"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1936, and the Ecclesiastical Commissioners (Powers) Measure, 1938, now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme which we have prepared with the consent of the Right Reverend Henry, Bishop of Chelmsford (in witness whereof he has signed the Scheme), for effecting the union of the Benefice of Nevendon, and the Benefice of North Benfleet, both situate in the Diocese of Chelmsford:

" Scheme.

"I. Union of Benefices. The Benefice of Nevendon and the Benefice of North Benfleet shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with cure of souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of North Benfleet with Nevendon' but the Parishes of the said Benefices shall continue in all respects distinct.

fices shall continue in all respects distinct.

"2. Taking effect of union. Upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme is published in the London Gazette the union shall forthwith take effect and the Reverend Alexander Edward Robert Knopp, if he is then Incumbent of the said Benefice of Nevendon, shall with his consent (testified by his signature hereto), be the first

Incumbent of the United Benefice.

"3. Parsonage House. Upon the union taking effect the Parsonage House at present belonging to the Benefice of Nevendon shall be the house of residence of the Incumbent of the United Benefice and thereafter the Parsonage House at present belonging to the Benefice of North Benfleet and the site and grounds usually occupied and enjoyed therewith shall be sold and disposed of by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, as to us shall seem expedient and the net proceeds of such sale shall be added to the Expenses Fund established pursuant to the 32nd Section of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923.

"4. Diversion of Endowments. Upon the Union taking effect or upon the date, if later, of the cessation of the pension charge placed upon the revenues of the said Benefice of North Benfleet upon the retirement therefrom of the Reverend Wolstan Dixie Churchill a part of the total endowments of the Benefices so constituted an United Benefice, that is to say, a capital sum

of £3333 6s. 8d. being part of a sum of money appropriated or to be appropriated by Queen Anne's Bounty to the said Benefice of North Benfleet pursuant to sections 7 and 38 of the Tithe Act, 1936, and the provisions of Part II of the 3rd Schedule to the said Act and paragraph I of the 8th Schedule to the same Act shall be severed or diverted from the said Benefice of North Benfleet and from the United Benefice and the sum of £3333 6s. 8d. £3 per cent. Redemption Stock (1986/96) issued or to be issued to Queen Anne's Bounty pursuant to the provisions of Part II of the said Third Schedule and representing the said capital sum of £3333 6s. 8d. shall be severed and diverted from the general corporate account of Queen Anne's Bounty and shall be transferred to and become vested in us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, as part of our Common Fund.

"5. Patronage. In every series of three successive turns of presentation to be made to the United Benefice after the union the Patrons of the Benefice of North Benfleet shall have the first and second turns and the Patron of the Benefice of Nevendon shall have the third

turn."

And whereas the provisions of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1936, and the Union of Benefices Rules, 1926 to 1930, relating to the preparation and submission of this Scheme have been duly complied with:

And whereas the said scheme has been

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1936, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for effecting the unions (1) of the Benefice (being a Rectory) of Castle Carrock, the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Cumrew and a part of the Benefice (being a Rectory) of Croglin, and (2) of the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Renwick, the remaining part of the said Benefice of Croglin, and parts of the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Kirkoswald, all of which Benefices are situate in the County of Cumberland and in the Diocese of Carlisle:

"Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend Henry Herbert, Bishop of Carlisle, pursuant to the provisions of the said Measure to inquire into and report upon the unions (1) of the said Benefice of Castle Carrock with the said Benefice of Cumrew and with a part of the said Benefice of Croglin and (2) of the said Benefice of Renwick with the remaining part of the said Benefice of Croglin and with parts of the said Benefice of Kirkoswald duly made their Report to the said Bishop of Carlisle and therein recommended such unions and the terms for effecting the same, and the said Bishop of Carlisle signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the said unions, based upon the terms recommended in the said Report:

And whereas the said Benefices of Castle Carrock, Cumrew, Croglin and Kirkoswald are now full, the Reverend Ernest Russell being the present Incumbent of the said Benefices of Castle Carrock and Cumrew, the Reverend William Foster Jones being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Croglin and the Reverend George Herbert Johnson Baily being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Kirkoswald and the said Benefice of Renwick is at present vacant:

And whereas the patronage of each of the said Benefices of Castle Carrock and Cumrew now belongs to one and the same body of

" Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consents of the said Henry Herbert, Bishop of Carlisle, and of the said Ernest Russell, William Foster Jones and George Herbert Johnson Baily (testified by their respectively signing this Scheme) do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:

" 1. That the said Benefice of Castle Carrock and the said Benefice of Cumrew and the northwestern part of the said Benefice of Croglin (which said part containing Newbiggin is de-lineated and set forth upon the Map or Plan hereto annexed and is thereon coloured red) shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with cure of souls under the style of The United Benefice of Castle Carrock with and the said north-western part of the said Benefice of Croglin shall also form part of the Parish of Cumrew for all ecclesiastical purposes but the Parishes of the said Benefices of Castle Carrock and Cumrew shall continue distinct in all respects.

2. That the said Benefice of Renwick, the remaining part (containing the Parish Church) of the said Benefice of Croglin and the northern and eastern parts of the said Benefice of Kirkoswald namely the part lying to the north of the middle of Briggle Beck and the part lying to the east of the road running from Raven. Bridge southward through Five Lane Ends (which said northern and eastern parts are delineated and set forth upon the said Map or Plan and are thereon coloured green) shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with cure of souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Croglin with Renwick and the said northern part of the said Benefice of Kirkoswald shall also form part of the Parish of Croglin for all ecclesiastical purposes and the said eastern part of the said Benefice of Kirkoswald shall also form part of the Parish of Renwick for all ecclesiastical purposes but the Parishes of the said Benefices of Renwick and Croglin shall continue distinct in all respects.

3. That upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette the unions referred to in Clauses I and 2 of this Scheme shall forthwith take effect and (a) the said Ernest Russell if he is then Incumbent of the said Benefice of Castle Carrock shall be the first Incumbent of the United Benefice of Castle Carrock with Cumrew, and (b) the said William Foster Jones if he is then Incumbent of the said Benefice of Croglin shall be the first Incumbent of the United Benefice of Croglin

with Renwick.

"4. That upon the said unions taking effect (a) the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Castle Carrock shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice of Castle Carrock with Cumrew and (b) the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Croglin shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United

Benefice of Croglin with Renwick

"5. That upon the said unions taking effect a part of the endowments of the United Benefice of Croglin with Renwick, namely, a sum of £2,000 Local Loans £3 per cent. per annum Stock now held by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, for the benefit of the said Benefice of Renwick and a sum of £500 £3 per cent. per annum Redemption Stock (1986-1996) being part of a larger sum of the said Stock now held by us for the benefit of the said Benefice of Renwick shall be severed from the United Benefice of Croglin with Renwick and shall be transferred and annexed to the United Benefice of Castle Carrock with Cumrew.

"6. That after the said unions have taken effect (a) the patronage of the United Benefice of Castle Carrock with Cumrew shall belong wholly to the Patrons of the said Benefices of Castle Carrock and Cumrew, and (b) the patronage of the United Benefice of Croglin with Renwick shall belong to the respective Patrons of the said Benefices of Croglin and Renwick in alternate turns, and the Patron of the said Benefice of Renwick shall have the right upon the first presentation to the United Benefice to be made after the union and every alternate right of presentation and the Patron of the said Benefice of Croglin shall have the right of presentation upon the second presentation to the United Benefice to be made after the union and every alternate turn thereafter.

"Provided always that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from making any other recommendations and proposals relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Measures, or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England, or of any Act of Parliament.

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have been duly published in accordance with the provisions of the said Measures and Notices have been transmitted to the persons or bodies entitled under the said Measures to receive Notice requiring any objections to such draft Scheme to be stated or transmitted in writing to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules applicable to proceedings under the said

And whereas certain objections have been so stated or transmitted to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the same Rules:

And whereas the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners after giving full consideration to such objections have deemed right to make no alterations in such draft Scheme:

And whereas public notice of the certification to His Majesty in Council of the said Scheme and the consent thereto in writing of the Bishop of Carlisle has been duly given in the manner and within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules aforesaid:

And whereas an appeal against the said Scheme has been made to His Majesty in Council by Mr. George Harrison, and such appeal was referred to the Judicial Committee of the Privy Council on the 5th day of September 1939:

And whereas the Lords of the said Committee, having taken the said appeal into consideration, reported to His Majesty in Council that the appeal ought to be dismissed and the said Scheme approved:

"Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend Lisle, Bishop of Hereford, pursuant to the provisions of the said Measures to inquire into and report upon the unions of (1) the said Benefices of Downton with Burrington, Aston and Elton and (2) the said Benefices of Wigmore and Leinthall Starkes duly made their Report to the said Bishop of Hereford and therein recommended the said unions and the terms for effecting the same, and the said Bishop of Hereford signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

"And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the said unions of Benefices based upon the terms recommended in the said

Report:

"And whereas the said Benefice of Wigmore is now full the Reverend John Rowley Donald being the present Incumbent thereof and the said Benefices of Downton with Burrington and Aston with Elton and Leinthall Starkes are at present vacant:

"And whereas (a) the patronage of the said United Benefice of Downton with Burrington belongs to Your Majesty and to Charles Andrew Rouse Boughton-Knight, Esquire, of Stone-brook House, Downton, Ludlow, as alternate Patrons and the alternate right of presentation or nomination to the said United Benefice is exercisable on behalf of Your Majesty by the Lord High Chancellor of England; and (b) the patronage of the said Benefice of Aston with Ellen and Leinthall Starkes belongs to the said Charles Andrew Rouse Boughton-Knight and to Mrs. Mary Custance of Warden Lodge, Bincleaves, Weymouth, as alternate Patrons; and (c) the patronage of the said Benefice of Wigmore belongs wholly to the Bishop of Hereford and his successors:

"Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said Lisle, Bishop of Hereford, and with the consent of the said John Rowley Donald (testified by their having respectively signed this Scheme) do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to

say:—
"I. That the said Benefice of Downton with Burrington and that part of the said United Benefice of Aston with Elton and Leinthall Starkes which consists of the said Benefices of Aston and Elton shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with cure of souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Downton with Burrington, Aston and Elton ' but the Parishes of the said Benefices shall continue distinct in all respects.

" 2. That the said Benefice of Wigmore and that part of the said United Benefice of Aston with Elton and Leinthall Starkes which consists of the said Benefice of Leinthall Starkes shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with cure of souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Wigmore with Leinthall Starkes' but the Parishes of the said Benefices shall continue distinct in all respects.

'3. That upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette the unions referred to in Clauses I and 2 of this Scheme shall forthwith take effect and the said John Rowley Donald if he is then Incumbent of the said Benefice of Wigmore shall be the first Incumbent of the United Benefice of Wig-

more with Leinthall Starkes.

"4. That upon the said unions taking effect (1) the Parsonage House at Aston at present belonging to the said United Benefice of Aston with Elton and Leinthall Starkes shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice of Downton with Burrington, Aston and Elton and (2) the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Wigmore shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice of Wigmore with Leinthall Starkes and so soon as conveniently may be the Parsonage House at Downton at present belonging to the said Benefice of Downton with Burrington and the site and appurtenances thereof and the grounds heretofore usually occupied and enjoyed therewith shall be sold and disposed of by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners at such time or times and in such manner in all respects as to us shall seem expedient and that the net proceeds of such sale shall be appropriated for the benefit of the United Benefice of Downton with Burrington, Aston and Elton.

"5. That upon the unions referred to in Clauses I and 2 of this Scheme taking effect (a) all the endowments and property now belonging to the said United Benefice of Downton with Burrington together with a sum sufficient to produce £50 per annum of the sum of money appropriated or to be appropriated by the Governors of Queen Anne's Bounty to the said United Benefice of Aston with Elton and Leinthall Starkes pursuant to the provisions of Part II paragraph 2 of the Third Schedule to the Tithe Act, 1936, and paragraph I of the Eighth Schedule to the same Act shall be annexed and belong to the said United Benefice of Downton with Burrington, Aston and Elton and (b) all the endowments and property now belonging to the said Benefice of Wigmore together with such part of the said endowments and property now belonging to the said United Benefice of Aston with Elton and Leinthall Starkes as is not annexed as aforesaid to the said United Benefice of Downton with Burrington, Aston and Elton shall be annexed and belong to the said United Benefice of Wigmore with Leinthall Starkes.

"6. That after the union referred to in Clause I of this Scheme has taken effect the course and succession in which presentations or nominations to the United Benefice from time to time as the same shall become vacant shall be made shall be as follows, that is to say, that in every series of four successive turns of presentation or nomination to be made to the said United Benefice the Lord Chancellor shall have the first turn, the said Charles Andrew Rouse Boughton-Knight and his successors in title shall have the second and the fourth turns and the said Mary Custance and her successors in title shall have the third turn.

"7. That after the union referred to in Clause 2 of this Scheme has taken effect the patronage of the united Benefice of Wigmore with Leinthall Starkes shall belong wholly to

the Bishop of Hereford.

"Provided always that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from making any other recommendations and proposals relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Measures, or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England, or of

any Act of Parliament.

The KING has been graciously pleased to approve the following awards in recognition of gallantry displayed in flying operations against the enemy:

Distinguished Service Order.

Flight Lieutenant Robert Edgar Guy Van Der KISTE (39248), No. 210 Squadron.

In April, 1941, this officer was the captain of an aircraft which carried out a reconnaissance of the Norwegian coast from Hammerfest to Harstad, entailing a flight of many The greater part of the reconnnaissance had to be carried out at a height of less than 2,000 feet owing to low cloud, but Flight Lieutenant Van Der Kiste made such skilful use of the low cloud and the topographical features of the country, that very little opposition from the ground was encountered. At Harstad, where there was no cloud, he approached the town flying just above the water level and, despite heavy and light antiaircraft fire, flew right in and completed his By skilful low flying among reconnaissance. the fiords he was able to avoid any damage to his aircraft. On a previous occasion, Flight Lieutenant Van Der Kiste carried out a reconnaissance at a low altitude under

extremely trying conditions. Although his aircraft was damaged by enemy fire he completed his mission and skilfully flew back to He has displayed high qualities of leadership and has contributed materially to the efficiency and high standard of morale obtaining in his Squadron

Captain Kenneth Arthur Quirk (102625), No. 1

Squadron, South African Air Force.

In May, 1941, Captain Quirk, with complete disregard for his own safety, landed near Acroma and rescued another officer who had been forced to land his fighter through enemy action. After burning this aircraft Captain Quirk flew off with the pilot in his own fighter in the face of fire from the enemy. He displayed great courage and devotion to duty in rescuing his comrade and in preventing the aircraft falling into enemy hands.

Bar to the Distinguished Flying Cross.

Wing Commander Thomas Geoffrey PIKE,

D.F.C. (16202), No. 219 Squadron.

This officer has displayed outstanding skill and keenness in his efforts to seek and destroy One night recently the enemy at night. while his aerodrome was being bombed, he took off to engage the attackers when the aerodrome was illuminated by the glare from a large number of incendiary bombs.

Acting Squadron Leader Thomas Frederick Dalton Morgan, D.F.C. (37415), No. 43

Squadron.

This officer has displayed exceptional skill both as a squadron commander and an individual fighter. During two consecutive nights in May, 1941, he destroyed three enemy aircraft bringing his total victories to 13. Squadron Leader Morgan has contributed in a large measure to the high standard of operational efficiency of the squadron.

Acting Squadron Leader John William Charles SIMPSON, D.F.C. (37642), No. 245 Squadron.

This officer has displayed great skill and initiative both as a squadron commander and an individual fighter. He has destroyed 12 enemy aircraft, of which two have been shot down at night.

Distinguished Flying Cross.

Wing Commander James Owen Willis (32059),

No. 45 Squadron.

This officer has displayed the utmost determination in action against the enemy. May, 1941, he led a force of fighter aircraft in an attack against a moving transport column of some 100 vehicles, the majority of which were either destroyed or damaged. His leadership has been of a high order.

Acting Squadron Leader Richard Edgar Peter

Brooker (39931), No. 1 Squadron. This officer led his flight with considerable skill and ability over a long period, during which he destroyed a number of enemy aircraft. Since taking command of the squadron, he has greatly assisted in the brilliant work performed by the squadron. Throughout Squadron Leader Brooker has set an excellent example.

Acting Squadron Leader Edward Chatham Wolfe (37705), Reserve of Air Force Officers, No. 141 Squadron.

This officer has displayed great determination as a night fighter pilot. During a patrol one night in May, 1941, he observed an enemy aircraft and closed in with great skill before ordering his air gunner to open fire. The aircraft which was still carrying a full load of bombs crashed to the ground and burst into flames. Squadron Leader Wolfe assumed command of the squadron in September, 1940, and since then he has undertaken numerous night operational flights. He has at all times displayed great courage and leadership.

Flight Lieutenant Bertie Rex O'Bryen HOARE (37858), No. 23 Squadron.

Since January, 1941, this officer has carried out many night operational missions. His bombing attacks have been delivered with great skill often in the face of severe opposition from ground defences, and, despite the hazardous nature of these sorties, he seldom returns without valuable information Flight Lieutenant Hoare has destroyed at least two enemy aircraft and certainly damaged others. He has shown great enthusiasm and gallantry throughout.

Flying Officer Robert Frederick LEAVITT (42238).

In April, 1941, this officer was detailed to carry out an extensive reconnaissance off the Norwegian coast. He made a successful reconnaissance of two towns, but later his aircraft was hit by anti-aircraft fire and The aircraft immediately went damaged. into a spin but after losing height of about 5,000 feet, Flying Officer Leavitt regained control and, although the engine was running intermittently and the blind flying instru-ments were useless, he carried out a visual reconnaissance of a third town. In spite of the damage to his engine Flying Officer Leavitt succeeded in maintaining height above cloud in order that it might be possible to glide to land should the engine fail completely. He eventually succeeded in regaining his base returning with much valuable information. Flying Officer Leavitt was subsequently found to be suffering from concussion and an injured skull. He displayed great fortitude and devotion to duty through-

Pilot Officer Andrew Henry HUMPHREY (33543), No. 266 Squadron.

This officer has performed splendid work as a night fighter pilot. One night in May, 1941, he pursued an enemy bomber at a height of 20,000 feet and finally shot it down in the vicinity of an aerodrome off the Dutch or Belgian coast. Shortly afterwards, he observed another enemy aircraft taking off from the aerodrome and, diving down to 50 feet, he destroyed it. Although heavily attacked by the ground defences, Pilot Officer Humphrey succeeded in flying clear and later attacked an enemy fighter. He was compelled to break off this engagement after one attack as his ammunition was expended. Two nights previously, he destroyed an enemy bomber from close range. He has displayed great keenness on all occasions.

Distinguished Flying Cross.

Flight Lieutenant Edward Christopher Deanesley (90251), Auxiliary Air Force, No. 256 Squadron.

Distinguished Flying Medal.

N.Z. 40283 Sergeant William Jack Scott, Royal New Zealand Air Force, No. 256 Squadron.

Flight Lieutenant Deanesley and Sergeant Scott, as pilot and air gunner respectively, have achieved conspicuous success during recent night fighting operations. One night in April, 1941, a Heinkel III was encountered and destroyed and since then a further three enemy aircraft have been destroyed, of which two were shot down during the same patrol. During these operations both Flight Lieutenant Deanesley and Sergeant Scott have displayed great skill and determination.

Distinguished Flying Medal.

628391 Flight Sergeant Charles STANSFIELD,

No. 149 Squadron.

One night in May, 1941, this airman was the first wireless operator of an aircraft detailed to carry out an attack against Berlin. Owing to unforeseen weather conditions the aircraft passed its objective by a considerable distance and was faced with the prospect of having insufficient petrol to complete the return flight part of which would have to be made over enemy territory in daylight. Sergeant Stansfield proceeded to give his captain and navigator the utmost aid by means of wireless communication. With great skill he made contact with his base and kept the authorities informed as to position, height, speed and state of fuel. The aircraft eventually landed safely in this country with completely empty petrol tanks. Sergeant Stansfield displayed exceptional skill and coolness under extremely difficult conditions and was largely responsible for the safe return of his aircraft.

518345 Flight Sergeant Gwilym Trevor

WILLIAMS, No. 219 Squadron.

This airman has been employed with the squadron since May, 1940. He has completed many hours of operational night flying and his keenness and ability have been of great benefit in the training of others. He has assisted his pilot in the destruction of three enemy aircraft at night.

903071 Sergeant Sydney Austin. No. 219 Squadron.

This airman has performed a large number of flying hours on night fighting operations during which he has assisted in the destruction of three enemy aircraft. He has displayed considerable ability and efficiency throughout.

519573 Sergeant James Gillies, No. 91 Squadron.

In April, 1941, this airman, as pilot of an aircraft on a reconnaissance patrol, observed a Heinkel 115 seaplane being towed by an enemy tender of 800 tons near the coast off Gris Nez. He returned to base and reported the incident and later escorted a section of our fighters to the target. Despite poor visibility, he located the objective and partici-pated in an attack which resulted in the destruction of the seaplane and inflicted great damage to the tender. Returning from this operation he engaged and shot down a Messerschmitt 109. Sergeant Gillies has displayed exceptional skill as a reconnaissance

pilot and, since October, 1940, has completed 150 sorties, during the course of which he has destroyed two enemy aircraft. On four other occasions, he has attacked enemy aerodromes and troops.

518381 Sergeant George LAURENCE, No. 141

Squadron.

When returning from a patrol one night in May, 1941, this airman observed an enemy aircraft within 20 miles of his base. Although his petrol was nearly exhausted he immediately closed to the attack and enabled his air gunner to open fire. Sergeant Laurence followed the enemy down to 3,000 feet firing five more bursts. The enemy aircraft subsequently crashed. On a previous occasion, Sergeant Laurence destroyed a Junkers 88 at night. He has shown great courage and devotion to duty throughout the many night operational flights in which he has participated.

630959 Sergeant Arthur Alexander O'LEARY,

No. 604 Squadron.

One night in May, 1941, this airman was one of the crew of a fighter aircraft engaged in night-flying operations. His pilot was closing in to attack a hostile aircraft when the enemy fired a burst, which severely wounded Sergeant O'Leary. In spite of his wounds, Sergeant O'Leary rendered valuable assistance to his pilot which enabled him to bring the aircraft safely back to base. Sergeant O'Leary displayed great courage and fortitude throughout.

745744 Sergeant John Blenkin RAFFELS, Royal Air Force Volunteer Reserve, No. 23 Squad-

968409 Sergeant Leonard Langley, No. 23

Squadron.

Sergeant Raffels and Sergeant Langley have performed excellent work as pilot and air gunner respectively in an aircraft engaged on night fighting operations. By their splendid teamwork they have destroyed three enemy aircraft and caused much damage to enemy aerodromes. Both have displayed great enthusiasm and efficiency.
