ROYAL AIR FORCE.

The KING has been graciously pleased to
approve the undermentioned awards in recog-
nition of gallantry displayed in flying operations
against the enemy:—

Awarded the Distinguished Flying Cross.

Flight Lieutenant Denys Edgar GILLAM,
A.F.C. (37167)—No. 616 Squadron.

This officer has been responsible for the
destruction of seven enemy aircraft and
probably of four more, and has damaged
six. On one occasion during a combat with
a large force of Messerschmitt 110's, he shot
one down and his own aircraft caught fire.
He descended by parachute and returned to
his station in time to lead the next patrol.
On another occasion Flight Lieutenant Gillam
shot down a Junkers 88 and landed within
eleven minutes from the time he took off.

Flying Officer Samuel James MILLEN (41047).

Late in October, 1940, this officer suc-
cessfully completed a special mission involv-
ing a hazardous flight of 5 hours 55 minutes
at a height of 27,000 feet. The success he
achieved in this, and many similar flights,
is due to his initiative and keenness, com-
bined with enthusiasm and very thorough
preparations before flight.

Pilot Officer Louis Patrick MASSEY (84686)—
Royal Air Force Volunteer Reserve—No. 61
Squadron.

Late in October, 1940, this officer was captain of a bomber aircraft engaged in a search for an aircraft believed to be down in the North Sea, when a Heinkel 115 was attacked and shot down. It was due to his initiative and skill in handling his aircraft that Pilot Officer Massey was able to press home his attack. In all of his 33 operational flights he has shown an admirable combination of courage and determination.

Awarded the Distinguished Flying Cross.

Pilot Officer Eric PLUMTREE (83716), Royal Air Force Volunteer Reserve—No. 53 Squadron.

Awarded the Distinguished Flying Medal.

755740 Sergeant Peter Merridith KINSEY, Royal Air Force Volunteer Reserve—No. 53 Squadron.

Pilot Officer Plumtree was the pilot and Sergeant Kinsey the air gunner of an aircraft detailed to test a new type of bomb sight during a patrol over the North Sea. At the far end of the patrol, sixteen enemy vessels were sighted, eight within the harbour of an enemy port and eight outside. Pilot Officer Plumtree dived from 3,000 to 800 feet to attack the vessels in the harbour in the face of intense anti-aircraft fire. Whilst making his escape he attacked an army camp with machine-gun fire at almost ground level, and then climbed to seek cloud cover out at sea. At this point an attack was made by three Messerschmitts, which riddled the aircraft with bullets and shells and wounded all members of the crew. Sergeant Kinsey held off the enemy and forced one to break off the engagement. Keeping his pilot informed of the position, he operated his gun until the other two were lost in the clouds. In spite of injuries, Pilot Officer Plumtree then brought the aircraft safely back to an aerodrome in England.
