The Exequatur of Monsieur Jean Gabriel Henry Marie Trémoulet, a French Citizen, as Consul-General of the French Republic at Sydney, Australia, with jurisdiction in the Fiji Islands, the Gilbert and Ellice Islands and the Solomon Islands, has been revoked, and the official recognition accorded to him in his consular capacity has accordingly been withdrawn as from the 5th December, 1940.

Proposal to vary Minimum Rates of Wages
(including Holiday Remuneration).

The Sugar Confectionery and Food Preserving Trade Board (Great Britain) hereby give notice that they propose to vary Minimum Rates of Wages with corresponding variations of Holiday Remuneration.

The Trade Board will consider any objection to the above-mentioned proposals which may be lodged with them within fourteen days from roth December, 1940.
