A PROCLAMATION

REVOKING THE PRETORIA MINT PROCLAMATION,
1922.

GEORGE R.I.

WHEREAS, in pursuance of section eleven of the Coinage Act, 1870, His late Majesty King George the Fifth, by the Pretoria Mint Proclamation, 1922, proclaimed, directed and ordained the establishment of a branch of Our Royal Mint in England at or near Pretoria in Our Union of South Africa:

And whereas by virtue of the said section it is lawful for Us, with the advice of Our Privy Council, by Proclamation to revoke any Proclamation previously made in pursuance of that section:

And whereas it appears to Us desirable that the establishment of the said branch Mint should be discontinued, having regard to the fact that our Ministers in Our Union of South Africa have requested the discontinuance thereof and that provision has been made by the Parliament of Our Union of South Africa for the minting of coin in Our Union of South Africa:

We, therefore, in pursuance of the said Act and of all other powers enabling Us in that behalf, do hereby, with the advice of Our Privy Council, proclaim, direct and ordain as follows:—

1. The establishment of the branch of Our Royal Mint in England at or near Pretoria in Our Union of South Africa shall, as from the first day of July, nineteen hundred and forty-one, be discontinued, and the Pretoria Mint Proclamation, 1922, shall, as from that date, cease to have effect:

Provided that nothing in this Proclamation shall affect anything legally done or suffered before that date, and all coins coined at the said branch Mint, before that date which are at that date current and a legal tender in any part of Our dominions shall not, by reason of this Proclamation, cease to be so current and a legal tender.

2. This Proclamation may be cited as the Pretoria Mint (Discontinuance) Proclamation, 1941.

Given at Our Court at Buckingham Palace, this twenty-sixth day of June, in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and forty-one, and in the fifth year of Our Reign.

"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions or other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are

from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas by Order in Council dated the 23rd day of July, 1931, regulations were laid down for the pay, retirement, and retired pay of Officers of Your Majesty's Naval and Marine Force employed on certain Inspection, Research, Design and Experimental Ordnance duties, and for the widows and dependants of these Officers:

"And whereas by Order in Council dated the 2nd day of February, 1937, regulations were laid down for the award of brevet rank to Officers of Your Royal Marine Force:

"And whereas it is desired to revise the conditions of service of Officers of Your Royal Marine Force employed on Inspection, Research, Design and Experimental Ordnance duties:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased by your Order in Council to sanction the following proposals:—

"(1) Captains, Royal Marines, on the Active List holding Junior posts, or Senior posts with the rank of Acting Major, to be promoted to the rank of Brevet Major at the time when they would normally be promoted to the rank of Major had they been performing Corps duty; such promotion to be subject to the Officers being recommended in all respects, but not to their having passed for promotion. Should Officers who are on probation become due for promotion under this clause, such promotion is to be suspended until they are confirmed in their appointments:

"(2) Captains, Royal Marines, who are placed on the Retired List under the provisions of paragraph 6 of the Schedule annexed to the Order in Council dated the 2nd day of July, 1931, while holding the rank of Brevet Major, to be granted the rank of Major on the Retired List.

"(3) The awards of Brevet rank under these provisions to be additional to the awards for distinguished or meritorious service sanctioned by Order in Council dated the 2nd day of February, 1937.

"The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in these proposals."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

"And whereas we consider that the foregoing rates of pay should be revised in the case of Pensioner Recruiters appointed or re-appointed as such after 10th July, 1922, and 4th October, 1925, respectively:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased by Your Order in Council to sanction the payment of Pensioner Recruiters appointed or re-appointed as such after 10th July, 1922, and before 5th October, 1925, at a flat rate of 11s. 6d. a day, and the payment of Pensioner Recruiters appointed or re-appointed as such after 4th October, 1925, at a flat rate of 10s. 6d. a day to cover all expenses except kit, together with the additional allowances aforesaid, with effect from 1st September, 1939.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in this proposal."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And whereas Orders in Council were made on the 13th May, 1887, the 30th April, 1894, the 14th July, 1899, the 16th May, 1904, the 10th May, 1905, the 8th May, 1919, the 14th July, 1922, and the 4th May, 1923, varying the said Order in Council of the 13th September, 1854:

And whereas it seems fit to His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, that the said Order in Council of the 13th day of September, 1854, as varied by the above-mentioned Orders, in so far as it affects burials in the burial ground of the Cathedral of Winchester should be further varied:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice aforesaid, is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the said Orders shall have effect subject to the following exception or qualification, viz.:—

That, notwithstanding anything in the said Orders in Council of the 13th day of September, 1854, the 13th day of May, 1887, the 30th day of April, 1894, the 14th day of July, 1899, the 16th day of May, 1904, the 10th day of May, 1905, the 8th day of May,

1919, the 14th day of July, 1922, and the 4th day of May, 1923, in a new earthen grave in the part of the said burial ground called the "Great Water Close" situated on the South side of the Lady Chapel, the burial may be allowed, at or below the depth of five feet from the surface of the ground, of the body of the late Phyllis Eleanor Selwyn, wife of the Very Reverend Edward George Selwyn, Dean of the said Cathedral.

ROYAL AIR FORCE.

The KING has been graciously pleased to approve the following awards in recognition of gallantry displayed in flying operations against the enemy:—

Bar to Distinguished Flying Cross.

Acting Squadron Leader Peter Henry Anker SIMMONS, D.F.C. (39671), No. 107 Squadron.

In June, 1941, this officer participated in an operational sweep against enemy shipping off the Dutch coast. Undeterred by extremely bad flying conditions, he eventually led his flight in a low level attack on an enemy convoy. In spite of fierce and accurate anti-aircraft fire, he succeeded in obtaining 2 direct hits on a vessel of 5,000 tons while another member of his flight also scored hits on a vessel of similar size. Both ships were destroyed. Earlier in May, Squadron Leader Simmons executed a highly successful operation over Heligoland with magnificent dash. He has at all times shown outstanding leadership and courage.

Distinguished Flying Cross.

Acting Flight Lieutenant Sidney George Stock (43258), No. 7 Squadron.

In June, 1941, this officer was the rear gunner of an aircraft which took part in an operational sweep of the enemy coast from Flushing to Dunkirk. Following the bombing of some ships near Dunkirk harbour, his aircraft was attacked by 3 Messerschmitt 109's but, by brilliant shooting, Flight Lieutenant Stock destroyed one and damaged another of the attackers. On a previous occasion he displayed great coolness in the face of considerable odds. Flight Lieutenant Stock has always displayed outstanding devotion to duty and keenness in gunnery.

Flying Officer Reginald William Cox (43145), No. 7 Squadron.

In June, 1941, this officer was the captain of an aircraft which participated in an operational sweep of the enemy coastline from Flushing to Dunkirk. Whilst carrying out an attack on some ships near Dunkirk, his aircraft was attacked by 2 Messerschmitt 109's. During the ensuing battle, Flying Officer Cox displayed great skill and determination and, as a result, one of the enemy aircraft was observed to go down into a steep dive with smoke and flames pouring from it. A few days previously he carried out an operation under extremely unfavourable weather conditions. Despite the fact that shortly after taking off the generator failed and wireless communication with his base became impossible, he continued his mission and successfully bombed his target. He has set an excellent example of courage and devotion to duty.

Pilot Officer James Robert ANDERSON (79508), Royal Air Force Volunteer Reserve, No. 103 Squadron.

One night in June, 1941, this officer was the captain of an aircraft which participated in a low level attack on dockside buildings at Brest. The target could not at first be identified but, although fully aware that the area was protected by a balloon barrage, Pilot Officer Anderson remained over the target for 30 minutes until a temporary improvement in visibility afforded the opportunity to attack. Descending from 3,000 feet his bombs were observed to burst on or near the objective. Despite intense light anti-aircraft fire, he continued his dive to 900 feet where he was held in the beams of searchlights but 8 of these were extinguished by his front and rear gunners. Pilot Officer Anderson has completed numerous operational flights and has always displayed the utmost determination and skill.

Pilot Officer John Winston SIEVERS (79514), Royal Air Force Volunteer Reserve, No. 150 Squadron.

One night in June, 1941, this officer was the captain of an aircraft which took part in an attack on Brest. In spite of intense anti-aircraft fire both from ground defences and ships, Pilot Officer Sievers descended to 4,500 feet and skilfully dropped all his bombs in the target area. On a previous occasion, during an attack on Hamburg, this officer displayed great flying skill which enabled his rear gunner to shoot down a Messerschmitt 110 which attacked his aircraft whilst held

GEORGE THE SIXTH, by the Grace of God, of Great Britain, Ireland and the Dominions beyond the Seas, King, Defender of the Faith, Emperor of India, to all whom these Presents shall come:

Greeting:

Whereas an Order, known as the Order of British India, was instituted by a Resolution of the Governor-General of India in Council, dated the seventeenth day of April in the year eighteen hundred and thirty-seven:

And whereas it seemed to Us desirable to make provision Ourselves for this Order:

We did by Royal Warrant under our Royal Sign Manual bearing date the twenty-fifth day of August, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-nine, make for Us, Our Heirs and Successors, Ordinances for the Governance of the Order:

And whereas We desire to make certain alterations in the said Ordinances:

Now know Ye that We do by these Presents for Us, Our Heirs and Successors make the following alterations to the said Ordinances, that is to say:—

"*Secondly.*—It is ordained that the Order shall consist of two classes and that appointments to it may be made only by Our Viceroy from among those on the active list of Our Armed Forces in India, including Frontier Corps and Military Police and of Our Royal Indian Navy and from among those on the active list of Indian States' Forces, for long, faithful and honourable service. Officers of the Indian Army holding the commission of Our Viceroy and Indian Officers of Indian States Forces, Frontier Corps and Military Police, and Indian Commissioned Warrant Officers and Indian Warrant Officers of Our Royal Indian Navy may be appointed to the Second Class. Appointments to the First Class shall be made only from members of the Second Class."
