CIVIL SERVICE.

Regulations dated the 18th day of March, 1941, made by the Treasury under Article 6 of the Order in Council dated the 22nd July, 1920, with respect to the Sick Leave Pay to be allowed to Civil Servants.

In pursuance of Article 6 of the said Order of 22nd July, 1920, the Treasury hereby amend as follows the Regulations dated the 6th June, 1929.

Clause 1 (iv) first paragraph

Substitute:

“ In the application to the case of officers holding Modified (War) certificates of the foregoing clauses of these Regulations the following modification shall be made, that for the first five years of service after the date of the certificate any civil pay allowed during sick leave in excess of three months in the aggregate in any year shall be reduced to such amount as, with any pension or retired pay and allowances payable in respect of the period of sick leave on account of War disability sustained in the Great War (1914-1918) or the War which commenced on 3rd September, 1939, will not exceed the full civil pay of the officer in respect of that period.”

Clause 1 (iv) second paragraph, line 2

Delete “ Great ”; add after “ disability ” “ specified in the preceding paragraph ”.

The KING has been pleased, on the recommendation of the Minister of Shipping, to award the Bronze Medal for Gallantry in Saving Life at Sea to Reginald English, Apprentice in the motor-vessel "Greystoke Castle," in recognition of his act of gallantry in the following circumstances:—

In darkness and a rough sea, the motor-vessel "Greystoke Castle" was in collision with another vessel in February, 1940, as a result of which the latter sank rapidly. Two boats, in one of which was Apprentice English, were sent away from the "Greystoke Castle" to pick up survivors and, while they were searching, Apprentice English was washed overboard but, fortunately, was rescued. Thirteen survivors were picked up by this boat, one badly injured, both legs being broken. All the survivors were got on board the "Greystoke Castle" with the exception of the injured man, who it was not possible to take out of the boat until it was hoisted. Apprentice English remained with the injured man, but while the boat was being hoisted, it was hit and swamped by a heavy sea and the after tackle became unhooked. Apprentice English, notwithstanding the risk involved and his previous experience, held on to the injured man with one hand and to the tackle with the other, and by his plucky action prevented the injured man from being washed overboard and lost.

ROYAL AIR FORCE.

The KING has been graciously pleased to approve the following awards in recognition of gallantry displayed in flying operations against the enemy:—

Distinguished Service Order.

Squadron Leader James Richmond GORDON-FINLAYSON, D.F.C. (36078), No. 211 Squadron.

This officer has completed over 100 operational sorties both by day and night. Throughout these operations, most of which have been carried out under exceptionally difficult conditions, he has displayed outstanding leadership and skill and, by his splendid example of courage and determination, has contributed materially to the successes achieved by his squadron.

Distinguished Flying Cross.

Squadron Leader Michael Frederic ANDERSON (90206), Auxiliary Air Force, No. 604 Squadron.

During the last four months, this officer has carried out numerous night operational flights in the course of which he has destroyed a Heinkel III and probably a Junkers 88; he has also destroyed another enemy aircraft by day. He has displayed the greatest enthusiasm and keenness in his efforts to obtain successful results in night fighting and has at all times set an example to the pilots under his command.

Captain Servaas Fuan Breda THERON (102649), South African Air Force, No. 3 Squadron.

One day in March, 1941, this officer intercepted and shot down an enemy aircraft near Dagabhur. Later the same day, he took off and destroyed one of two Italian C.R.42's which attempted to attack Dagabhur aerodrome. Two days later, in an attack by our fighters on Diredawa aerodrome, Captain Theron shot down a C.R.42 and destroyed four Savoia bombers on the ground. In these engagements this officer displayed the greatest skill, determination and courage.

Pilot Officer Harold PATERSON (83712), Royal Air Force Volunteer Reserve, No. 214 Squadron.

One night in March, 1941, this officer was detailed to attack a cruiser of the Hipper class at Brest. While reconnoitring at about 7,000 feet, a flare dropped by another aircraft, illuminated the target, whereupon Pilot Officer Paterson decided to attack. Diving to 1,000 feet, in the face of heavy opposition from ground defences, he released several very heavy bombs. During the flight, searchlights were machine-gunned and, whilst over the sea, an E-boat was also machine-gunned from a height of only 50 feet. Although his aircraft was severely damaged and difficult to handle, Pilot Officer Paterson succeeded in returning to this country and in landing his aircraft safely. This officer has completed 20 operational flights and has at all times displayed courage, determination and devotion to duty of a high order.
