ARCHITECTS (REGISTRATION) ACT, 1931.

A Regulation made by the Architects Registration Council of the United Kingdom under Section 13 of the above-mentioned Act has been submitted for the approval of the Privy Council and is published herewith.

Representations by persons to whom the Regulation is applicable may be made in writing to the Privy Council Office on or before the 25th day of April, 1941.

REGULATION MADE IN PURSUANCE OF SECTION 13 OF THE ARCHITECTS (REGISTRATION) ACT, 1931, AMENDING THE EXISTING REGULA-TIONS.

Amendment to Regulation 26.

Add the following paragraph at the end of the Regulation: ____

" or (7) provided (i) that no previous application from him has been rejected by the Council, (ii) that he produces certificates in the form following, signed by not less than six architects who are members of one or other of the constituent bodies mentioned in sub-paragraphs (i) to (vi) of Paragraph I of the First Schedule to the Principal Act, and (iii) that his application is supported by a majority at a meeting of the Admission Committee attended by not less than 12 members, and such Committee, in deciding whether to give or withhold their support to the application, shall have an absolute discretion.

Certificate.

I hereby certify that I have known Mr. personally for years and that I am satisfied that he had been in bona-fide practice for not less than years as an architect prior to July 29th, 1938. I understand that the term ' practising as an architect ' means that he was carrying on his profession as an architect habitually and as a means of livelihood.
