PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 1st day of November, 1940 (C.W.6111/40), in the words following, viz.:—

"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions or other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas by Orders in Council dated the 13th July, 1915 (No. 152/C.W.) and the 13th April, 1918 (10/C.W.) certain conditions of service were laid down for temporary Instructor Officers of the Royal Navy:

"And whereas we consider it desirable that Instructor Officers entered for the duration of the present hostilities in the Royal Navy should serve under the same conditions of service as are laid down for Officers of other branches of Your Majesty's Naval Forces who are entered for such hostilities only:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to sanction that the conditions of service set forth in the Schedule annexed hereto shall apply to Instructor Officers entered on or after the 23rd October, 1939, for service during the present hostilities.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in these proposals.

"SCHEDULE.

"*Temporary Instructor Lieutenants, Royal Navy, entered for the period of hostilities only.*

"1. *Full Pay.*—Pay to be at the rate laid down from time to time for other Instructor Officers of the Royal Navy.

"2. *Sick Leave.*—Sick leave on full pay or otherwise to be granted under the regulations laid down from time to time for other temporary officers entered for the period of hostilities.

"3. *Discharge Gratuities.*—The discharge gratuities provided under the Regulations established by Orders in Council of the 13th July, 1915, and the 13th April, 1918, not to be payable."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

Whereas there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated

the 11th day of November, 1940 (N11993/40), in the words following, viz:—

"Whereas by section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions or other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman or Marine therein shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas Order in Council of 19th December, 1923, and later Orders in Council sanctioned various rates of extra duty pay for non-commissioned officers and men of the Royal Marines when employed in appointments at the R.M. Divisions or when organised in Service Units:

"And whereas we have found it expedient to establish a Tradesmen's Unit of the Royal Marine Corps:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to sanction the establishment of the Tradesmen's Unit of the Royal Marine Corps, with pay and allowances as set out hereunder:—

Substantive pay—To be at the rates authorised for corresponding grades of tradesmen enlisted in Your Majesty's Army, without the addition of extra duty pay, with the proviso that tradesmen already serving may retain their existing Royal Marine rates of pay together with any extra duty pay they may be receiving if this is to their advantage. The effective date of transfer to Army tradesmen's rates of pay to be not earlier than 30th December, 1939, in any case.

Allowances—To be at Royal Marine rates generally.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in these proposals."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1936, duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a Scheme bearing date the 11th day of April, 1940, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1936, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for effecting (1) the union of the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Notting Hill, Saint Michael and All Angels, and the Benefice (being a

Vicarage) of Notting Hill, Christ Church, and (2) certain alterations of boundaries affecting the Parishes of the said Benefices of Notting Hill, Saint Michael and All Angels, and Notting Hill, Christ Church, and the Parish of the Benefice of Notting Hill, Saint Columb, all of which Benefices and Parishes are situate in the County of Middlesex and in the Diocese of London:

"Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Honourable and Right Reverend Arthur Foley, formerly Bishop of London, pursuant to the provisions of the said Measures to inquire into and report upon the union of the said two Benefices of Notting Hill, Saint Michael and All Angels, and Notting Hill, Christ Church, and upon the alteration of the boundaries of the said Parishes of Notting Hill, Saint Michael and All Angels; Notting Hill, Christ Church; and Notting Hill, Saint Columb; duly made their Report to the said Bishop of London and therein recommended the said union and alterations of boundaries and the terms for effecting the same, and the said Bishop of London signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

"And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the said union and alterations of boundaries which Scheme is based upon the terms recommended in the said Report but with the assent of the Right Honourable and Right Reverend Geoffrey Francis, now Bishop of London, embodies certain modifications thereof:

"And whereas the said Benefice of Notting Hill, Saint Michael and All Angels, is now full, the Reverend William Henry John Platts being the present Incumbent thereof, and the said Benefice of Notting Hill, Christ Church is at present vacant:

"And whereas the patronage of the said Benefice of Notting Hill, Christ Church, now belongs to the said Geoffrey Francis, Bishop of London, in right of his See:

"Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said Geoffrey Francis, Bishop of London, and with the consent of the said William Henry John Platts (testified by their signing this Scheme), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

"1. That the said Benefice of Notting Hill, Saint Michael and All Angels, and the said Benefice of Notting Hill, Christ Church, shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with cure of souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Notting Hill, Saint Michael and All Angels with Christ Church' and that the Parishes of the said Benefices shall also be united into one Parish for ecclesiastical purposes and for such other purposes as in the said Measure provided.

"2. That the Church of the Parish of Notting Hill, Saint Michael and All Angels, shall be the Parish Church of the United Parish and that the Table of Fees for the said Parish of Notting Hill, Saint Michael and All Angels shall (until revised or altered by proper authority) be the Table of Fees for the United Parish.

"3. That upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette the union shall forthwith take effect and the said William Henry John Platts if he is then

Incumbent of the said Benefice of Notting Hill, Saint Michael and All Angels shall be the first Incumbent of the United Benefice.

" 4. That upon the union taking effect the register books of baptisms, marriages and burials and other the records and muniments deposited in Christ Church, Notting Hill, shall be transferred to the Parish Church of the United Benefice but the marriage registers in duplicate current at Christ Church, Notting Hill, shall first be sent by the Incumbent of the United Benefice to the Registrar General to be closed officially.

" 5. That upon the said union taking effect the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Notting Hill, Saint Michael and All Angels, shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice and so soon as conveniently may be the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Notting Hill, Christ Church, and the site and appurtenances thereof and the grounds heretofore usually occupied and enjoyed therewith shall be sold and disposed of by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, at such time or times and in such manner in all respects as to us shall seem expedient and that the net proceeds of such sale shall form part of the aggregate fund hereinafter referred to.

" 6. That with the consent of the said Geoffrey Francis, Bishop of London, as Patron of the said Benefice of Notting Hill, Christ Church (testified as aforesaid) upon the union taking effect the endowments and property of the said Benefice of Notting Hill, Christ Church, shall be applied as follows, that is to say:—(a) an annual sum of £80 being part of a larger annual payment at present made by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, to the Incumbent for the time being of the said Benefice of Notting Hill, Christ Church, and a part, namely £20 per annum of the grant of £60 per annum now payable by us towards the stipend of a second Curate for the said Benefice of Notting Hill, Christ Church, shall be added to the grant of £120 per annum now payable by us towards the stipend of a first Curate for the said Benefice of Notting Hill, Saint Michael and All Angels, and the combined sum of £220 per annum shall be payable towards the stipend of a first Curate for the United Benefice; (b) an annual sum of £60 being a further part of the aforesaid larger annual payment and a part namely £11 17s. 8d. per annum of the grant of £120 per annum now payable by us towards the stipend of a first Curate for the said Benefice of Notting Hill, Christ Church, shall be added to the grant of £120 per annum now payable by us towards the stipend of a second Curate for the said Benefice of Notting Hill, Saint Michael and All Angels, and the combined sum of £191 17s. 8d. per annum shall be payable towards the stipend of a second Curate for the United Benefice; (c) an annual sum of £60 being a further part of the aforesaid larger annual payment shall be added to the remaining part, namely, £40 per annum of the said grant of £60 per annum at present payable by us towards the stipend of a second Curate for the said Benefice of Notting Hill, Christ Church, and the combined sum of £100 per annum shall be payable towards the stipend of a third Curate for the United Benefice; (d) an annual sum of £50 being a further

part of the aforesaid larger annual payment shall be appropriated for the augmentation of the said Benefice of Notting Hill, Saint Columb; (e) an annual sum of £74 being a further part of the aforesaid larger annual payment together with the sum of £17 17s. 8d. per annum at present payable by us towards the stipend of a Curate for the said Benefice of Notting Hill, Saint Columb, shall be added to the remaining part, namely £108 2s. 4d. per annum, of the grant of £120 per annum at present payable by us towards the stipend of a first Curate for the said Benefice of Notting Hill, Christ Church, and the combined sum of £200 per annum shall be payable towards the stipend of a Curate for the said Benefice of Notting Hill, Saint Columb; and (f) all other the endowments and property of the said Benefice of Notting Hill, Christ Church, other than the Parsonage House thereof, shall belong to the United Benefice. Provided always that the several sums payable towards the stipends of Curates for the United Benefice and for the said Benefice of Notting Hill, Saint Columb, as herein recommended and proposed shall be payable in accordance with the regulations and conditions from time to time in force concerning the payment of Curate Grants made by us out of our Common Fund.

" 7.—(a) That so soon as conveniently may be after the union has taken effect Christ Church, Notting Hill, shall be taken down and the materials and site thereof, together with any ground annexed thereto and necessary for the use and enjoyment thereof shall be sold and disposed of by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, at such time or times and in such manner in all respects as to us shall seem expedient subject to the conditions and restrictions imposed by the said Measures.

" (b) That the net proceeds to arise from such sale or sales after defraying the expenses attendant upon the sale or sales, the taking down of the Church, the removal of monuments (if any) and all other expenses incidental to these matters, shall together with the net proceeds from the sale of the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Christ Church, Notting Hill, as provided in Clause 5 of this Scheme, be applied by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners as follows, that is to say, (1) a sufficient sum shall be appropriated for the payment of the compensation or compensations hereinafter referred to or for the repayment of any advance made for the purpose of such compensation or compensations and (2) the balance of such net proceeds shall be transferred to the Expenses Fund of the Diocese of London established pursuant to the 32nd Section of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923.

" (c) That the font, communion table, and plate used for the purpose of the Holy Communion in Christ Church, Notting Hill, shall in accordance with the provisions of the said Measures and as the Bishop of the Diocese may direct be transferred to the Parish Church of the United Benefice or to some other Church or Churches within the said Diocese of London and the bells, organ and other furniture and fittings of Christ Church, Notting Hill, or such of them as the Bishop of London shall select, shall be removed to the Parish Church of the United Benefice, and any of such articles not so removed shall be removed to some other

Church or Chapel or Churches or Chapels within the Diocese of London which the Bishop may select or shall be sold and in such case the proceeds shall be added to the fund arising from the sale of the site and materials of Christ Church, Notting Hill, as aforesaid.

"(d) That in the event of the services of any Church Officers and servants of Christ Church, Notting Hill, being dispensed with by reason of the union taking effect such Church officers and servants shall out of any moneys to be received by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, under the provisions of this Clause receive such reasonable compensation as having regard to age, length of service and other circumstances of the case shall seem to us and to the Bishop of London equitable and proper. Provided always that it shall be lawful for us if we shall see fit so to do in all or any of these cases to advance the compensation money or any part thereof out of the said Expenses Fund.

"8. That with the consent of the Reverend George Ferdinand Cecil Bond, being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Notting Hill, Saint Columb (testified by his signing this Scheme), upon the union taking effect there shall be transferred and annexed for all ecclesiastical purposes to the Parish of the said Benefice of Notting Hill, Saint Columb, (a) all that part of the Parish of the said Benefice of Notting Hill, Christ Church, which lies to the south east of the middle of Golborn Road, and (b) all that part of the Parish of the said Benefice of Notting Hill, Saint Michael and All Angels, which lies to the south of an imaginary line commencing at the junction of Ladbroke Grove with Oxford Gardens and extending thence eastwards along the middle of Oxford Gardens to a point opposite to the northern end of the wall or fence forming the western boundary of the house and premises known as No. 51, Oxford Gardens, and extending thence southwards to and along such wall or fence to its southern end and extending thence eastwards along the wall or fence forming the southern boundary of the houses and premises known successively as Nos. 51 to 1 Oxford Gardens to the eastern end of the lastly mentioned wall or fence and extending thence northwards along the wall or fence forming the eastern boundary of the house and premises known as No. 51, Oxford Gardens, to its northern end and extending thence first northwards to and then eastwards along the middle of Oxford Gardens to its junction with Portobello Road.

"9. That with the consent of the said Geoffrey Francis, Bishop of London (testified as aforesaid) upon the day of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council affirming this Scheme the patronage of the said Benefice of Notting Hill, Christ Church, shall be surrendered in favour of the Patrons of the Benefice of Notting Hill, Saint Michael and All Angels, and upon the union taking effect the patronage of the United Benefice shall belong wholly to the Patrons of the said Benefice of Notting Hill, Saint Michael and All Angels.

"Provided always that the provisions herein contained relating to the sale and disposal of Christ Church, Notting Hill, shall not take effect until the consents and approval which by the said Measures are made requisite to

the sale under the powers conferred by those Measures of the site of any Church shall be obtained to the sale and disposal hereby proposed of Christ Church, Notting Hill, and of the site thereof together with any ground annexed or belonging thereto.

"And provided further that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from making any other recommendations and proposals relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Measures, or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England, or of any Act of Parliament."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have been duly published in accordance with the provisions of the said Measures, and Notices have been transmitted to the persons or bodies entitled under the said Measures to receive Notice requiring any objections to such draft Scheme to be stated or transmitted in writing to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules applicable to proceedings under the said Measures:

And whereas certain objections have been so stated or transmitted to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the same Rules:

And whereas the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners after giving full consideration to such objections have deemed right to make certain alterations in such draft Scheme:

And whereas public notice of the certification to His Majesty in Council of the said Scheme and the consent thereto in writing of the Bishop of London has been duly given in the manner and within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules aforesaid:

And whereas the said Scheme has been laid before both Houses of Parliament for the space of two calendar months:

And whereas no appeal has been proceeded with to His Majesty in Council within the period of one month after the date of the said public notice in accordance with the provisions of the said Measures against the said Scheme or any part thereof by any person who has made objection as aforesaid to the said draft Scheme:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that the Benefices therein recommended to be united shall be united to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme and further to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the date when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measures.

And His Majesty by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of London.
