Venice, May 15. N. S.

A Convoy is preparing here for the *Levant* with considerable Supplies of Provisions and Ammunition for the Service of the Venetian Forces in those Parts. The Men of War which are ordered to cruize against the *Algerines* and *Tripolins*, are sitting out here with all expedition. This week arrived here the *Mermanid*, Captain *Thorpe* Commander, from *Smyrna*, very richly laden; as also a Venetian Ship called *The Golden Cross*; and the King *William*, is daily expected from the same Place. Our last Advices from *Dalmatia* say, Signior *Grimani*, Commissioner from this Republick for settling the Limits, continued at *Spalato*, the Turkish Commissioners, who are to confer with him for this purpose, not being yet arrived on the Frontiers. General *Mocenigo* was gone from *Zara* to visit the fortified Places in *Dalmatia*. Preparations were making at *Lepanto*, *Romelia*, and *Previsa*, for demolishing and evacuating those Places. Our Advices from *Napoli di Romania* of the 5th of *April* say, the *Bassa* of *Negropont* had sent an Officer with a Compliment to Captain-General *Cornaro*, upon the Conclusion of the Peace. Signior *Delfino* was sailed from thence with two Men of War for *Corfou*, to take Possession of the Government of that Island, and the Isles of *Zant* and *Cephalonia*, which was lately given him by the Senate upon the Death of Signior *Contarini*.

*Turin*, May 10. On the 6th Instant the Dutchess of *Savoy* was delivered of a Prince, who is Christen'd by the Names of *Victor Amadee Philip Joseph*; For which, *Te Deum* has been sung in the Cathedral of this Place, with a Discharge of the Artillery round the Town, and three days have been spent in Publick Demonstrations of Joy upon this Occasion.

*Milan*, May 13. The Prince of *Vaudemont* has appointed the Baron of *Cran* to Congratulate the Duke of *Savoy* upon the Birth of the Prince of *Piedmont*. *Te Deum* was sung last Sunday in our Cathedral, and the Artillery round the Town was discharged, on account of Signior *Archinto's* being chosen by the Pope to be Archbishop of this Place.

*Vienna*, May 16. The Imperial Court continues at *Laxemburgh*, where they are entertained with Hunting, and other Diversions. The Emperor's Ministers are now taken up with regulating divers Matters relating to the Troops to be kept on foot, and in considering of the Means to provide for their Subsistence. It's said, none of the Forces that are in the Emperor's immediate Service will be disbanded, but on the contrary, Orders are given for recruiting them, and remounting the Horse; The Auxiliary Troops that ser-

ved in *Hungary* during the War, are paid off, and are on their March homewards; and some Regiments of those that belong to the Circle of *Francia* have passed by this City, and others have taken their way on the other side the *Danube*, being ordered to use different Roads, that they may be less burdenson to the Countries through which they are to pass. It's said, The Count of *Saltsbourg* will be made President of the Imperial Chamber. The Count of *Oetting* has ordered his Equipage to be got ready by the middle of the next Month, intending then to set out from hence on his Embassy to the Port; Prince *Eugens* of *Savoy* will also leave this Place about the same time, in order to go and visit the Fortifications in *Hungary*. Our Advices from thence say, a Body of the Imperial Forces are ordered to encamp this Summer in *Hungary*; from which, Detachments will be sent to work on the Fortifications of *Esseck*, *Buda*, and *Arat*. The Commissioners for settling the Limits between the Emperor's and the Grand Signior's Territories, had ordered a great number of *Rascians* to be employed to make the Line from the Shore opposite to the Mouth of the *Theysse*, to the *Saue* near *Swezem*, by which they design to distinguish the Borders on that side, and they afterwards removed from *Salzement* to *Brod*, to regulate the Boundaries of those Parts.

*Mentz*, May 23. The Elector of *Mentz* intends to be going from hence to morrow for *Bamberg*, where he designs to continue during the greatest part of this Summer. His Electoral Highness has appointed the Baron of *Schomborn*, his Brother, to go to the Court at *Vienna*, to receive from the Emperor in his Name the Investiture of the Electorate and Archbishopsrick of *Mentz*, who will accordingly begin his Journey thither in few days.

*Cologne*, May 26. The Elector Palatine took a Review this week of his Forces quartered in the Duchies of *Bergs* and *Juliers*, which were drawn together for that purpose at *Beuroth*, near *Dusfeldorp*; Four Battalions of Foot were ordered to march immediately to the Palatinate, who passed yesterday by this Place on their march thither, and the Regiment of Horse of *Hochkirke*, with the Dragoons of *Jungheim*, will take the same way in a day or two. It's said, the Elector Palatine will continue at *Pewroth* till the latter end of the next Month; after which, he intends to go to *Aix la Chapelle* to use the Waters. Two Deputies are arrived from *Francfort*, to assist on the part of that City at the Conferences that are begun here for regulating the Tolls or Customs to be paid to the several Princes and States, whose Dominions lie upon the *Rhine*, by the Boats that pass along that River.

*Brussels*, May 26. The Elector of *Bavaria* went on Thursday last from *Marimont* to *Mons*, and having

ving viewed the new Fortifications that are making there, and taken a Review of the Garrison, he went back to *Marinon*, from whence he returned hither last Saturday. The Baron de *Pallavicini*, Envoy Extraordinary from the Duke of *Savoy*, who came hither to notify the Birth of the Prince of *Piedmont*, had yesterday his Publick Audience of his Electoral Highness. The Burghers of this Place are assembled, to consider of continuing the Excise laid upon Beer, Bread, Meat, and other Provisions. Don *Lewis de la Valle*, Colonel of a Regiment of *Spanish Foot*, has received a Patent from *Spain*, conferring on him the Title of *Marquis de la Valle*.

*Hague*, May 29. The States of *Holland* and *Westfriseland* are still assembled here, to consider, among other Matters, about forming the Marine Regiments. The Directors of the *West-India* Company, who came hither to sollicite the Renewal of their Charter, are gone home, and will return to this Place about three weeks hence. Monsieur *Gersdorf*, Resident from the King of *Poland*, delivered a Letter this week from the King his Master to the Deputies of the City of *Amsterdam*, to which Place he intends to go in few days. The Plaçets lately published here, to permit the Exporting of Rice and Pease, have been sent to the Colledges of the Admiralty; but the Exportation of Corn is still prohibited in these Provinces, notwithstanding great quantities have lately been imported from *Dantzick*, and other Places.

*Paris*, May 30. N. S. The Count de *Revera*, Envoy Extraordinary from the Duke of *Savoy* to notify the Birth of the Prince of *Piedmont*, had Audience of the King on the 26th Instant at *Versailles*; He had Audience likewise of the Dauphin, the Duke and Dutchess of *Burgundy*, the Dukes of *Anjou* and *Berry*, and of the Duke and Dutchess de *Chartres*. Yesterday the King took a Review of the two Companies of his Guards of *Mousquetiers*. The Court goes to-morrow to *Marli*, where the King intends to stay till Thursday next; and the Dauphin in the mean time will go to *Mudon*. The Prince of *Conti* is returned from *Neuf-Chatel*, nothing being yet determined with relation to his Pretensions to that Principality. Our last Letters from that Place say, the Dutchess of *Nemours* set out from thence on the 18th Instant on her return to *Paris*.

*Plimouth*, May 19. His Majesty's Ships the *Rye* and the *Sun-Prize* sailed from hence yesterday to the Eastward; As did likewise the *Ann Galley* of *Laudan*, *Edm. Creamer* Master, bound from *Malaga* to *Rotterdam*, and the *Hopewell* of *London*, *Nicholas Smith* Master, bound home from *Virginia*. The same day came in here the *Jeseph* of *London*, *John Cornish* Master, bound for *Gadiz*. This day arrived in this Port, the *Success*, *Edw. Mopper* Master, and the *Henrietta*, *Anthony Harrison* Master, both of *Whiteby*, and bound from *Norway* to *Liverpoole*.

*Whitehall*, May 22. Monsieur *Geldermalsen*, Envoy Extraordinary from the States-General of the United Provinces, had Audience this day of their Royal Highnesses the Princess and Prince of *Denmark*, being introduced in the usual manner by Sir *Charles Cottrell*, Master of the Ceremonies.
