## CENTRAL CHANCERY OF THE ORDERS OF KNIGHTHOOD.

*St. James's Palace, S.W.1,

The KING has been graciously pleased to approve the award of the George Medal to:—  
Acting Flight Lieutenant John Wyness Sim (73397), Royal Air Force Volunteer Reserve.

This officer has shown keen devotion to duty and has courageously dealt with unexploded bombs. As he lacked special training and experience in dealing with bombs, he displayed outstanding courage and initiative.

358920 Acting Sergeant Sidney Boys, Royal Air Force.

This airman is in charge of the station fire tender. During a night in September, 1940, he was ordered to proceed to an aircraft which had crashed in flames. Although the aircraft was known to be loaded with bombs, and enemy aircraft were overhead, this airman drove his fire tender up to the crash and manned the hose himself and succeeded in extinguishing the fire. The crew had descended by parachute. In October, 1940, he again proceeded to the scene of a crash, and although he did not know if the aircraft was loaded with bombs, he manned the hose himself and succeeded in extricating one member of the crew alive; the other two were killed. In November, 1940, he drove his fire tender through thick fog to the scene of another crash, and knowing that there were bombs in the wreckage (one having already exploded), he once more manned the hose himself and put out the fire. By his prompt and courageous action on this occasion he saved the lives of two of the crew.

He has displayed a complete disregard for his personal safety and by his courageous actions has saved the lives of three people and set a magnificent example to the men under his control.

*The Medal of the Military Division of the Most Excellent Order of the British Empire, for Meritorious Service.*

14505 Corporal William Gazeley, Royal Air Force.

In spite of lack of special training and experience, this airman assisted in locating and dealing with three unexploded bombs one night in October, 1940. Corporal Gazeley showed outstanding courage and disregard of danger.

907748 Aircraftman 1st Class Arthur Leslie Watkins, Royal Air Force.

In December, 1940, an aircraft crashed on an aerodrome and immediately burst into flames. Without hesitation Aircraftman Watkins jumped on to the blazing aircraft, assisted the pilot clear of the wreckage and put out his burning clothing. The presence of mind and courage of this airman undoubtedly saved the pilot from being severely burned and possibly from being killed. The aircraft contained ammunition, which started to explode shortly after the pilot was clear of the wreckage.

## IMPERIAL SERVICE MEDAL.

The notice regarding Harold Richmond Portbury in Gazette No. 35110 of the 18th March, 1941, is hereby cancelled, it having been subsequently ascertained that he died before the date of the award therein mentioned.

His Majesty The KING has been graciously pleased to award the Edward Medal to Mubengwa Musonda in recognition of his gallantry in the following circumstances:—

Mubengwa Musonda is an African employed by the Rhokana Corporation at their mine at Nkana, Northern Rhodesia. On the 1st March, 1940, a European was putting a charge of dynamite into a mass of rock jammed at the top end of a main chute. As he finished lighting the charge the rock under his feet gave way and he fell about eight feet and was pinned by his legs which were buried under the rock. He was in great danger, not only from the charge which he had already lit, but also from further supplies of rock which were still entering the main chute from the feeder chutes; further, the rock in which he was partly buried might have slipped further down the chute at any moment. Mubengwa Musonda lowered himself into the chute, wedging himself into the side without standing on the rock, and gripped the European under the arms. He managed to release one of the trapped man's legs, but immediately afterwards it was again buried when more rock fell into the main chute. Mubengwa Musonda maintained his hold and kept the European upright until help arrived and they were both brought to safety. In the meantime the charge overhead had fortunately not exploded.

Mubengwa Musonda's action showed very considerable courage and a disregard for his own personal safety.

In pursuance of Section 122 of the Factories Act, 1937, and of all other powers enabling him in that behalf, the Right Honourable Ernest Bevin, Minister of Labour and National Service, has been pleased to appoint Winifred Eva Ione Robinson to be His Majesty's Inspector of Factories.
