At the Court at *Buckingham Palace*, the 19th day of *November*, 1940.

PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 1st day of November, 1940 (C.W.6111/40), in the words following, viz.:—

"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions or other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas by Orders in Council dated the 13th July, 1915 (No. 152/C.W.) and the 13th April, 1918 (10/C.W.) certain conditions of service were laid down for temporary Instructor Officers of the Royal Navy:

"And whereas we consider it desirable that Instructor Officers entered for the duration of the present hostilities in the Royal Navy should serve under the same conditions of service as are laid down for Officers of other branches of Your Majesty's Naval Forces who are entered for such hostilities only:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to sanction that the conditions of service set forth in the Schedule annexed hereto shall apply to Instructor Officers entered on or after the 23rd October, 1939, for service during the present hostilities.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in these proposals.

"SCHEDULE.

"*Temporary Instructor Lieutenants, Royal Navy, entered for the period of hostilities only.*

"1. *Full Pay.*—Pay to be at the rate laid down from time to time for other Instructor Officers of the Royal Navy.

"2. *Sick Leave.*—Sick leave on full pay or otherwise to be granted under the regulations laid down from time to time for other temporary officers entered for the period of hostilities.

"3. *Discharge Gratuities.*—The discharge gratuities provided under the Regulations established by Orders in Council of the 13th July, 1915, and the 13th April, 1918, not to be payable."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.
