

Treary of Ryſwick, who has ſince reſided here in the ſame Quality, went from hence to Rotterdam, in order to embark there for England on board the *Mary Yacht* as ſoon as the Wind is fair. The Dutcheſs of Deux-Ponts is returned to Germany. The Count de Tallard, Ambaſſador from the Moſt Chriſtian King, who arrived here ſome days ago from England, is gone to Loo, as is likewiſe the Baron of Schultze, Envoy from the Princes of the Houſe of Lunenburgh. The Envoy of Morocco had his Publick Audience of the States-General yeſterday, to which he was conducted by the Sieurs Van Eſſen and Does, both Members of that Aſſembly, with the uſual Ceremonies.

Paris, July 4. N. S. The Court returns this day from Marli to Verſailles. The Count de Prieſt, who is going to England with the Character of Ambaſſador Extraordinary from the Duke of Savoy, is arrived here, and will in few days proceed on his Journey. The Perſons who are concerned in the Expedition which Monſieur Point made two years ago to Carthage. have preſented another Petition againſt him to the Council, who have given him time for getting his Witneſſes together, and collecting the Papers that may enable him to make his Defence; after which they intend to determine this Buſineſs.

Bristol, June 26. The *Thomas and Jane* of this Port arrived here yeſterday from Virginia, and the *Antelope*, William Helliſter Maſter, from Jamaica; And this day came in the *Benjamin and Sarah*, Isaac Challenſer Commander, from Jamaica, and the *John* of this Port, John Mealman Maſter, from Virginia.

Cowes, June 26. Laſt week arrived here the *Thomas and Margaret* of London, Tho. Oliver Maſter, bound for Jamaica, and the *Thomas and Elizabeth* of London, John Fell Maſter, bound to Newfoundland. Yeſterday and this day the following Ships came into this Port from London, viz. The Owner's Adventure, James Mitchell Maſter, for Penſylvania; the *Horſe*, Joſeph Sandwell Maſter, for the Barbadoes; the *Providence*, Richard Morphew Maſter, for Bilboa; the *Gabriel*, Joſeph Hall Maſter, for Venice; and the *Unity*, William White Maſter, for Guinea.
