"And whereas Your Majesty was graciously pleased by Your Order in Council bearing date the 1st day of January, 1940, to approve of Instructor Captain Arthur Edward Hall, C.B., C.B.E., A.R.C.S., R.N., Director of the Education Department, being retained on the Active List of the Royal Navy for a year after attaining the age for compulsory retirement:

"And whereas we consider that the services of this Officer should be further retained in his present appointment and that in view of the increased scope of his duties caused by the war he should be advanced to the rank of Instructor Rear Admiral:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to approve his promotion to the Rank of Instructor Rear Admiral, with effect from the 19th January, 1941, under the following conditions:—

"Retirement—to be compulsorily retired on attaining the age of 60—or, on super-session in his present appointment, if earlier.

"Pay—to receive a consolidated rate of £1,600 a year.

"Retired pay—to be £814 10s. od. a year.

"Widow's pension—to be as for other non-executive Rear Admirals.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in this proposal."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

" We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1936, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for effecting the union of the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Sheffield, Saint Philip, and the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Netherthorpe, Saint Ann, both of which Benefices are situate in the County of York and in the Diocese of Sheffield:

" Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend Leslie, Bishop of Sheffield, pursuant to the provisions of the said Measures to inquire into and report upon the union of the Benefices of Sheffield, Saint Philip, and Netherthorpe, Saint Ann, duly made their Report to the said Bishop of Sheffield and therein recommended the union of those Benefices and the terms for effecting the union, and the said Bishop of Sheffield signified in writing his approval of the Report:

" And whereas we, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the union of those Benefices which Scheme is based upon the terms recommended in the Report, but with the assent of the said Bishop embodies certain modifications thereof:

" And whereas the Benefice of Sheffield, Saint Philip, is now full the Reverend George Needham being the present Incumbent thereof and the Benefice of Netherthorpe, Saint Ann, is at present vacant:

" Now, therefore, we, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said Leslie, Bishop of Sheffield, and with the consent also of the said George Needham (testified by their respectively signing this Scheme) do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

" 1. That the Benefice of Sheffield, Saint Philip, and the Benefice of Netherthorpe, Saint Ann, shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with cure of souls under the style of ' The United Benefice of Sheffield, Saint Philip and Saint Ann ' and that the Parishes of the Benefices shall also be united into one Parish for ecclesiastical purposes and for such other purposes as in the said Measures provided.

" 2. That the Church of the Parish of Saint Ann, Netherthorpe, shall be the Parish Church of the United Parish and that the Table of Fees for the Parish of Saint Ann, Netherthorpe, shall (until revised or altered by proper authority) be the Table of Fees for the United Parish.

" 3. That upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette the union shall forthwith take effect and the said George Needham if he is then Incumbent of the Benefice of Sheffield, Saint Philip, shall be the first Incumbent of the United Benefice.

" 4. That upon the union taking effect the register books of baptisms, marriages and burials and other the records and muniments deposited in the Church of Saint Philip, Sheffield, shall be transferred to the Parish Church of the United Benefice but the marriage registers in duplicate current at the Church of Saint Philip,

Sheffield, shall first be sent by the Incumbent of the United Benefice to the Registrar-General to be closed officially.

" 5. That so soon as conveniently may be after the union has taken effect the Parsonage Houses at present belonging to the Benefices of Sheffield, Saint Philip, and Netherthorpe, Saint Ann, respectively and the sites and appurtenances thereof and the grounds heretofore usually occupied and enjoyed therewith shall be sold and disposed of by us at such time or times and in such manner in all respects as to us shall seem expedient and that the net proceeds of such sale or sales shall be held by us and shall be applied towards any or all of the following objects, that is to say:—

(a) the acquisition of a suitable house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice in accordance with plans to be approved by us or the Governors of Queen Anne's Bounty.

(b) the discharge of any mortgage or loan subsisting at the date when the union takes effect in respect of the acquisition of any such house and

(c) the cost of renovating improving and adapting any such house in accordance with plans to be approved as aforesaid; and any residue shall constitute and form part of the Expenses Fund established pursuant to Section 32 of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923.

" 6. That upon the union taking effect (1) a Curate shall be employed to assist the Incumbent of the United Benefice and a portion of the endowments of the United Benefice namely an annual sum of £140 (being part of a larger annual payment at present made by us to the Incumbent of the Benefice of Netherthorpe, Saint Ann) and a further annual sum of £60 (being part of a larger annual payment at present made by us to the Incumbent of the Benefice of Sheffield, Saint Philip) shall be constituted a fund to meet the expenses of employing a Curate as aforesaid or for occasional clerical or lay assistance; and (2) a further portion of the endowments of the United Benefice namely an annual sum of £150 (being the remainder of the larger annual payment at present made by us to the Incumbent of the Benefice of Netherthorpe, Saint Ann) shall be constituted a fund for the remuneration of a second Curate who shall also be Chaplain of the Royal Sheffield Infirmary and Hospital if appointed to such Chaplaincy according to the terms of the appointment thereto. And the said two funds shall be paid by us to the Diocesan Board of Finance of the Diocese in trust to apply the same respectively for the purposes aforesaid.

" 7.—(1) That so soon as conveniently may be after the union has taken effect the Church of Saint Philip, Sheffield, shall be taken down and the materials and site thereof, together with any ground annexed thereto and necessary for the use and enjoyment thereof shall be sold and disposed of by us at such time or times and in such manner in all respects as to us shall seem expedient subject to the conditions and restrictions imposed by the said Measures.

" (2) That the net proceeds to arise from such sale or sales after payment of the expenses attendant upon the sale or sales, the taking

down of the Church, the removal of monuments (if any) and all other expenses incidental to these matters, shall be applied by us as follows, that is to say (a) a sufficient sum shall be appropriated for the payment of the compensation or compensations hereinafter mentioned or for the repayment of any advance made for the purpose of such compensation or compensations; (b) a sum to be determined by us, in consultation with the Bishop of Sheffield, shall be applied towards the cost of the repair and redecoration of the Parish Church of the United Parish; and (c) any residue shall be appropriated to and form part of the said Expenses Fund.

"(3) That the font, communion table and plate used for the purpose of the Holy Communion in the said Church of Saint Philip, Sheffield, shall not be sold but shall in accordance with the provisions of the said Measures and as the Bishop of the Diocese may direct be transferred to the Church of Saint Ann, Netherthorpe, being the Parish Church of the United Benefice or to some other Church or Churches within the Diocese of Sheffield and the bells, organ and other furniture and fittings of the Church of Saint Philip, Sheffield, or such of them as the Bishop of Sheffield shall select, shall be removed to the Parish Church of the United Benefice, and any of such articles not so removed shall be appropriated by the Bishop of Sheffield for use in any other Church or Chapel or Churches or Chapels within the Diocese of Sheffield which the Bishop may select or shall be sold and in such case the proceeds shall be added to the fund arising from the sale of the site and materials of the Church of Saint Philip, Sheffield, as aforesaid.

"(4) That in the event of the services of any Church officers and servants of the Church of Saint Philip, Sheffield, being dispensed with by reason of the union taking effect, such Church officers and servants shall out of any moneys to be received by us under the provisions of this clause receive such reasonable compensation as having regard to age, length of service and other circumstances of the case shall seem to us and to the Bishop of Sheffield equitable and proper; Provided that it shall be lawful for us if we shall see fit so to do in all or any of these cases to advance the compensation money or any part thereof out of the said Expenses Fund.

"8. That after the union has taken effect the course and succession in which the respective Patrons shall present or nominate to the United Benefice from time to time as the same shall become vacant shall be as follows that is to say, the right of presentation shall be exercised by the Patrons of the two Benefices alternately the Patron of the Benefice of Netherthorpe, Saint Ann, having the right upon the first presentation to the United Benefice to be made after the union and every alternate right of presentation and the Patron of the Benefice of Sheffield, Saint Philip, having the right of presentation upon the second presentation to the United Benefice to be made after the union and every alternate turn thereafter.

"Provided always that the provisions herein contained relating to the sale and disposal of the Church of Saint Philip, Sheffield, shall not take effect until the consents and approval which by the said Measures are made requisite to the sale under the powers conferred by those

Measures of the site of any Church shall be obtained to the sale and disposal hereby proposed of the Church of Saint Philip, Sheffield, and of the site thereof together with any ground annexed or belonging thereto.

"And provided further that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from making any other recommendations and proposals relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Measures, or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England, or of any Act of Parliament."

And whereas the provisions of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1936, and the Union of Benefices Rules, 1926 to 1930, relating to the preparation and submission of this Scheme have been duly complied with:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that it shall be and become effectual in law immediately upon the publication of this Order in the London Gazette.

That upon the said union taking effect (a) the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Leeds, All Saints, shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice and (b) the afore-mentioned sum of £1,152 6s. 8d. in the hands of Queen Anne's Bounty representing the net proceeds of the sale of the former Parsonage House of the said Benefice of Leeds, Saint Alban the Martyr, shall be transferred to us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners and shall constitute and form part of the Expenses Fund established pursuant to the 32nd Section of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, to the intent that the said sum may thereafter be applied as the Bishop, with the approval of us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, may direct,

towards the provision of a Parsonage House for a new Ecclesiastical District formed or to be formed in the said Diocese of Ripon.

" 6. That upon the union taking effect provision shall be made by the Incumbent of the United Benefice for obtaining the services of a Curate to assist him in the performance of the duties of the United Benefice and a portion of the endowments of the United Benefice, namely an annual sum of £196 (being part of a larger annual payment at present made by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, to the Incumbent for the time being of the said Benefice of Leeds, Saint Alban the Martyr) shall be appropriated by us as a fund to meet the expenses of providing for the services of such Curate as aforesaid which said fund of £196 per annum shall be paid by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, to the Diocesan Board of Finance of the Diocese as trustees to apply the same for the purpose of paying the stipend of the said Curate.

" 7.—(a) That so soon as conveniently may be after the union has taken effect the Church of Saint Alban the Martyr, Leeds, shall be taken down and the materials and site thereof, together with any ground annexed thereto and necessary for the use and enjoyment thereof shall be sold and disposed of by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, at such time or times and in such manner in all respects as to us shall seem expedient subject to the conditions and restrictions imposed by the said Measures.

" (b) That of the net proceeds to arise from such sale or sales after payment of the expenses attendant upon the sale or sales, the taking down of the Church, the removal of monuments (if any) and all other expenses incidental to these matters, so much as may be required, shall be applied by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners in payment of the compensation or compensations hereinafter mentioned or in repayment of any advance made for the purpose of such compensation or compensations and the balance shall constitute and form part of the said Expenses Fund, to the intent that such balance may thereafter be applied as the Bishop, with the approval of us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, may direct towards the cost of a permanent Church erected or to be erected in the said Diocese of Ripon.

" (c) That the font, communion table, and plate used for the purpose of the Holy Communion in the said Church of Saint Alban the Martyr, Leeds, shall not be sold but shall, in accordance with the provisions of the said Measures and as the Bishop of the Diocese may direct, be transferred to some other Church or Churches within the said Diocese of Ripon and the bells, organ and other furniture and fittings of the said Church of Saint Alban the Martyr, Leeds, or such of them as the Bishop of Ripon shall select, shall be appropriated for use in any Church or Chapel or Churches or Chapels within the Diocese of Ripon which the Bishop may select or shall be sold and in such case the proceeds shall be added to the fund arising from the sale of the site and materials of the said Church of Saint Alban the Martyr, as aforesaid.

" (d) That in the event of the services of any Church officers and servants of the said Church of Saint Alban the Martyr, Leeds, being dispensed with by reason of the union

taking effect, such Church officers and servants shall out of any moneys to be received by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, under the provisions of this clause receive such reasonable compensation as having regard to age, length of service, and other circumstances of the case shall seem to us and to the Bishop of Ripon equitable and proper. Provided always that it shall be lawful for us if we shall see fit so to do in all or any of these cases to advance the compensation money or any part thereof out of the said Expenses Fund.

" 8. That with the consent (testified as aforesaid), of the said Geoffrey, Bishop of Ripon, as the Patron of the said Benefice of Leeds, Saint Alban the Martyr (a) upon the union taking effect a part of the total endowments of the Benefices hereinbefore recommended and proposed to be constituted an United Benefice, that is to say, an annual sum of £52 (being a further part of the said larger annual payment at present made by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, to the Incumbent for the time being of the said Benefice of Leeds, Saint Alban the Martyr) shall be severed or diverted from the said Benefice of Leeds, Saint Alban the Martyr, and from the United Benefice and shall be appropriated by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, for the augmentation, in equal one-third shares, of the Benefices of The Epiphany, Gipton, Leeds; Saint Wilfrid, Halton, Leeds, and the Venerable Bede, Wyther, all in the said Diocese of Ripon and (b) upon the union taking effect or upon the cessation of the said pension to the said Charles Robert Sutton whichever shall the later happen, a further part of the total endowments of the Benefices hereinbefore recommended and proposed to be constituted an United Benefice that is to say an additional £50 per annum (being a further part of the said larger annual payment at present made by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners to the Incumbent for the time being of the said Benefice of Leeds, Saint Alban the Martyr) shall be severed or diverted from the said Benefice of Leeds, Saint Alban the Martyr, and from the United Benefice and shall be appropriated by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for the further augmentation in equal one-third shares of the said Benefices of The Epiphany, Gipton, Leeds; Saint Wilfrid, Halton, Leeds; and the Venerable Bede Wyther.

" Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend Nugent, Bishop of Lincoln, pursuant to the provisions of the said Measures to inquire into and report upon the union of the said two Benefices of Lissington and Holton cum Beckering duly made their Report to the said Bishop of Lincoln and therein recommended the union of the said two Benefices and the terms for effecting the union, and the said Bishop of Lincoln signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

" And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the union of the said two Benefices based upon the terms recommended in the said Report:

" And whereas both the said Benefices are now full the Reverend Arthur Edwin Day being the present incumbent of the said Benefice of Lissington and the Reverend James Osborne being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Holton cum Beckering:

" Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said Nugent, Bishop of Lincoln (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme) and with the consent of the said Arthur Edwin Day (testified by his signing this Scheme), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

" 1. That the said Benefice of Lissington and the said Benefice of Holton cum Beckering shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with cure of souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Lissington with Holton cum Beckering' and that such United Benefice shall be included in and form part of the Rural Deanery of Walshcroft (West) but

that the Parishes of the said Benefices shall continue distinct in all respects.

" 2. That upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette both of the said two Benefices shall be vacant, the union of the same two Benefices shall take effect forthwith: and if the said Benefice of Holton cum Beckering only shall be then vacant the said union shall also take effect forthwith and the said Arthur Edwin Day if he is then Incumbent of the said Benefice of Lissington shall be the first Incumbent of the United Benefice and if the said Benefice of Lissington only shall be then vacant the said union shall take effect upon the next avoidance of the said Benefice of Holton cum Beckering and if neither of the said two Benefices be then vacant, then the said union shall take effect on the next avoidance of the said Benefice of Holton cum Beckering and the Incumbent at that time of the said Benefice of Lissington shall become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice.

" 3. That upon the said union taking effect the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Lissington shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice.

" 4. And whereas no appeal has been made to His Majesty in Council within the period of one month after the date of the said public notice in accordance with the provisions of the said Measures against the said Scheme or any part thereof by any person who has made objection as aforesaid to the said draft Scheme:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that the Benefices therein recommended to be united shall be united to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme and further to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the date when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measures.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Lincoln.

That if on the union taking effect each of the said benefices has a parsonage house the parsonage house of Ampport shall be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the united benefice but otherwise the parsonage house of Monxton shall be the house of residence until a house more suitably placed for the residence of an Incumbent of the United Benefice has been provided in substitution therefor and that the house at Monxton together with the site and appurtenances and grounds thereof or usually occupied therewith when no longer required as or for such house of residence shall be sold and disposed of by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners at such time and in such manner as we shall deem expedient and that the net proceeds of the sale together with the fund of £4,280 and any accumulations of interest thereon held by Queen Anne's Bounty aforesaid or any unexpended balance thereof at that time remaining shall be transferred to the Expenses Fund established pursuant to the 32nd section of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923.

"4. That (a) upon the union taking effect a part of the total endowments of the Benefices hereinbefore recommended and proposed to be constituted an United Benefice, that is to say a capital sum of £6,000 being part of a sum of money appropriated or to be appropriated by Queen Anne's Bounty to the said Benefices of Ampport and Monxton pursuant to sections 7 and 38 of the Tithe Act 1936 and the provisions of Part II of the Third Schedule to the said Act, and paragraph 1 of the Eighth Schedule to the same Act shall be severed or diverted from the said Benefices of Ampport and Monxton and from the United Benefice and shall be appropriated by Queen Anne's Bounty for the augmentation of the Benefice of Eastleigh in the said Diocese of Winchester, and (b) upon the union taking effect or upon the cessation of the said pension to the said John Spencer Mullins Walker, whichever shall the later happen, a further part of the total endowments of the Benefices hereinbefore recommended and proposed to be constituted an United Benefice, that is to say a capital sum of £6,333 6s. 8d. being a further part of the aforesaid sum of money appropriated or to be appropriated to the said Benefices of Ampport and Monxton shall be severed or diverted from the said Benefices and from the United Benefice and shall be appropriated by Queen Anne's Bounty as to £3,166 13s. 4d. part thereof for the augmentation of the Benefice of Knights Enham and as to £3,166 13s. 4d. the remaining part thereof for the augmentation of the Benefice of Baughurst, both in the said Diocese of Winchester:

"5. That with the consents of the several Patrons and Incumbents of the said Benefice of Weyhill and of the said United Benefice of Grateley with Quarley, which consents (save where otherwise specified) are testified by their respectively signing this Scheme, that is to say with the consents of the Provost and Scholars of Queen's College in the University of Oxford (in testimony whereof they have caused their Common or Collegiate Seal to be affixed to this Scheme) as Patrons of the said Benefice of Weyhill, of Ella, Baroness de Paravicini, and the Royal College of Saint Katharine as the alternate Patrons of the said United

Benefice of Grateley with Quarley (in testimony whereof the said Ella, Baroness de Paravicini has signed this Scheme and the said Royal College of Saint Katharine have caused their Common Chapter Seal to be affixed to this Scheme), and with the consents of the Reverend Edward Joseph Northcote-Green, now Incumbent of the said Benefice of Weyhill, and the Reverend Reginald Henry Arthur Currey now Incumbent of the said United Benefice of Grateley with Quarley upon the union taking effect:

three Benefices and the terms for effecting the union including certain alterations of boundaries affecting (a) the Parish of the Benefice of Appleshaw and the Parish of Quarley being one of the Parishes of the United Benefice of Quarley with Grateley, in the said County of Southampton and in the said Diocese of Winchester and (b) the Parish of the Benefice of Ludgershall, in the County of Wilts and in the Diocese of Salisbury and the said Bishop of Winchester and the Right Reverend Ernest Neville, Bishop of Salisbury, signified in writing their approval of the said Report:

"And whereas all the said three Benefices of Kimpton, Thruxton and Fyfield are now full the Reverend Reginald Edward Langdon being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Kimpton, the Reverend Hugh Edward Clatworthy being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Thruxton and the Reverend Evan Knatchbull Revell Reynolds being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Fyfield:

"Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consents of the said Cyril, Bishop of Winchester, and of the said Ernest Neville, Bishop of Salisbury, and with the consent also of the said Hugh Edward Clatworthy (in testimony whereof they have respectively signed this Scheme) do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

"1. That the said Benefice of Kimpton, the said Benefice of Thruxton and the said Benefice of Fyfield shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with cure of souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Kimpton with Thruxton and Fyfield' but the Parishes of the said Benefices shall continue distinct in all respects.

"2. That the union of the said Benefices shall take effect as follows, that is to say:—

(i) The Benefice of Thruxton shall, pending the union of all three Benefices, be united into one Benefice with cure of souls with that one of the Benefices of Fyfield or Kimpton which either is vacant at the date of, or is first vacated after, the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council affirming this Scheme; but the Parishes of the Benefices so united shall continue in all respects distinct;

(ii) The Benefices so united shall be united into one Benefice with cure of souls with the other of the said Benefices upon the next vacancy in that Benefice occurring after the union effected in accordance with the preceding paragraph.

"3. That the patronage of the United Benefices (hereinafter in this clause referred to as the interim United Benefices) of Kimpton with Thruxton or Thruxton with Fyfield, as the case may be shall be exercised alternately by the Patrons of the constituent Benefices and the first turn of presentation to such interim United Benefice after the union shall be exercised by

the Patron of the said Benefice of Kimpton or by the Patron of the said Benefice of Fyfield as the case may be.

That after the union referred to in clause 1 of this Scheme has taken effect the course and succession in which the respective Patrons shall present or nominate to the United Benefice from time to time as the same shall become vacant shall be as follows, that is to say, that in every series of three successive turns of presentation or nomination to be made to the United Benefice after the union the first turn of presentation shall belong to the Patron of that Benefice the Incumbent of which does not become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice of Kimpton with Thruxton and Fyfield, and the third turn shall belong to the Patron of that one of the said three Benefices the Incumbent of which shall have become the first Incumbent of the last mentioned United Benefice.

"5. That upon any union recommended by this Scheme taking effect the Parsonage House at present belonging to the Benefice of Thruxton shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice and immediately as each of the Benefices of Fyfield and Kimpton is united as provided in clause 2 hereof the Parsonage House belonging to such Benefices of Fyfield and Kimpton and the site and appurtenances thereof and the grounds theretofore usually occupied and enjoyed therewith shall if not previously sold under the Parsonages Measure 1938, be sold and disposed of by us; and of the net proceeds of such sales a sum not exceeding £200 shall be appropriated towards the cost of effecting such improvements to the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Thruxton as in our opinion and that of the Bishop of Winchester appear necessary and the remainder of such net proceeds shall constitute and form part of the Expenses Fund established pursuant to the 32nd Section of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923.

Redemption Stock (1986/96) issued, or to be issued, to Queen Anne's Bounty pursuant to the provisions aforesaid, and representing the said capital sum of £3,333 6s. 8d. shall be severed and diverted from the general corporate account of Queen Anne's Bounty and shall be transferred to, and become vested in us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, as part of our Common Fund.

" 7. That upon any union recommended by this Scheme taking effect (a) a part of the total endowments of the Benefices so constituted an United Benefice, that is to say, a capital sum of £2,500 being a further part of the sum of money appropriated or to be appropriated by Queen Anne's Bounty to the said Benefice of Thruxton as aforesaid shall be severed or diverted from the said Benefice of Thruxton and from the last mentioned United Benefice, and shall be appropriated by Queen Anne's Bounty for the augmentation of the Benefice of Appleshaw, in the said Diocese of Winchester, (b) a further part of the total endowments of the Benefices so constituted an United Benefice, that is to say, a capital sum of £3,166 13s. 4d. being a further part of the aforesaid sum of money appropriated, or to be appropriated, to the said Benefice of Kimpton, shall be severed or diverted from the said Benefice of Kimpton and from the said United Benefice and shall be appropriated and held by Queen Anne's Bounty as to £1,666 13s. 4d. part thereof for the augmentation of the Benefice of Saint Mary Bourne, and as to £1,500 the remaining part thereof for the augmentation of the Benefice of Knights Enham both in the said Diocese of Winchester, and (c) the sum of £1,668 5s. 9d. Local Loans £3 per centum Stock now held by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, on behalf of the said Benefice of Thruxton or any securities or investments representing the same shall be transferred to, and become vested in us as part of our Common Fund; Provided that if the said Benefices of Thruxton and Fyfield shall be united into one Benefice under Clause 2 (i) of this Scheme the provisions of parts (b) and (c) of this Clause shall not take effect until such United Benefice is united with the said Benefice of Kimpton.

" 8. That with the consents of the several Patrons and Incumbents of the said Benefice of Appleshaw of the said United Benefice of Quarley with Grateley and of the said Benefice of Ludgershall namely the Dean and Chapter of the Cathedral Church of Holy Trinity, Saint

Peter, Saint Paul and Saint Swithun at Winchester, being the Patrons of the said Benefice of Appleshaw (in testimony whereof they have caused their Common or Capitular Seal to be affixed to this Scheme), Ella, Baroness de Paravicini, and the Royal College of Saint Katharine being the alternate Patrons of the said United Benefice of Quarley with Grateley (in testimony whereof the said Ella, Baroness de Paravicini, has signed this Scheme and the said Royal College of Saint Katharine have caused their Common Chapter Seal to be affixed to this Scheme) Charles Edwin Awdry of Notton Lodge, Lacock, in the said County of Wilts, a Captain in Your Majesty's Army, being the Patron of the said Benefice of Ludgershall the Reverend Walter Wynne Hall, being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Appleshaw, the Reverend Reginald Henry Arthur Currey, being the present Incumbent of the said United Benefice of Quarley with Grateley, and the Reverend Alfred William Watt being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Ludgershall (testified by their respectively signing this Scheme) A. upon any union recommended by this Scheme taking effect (1) all that part of the Parish of the said Benefice of Fyfield together with all that contiguous detached portion of the Parish of the said Benefice of Thruxton lying to the north and north-east of the middle of the Cheltenham Spa and Andover Branch Line of the Great Western Railway shall be transferred and annexed for all ecclesiastical purposes to the Parish of the said Benefice of Appleshaw, and (2) all that part of the Parish of the said Benefice of Thruxton which lies to the west of the middle of the road leading from Quarley to Kimpton Down shall be transferred and annexed for all ecclesiastical purposes to the Parish of Quarley and to the United Benefice of Quarley with Grateley, and B. upon the union referred to in Clause 1 of this Scheme taking effect the northern part of the Parish of the said Benefice of Kimpton known as Faberstown and including all that part of such Parish lying to the north of the middle of the road leading from Kalis Corner on the boundary between the Parishes of the said Benefices of Kimpton and Fyfield in a north-westerly direction through Great Shoddesden and near Willis Wood to the point where such road meets the boundary between the Parishes of the said Benefices of Kimpton and Ludgershall shall be transferred and annexed for all ecclesiastical purposes to the Parish of the said Benefice of Ludgershall.
