ROYAL AIR FORCE.

The KING has been graciously pleased to approve the following appointment and awards in recognition of gallantry displayed in flying operations against the enemy:—

Appointed a Companion of the Distinguished Service Order.

Squadron Leader Archibald Ashmore MCKELLAR, D.F.C. (90168), Auxiliary Air Force (since killed in action)—No. 605 Squadron.

This officer has led his squadron with outstanding courage and determination. He has destroyed 20 enemy aircraft, and his magnificent fighting spirit has proved an excellent inspiration to his fellow pilots.

Awarded a Bar to the Distinguished Flying Cross.

Acting Flight Lieutenant John Wolferstan VILLA, D.F.C. (39768)—No. 92 Squadron.

In October, 1940, this officer led his squadron in an attack against an enemy bombing formation attempting a raid on London, and immediately caused the enemy to jettison their bombs and form a defensive circle. He pressed home his attack with great determination and assisted in the destruction of two Messerschmitt 109's and possibly a further two. He has shown outstanding powers of leadership, skill and courage and has destroyed a total of 13 hostile aircraft.

Pilot Officer Robert Francis Thomas DOE, D.F.C. (41908)—No. 238 Squadron.

This officer has continued to engage the enemy with initiative and success. On one occasion he dived vertically through a strong

protective formation of fighters and attacked two four-engined enemy aircraft. He has destroyed a total of 14 hostile aircraft.

Pilot Officer Thomas Francis NEIL, D.F.C. (79168)—No. 249 Squadron.

In November, 1940, this officer engaged a Junkers 87, which he destroyed within the space of six minutes. He was then attacked by three Messerschmitt 109's, two of which he destroyed. His magnificent fighting spirit has enabled him to destroy at least 11 enemy aircraft.

Awarded the Distinguished Flying Cross.

Acting Squadron Leader Norman Maxwell BOFFEE (37343)—No. 75 (New Zealand) Squadron.

One night in November, 1940, this officer was captain of an aircraft detailed to attack the marshalling yards at Munich. He was the first to locate the target, which he successfully bombed, causing large fires that were instrumental in guiding subsequent aircraft to the area. The successful completion of the operation was largely due to Squadron Leader Boffee's accuracy in navigation and bomb-aiming. His work as a flight commander has been marked by consistent keenness and devotion to duty and, as captain of aircraft, he has taken part in 27 bombing attacks.

Acting Squadron Leader Michael Lister ROBINSON (37300)—No. 609 Squadron.

Squadron Leader Robinson has shown conspicuous gallantry and leadership in his attacks against the enemy. On two days, in combat with large enemy forces, he destroyed two of their aircraft on each occasion, bringing his total victories to at least six.

Flight Lieutenant Christopher John MOUNT (36162)—No. 602 Squadron.

This officer has shown outstanding ability as a leader. One day in October, 1940, he led his squadron against the enemy with outstanding success when eight of their aircraft were destroyed without loss. Flight Lieutenant Mount has himself destroyed two and damaged a further three enemy aircraft.

Acting Flight Lieutenant Alfred William Alexander BAYNE (39014)—No. 17 Squadron.

In November, 1940, this officer led his squadron against 25 heavily escorted enemy dive bombers which were attacking two destroyers. His magnificent leadership and quick judgment largely contributed to the splendid success of the squadron, which destroyed 15 and damaged several more of the enemy bombers without loss. He has himself destroyed four enemy aircraft and assisted in the destruction of others.

Acting Flight Lieutenant Lloyd Watt COLEMAN (72585)—Royal Air Force Volunteer Reserve—No. 149 Squadron.

In November, 1940, this officer was captain of an aircraft detailed to attack the railway yards and locomotive sheds at Munich. In spite of the fact that on his arrival he found considerable anti-aircraft activity and that he had been warned of the presence of balloons, he glided down to a height of

3,500 feet and straddled the target with his bombs. He then circled the town and ordered his air gunners to put out as many searchlights as possible. Since June, 1940, Flight Lieutenant Coleman has carried out 25 raids, 15 of them as captain of aircraft, during which he has displayed skill, persistent determination and devotion to duty and has set a magnificent example to his squadron.

Acting Flight Lieutenant Robert Hugh HOLLAND (33487)—No. 92 Squadron.

This officer has been continuously engaged in active operations since October, 1939. He has shown outstanding skill in leading his section, flight and squadron, and his keenness to engage the enemy on all occasions has proved a splendid example. He has destroyed at least six enemy aircraft and damaged a considerable number of others.

Acting Flight Lieutenant Walter John LAWSON (43419)—No. 19 Squadron.

Flight Lieutenant Lawson has consistently led his flight, and frequently his squadron, with great skill and courage and has destroyed at least five enemy aircraft. His exceptional coolness inspires great confidence in his fellow pilots. On two occasions he has refused to abandon his aircraft when damage caused would clearly have justified such a course.

Acting Flight Lieutenant Anthony Desmond Joseph LOVELL (40402)—No. 41 Squadron.

This officer has flown continuously on active operations against the enemy since war began. He has shown a fine fighting spirit and has led his flight and on occasions his squadron with great courage, coolness and determination. He has destroyed seven enemy aircraft.

Flying Officer Richard George Arthur BARCLAY (74661), Royal Air Force Volunteer Reserve—No. 249 Squadron.

This officer has shown admirable coolness and courage in combat against the enemy. His keenness and determination have enabled him to destroy at least four of their aircraft.

Flying Officer Thomas Paul Michael COOPER-SLIPPER (41555)—No. 605 Squadron.

Flying Officer Cooper-Slipper has displayed great skill and daring in air combat. On one occasion he deliberately rammed and destroyed a hostile aircraft after his own controls had been practically shot away. He has destroyed seven enemy aircraft and damaged three others.

Pilot Officer George Ernest GOODMAN (42598)—No. 1 Squadron.

This officer has performed outstanding work in all his engagements against the enemy. In October, 1940, he assisted in the destruction of an enemy bomber which was attacking an aerodrome in the failing light at dusk. His courage and resourcefulness have enabled him to destroy at least six enemy aircraft.

Pilot Officer David Cooper LEARY (42756)—No. 17 Squadron.

In November, 1940, this officer was engaged with his squadron in protecting two destroyers which were being attacked by a formation of enemy dive bombers heavily escorted by fighters. Showing magnificent courage and determination, Pilot Officer Cooper destroyed two of the enemy bombers and assisted in the destruction of another. He has now destroyed at least five enemy aircraft.

Pilot Officer Graham Herbert RUSSELL (42025)—No. 236 Squadron.

In November, 1940, Pilot Officer Russell was engaged on a reconnaissance of Brest. Despite box barrage of about 600 bursts and intense light anti-aircraft fire which caused him to descend to 20 feet over the harbour, he succeeded in obtaining valuable information regarding the disposition of ships in the harbour and enemy aircraft on the aerodrome at Brest-Guilers. On the return flight he attacked a Dornier 24 flying boat, which was destroyed after a short engagement. He has consistently shown great dash and initiative and his example has been an inspiration to his fellow pilots.

Pilot Officer John Ronald URWIN-MANN (42281)—No. 238 Squadron.

This officer has displayed initiative and dash in his many engagements against the enemy. He has led his section in an excellent manner and has destroyed at least eight enemy aircraft.

Awarded a Bar to the Distinguished Flying Medal.

740042 Sergeant James Harry LACEY, D.F.M., Royal Air Force Volunteer Reserve—No. 501 Squadron.

Sergeant Lacey has shown consistent efficiency and great courage. He has led his section on many occasions and his splendid qualities as a fighter pilot have enabled him to destroy at least 19 enemy aircraft.

Awarded the Distinguished Flying Medal.

740603 Sergeant Michael Christopher Bindloss BODDINGTON, Royal Air Force Volunteer Reserve—No. 234 Squadron.

This airman has participated in nearly every operational patrol carried out by his squadron. He has displayed great determination, coolness and courage and has destroyed six hostile aircraft.

991242 Sergeant Glyn GRIFFITHS—No. 17 Squadron.

This airman has shown splendid courage and initiative in his attacks against the enemy. He has destroyed at least six of their aircraft, two of which were shot down in one day.

748522 Sergeant Eric William WRIGHT, Royal Air Force Volunteer Reserve—No. 605 Squadron.

This airman has displayed fine qualities of leadership, skill and courage. His sound tactics and efficiency have enabled him to destroy at least six enemy aircraft.

Whereas it is expedient that the Council of the County Borough of Smethwick (which Council and County Borough are in this Order referred to as "the Council" and "the County Borough" respectively) should be empowered to appoint Officers to be termed Adjudicating Officers to perform duties under the Poor Law Acts, 1930 to 1938, relating to the grant of relief:

Now therefore the Minister of Health, in exercise of the powers conferred upon him by the Poor Law Act, 1930, and of all other powers enabling him in that behalf, hereby makes the following Order:—

Citation, &c.

1.—(1) This Order may be cited as the Smethwick (Adjudicating Officers) Order, 1940, and, in its application to the County Borough, shall be read as one with the Public Assistance Order, 1930, as amended by the Public Assistance (Casual Poor) Order, 1931 and the Public Assistance (Casual Poor) Amendment Order, 1939, the Public Assistance (Amendment) Order, 1939, the Public Assistance (Amendment) Order, 1940 and the Public Assistance (Amendment) Order (No. 2), 1940 and modified by this Order:

Provided that in case of any inconsistency the provisions of this Order shall prevail.

(2) This Order shall come into operation on the eleventh day of December, 1940.

Modification of Orders, &c., applicable to the County Borough.

2.—(1) Any orders, rules or regulations made by the Minister and in force in the County Borough shall, in their application to the County Borough, have effect subject to such modifications as may be necessary to give full effect to the provisions of this Order.

(2) Notwithstanding the generality of the provisions of paragraph (1) of this Article the Public Assistance Order, 1930, as amended

as hereinbefore set out shall in its application to the County Borough be modified in manner following, namely:—

(a) in paragraph (1) (b) of Article 25, before the words "a Relieving Officer", there shall be inserted the words "an Adjudicating Officer or";

(b) in paragraph (5) of Article 166, after the words "the Council" wherever those words occur, there shall be inserted the words "or an Adjudicating Officer" and after the words "when required by them" there shall be inserted the words "or him";

(c) to paragraph (1) of Article 167 there shall be added the words "and shall also attend before any Adjudicating Officer when that Officer is considering applications for relief reported to him by the Relieving Officer";

(d) in paragraph (4) of Article 167, after the word "Committee", there shall be inserted the words "and each attendance before any Adjudicating Officer";

(e) in paragraph (5) of Article 167, for the words "report to the Committee at their next meeting every application for relief made to him since their previous meeting", there shall be substituted the words "report to the Adjudicating Officer acting for his district every application for relief made to him";

(f) in paragraph (12) of Article 167, for the words "until the next ordinary meeting of the Committee", there shall be substituted the words "until his next attendance before an Adjudicating Officer."

(3) Notwithstanding the generality of the provisions of paragraph (1) of this Article the Relief Regulation Order, 1930, as partly rescinded on 19th December 1931 and amended by the Relief Regulation (Amendment) Order, 1932, the Relief Regulation (Amendment) Order, 1940 and the Relief Regulation (Amendment) Order (No. 2), 1940, shall in its application to the County Borough be modified in manner following, namely:—

(a) in the proviso to paragraph (2) (a) of Article 11, for the word "Committee" wherever that word occurs, there shall be substituted the words "Sub-Committee or Adjudicating Officer" and the word "their" in line 7 shall be omitted;

(b) in Article 10, the proviso to Article 12 and Article 16, after the words "Committee or Sub-Committee" wherever those words occur, there shall be inserted the words "or Adjudicating Officer."

Appointment of Officers.

3. The Council shall from time to time appoint such numbers of suitable persons as they may think necessary to hold the office of Adjudicating Officer and may so appoint such numbers of suitable persons to hold the office of Assistant Adjudicating Officer and any person so appointed to either of those offices shall perform such of the duties of that office (as prescribed by this Order) in such area or areas as the Council may from time to time require.

Conditions of Service, &c.

4. Every person appointed by the Council as an Adjudicating Officer shall be a Senior Poor Law Officer.

Duties of Adjudicating Officer.

5. The duties of Adjudicating Officer shall be the following, namely—

- (a) to consider all applications for relief reported to him by Relieving Officers and Relieving Officers' Reports thereon, and, when necessary, to interview applicants for relief;
- (b) to determine, in accordance with the statutory provisions and any rules, orders or regulations made by the Minister in that behalf, and, subject thereto, in accordance with rules to be prescribed by the Council for the purpose, the nature and amount of relief (if any) to be given to applicants for relief;
- (c) to make orders for the grant of relief accordingly;
- (d) to reconsider periodically, in accordance with any rules, orders or regulations made by the Minister in that behalf, and, subject thereto, in accordance with any rules prescribed by the Council for the purpose, the cases of persons receiving relief, and to make any necessary orders with regard thereto;
- (e) to report to the appropriate Sub-Committee of the Public Assistance Committee all orders for relief made by him;
- (f) to refer for consideration by the appropriate Sub-Committee of the Public Assistance Committee such applications for relief reported to him by Relieving Officers and such cases due for reconsideration by him as in his opinion should be dealt with by such Sub-Committee, and also any cases falling within such classes as the Council may from time to time direct;
- (g) to refer to the appropriate Sub-Committee of the Public Assistance Committee for review or consideration any case in which a recipient of relief or an applicant for relief asks for reconsideration of the Adjudicating Officer's determination or proposed determination of his case;
- (h) to keep Relief Order Books and to make entries therein in accordance with the provisions of Article 22 of the Public Assistance Order, 1930, whenever he considers applications for relief or reconsiders cases in which relief has been granted;
- (i) to report to the appropriate Sub-Committee of the Public Assistance Committee all cases in which an application for relief has been refused, or in which on reconsideration relief has been discontinued;
- (j) to carry out such other duties relating to the grant of relief as may be assigned to him by the Public Assistance Committee.

Duties of Assistant Adjudicating Officers.

6. Assistant Adjudicating Officers shall perform such of the duties of Adjudicating Officers as the Council may from time to time prescribe and, unless expressly authorised by the Council to act as temporary substitutes for Adjudicating Officers under Article 149 of the Public Assistance Order, 1930, they shall act immediately under the direction of Adjudicating Officers.
