24th December, 1940.*

COAL MINES ACT, 1930.**CENTRAL (COAL MINES) SCHEME, 1930.**

Whereas by sub-section (5) of Section 1 of the Coal Mines Act, 1930, it is provided that any scheme may be amended with the approval of the Board of Trade in manner provided by the scheme;

And whereas in pursuance of the powers conferred upon them by sub-section (4) of Section 2 of the said Act, the Board of Trade have made the Central (Coal Mines) Scheme (Amendment) Order, 1940, which provides that the Central (Coal Mines) Scheme, 1930, may be amended so as to provide for certain matters specified in the schedule thereto in addition to the matters mentioned in sub-sections (2) and (3) of Section 2 of the said Act;

And whereas the amendments of the said scheme set out in the schedule hereto have been submitted to the Board of Trade by the Central Council for approval:

Now therefore the Board of Trade, in pursuance of the powers conferred upon them by sub-section (5) of Section 1 of the said Act, hereby approve the amendments of the Central (Coal Mines) Scheme, 1930, set out in the schedule hereto and approve the first day of January, 1941, as the date on which the said amendments shall come into force.

SCHEDULE.

The Central (Coal Mines) Scheme, 1930, shall be amended by the insertion of the following clause, that is to say:—

(1) If the owner of any coal mine situated in Great Britain has on application made by him to the Council satisfied the Council that the production, supply or sale of coal from his undertaking during any impairment quarter which has commenced on a date subsequent to the 30th day of September, 1940, and prior to that on which either (a) the Emergency Powers (Defence) Act, 1939, as originally enacted or subsequently amended or extended shall expire, or (b) a period of twelve months after the termination of actual hostilities in every war which has commenced since the 2nd day of September, 1939, in which His Majesty may

have been engaged shall have elapsed, whichever of these two dates shall be the earlier (in this clause referred to as a "particular impairment quarter") has been impaired by reason of loss of trade consequent on any such war as aforesaid, the Council may, if they think fit, pay to any such owner in respect of any such particular impairment quarter such amount as is hereinafter specified for the purposes of facilitating the production, supply or sale of coal from his undertaking; so however that in the case of an undertaking in respect of which the owner has been paid any amount under the provisions of this sub-clause and which, in the opinion of the Council, has not been maintained so that the maintenance tonnage of that undertaking could be produced or supplied therefrom within such time as they may deem reasonable, the Council shall not (unless they are satisfied that the failure so to maintain the undertaking is solely due to hostile operations and that such owner is taking or has caused to be taken all steps possible for remedying that failure with all reasonable speed) pay any further amount to that owner under the provisions of this sub-clause unless and until such maintenance tonnage can, in the opinion of the Council, be so produced or supplied.

(2) The Executive Board for each District shall pay to the Trustees on the demand of the Council, to enable the Council to make payment to owners of coal mines in accordance with the provisions of sub-clause (1) of this clause, such contribution at a uniform rate not exceeding the amount of fourpence per ton as may from time to time be prescribed by the Council of the aggregate coal supply of all the coal mines in the district during each month commencing on the 1st day of January, 1941.

(3)—(i) The Council shall ascertain the actual total tonnage of the coal supply from all coal mines situated in Great Britain (in this clause referred to as "general coal supply tonnage") during (a) each quarter (in this clause referred to as a "standard quarter") of the year ended on the 31st day of December, 1939, and (b) the corresponding quarter (in this clause referred to as an "impairment quarter") of any year subsequent thereto commencing on the 1st day of October, 1940.

(ii) The Council shall also ascertain in respect of each standard quarter and each particular impairment quarter the actual total tonnage of the coal supply from the undertaking of any owner who has made application to the Council as mentioned in sub-clause (1) of this clause; so however that if it is proved to the satisfaction of the Council that such actual total tonnage was during any standard quarter reduced by not less than ten per centum by reason of loss of output owing to strikes or accidents the Council may in respect of any corresponding particular impairment quarter substitute for such actual total tonnage such total tonnage as they deem equitable; and if the Council are at any time of opinion that by reason of changes in the special circumstances of any part of the undertaking which have arisen since the 31st day of December, 1939, the undertaking is unable to produce or supply

in any impairment quarter the actual total tonnage produced or supplied during the corresponding standard quarter, the Council may in respect of such impairment quarter substitute for such actual total tonnage such total tonnage as they deem equitable. Such actual or substituted total tonnage, as the case may be, is referred to in this clause as "particular coal supply tonnage".

(iii) The Council shall also ascertain the actual total tonnage it would have been necessary to supply during the particular impairment quarter (in this clause referred to as "notional coal supply tonnage") from the undertaking of any owner as aforesaid so that the proportion which the notional coal supply tonnage in respect of any such undertaking bears to the general coal supply tonnage during that impairment quarter is the same as the proportion which the particular coal supply tonnage of the corresponding standard quarter bore to the general coal supply tonnage during such standard quarter.

(iv)—(a) In the case of the transfer of ownership of any coal mine or part of a coal mine the Council shall, if necessary, determine, that part of the particular coal supply tonnage and the notional coal supply tonnage of the undertaking of the transferring owner attributable to that coal mine or part thereof, as the case may be, and that part of these tonnages shall be added to the existing particular coal supply tonnage and the notional coal supply tonnage (if any) of the undertaking of the acquiring owner and deducted from those tonnages of the undertaking of the transferring owner.

(b) Before making any such addition to and deduction from the particular coal supply tonnage and the notional coal supply tonnage as aforesaid the Council may require the transferring or the acquiring owner or both of them to produce such evidence of the transfer of ownership of such coal mine or part thereof as the Council may consider necessary.

(v) The amount (if any) payable to an owner of a coal mine in pursuance of the provisions of sub-clause (1) of this clause shall be calculated at such uniform rate per ton as the Council may from time to time determine but not exceeding three shillings and sixpence and shall be payable at such uniform rate in respect of each ton of the tonnage by which the particular coal supply tonnage is less than the notional coal supply tonnage of the undertaking of that owner for the particular impairment quarter; so however that, notwithstanding anything contained in any of the paragraphs of this sub-clause, in the case of a coal mine which (a) has been first opened since the 1st day of January, 1939, (b) belongs to an owner who on the date on which such coal mine was first opened did not own any other coal mine situated in Great Britain acquired by him on or before the 1st day of January, 1939, and (c) was not open during the whole of any standard quarter, the amount (if any) payable to the owner thereof in any particular impairment quarter in pursuance of the provisions of sub-clause (1) of this clause shall be calculated at the applicable rate per ton in respect of such number of tons of coal

as the Council having regard to the special circumstances of that coal mine may deem equitable.

(4) The Council may make and from time to time vary rules as to the procedure to be followed by owners of coal mines as aforesaid for making applications under this clause, and without prejudice to the generality of the foregoing provisions such rules may prescribe the limits of time after the end of any impairment quarter within which applications in respect of that quarter may be made by such owners to the Council.

(5) The Council shall appoint from among its members a War Emergency Assistance Committee (hereinafter in this clause referred to as "the Committee") and may delegate (subject to the directions from time to time of the Council) to such Committee such of its functions under this clause as the Council may from time to time determine.

The Council may from time to time appoint a chairman of the Committee either from among the members of the Council or otherwise. No decision of the Committee shall be subject to the approval of the Council unless the Council at any time before such decision is made so directs.

(6) There shall be opened an account (to be entitled the War Emergency Assistance Account) of the Central Fund to which shall be credited all amounts received by the Trustees on behalf of the Council for the purposes of this clause and against which shall be debited all amounts payable to owners of coal mines by the Council under this clause and no other amount whatsoever shall be credited to or debited against that account; so however that on the expiration of the last impairment quarter specified in sub-clause (1) of this clause and when the Council have paid all such amounts, if any, to such owners as aforesaid under the provisions of this clause any balance then standing to the credit of the War Emergency Assistance Account shall be transferred to such account as the Council may determine.

(7) The Council shall cause true and proper separate accounts to be kept of all moneys received and paid by them in the exercise of their functions under this clause.

(8) In connection with the exercise of their functions under this clause the Council may, in addition to the exercise of the powers conferred on them by clause XV of the scheme, require such evidence and documents in support thereof (duly authenticated in such manner as the Council may from time to time determine) from any Executive Board or from any owner of a coal mine situated in Great Britain as the Council may consider necessary and any coal owner concerned shall permit inspection by any person authorised in that behalf by the Council of any coal mine owned by him and of any premises used in connection with or for the purposes of his undertaking and such owner, his agents and servants shall furnish such means as may be required by that person to enable him adequately to make such inspection.

(9)—(i) Any Executive Board who is aggrieved by any act or omission of the Council, the Committee or any person acting on behalf of the Council or the Committee, in pursuance of their functions under this clause

and any owner who is aggrieved by any such act or omission relating to, in connection with, or arising out of any application made by that owner under sub-clause (1) of this clause shall, within twenty-one days of the date of any notice of the matter or where no notice is given within twenty-one days after such Executive Board or owner (as the case may be) first became aware of the matter, be entitled by giving notice in writing to the Council to require the matter to be referred to arbitration in accordance with the provisions of this clause.

(ii) Where any matter is required to be referred to arbitration under the provisions of this clause it shall be referred to the Coal Supply Tonnage Arbitrator, who shall be appointed by the Council and who shall not be financially interested, directly or indirectly, in any undertaking comprising coal mines. Such appointment shall be for such period and on such terms as may from time to time be decided by the Council.

(iii) The Coal Supply Tonnage Arbitrator shall give such directions as he thinks fit as to the conduct and hearing of the reference and the procedure in relation thereto.

(iv) The decision of the Coal Supply Tonnage Arbitrator shall be given, if possible, within fourteen days from the receipt by him of such reference and shall be final and binding upon all parties concerned.

(v) Where any act, decision, or resolution of the Council, the Committee, or any person acting on behalf of the Council or the Committee in pursuance of their functions under this clause has been referred to arbitration under this clause the Executive Board or owner concerned shall be bound thereby pending the decision of the Coal Supply Tonnage Arbitrator.

(10) The provisions of clauses XIII and XIX shall not apply to matters in respect of which provision for arbitration is made by this clause.

(11) Notwithstanding anything contained in the scheme the provisions of this clause shall govern the matters dealt with thereby and any provision contained in any other clause of the scheme shall be read, construed and have effect as altered or modified as may be necessary.

(12) In this clause, unless the context otherwise requires, the following expressions have the meanings hereby respectively assigned to them, that is to say:—

"Coal Supply" means, in relation to any coal mine or undertaking for any period the aggregate of the export supply and the inland supply of coal supplied from that coal mine or undertaking during such period as ascertained for the purposes of the Scheme by the Executive Board for the District in which the coal mine or undertaking is situate; and the expression "Supply" shall be construed accordingly.

"Hostile operations" includes enemy attack of any description and all measures taken by way of offence or defence against an enemy or against enemy attack or apprehended enemy attack.

"Maintenance tonnage" means the particular coal supply tonnage, if any, of an undertaking for a standard quarter or, if none, such number of tons of coal as

the Council, having regard to the special circumstances of that undertaking, may from time to time determine.

"Quarter" means the period of three months beginning on the first day of January, the first day of April, the first day of July or the first day of October in any year.

"Undertaking" means one coal mine or, if more than one coal mine is in the same ownership, all the mines in that ownership.
