CIVIL SERVICE.

Regulations dated the 18th day of March, 1941, made by the Treasury under Article 6 of the Order in Council dated the 22nd July, 1920, with respect to the Sick Leave Pay to be allowed to Civil Servants.

In pursuance of Article 6 of the said Order of 22nd July, 1920, the Treasury hereby amend as follows the Regulations dated the 6th June, 1929.

Clause I (iv) first paragraph

Substitute:

" In the application to the case of officers holding Modified (War) certificates of the foregoing clauses of these Regulations the following modification shall be made, that for the first five years of service after the date of the certificate any civil pay allowed during sick leave in excess of three months in the aggregate in any year shall be reduced to such amount as, with any pension or retired pay and allowances pay-able in respect of the period of sick leave on account of War disability sustained in the Great War (1914-1918) or the War which commenced on 3rd September, 1939, will not exceed the full civil pay of the officer in respect of that period.

Clause 1 (iv) second paragraph, line 2

- Delete " Great "; add after " disability "
- specified in the preceding paragraph ".
