"Whereas by section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, inter alia, that all pay, pensions or other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman or Marine therein shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas we consider it desirable that extra remuneration should be granted to ratings with special linguistic qualifications:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to sanction the grant of a special allowance of rs. a day to qualified ratings when we consider that payment is justified by the importance of the duties performed.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in this proposal."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

"Whereas by section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, inter alia, that all pay, pensions, or other allowances in the nature thereof, payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman, or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner, and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions, as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas Orders in Council of 29th January, 1929, 1st October, 1932, 27th October, 1936, 1st July, 1937, 24th February, 1938, and 5th September, 1939, authorised payment of extra duty pay to certain Royal Marine ranks when organised in service units:

"And whereas we consider that extra remuneration at the rate of 3d. a day should be paid to Royal Marine ranks qualified and employed as Wire Splicers in the establishment of such units:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to sanction payment accordingly.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in this proposal."

"Whereas by section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, inter alia, that all pay, pensions, or other allowances in the nature thereof, payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman, or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner, and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions, as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas we are of opinion that the responsibilities devolving upon the Senior Telegraphist ratings in certain classes of H.M. Ships merit additional remuneration during the present war:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to sanction payment of an allowance at the rate of one shilling a day to the Senior Telegraphist rating borne in all Capital Ships, Cruisers, Cruiser-Minelayers, Aircraft Carriers and Destroyer and Submarine Depot Ships in which no qualified Signal Officer or Warrant Telegraphist is borne, during the period of hostilities.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in this proposal."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1936, of the Act of the 33rd and 34th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 39, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say, the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 113, the Act of the 4th and 5th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 39, and the Act of the 31st and 32nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 114, duly prepared and laid

before His Majesty in Council a Scheme bearing date the 3rd day of April, 1941, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 and 1936, of the Act of the 33rd and 34th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 39, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say, the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 113, the Act of the 4th and 5th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 39, and the Act of the 31st and 32nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 114, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting the union of the Benefice (being a Rectory) of High Laver and the Benefice (being a Rectory) of Magdalen Laver; the annexation of a part of the Parish of the said Benefice of High Laver to the Parish of the Benefice of Matching; and the transfer of the ownership of the advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said Benefices of High Laver and Magdalen Laver, all of which said Benefices are situate in the county of Essex and in the Diocese of Chelmsford:

"Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend Henry, Bishop of Chelmsford, pursuant to the provisions of the said Measures to inquire into and report upon the union of the said three Benefices of High Laver, Magdalen Laver and Matching duly made their Report to the said Bishop of Chelmsford, and therein recommended the union of the said two Benefices of High Laver and Magdalen Laver only and the terms for effecting the union, and also recommend the annexation to the Parish of the said Benefice of Matching of a part of the Parish of the said Benefice of High Laver and the said Bishop of Chelmsford signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

"And whereas by the Will dated the 27th day of February, 1914, of the late Richard Thomas Dutton Budworth, Clerk in Holy Orders and an Honorary Canon of the Cathedral Church of Durham, the advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of High Laver was devised to David Philip Dutton Budworth, Clerk in Holy Orders, now of No. 7, Hungershall Park, Tunbridge Wells, in the County of Kent, and Eustace Hebert North, now of Fairways, Devil's Highway, Wellington College, in the County of Berks, Esquire, the executors and trustees of the said Will, upon trust to apply the same for the benefit of Durham School:

"And whereas the said Richard Thomas Dutton Budworth died on the 7th day of December, 1937, and probate of his Will was granted on the 3rd day of March, 1938:

"And whereas the Dean and Chapter of the Cathedral Church of Durham being the Governing Body of Durham School have disclaimed the said devise and the said Dean and Chapter, the said David Philip Dutton Budworth and the said Eustace Hebert North are willing that the whole advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of High Laver shall be transferred to and be vested in the Bishop of Chelmsford for the time being:

"And whereas the advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the

said Benefice of Magdalen Laver is vested for an estate in fee simple without encumbrances in the Reformation Church Trust, whose Registered Office is situate at No. 57 Berners Street, in the County of London:

"And whereas the said Reformation Church Trust is desirous that the whole advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Magdalen Laver should be transferred to and be vested in the Bishop of Chelmsford for the time being:

"And whereas the said Henry, Bishop of Chelmsford, is willing to accept the transfers as aforesaid and in token of such his willingness and also in token that the same transfers have that consent of the Bishop of the Diocese which by the hereinbefore mentioned Acts or by some or one of them is made necessary he, the said Henry, Bishop of Chelmsford, has executed this Scheme as hereinafter mentioned:

"And whereas the transfers of patronage which are hereinbefore mentioned and are hereinafter recommended and proposed will in our opinion tend to make better provision for the cure of souls in the Parishes or Districts in or respect of which the rights of patronage or advowsons so recommended and proposed to be transferred as aforesaid respectively arise or exist, that is to say, in the respective Parishes of the said Benefices of High Laver and Magdalen Laver:

"And whereas upon the said transfers of patronage taking effect the patronage of the United Benefice hereinafter recommended and proposed to be constituted will be vested wholly in the See of Chelmsford:

"And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the union of the said two Benefices and for the said alteration of boundaries, which Scheme is based upon the terms recommended in the said Report, but with the assent of the said Bishop of Chelmsford embodies certain modifications thereof, and, further, for effecting such transfers of patronage as are hereinbefore mentioned:

"And whereas both of the said Benefices are now full, the Reverend Claude Hamilton Roe being the present Incumbent of the Benefice of High Laver and the Reverend Arthur David King being the present Incumbent of the Benefice of Magdalen Laver:

"Now, therefore, with the consent, so far as the transfers of patronage hereinafter recommended and proposed are concerned, of the said David Philip Dutton Budworth and the said Eustace Hebert North (in testimony whereof they have signed and sealed this Scheme) and of the said Dean and Chapter and the said Reformation Church Trust (in testimony whereof they have caused their respective corporate or common seals to be affixed to this Scheme) and with the consent of the said Henry, Bishop of Chelmsford (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme and sealed the same with his Episcopal Seal) we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

"1. That upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly

gazetted Order the whole advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to each of the said Benefices of High Laver and Magdalen Laver shall be transferred to the said Henry, Bishop of Chelmsford, and his successors in the same Bishopric, and shall thereupon and thenceforth become and be absolutely vested in and shall and may be from time to time exercised by the said Henry, Bishop of Chelmsford, and by his successors in the same Bishopric for ever.

"2. That the said Benefice of High Laver and the said Benefice of Magdalen Laver shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with Cure of Souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of High Laver and Magdalen Laver' but the Parishes of the said Benefices shall continue in all respects distinct.

"3. That if upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette both of the said two Benefices shall be vacant, the union of the same two Benefices shall take effect forthwith: and if the said Benefice of High Laver only shall be then approve, then the said union shall take effect forthwith if the Incumbent of the other of the said two Benefices shall with the approval of the Bishop consent to become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice, but if he shall not so consent or if the Bishop shall not approve, then the said union shall take effect upon the then next avoidance of the said Benefice of Magdalen Laver and the then Incumbent of High Laver shall be the first Incumbent of the United Benefice, and if the said Benefice of Magdalen Laver only shall be then vacant the said union shall take effect upon the next avoidance of the said Benefice of High Laver and if neither of the said two Benefices be then vacant, then the said union shall take effect on the next avoidance of the said Benefice of High Laver if the Incumbent at that time of the said Benefice of Magdalen Laver shall have been instituted to Magdalen Laver subsequently to the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme or if instituted before that date shall with the approval of the Bishop consent to become the Incumbent of the United Benefice, but if he shall have been instituted to the said Benefice of Magdalen Laver before that date and shall not so consent or if the Bishop shall not approve, then the said union shall take effect immediately upon the next vacancy of the said Benefice of Magdalen Laver following such avoidance of the said Benefice of High Laver and the then Incumbent of the said Benefice of High Laver shall become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice.

"4. That upon the said union taking effect and pending the provision of a more suitable house of residence the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Magdalen Laver shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice.

"5. That with the consent of the Reverend John Racster Smart, being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Matching (testified by his signing this Scheme) upon the said union taking effect all that portion of the Parish of the said Benefice of High Laver which

lies to the north of the line shown in red upon the map or plan annexed to this Scheme and which is shown by the pink colour thereon shall be severed from the said Parish and shall be annexed for all ecclesiastical purposes to the Parish of the said Benefice of Matching.

" 6. That upon the said union taking effect (a) provision shall be made by the Incumbent of the United Benefice for obtaining occasional clerical or lay assistance and a part of the total endowments of the Benefices so constituted an United Benefice, that is to say, a capital sum of £1,000 being a part of the sum of money appropriated or to be appropriated by Queen Anne's Bounty to the said Benefice of High Laver pursuant to sections 7 and 38 of the Tithe Act 1936 and the provisions of Part II of the Third Schedule to the said Act, and paragraph 1 of the Eighth Schedule to the same Act, shall be severed or diverted from the said Benefice of High Laver and from the United Benefice, and a sum of £1,000 3 per cent. Redemption Stock 1986/96 issued, or to be issued, to Queen Anne's Bounty pursuant to the provisions of Part II of the said Third Schedule and representing the said capital sum of £1,000, shall be severed and diverted from the general corporate account of Queen Anne's Bounty and shall be held by Queen Anne's Bounty as a special fund to meet the expenses of providing for occasional clerical or lay assistance as aforesaid with the same powers of sale and reinvestment as if the said sum of stock were still held by Queen Anne's Bounty on their general corporate account, and the income on the said fund or on any securities or investments representing the same, shall be paid by Queen Anne's Bounty to the Diocesan Board of Finance of the Diocese as trustees to apply the same for the purpose of paying the expense of occasional clerical or lay assistance as aforesaid, and (b) a further part of the total endowments aforesaid that is to say, a capital sum of £4,566 13s. 4d. being a further part of the said sum of money appropriated or to be appropriated by Queen Anne's Bounty to the said Benefice of High Laver as aforesaid shall be severed or diverted from the said Benefice of High Laver and from the United Benefice and shall be appropriated and held by Queen Anne's Bounty for the augmentation of the said Benefice of Matching.

" Provided that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from making any other recommendations and proposals relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Measures and Acts, or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England, or of any Act of Parliament."

And whereas the provisions of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1936, and the Union of Benefices Rules, 1926 to 1930, relating to the preparation and submission of this scheme have been duly complied with:

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said scheme and to order that it shall be and become effectual in law immediately upon the publication of this Order in the London Gazette.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1936, duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a Scheme bearing date the 16th day of January, 1941, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

" We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1936, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for effecting the division of the Parish of the Benefice of Leicester, Saint Luke, and the union of all the several parts thereof to the Parishes of the three Benefices of Leicester, Christ Church; Leicester, Saint Matthew; and Leicester, Saint George, all of which Benefices are situate in the County of Leicester and in the Diocese of Leicester:

" Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend Cyril Charles Bowman, formerly Bishop of Leicester, pursuant to the provisions of the said Measures to inquire into and report upon the division of the said Benefice of Leicester, Saint Luke, among the said three Benefices of Leicester, Christ Church; Leicester, Saint Matthew; and Leicester, Saint George, duly made their Report to the said Bishop of Leicester and therein recommended the division of the said Benefice of Leicester, Saint Luke, and the terms for effecting the same including certain alterations of boundaries affecting the Parishes of the said Benefices of Leicester, Christ Church, and Leicester, Saint George, and the said Bishop of Leicester signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

" And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the division of the said Benefice of Leicester, Saint Luke, which Scheme is based upon the terms recommended in the said Report but with the assent of the Right Reverend Guy Vernon, now Bishop of Leicester, embodies certain modifications thereof:

" And whereas the said Benefice of Leicester, Saint Luke, is at present vacant and the said three Benefices of Leicester, Christ Church; Leicester, Saint Matthew; and Leicester, Saint George, are all now full, the Reverend Canon Harold John Drummond being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Leicester, Christ Church, the Reverend Victor Frederick Hambling being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Leicester, Saint Matthew, and the Reverend James Adams being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Leicester, Saint George, and such Incumbents have signed this Scheme in token of their consent to the alteration of the boundaries of their respective Parishes including the addition thereto of portions of the Parish of Leicester, Saint Luke, as hereinafter recommended and proposed:

" Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said Guy Vernon, now Bishop of Leicester (testified by his signing this Scheme),

do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

" 1. That upon the day of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council affirming this Scheme the said Parish of Leicester, Saint Luke, shall be divided and all the several parts thereof shall be united as follows, that is to say, (a) there shall be transferred and annexed for all ecclesiastical purposes to the said Parish of Leicester, Christ Church, all that part of the said Parish of Leicester, Saint Luke, which lies to the west of the middle of Brunswick Street and to the west of the middle of Humberstone Road which part is shown by pink colour on the map annexed to this Scheme; (b) there shall be transferred and annexed for all ecclesiastical purposes to the said Parish of Leicester, Saint Matthew, all that part of the said Parish of Leicester, Saint Luke, which lies to the north of the middle of Bell Lane and of a straight line in continuation extending to the eastern boundary of the last mentioned Parish and which lies to the east of the middle of Brunswick Street and to the east of the middle of Humberstone Road which part is shown by green colour on the said map; (c) there shall be transferred and annexed for all ecclesiastical purposes to the said Parish of Leicester, Saint George, all that part of the said Parish of Leicester, Saint Luke, which lies to the south of the lastly described territory which part is shown by orange colour on the said map.

" 2. That upon the day aforesaid there shall be transferred and annexed for all ecclesiastical purposes to the said Parish of Leicester, Christ Church, (a) all that part of the said Parish of Leicester, Saint George, which lies to the north of the middle of Humberstone Road and is shown by purple colour on the said map and (b) all that part of the said Parish of Leicester, Saint Matthew, which lies to the south of the wall or fence forming the southern boundary of the houses and premises situate on the south side of Denman Street and of a straight line in continuation extending to the middle of Wharf Street and is shown by blue colour on the said map.

" 3. That upon the said division taking effect the register books of baptisms, marriages and burials and other the records and muniments deposited in the Church of Saint Luke, Leicester, shall be transferred to the Church of Saint Matthew, Leicester, but the marriage registers in duplicate current at the Church of Saint Luke, Leicester, shall first be sent by the Incumbent of the said Benefice of Leicester, Saint Matthew, to the Registrar General to be closed officially.

" 4. That upon the said division taking effect the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Leicester, Saint Luke, and the site and appurtenances thereof and the grounds heretofore usually occupied and enjoyed therewith shall be sold and disposed of by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners at such time or times and in such manner in all respects as to us shall seem expedient and that the net proceeds of such sale shall be appropriated towards the cost of improving the Parsonage House of the said Benefice of Leicester, Christ Church, or towards the cost of providing a new Parsonage House for that Benefice as to us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, and to the Bishop of the Diocese

may seem expedient and any balance of such net proceeds not so appropriated shall be held and invested by us and the income therefrom applied to the endowment of the proposed new District hereinafter mentioned.

" 5. That upon the said division taking effect the endowment of the said Benefice of Leicester, Saint Luke, consisting of an annual sum or stipend of £374 payable by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, to the Incumbent of that Benefice shall be appropriated as follows, that is to say (a) an annual sum of £100 shall be annexed to the said Benefice of Leicester, Christ Church, as an addition to the endowment thereof, (b) an annual sum of £87 shall be annexed to the said Benefice of Leicester, Saint Matthew, as an addition to the endowment thereof, and (c) an annual sum of £187 shall be held and accumulated by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners as the endowment or part of the endowment of the proposed New District hereinafter mentioned. Provided that pending the formation of such proposed District and if the Bishop of Leicester shall so direct the said sum of £187 together with the income in respect of any accumulations thereof shall be paid subject to such conditions as we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, shall deem expedient towards the stipend of a curate serving the area or a part of the area proposed to be comprised within such District.

" 6.—(a) That so soon as conveniently may be after the said division has taken effect the Church of Saint Luke, Leicester, shall be taken down and the materials and site thereof, together with any ground annexed thereto and necessary for the use and enjoyment thereof shall be sold and disposed of by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, at such time or times and in such manner in all respects as to us shall seem expedient subject to the conditions and restrictions imposed by the said Measures.

" (b) That the net proceeds to arise from such sale or sales, after payment of the expenses attendant upon the sale or sales, the taking down of the Church, the removal of monuments (if any) and all other expenses incidental to these matters, shall be applied by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, as follows, that is to say (1) in payment of the compensation or compensations hereinafter mentioned or in repayment of any advance made for the purpose of such compensation or compensations; (2) towards the cost of providing a Church dedicated to Saint Luke for a new District in the patronage of the Bishop of the Diocese to be formed in or near the City of Leicester.

" (c) That the font, communion table, and plate used for the purpose of the Holy Communion in the said Church of Saint Luke, Leicester, shall not be sold but shall in accordance with the provisions of the said Measures and as the Bishop of the Diocese may direct be transferred to the said new Saint Luke's Church and the bells, organ and other furniture and fittings of the said Church of Saint Luke, Leicester, or such of them as the Bishop of Leicester shall select shall be appropriated by the Bishop of Leicester for use in the same Church or if not required therefor, be removed to any other Church or Chapel or Churches or Chapels within the said Diocese of Leicester which the Bishop may select or shall be sold and in such case the proceeds shall be added

to the fund arising from the sale of the site and materials of the said Church of Saint Luke, Leicester, as aforesaid.

"(d) That in the event of the services of any Church officers and servants of the said Church of Saint Luke, Leicester, being dispensed with by reason of the division taking effect, such Church officers and servants shall out of any moneys to be received by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, under the provisions of this clause receive such reasonable compensation as having regard to age, length of service, and other circumstances of the case shall seem to us and to the Bishop of Leicester equitable and proper. Provided always that it shall be lawful for us if we shall see fit so to do in all or any of these cases to advance the compensation money or any part thereof out of the Expenses Fund established pursuant to the 32nd Section of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923.

 beside a battery of artillery which, by his
 timely warning, was able to move to a better
 position. Flight Lieutenant McFall dis-
 played outstanding gallantry and devotion to
 duty throughout a difficult period.

 tion of at least 6 enemy aircraft at night.

Distinguished Flying Cross.

 SANDERS (33095), No. 264 Squadron.

This officer has taken part in many opera-
 tional missions against the enemy. On one
 occasion he carried out a very fine recon-
 naissance of Wilhelmshaven in the face of
 intense anti-aircraft opposition and under
 appalling weather conditions. As a squadron
 commander he has proved himself to be a
 fine leader and a determined pilot who has
 contributed in a large measure to the many
 successes obtained by his squadron. He has
 recently destroyed two enemy aircraft at
 night.

Acting Squadron Leader Ronald Ogilvy
 Maurice GRAHAM (72159), Royal Air Force
 Volunteer Reserve, No. 101 Squadron.

In May, 1941, this officer led a formation
 of aircraft which attacked a convoy of enemy
 shipping near Boulogne. Although the con-
 voy was sailing within the protective range
 of its own land anti-aircraft defences Squad-
 ron Leader Graham brilliantly executed a
 most determined attack. In the face of in-
 tense fire from the convoy escorting vessels
 and land defences, he descended to an ex-
 tremely low level and obtained two direct hits
 on the largest vessel in the convoy. It was
 subsequently learned that this vessel was
 sunk. On a previous occasion he commanded
 a flight which operated with much success
 against enemy shipping. Squadron Leader
 Graham has carried out numerous operational
 missions and throughout has displayed great
 leadership, courage and determination.

Acting Flight Lieutenant Peter William DUNNING-WHITE (90543), Auxiliary Air Force, No. 615 Squadron.

This officer has proved himself a keen and efficient pilot who has led his flight and sometimes his squadron with considerable success. During his many operational flights he has destroyed at least four enemy aircraft, one of which was destroyed at night.

Acting Flight Lieutenant Edward Brian MORTIMER-ROSE (41944), No. 234 Squadron.

This officer has displayed great skill as a fighter pilot. In a recent combat he destroyed two of five enemy aircraft destroyed by his flight thus bringing his victories to at least six. He has set a splendid example and has contributed materially to the high standard of efficiency in his squadron.

Acting Flight Lieutenant Bryan John WICKS (40774), No. 56 Squadron.

This officer has served with the squadron since the war began. In May, 1940, during the intensive air operations in France, he was forced to land behind the German lines after he had destroyed one of their aircraft. Nevertheless, he succeeded in reaching this country in safety. He has destroyed at least three enemy aircraft and shared in the destruction of others. Flight Lieutenant Wicks, who recently assumed command of his flight, has shown excellent qualities of leadership and determination.

Flying Officer Roland Prosper BEAMONT (41819), No. 87 Squadron.

This officer has displayed great skill and efficiency during a long period of active operations. He has completed many night flying operations and, on two occasions, has assisted in damaging several aircraft on the ground in spite of intense opposition from the defences. He has personally destroyed at least five enemy aircraft.

Flying Officer Robert Lionel Frank DAY (41263), No. 141 Squadron.

Pilot Officer Francis Charles Anthony LANNING (79580), Royal Air Force Volunteer Reserve No. 141 Squadron.

In May, 1941, Flying Officer Day and Pilot Officer Lanning were the pilot and air gunner respectively of an aircraft engaged in night fighting operations. Observing an enemy aircraft at about 1,000 feet below him, Flying Officer Day skilfully closed in to attack and enabled Pilot Officer Lanning to shoot down the raider. The same night, on further patrol, these officers destroyed another enemy aircraft. Flying Officer Day and Pilot Officer Lanning have carried out many night operational flights and both have displayed great courage and devotion to duty.

Pilot Officer Jack Alexander James BAILEY (86371), Royal Air Force Volunteer Reserve, No. 115 Squadron.

One night in May, 1941, this officer was the pilot of an aircraft which carried out an attack against an important target at Hamburg. When over the North Sea, on the outward journey, a Junkers 88 was encountered. Evading an attempted attack from the rear, Pilot Officer Bailey skilfully manoeuvred his aircraft enabling his rear gunner to fire a burst of about 400 rounds into the enemy aircraft which crashed into the sea in flames.

Pilot Officer Bailey flew on to Hamburg, bombed his objective successfully and returned safely to base. Since February, 1941, he has participated in many operational flights and throughout has shown similar courage, determination and devotion to duty.

Acting Flight Lieutenant Cuthbert RAYMOND (43710), No. 15 Squadron.

Distinguished Flying Medal.

901384 Sergeant Jack Reginald BUSHELL, No. 15 Squadron.

One night in May, 1941, Flight Lieutenant Raymond and Sergeant Bushell were captain and rear gunner respectively in an aircraft which carried out an attack against Berlin. After spending a considerable time over the target area waiting for a break in the clouds to permit of accurate bombing, a steady run was made over the target and, despite heavy and accurate anti-aircraft fire a well aimed stick of bombs was finally released over the objective. The aircraft was then hit by shell-fire. After flying for a short distance it caught fire and began to lose height. After the fire had been put out the aircraft was subjected to a determined attack by an enemy fighter but Sergeant Bushell coolly engaged the enemy and enabled his captain to manoeuvre his aircraft and finally evade the attacker. In the face of many difficulties Flight Lieutenant Raymond flew his aircraft back to his base and landed safely. Flight Lieutenant Raymond and Sergeant Bushell both displayed the greatest courage and determination throughout.

Distinguished Flying Medal.

758032 Sergeant Bertie George COOK, Royal Air Force Volunteer Reserve, No. 101 Squadron.

This airman was the pilot of an aircraft which participated in an attack against three enemy merchant ships and their escorting vessels. Descending to only 50 feet, Sergeant Cook attacked one of the escorting vessels and obtained direct hits with two of his bombs. A few days later, he took part in another attack on enemy shipping off Boulogne. In the face of intense and accurate fire both from the ships and shore batteries, he bombed his objective from an extremely low level. Sergeant Cook displayed considerable ability in flying his aircraft back to base from this attack. He has displayed great courage, initiative and devotion to duty throughout.

565286 Sergeant Alfred Ernest MARSHALL, No. 73 Squadron.

This airman has displayed outstanding skill, courage and devotion to duty whilst engaged on active operations against the enemy. He has personally destroyed 15 enemy aircraft. On a recent occasion he took off to engage the enemy whilst a fierce ground attack was being made against the aerodrome.

632105 Sergeant Idris Henry RICHARDS, No. 148 Squadron.

Since November, 1939, this wireless operator/air gunner has completed numerous operational missions, including attacks over

Germany, the invasion ports and Italy. On one of these flights his skilful use of the wireless was mainly responsible for the safe return of his aircraft. On another occasion, when his aircraft was caught in searchlights at a low altitude, he immediately manned the front turret and extinguished three searchlights in the face of intense anti-aircraft fire. In October, 1940, at Castel Benito, he machine gunned enemy aircraft on the ground setting at least two of them on fire. He has displayed great skill, courage and keenness on all occasions.
