"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty, by Your Order in Council, may be graciously pleased to sanction payment accordingly, with effect from the 1st September, 1940.

"We beg humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to sanction the payment of Continuous Service rates of pay to all Special Service ratings of all branches in which they may be entered.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in this proposal."

(hereinafter called 'the Duke of Portland') as tenant for life under a compound Settlement constituted by (i) a Settlement dated the 2nd day of August 1879 and made between the Most Noble William John Cavendish Bentinck Scott then Duke of Portland of the first part the Duke of Portland of the second part Edward Bailey of the third part and Arthur Charles Greville and the said Edward Bailey of the fourth part (ii) a Dientailing Assurance dated the 9th day of August 1915 and made between the Duke of Portland of the first part the Most Honourable William Arthur Henry Cavendish Bentinck commonly called the Marquess of Titchfield of the second part and Edward Horsman Bailey Charles Ludovic Lindsay and The Right Honourable Francis Bingham Baron Mildmay of Flete (then Francis Bingham Mildmay) of the third part and (iii) a Resettlement dated the 11th day of August 1915 and made between the Duke of Portland of the first part the said Marquess of Titchfield of the second part the Honourable Ivy Gordon Lennox of the third part and the said Edward Horsman Bailey Charles Ludovic Lindsay and Francis Bingham Baron Mildmay of Flete (then Francis Bingham Mildmay) of the fourth part. And the Duke of Portland is therefore the Patron or person entitled to present or nominate to the said Benefice in case the same were now vacant: and a Principal Vesting Deed dated the 9th day of February 1926 has been executed in pursuance of the said last mentioned Act:

"And whereas the Duke of Portland is desirous that the whole Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Sibthorpe should be transferred to and be vested in the Bishop of Southwell for the time being:

"And whereas the Right Reverend Henry, now Bishop of Southwell, is willing to accept such transfer, and in token of such his willingness and also in token that the same transfer has that consent of the Bishop of the Diocese

which by the Acts in the hereinbefore mentioned Act recited or by some or one of them is made necessary he, the said Henry, Bishop of Southwell, has executed this Scheme as hereinafter mentioned:

"And whereas the transfer of the Patronage of the said Benefice of Sibthorpe which is hereinbefore mentioned and hereinafter recommended and proposed, will in our opinion tend to make better provision for the cure of souls in the Parish or District in or in respect of which the right of Patronage or Advowson so recommended and proposed to be transferred as aforesaid arises or exists, that is to say, in the Parish of Sibthorpe:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Duke of Portland, being the person whose consent as Patron is required by the provisions of the hereinbefore mentioned Acts and of the Act of the 1st and 2nd years of her said late Majesty, Chapter 106 (in testimony of which consent he has signed and sealed this Scheme), and with the consent of the said Henry, Bishop of Southwell (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme and sealed the same with his Episcopal Seal), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme and without any conveyance or assurance in law other than such

duly gazetted Order, the whole Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Sibthorpe shall be transferred to the said Henry, Bishop of Southwell, and his successors in the same Bishopric, and shall thereupon and thenceforth become and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the said Henry, Bishop of Southwell, and by his successors in the same Bishopric for ever.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any further or other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, or of any of them, or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.
