1153113 Aircraftman 2nd Class Enos Garrett, Royal Air Force.

One night in January, 1941, during a heavy air raid, a large high explosive bomb wrecked some houses. A party of airmen were hastened to the spot where, in one of the houses, a young woman was trapped under a blazing staircase. Without hesitation one of the party, Aircraftman Garrett, commenced to extricate her, and although it was necessary continually to throw buckets of water over him to sustain him in his efforts, he eventually succeeded in rescuing her. Three other people were apparently trapped under the stairs, but the fire was so fierce that, in spite of repeated attempts by Aircraftman Garrett, it was impossible to save them. Undaunted, however, he led a working party in an attempt to control the fire, despite the fact that enemy aircraft remained overhead and may have dropped further bombs, using the fire as an aiming This airman showed great bravery throughout and was undoubtedly responsible for saving the woman's life.

562959 Sergeant Frank Richard Woolven, Royal Air Force.

When the ship in which Woolven was travelling was shelled by the enemy, considerable damage was done and a number below deck were badly hurt. Woolven immediately went down to help them but found he could do little alone and returned to the deck for help. On reaching deck he was ordered to abandon ship immediately but before doing so, with great presence of mind, he collected a torch and a bottle of tablets.

Though there were several ships and aircraft in the neighbourhood, Woolven and two who were with him were not spotted and they were accordingly not picked up. In order to form a makeshift raft, Woolven

managed to collect some oars and a piece of rope which were in the water near him and lashed the oars together so that the three of them could lie with their legs over one oar and their backs and arms against the other.

That evening one of the two became delirious, but thanks to Woolven's cheerfulness and optimism he was calmed down and he and his comrade persuaded to go on

holding out.

About 4.30 next morning, after they had been nearly twenty-four hours in the water, the party of three was picked up by a British warship. Just before being picked up Woolven had seen a darkened vessel which he took to be a submarine. Having, therefore, attracted the warship's attention with his torch, he shouted to her to keep clear as he had seen a submarine in the vicinity. The warship had, however, passed the vessel which Woolven had seen, and knowing that it was a trawler, proceeded to pick the party up. The two were by now in an extreme state of exhaustion, but Woolven appeared to be quite unshaken by his experience.

Woolven displayed throughout fortitude and foresight of a high order and his fine example was largely instrumental in saving

the lives of his two comrades.

THE CORONERS (AMENDMENT) ACT, 1926.

Order for the alteration of Coroners' Districts.

Whereas vacancies have arisen in the office of Franchise Coroner for the Langbaurgh East, Langbaurgh West and Langbaurgh North Districts of the Langbaurgh Wapentake and the Liberty of Whitby and Whitby Strand in the County of the North Riding of Yorkshire:

And whereas by the operation of Section 4 (1) of the Coroners (Amendment) Act, 1926, the areas in which the said Franchise Coroners had jurisdiction have become merged for all purposes relating to Coroners in the said County:

And whereas by Section 4 (2) of the said Act it is provided that where any area in which a Franchise Coroner had jurisdiction is merged in a County which is divided into Coroners' Districts, any consequential alterations of the division of the County into Coroners' Districts shall be effected in manner provided by the Act.

And whereas it is provided by Section 12 of the said Act that a County Council may at any time submit, after complying with such requirements as to notice and consideration of objections as may be prescribed, to the Secretary of State, a draft Order providing for such alteration of any existing division of the County into Coroners' Districts as appears to them to be suitable, and that the Secretary of State, after taking into consideration any objections to the draft made in the prescribed manner and within the prescribed time, may make an Order, either in the terms of the draft submitted to him or with such modifications as he thinks fit:

And whereas the County of the North Riding of Yorkshire is now divided into three Coroners' Districts:

And whereas the Council of the said County has in pursuance of the said Section 12 of the said Act submitted a draft Order to the Secretary of State:

And whereas the requirements of the Coroners (Orders as to Districts) Rules, 1927, have been complied with:

Now therefore I, the undersigned, One of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries—of State, in pursuance of the power vested in me by Section 12 of the said Act hereby order that the existing division of the County of the North Riding of Yorkshire into Coroners' Districts shall be altered and that the said County shall be divided into five Coroners' Districts which shall be named and constituted as set out in the Schedule to this Order and substituted for the existing Districts.

This Order shall come into operation on the 3rd day of June, 1941; provided however that nothing herein contained shall affect the proceedings at any inquest begun by a Coroner before that day.
