).
Since July, 1940, this officer has destroyed
His great skill and seven enemy aircraft. initiative in air combat were particularly shown on one occasion when, although wounded in the eye, his aircraft damaged and the windscreen rendered opaque by bullets, he brought his aircraft back to base and made a successful landing. He has proved a fearless fighter when attacking superior numbers of enemy aircraft.

Pilot Officer Peter Lawrence Parrott (41054). This officer has been continuously engaged in operational flights against the enemy since January, 1940. He has displayed great determination and keenness and has destroyed or severely damaged at least six hostile aircraft.

Pilot Officer Allen Richard WRIGHT (33499).

One night in August, 1940, this officer displayed great determination and skill in destroying a Heinkel III, under difficult conditions. Pilot Officer Wright has consistently shown a keen desire to engage the enemy on all occasions. He has brought down a total of four enemy aircraft and has badly damaged four more.

Major Robert Henning PRELLER, South African Äir Force.

While carrying out a reconnaissance and attacking an enemy aircraft on the ground, Major Preller was shot down in the desert in enemy territory 70 miles from the border. He destroyed his aircraft and proceeded to walk to British territory accompanied by his crew of two who eventually became exhausted. He left them at a water hole and proceeded alone to seek aid. After 14 days, having suffered terrible hardships through lack of water and food, he made contact with British forces, and was able to give directions which led to the rescue of his crew and the recovery of a very valuable exposed film of enemy military objectives. This officer has shown marked determination in individual operations, and in leading his squadron he has imbued them with his own fighting spirit to a remarkable degree.

Awarded the Distinguished Flying Medal.

564749 Flight Sergeant Percy Frederick MORFILL.

This airman has displayed great skill and coolness in his attacks against the enemy. His fine attacking qualities have enabled him to destroy at least seven of their aircraft.

505650 Sergeant Francis BAVIN-SMITH.

Sergeant Bavin-Smith has taken part in numerous raids over enemy territory, successfully navigating the formation, controlling the fire of less experienced air gunners and taking photographs of targets often under intense In June, 1940, during a raid on enemy positions, when this airman was observer in the leader's aircraft, despite being attacked by four enemy fighters, Sergeant Bavin-Smith rapidly produced the requisite course, and enabled the formation to withdraw without Two fighters were shot down in the engagement. He is cool, level headed and courageous, and his determination has inspired the other air gunners in his squadron to maintain their high standard of morale.

740502 Sergeant John Maurice Bentley BEARD, Royal Air Force Volunteer Reserve.

Sergeant Beard has displayed great courage and coolness in his engagements against the enemy. This was particularly shown on one occasion in September, 1940, when, by cool tactics, he destroyed two Messerschmitt 100's which attacked him from the rear, whilst he was pursuing an enemy bomber. He has destroyed a total of five enemy aircraft.

810021 Sergeant Horatio Herbert CHANDLER, Auxiliary Air Force.

This airman has been continuously engaged in operations against the enemy since April, 1940, and has destroyed six of their aircraft. He has displayed courage, skill and determination.

741447 Sergeant Paul Caswell Powe FARNES, Royal Air Force Volunteer Reserve.

This airman has participated in numerous engagements against the enemy since the outbreak of war. He has displayed great skill and coolness in combat and has destroyed eight hostile aircraft.

740826 Sergeant Alan Stuart Harker, Royal Air Force Volunteer Reserve.

This airman has displayed courage and engagements determination in superior numbers of enemy aircraft. skill and marksmanship have enabled him to destroy at least five enemy aircraft.

565271 Sergeant Reginald Thomas LLEWELLYN. This airman has participated in numerous engagements against the enemy in Belgium, Northern France and, later, in England. has at all times displayed great courage and devotion to duty and has destroyed twelve enemy aircraft and shared in the destruction of others.

562582 Sergeant Joseph John William MILDREN. This airman has been the air observer in the leading aircraft on all raids made by the squadron since the commencement of hostilities. In June, 1940, when attacking an enemy aerodrome from a height of 2,000 feet, Sergeant Mildren proceeded with difficulty, in a cramped position, and in face of enemy opposition, to obtain excellent photographs of the target showing the exact location of the bomb bursts and many other important details on the enemy aerodrome. He then operated a gun firing through the camera hatch, and gave a most lucid, calm and helpful description of the fight to the leader. When the starboard petrol feed was severed, and half the petrol had gone into the fuselage, he did his utmost to check the leak and assisted the pilot with fuel calculations. His actions eventually resulted in the safe return of the aircraft to its base. He has shown coolness and courage in many active operations against the enemy, and is a well balanced and thoroughly dependable asset to his unit.
