On 14th July, 1940, Sergeant Jobson and Driver Gurnham displayed great coolness and gallantry when a Battle aircraft crashed, and burst into flames outside an aerodrome. Driver Gurnham was the first on the scene of the accident, followed by Sergeant Jobson about one minute later. Despite the flames and ammunition which was bursting in all directions, the two men climbed on to the wreckage and succeeded in extricating the pilot who had a broken leg. A petrol tank exploded just after the rescue had been effected. Sergeant Jobson and Driver Gurnham, with complete disregard for their personal safety, undoubtedly saved the life of the pilot.

##### *Appointed a Companion of the Distinguished Service Order.*

Acting Squadron Leader Adolph Gysbert MALAN, D.F.C. (37604)—No. 74 Squadron.

This officer has commanded his squadron with outstanding success over an intensive period of air operations and, by his brilliant leadership, skill and determination has contributed largely to the successes obtained. Since early in August, 1940, the squadron has destroyed at least 84 enemy aircraft and damaged many more. Squadron Leader Malan has himself destroyed at least eighteen hostile aircraft and possibly another six.

Pilot Officer Harbourn Mackay STEPHEN, D.F.C. (78851)—Royal Air Force Volunteer Reserve; No. 74 Squadron.

One day in November, 1940, Pilot Officer Stephen led a section of his squadron in an attack against an escorted formation of enemy bombers, three of which he destroyed. Later in the month, he undertook a voluntary patrol in company with his flight commander and destroyed a Messerschmitt 109. This success brought the number of aircraft destroyed by members of his home station to the magnificent total of 600, and, at the same time, increased his own score to nineteen. His exceptional courage and skill have greatly enhanced the fine spirit shown by his squadron.

##### *Awarded the Distinguished Flying Cross.*

Flight Lieutenant Raymond Myles Beecham DUKE-WOOLLEY—No. 253 Squadron.

This officer has commanded his squadron since September, 1940, and his fine leadership and personal example have contributed materially to the many successes obtained. He has destroyed at least three enemy aircraft and damaged several more.

Flying Officer Alan Francis ECKFORD (41563)—No. 253 Squadron.

This officer has displayed great keenness in his attacks against the enemy both in France and in England. His courage and skill, often in the face of odds, have enabled him to destroy six enemy aircraft.

Pilot Officer Charles Francis AMBROSE (42583)—No. 46 Squadron.

This officer has taken part in 100 operational missions during which he has destroyed at least two enemy aircraft and damaged several others. He has displayed outstanding courage and a fine fighting spirit throughout.

Pilot Officer Bryan Vincent DRAPER (76309)—Royal Air Force Volunteer Reserve, No. 74 Squadron.

Since December, 1939, Pilot Officer Draper has participated in numerous engagements

against the enemy. He has shown great skill and determination as a fighter pilot and has destroyed seven enemy aircraft.

This airman has shown great courage and determination over a long and intensive period of air operations. He has destroyed seven enemy aircraft.

Within a period of eight days in September, 1940, this airman destroyed two enemy aircraft and assisted in the destruction of three more. His courage and efficiency over a long period, have set a splendid example to his fellow pilots. He has personally destroyed four enemy aircraft and possibly four more.

800632 Acting Sergeant James Douglas CULMER—Auxiliary Air Force, No. 25 Squadron.

Sergeant Culmer was the rear gunner of an aircraft patrolling an area over Essex one night in November, 1940, when searchlights suddenly illuminated a Heinkel 111, about 50 yards astern. He opened fire with the utmost speed, and the accuracy of his fire caused the Heinkel to break up. He displayed great skill and vigilance.
