*Document No. 3.*DEFENCE (FINANCE) REGULATIONS,
1939.

ACQUISITION OF SECURITIES.

TREASURY DIRECTIONS.

The Treasury, in pursuance of paragraph (2) of Regulation 1 of the Defence (Finance) Regulations, 1939, have, by the Acquisition of Securities (No. 1) Order, 1941, transferred to themselves certain securities as detailed in that Order.

In pursuance of paragraph (3) of the said Regulation, the Treasury hereby give the following directions to the owners of securities so transferred.

1. The documents of title relating to the securities shall (except as mentioned in paragraph 3 below) be delivered forthwith to the Bank of England, London, or to one of the Receiving Banks mentioned in paragraph 6, for transmission to the Bank of England and shall be accompanied by:—

(i) Form S.1 (B), or S.2 as appropriate, issued by the Bank of England in relation to the securities, and

(ii) the documents prescribed in paragraph 2.

Such delivery should be made through a bank or stockbroker in the United Kingdom, but may be made directly to the Securities Registration Office, the Bank of England, London, or to one of the said Receiving Banks.

2.—(a) Bonds in respect of which interest is represented by coupons, shall be accompanied by all relative coupons maturing on or after the 12th day of January, 1941.

(b) Bonds registered as to principal and interest, or as to principal only, and certificates in respect of registered shares or stock shall be accompanied by a form of transfer or power of attorney (either endorsed on the back of the document of title or in a separate form) duly signed by the registered holder or holders: signatures shall be witnessed and shall also be confirmed by a bank or stockbroker. Transfers and powers of attorney shall not be dated and the names of the transferees and attorneys shall not be inserted therein.

3.—(a) Where the documents of title are held at the United Kingdom Security Deposit, Montreal, delivery shall be effected by the delivery of such documents to The Agency, Bank of Montreal, New York. Such delivery shall be effected by the owner procuring the bank or stockbroker through whom the documents of title were delivered to the Bank of England for transmission to the United Kingdom Security Deposit to complete as requisite the prescribed Form P.8.

(b) In other cases where documents of title are held outside the United Kingdom delivery may be effected, together with the required documents, to The Agency, Bank of Montreal, New York as agents for the Bank of England. Holders desiring to avail themselves of this facility shall, before giving the necessary instructions, apply to the Bank of England, London, or to one of the said Receiving Banks, on the appropriate form, for a Deposit Voucher,

and lodge with the application the appropriate Form S.1 (B) or S.2 referred to in paragraph 1 (i). The Deposit Vouchers should be forwarded to the custodian of the documents of title and should accompany such documents when delivery is made, or alternatively, if the holder transmits instructions to the custodian of the documents of title by telegraph, the identification number shown on the Deposit Voucher shall be advised to the custodian, who shall make reference to this identification number when the documents of title are delivered to The Agency, Bank of Montreal, New York.

4. Payment shall be made after delivery of the requisite documents, complete and in order, has been made to the Bank of England, or (where the documents of title are delivered to The Agency, Bank of Montreal, New York) after advice has been received by the Bank of England from The Agency, Bank of Montreal, New York, that the requisite documents of title complete and in order have been delivered to them. Such payment shall be made:—

(a) On the 24th February, 1941, where on or before the 17th January, 1941, either the documents of title are so delivered to the Bank of England or to The Agency, Bank of Montreal, New York, or (if such documents are held by the United Kingdom Security Deposit) Form P.8 is so delivered to the Bank of England.

(b) On the 24th February, 1941, or seven days after advice from The Agency, Bank of Montreal, New York, of due delivery (which-ever is the later), where the documents of title are delivered to The Agency, Bank of Montreal, New York, or where such documents are already held by the United Kingdom Security Deposit and Form P.8 is lodged with the Bank of England after the 17th January, 1941, with directions to give instructions for transfer by cable.

(c) In any other case, six weeks after delivery of documents of title or of Form P.8 as the case may be.

5. Payment shall be made by the Bank of England in London:—

(a) In the case of securities delivered to the Bank of England through a bank or stockbroker, to that bank or stockbroker.

(b) In the case of securities delivered directly to the Bank of England, to the person by whom the documents were delivered.

(c) In the case of securities delivered to The Agency, Bank of Montreal, New York, to the person through whom the application for a deposit voucher was lodged.

(d) In the case of securities the documents of title to which are held by the United Kingdom Security Deposit, Montreal, to the person through whom instructions for delivery to The Agency, Bank of Montreal, New York, are received.

6. The Bank of Ireland, Belfast, and any branch in the Isle of Man of Barclays Bank, Limited, Lloyds Bank, Limited, Martins Bank, Limited or the Westminster Bank, Limited, shall be Receiving Banks for the purposes of this Direction.

ROYAL AIR FORCE.

The KING has been graciously pleased to approve the following appointment and awards in recognition of gallantry displayed in flying operations against the enemy:—

Appointed a Companion of the Distinguished Service Order.

Wing Commander Richard Angus McMURTRIE, D.F.C. (28229), No. 269 Squadron.

This officer displayed determined leadership and sound judgment when during a period of five days in December, 1940, he led three separate bombing missions against a

target over 60 miles inside Norway. On the first occasion, despite heavy cloud over sea and land he successfully located and attacked his objective. He then remained flying in the target area with his lights burning in order to assist subsequent aircraft in finding the target. In the next two raids he again bombed the target heavily with unhurried precision. He has taken part in 76 operational flights and his leadership and personal example in the air are of the utmost value to the squadron.

Awarded a Bar to the Distinguished Flying Cross.

Acting Flight Lieutenant George Patterson CHRISTIE, D.F.C. (40081), No. 66 Squadron.

This officer has shown outstanding ability and leadership over a long period of air operations. He is a keen and determined pilot and has destroyed at least seven enemy aircraft.

Awarded the Distinguished Flying Cross.

Squadron Leader Norman George MULHOLLAND (34098), No. 115 Squadron.

Since August, 1940, this officer has participated in 24 major operations, which have entailed over 141 flying hours. One night in December, 1940, undaunted by heavy anti-aircraft fire concentrated on his aircraft, he made several runs over Kiel Harbour, and obtained a number of valuable photographs. On the following night Squadron Leader Mulholland obtained a valuable record of the result of the concerted raid upon objectives in Mannheim. By his persistent determination, outstanding skill, courage and leadership, this officer has at all times set a very high example.

Acting Squadron Leader Robert Norman BATESON (39054), No. 113 Squadron.

Squadron Leader Bateson has displayed great devotion to duty when leading his squadron during extensive operations during September and October, 1940. His leadership has in fact played a considerable part in forcing the enemy to abandon several of his military base ports. He has led operational formations on thirty-six occasions and often, after objectives have been attacked, he has had to force his way through superior numbers of enemy fighters. Squadron Leader Bateson has also carried out a long series of hazardous reconnaissances and has obtained vital information. Throughout the period of active operations he has displayed rare courage and devotion to duty.

Awarded the Distinguished Flying Medal.

561348 Flight Sergeant Reginald Harvey SMITH, No. 269 Squadron.

One night in December, 1940, this airman successfully navigated the leading aircraft of a formation which attacked a target 60 miles inside Norway. So well did he make use of the little he could see of the sea and mountain tops that the objective was successfully attacked in weather which seemed quite prohibitive to success. Since the beginning of the war he has carried out 138 operational flights consisting of 600 flying hours, and has

carried out successful attacks against units of the enemy fleet. He has always shown skill, determination and devotion to duty of a high order.

740790 Sergeant Peter Frederic JACKSON, Royal Air Force Volunteer Reserve, No. 604 Squadron.

One night in December, 1940, this airman was the pilot of a fighter aircraft on patrol. While closing in to attack a night raider he was fired on by its rear gunner and was badly cut about the head and face. In spite of his face being covered with blood and only being able to see with one eye, he returned and landed his aircraft safely at his base in poor visibility and without wireless aid. Sergeant Jackson has displayed determination and outstanding eagerness to search and destroy enemy night bombers at the closest range.

638009 Sergeant Wilfred SCARROTT, No. 59 Squadron.

One day in December, 1940, this airman was the wireless operator air gunner of an aircraft detailed to carry out a photographic reconnaissance of enemy occupied aerodromes in Northern France. His aircraft was attacked from astern by two Messerschmitt 109's and during the first burst of enemy fire Sergeant Scarrott was wounded in the face and his gun sight was shot away. Despite this he returned a long burst at one of the enemy aircraft causing it to crash into the sea. He displayed coolness, courage and efficiency of a high order.

746791 Sergeant Frederick SYMMONS, Royal Air Force Volunteer Reserve, No. 115 Squadron.

Since July, 1940, Sergeant Symmons has completed 28 operational flights, totalling 177 flying hours. One night in December, as navigator and camera operator he was successful in obtaining valuable photographs of Kiel Harbour despite very heavy anti-aircraft fire. On the following night during an attack on Mannheim he obtained an excellent photograph giving valuable information regarding the damage done. Sergeant Symmons has displayed exceptional skill and coolness, and the success achieved in night photography is largely due to his persistent efforts and devotion to duty.
