Kensington, May 31.

HIS Majesty was pleased this day to declare in Council, That intending to go over to *Holland* for a short time, He has appointed *Thomas* Lord Archbishop of *Canterbury*; *John* Lord *Sommers*, Baron of *Erusham*, Lord Chancellor of *England*; *Thomas* Earl of *Pembroke* and *Montgomery*, Lord President of the Council; *John* Viscount *Lonsdale*, Lord Privy-Seal; *William* Duke of *Devonshire*, Lord Steward of His Majesty's Household; *John* Earl of *Bridgewater*, First Commissioner of the Admiralty; *John* Earl of *Mariborough*, Governor to his Highness the Duke of *Glocester*; *Edward* Earl of *Ferisy*, one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State; and *Charles* *Montague* Esq; First Commissioner of the Treasury; to be Lords Justices of *England* for the Administration of the Government during His Majesty's Absence.

Legborne, May 22. N.S. The Letters from *Palermo* of the 7th Instant give an Account, that a Felucca was come in there from *Sardinia*, the Master of which say That on the 2d, Admiral *Aylmer*, with the Squadron of *English* Men of War under his Command, came to an Anchor off of *Cape Polo*, and failed again the same day for *Tunis*. Last week failed from hence the *Chetwyn*, Capt. *Motherby*, and the *Speedwel*, Capt. *Clark*, Commanders, both for the Gulph of *Vinice*; and the *Elizabeth* and *Ann*, Captain *Timothy Paine*, and the *Amity*, Captain *Thomas Young*, bound for *London*; The *Sarah*, Captain *John Williams* Commander, put to Sea last night, being bound for *Alexandria*, and the *Shrewsbury*, Captain *Goddard*, is departed for *Tunis*. The Marquess of *Tavistock*, who is travelling in these Parts, came hither last week, and was by the Great Duke's Order lodged in the Prince's Palace; The Marquis *del Borro*, General of the Great Duke's Forces, and Governor of *Legborne*, visited his Lordship, and having splendidly entertained him at Dinner, carried him to see the Mould, where he was saluted by the *English* Ships in this Port; And his Lordship has since left this Place, intending to go to *Pisa*, and thence to *Genova*.

Venice, May 22. Signior *Ruzzini* arrived here last Sunday from *Vienna*, and on Monday went to the Senate, and gave an Account of his Negotiations in his late Embassies to the Imperial Court, and at the Treaty of *Carlowitz*. Cardinal *Ottoboni* is shortly expected here from *Rome*. The Letters from *Spalatro* of the 9th Instant say, that Signior *Grimani*, Commissioner from this Republic for settling the Limits between the *Venetian* and *Turkish* Territories, having received Advice, that *Osman Aga*, Sceleter or Sword-bearer to the Sultan, who is appointed to confer with him as Commissioner from the Port, was arrived at

Traunick in *Bosnia*, he dispatched Colonel *Alberti* with a *Droggerman* to agree with him about the Time and Place of their Meeting, and the Manner in which they should hold their Conferences; but the Colonel met at *Singh* some *Turkish* Officers, who were coming to the *Venetian* Commissioner on the like Account, with whom he returned to *Spalatro*, and Signior *Grimani* having adjusted all Matters with them, the *Turks* were returned to *Traunick*; And Signior *Grimani* was preparing to leave *Spalatro*, in order to repair to the Place of Conference.

Warsaw, May 20. Several of the Provincial Diets have sent Deputies to the King of *Poland*, to desire he will send home the *Saxon* Forces that are in this Kingdom, and it's said, the King has promised to comply with their Desire; Upon which, they are returned home very well satisfied. The *Sieur Van Beuchling*, and the *Sieur Bryer*, both Members of the Council of *Saxony*, who came hither to receive the King's Orders touching the Affairs of that Electorate, are on their departure from hence for *Dresden*. Our last Letters from *Lemberg* say, they had Advice, that all Things were preparing at *Caminiec* for the Evacuating of that Place, and that the Crown-Generall and the other Commissioners who are appointed to take Possession of it, where on their Journey thither.

Vienna, May 23. The Imperial Court came this evening from *Laxembourg* to *Favorita*, and will be to morrow here in Town; and their Imperial Majesties intend the next day to return to *Laxembourg*. The Count *de Paar*, who was appointed to go and Compliment the Elector of *Bavaria* in the Name of the Emperor on the Death of the Electoral Prince his Son, being fallen sick, Count *Anthony of Dietrichstein* is ordered to go thither in his Place. An Envoy arrived here this week from the Duke of *Savoy*, to notify the Birth of his Son the Prince of *Piedmont*. The Marquis *de Villars*, Envoy Extraordinary from *France*, has congratulated the King and Queen of the *Romans* on their Marriage; which Compliment had been delayed thus long, by reason of the Differences that happened between the High-Steward to the Arch-Duke and the said Envoy, who did not come to Court till the same was accommodated. The Count *de Mansfeldt*, who went some time ago to *Presbourg*, is returned hither. It's said, the Emperor's Journey's to *Hungary* is put off till the latter end of the next Month; and that the King of the *Romans* will accompany him, intending to visit the fortified Places in that Kingdom. Prince *Eugene* of *Savoy* is preparing to go thither, to give Directions, as well for the finishing of the new Fortress that was begun last Summer by his Order near *Arat*, as for adding some new Works to the Fortifications of *Buda*, *Esseck*; and *Peters Waradin*. The Count *de Zedenicki*, who has resided some time at the Court of *Poland* as Envoy from the Emperor, arrived here this week, and

has
